The matter was discussed and it was revealed that a similar kind of directions were issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court/High Court of MP in WP NO. 5559/2015 & the clarification was sought by WRC from NCTE - Hqrs. The NCTE Hqrs vide letter No. 64-183/2014/NCTE/Legal/3300 dated 03<sup>rd</sup> September 2015 had directed to RCs to comply with the directions of the Hon'ble Court.
