Recognition was granted for D.Ed. course with intake of 50 vide order dated 08.08.2007. On the directions received from Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh at Jabalpur in the matter of PIL filed by Sh. Pawan Dubey, inspection u/s 13 was conducted by NCTE HQrs. on 04.09.2014. Deficiency letter was issued by the NCTE HQrs. to the institution dated 13.04.2015 and the reply of the deficiency letter was received on 21.05.2015. On promulgation of NCTE Regulations, 2014, revised order was issued dated 30.05.2015 for B.Ed. course of two years duration with certain conditions for compliance. WRC in its 258th meeting held on 22-24 August, 2016 considered the deficiency letter dated 13.04.2015 and reply received dated 21.05.2015. As decided by the Committee Show-cause notice u/s 17 was issued dated 26.08.2016 related to built-up area and staff list and for regularization of shifting by the institution without obtaining prior permission and non-fulfillment of the prescribed norms concerning built up area and infrastructural facilities, submission of all documents and depositing the fee of Rs.1,50,000/- for shifting. Therein, it has been mentioned that the institution is recognized for 2 units of B.Ed. hence, the norms stated in Appendix-4 of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 apply. The staff required is 1+15. The institution has submitted an approved faculty list of only 1+7. The institution submitted reply to the SCN vide letter dated 03.09.2016 and stated that "language of the notice is bit confusing" and requested to clarify and inform on what points compliance has been sought.

				<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The matter was then placed in 259th meeting of WRC held on September 21-23, 2016. The Committee considered the reply of SCN received on 07.09.2016 and accordingly, institution was conveyed the decision of WRC vide letter dated 27.09.2016 with direction to submit representation along with supporting documents on the following within 15 days: <i>"... Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 26.08.2016, and the reply was received on 07.09.2016, the points of the reply are as under:- (i) Shifting: The institution has stated that it had shifted in the year 2006 and in spite of many reminders inspection was not carried out. The VT conducted Section 13 has not made any adverse observations on land and built up area. However, on perusal of the records it is seen that, while the land area is sufficient to run two courses, the built up area is less i.e. 3000 sq.mts. against the requirement of 3500 sq.mts. for two units of B.Ed. and one unit of D.Ed. course. The institution is required to exercise one of the two options: of either increasing the built up area by 500 sq. mt. or reducing the unit of B.Ed. course to one.</i> <i>(ii) Staff: The institution is required to appoint staff as per NCTE Regulations, 2014. The action is necessary since the Regulations have been framed under the supervision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court. The institution is advised to comply with the requirement immediately. It should submit the lists of the required staff members duly approved by the competent authorities within a period of one month. Hence, clarification be obtained from the institution on the above two grounds."</i> Reply to the show cause notice dated 27.09.2016 was submitted by the institution vide letter dated 11.10.2016 and stated that the institution has preferred writ petition no. 6397/2016 before the Gwalior Bench of Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh against the SCN and requested to keep the SCN in abeyance till the final decision of the Hon'ble Court. The above said Writ Petition was disposed off by the Hon'ble Court with the following directions- <i>"(i) That respondent-WCR for NCTE is directed to take a decision by considering the reply, Annexure P/7 filed by the petitioner to the impugned notice after providing reasonable opportunity of being heard to the petitioner in terms of the provisions of NCTE Act and relevant regulations.</i> <i>(ii) Till decision as aforesaid [vide (i)] is taken by the respondent-WCR, no coercive steps shall be taken against the petitioner/institution while implementing the rigors of the provisions of the Regulations 2014 under review.</i> <i>(iii) If aggrieved by the decision of WCR, the petitioner shall be free to avail the remedy of appeal before NCTE. With the above said directions, the petition stands disposed off."</i> The matter was placed in 263rd meeting of WRC held on November 25-27, 2016 and it was decided that the case be put up after receipt of final judgment of Hon'ble High Court of M.P. Bench at Gwalior.

