The Recognition was granted to the institution on 27.06.2005 for B.Ed. one year programme with an intake of 100 students. 2. After promulgation of NCTE Regulation 2014 Revised Recognition order was not issued for two-year B.Ed. programme due to non-submission of affidavit by the institution. 3. The institution has submitted an affidavit on 14.09.2020 for acceptance of NCTE Regulation 2014 with a request to issued revised Recognition order for B.Ed. two-year programme with an intake of 100 seats. 4. Latest Staff list duly approved by the affiliating body along with the faculty approval letter. 2. Land Possession/ Mutation certificate issued by Land Revenue Department. 3. Building plan issued approved the Competent Authority. 4. Building Completion Certificate 5. Non-Encumbrance certificate issued by Land Revenue Department. 6. Change of land Use certificate. 7. Certified copy of Land documents. 8. Affidavit on Rs. 100/- indicating the details of land. 9. Original FDRs towards Endowment and Reserve Fund <p>The WRC also decided that in view of earlier decision, fact finding committee may be appointed to investigate the matter of the receipt of Affidavit further and the report may be submitted within a month.</p>