				<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Another show cause notice dated 28.04.2017 was issued to the institution u/s 17(1) of the NCTE Act for compliance of conditions in light of NCTE Regulations 2014 as mentioned in the revised recognition order on the following grounds: <i>"... it has been found from the record that the institution has not submitted the following documents in compliance of the conditions mentioned in the revised order: (i) Original staff profile (1-Principal/HOD +15 faculties) for the session 2015-16 duly approved by the affiliating body. (ii) Originally notarized (not xerox) CLU, NEC, Building Plan and Building Completion Certificate in prescribed format."</i> • The matter was placed in 290th meeting of WRC held on March 21-23, 2018 and it was observed that WRC in its 263rd meeting decided that <i>"the case should be put up as soon as the final judgment of the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh, Bench at Gwalior is received. The decision of the court is now received. The court has asked the WRC to take a decision after considering the reply of the institution (dated 11.10.2016)"</i>... <i>"Compliance should be submitted by the institution within one month failing which recognition will be withdrawn."</i> • In compliance of the decision of the WRC in its 290th meeting, letter was issued to the institution dated 26.03.2018. • The reply of the institution dated 20.04.2018 was considered in 291st meeting of WRC held on 26-27 April 2018 and it was observed that <i>"the institution has enclosed a resolution for reducing the unit of B.Ed. from two to one and has also submitted staff profile. The institution needs to submit an additional FDR for Rs.4.00 lakhs. On receipt of the amount, order will be issued."</i> • Accordingly, a letter dated 04.05.2018 was issued to the institution for submitting additional FDR of Rs. 4.00 lakh. • No reply was received to the letter dated 04.05.2018. • The matter was placed in 303rd meeting of WRC held on 26-28 February, 2019 and the Committee decided to withdraw the recognition for B.Ed. programme from academic session 2019-2020 u/s 17(1) of NCTE Act, 1993. • Accordingly, withdrawal order dated 07.03.2019 was issued to the institution. • The institution filed an appeal on 26.03.2019. • The Appellate Committee remanded back the case to WRC vide order dated 10.06.2019 and directed the appellant institution to forward to WRC the original FDR for Rs.4.00 lakh within 15 days of receipt of orders of appeal. • WRC in its 312th meeting held on 27-29 January, 2020 considered the matter and show cause notice u/s 17 of NCTE Act 1993 be issued on the following grounds: • <i>"(i) The request made vide letter dated 20.04.2018 from the institution is for the reduction of one unit of B.Ed. without mentioning whether the proposed reduction in area is in old campus or in changed campus. 				<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Accordingly, SCN dated 13.02.2020 was issued to the institution.• The institution replied to the SCN vide letter dated 07.03.2020.• In 316th meeting of WRC held on 27-28 August & 4th September, 2020, the WRC considered the issue of institution which were granted recognition/permission by NCTE on rented premises and decided to issue Show Cause Notice u/s 17 of NCTE Act to all such institutions.• Accordingly, final Show Cause Notice dated 23.09.2020 was issued to the institution.• The institution replied to the show cause notice vide letter dated 19.10.2020.• The matter was placed in 336th meeting of WRC held on 24-25 March, 2021 and the Committee decided to issue show cause notice u/s 17 of NCTE Act 1993 to the institution for submission of BCC in prescribed format duly approved by the competent authority, Building plan duly approved by competent authority, processing fee of Rs.1,50,000/-.• The reply submitted by the institution is not traceable in the regulatory file.• Vide order of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P.(C) 5258/2020 dated 06.01.2021, "WRC is directed to decide the petitioner's application for restoration of recognition, which has been remanded to it by the order of the Appellate Committee dated 10.06.2019".• In consideration of documents available on record in light of NCTE Regulations, the Committee decides for issuance of restoration order to the institution with intake of one unit of 50 students for B.Ed. course until a fresh withdrawal order is issued to the institution.
