The institution filed Writ Petition Civil No. 555 of 2022 in the Supreme Court of India. The Hon'ble Supreme Court passed an order dated 29.08.2022. The directions of the order is as under:-

- (a) Issue a writ of mandamus or may any other appropriate writ or order direction to the Northern Regional Committee (NRC) of National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) (Respondent No. 1) to grant modified recognition for conducting D.El.Ed. course for one basic unit from the academic session 2023 -24, already granted by the Respondent students & Commence the said course from the present academic session 2022-23; and/or.
- (b) Issue a writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ or order or direction to the Respondent No. 2 Affiliating Body to grant affiliation to Petitioner No. 1 for conducing D.El.Ed. course for one basic unit from present Academic the 2022-23 Session with consequential direction Respondent No. 2 to include the name of the Petitioner institution in the list of colleges course for the present academic session 2022-23 permit the Petitioner institution to admit students from the present academic session 2022-23; and/or.
- (c) Issue a writ of mandamus or any other appropriate with or order or direction relaxing the cut-off date fixed by this Hon'ble Court in the Petitioner No.1 for the present Academic session 2022-23; and/or

(d) Pass such other orders as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the present case.

There is no dispute that the first found of counselling has not commenced in the State of Haryana. The complaint of the petitioner is that State of Haryana. The complaint of the petitioner is that though the recognition was sought for D.El.Ed. course for 50 seats, it has been granted only for the year 2023-24 namely the next academic year. This is despite there being no fault on their part, according to the petitioners.

We heard learned counsel for the petitioners as also learned counsel for the NCTE-Respondent No. and learned counsel for the State of Haryana. Though the learned counsel for the NCTE would point out that this court may not in this case grant the benefit of orders which have been passed and relied upon by the petitioners on the basis that the NCTE is in the process of discontinuing the course in question as per the Minutes of the 55th General Body Meeting of NCTE held on 14th July, 2022 in virtual mode, it is not in dispute that such a decision has not yet been taken.

The learned counsel for the petitioners, in facts, would point out the several institutions are already in operation. In such circumstances, we of the view that the relief should not be denied to the petitioners.

The writ petition stands disposed of as follows: -

1. There will be direction to the NCTE respondent No. 1 to grant modified recognition for conducting D.E.Ed. Course.

We direct the first respondent-NCTE to grant recognition for the D.El.Ed. course for on basic unit from the present academic year in place of 2022-2023 already granted by the first respondent. Such orders are to be given within a period of three days from today.

- 2. The second respondent will consider grant of affiliation to the petitioner No. 1 for conducing D.El.Ed. course within a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of copy of this orders after conducting any necessary inspection.
- 3. We make it clear that subject to the grant of affiliation and other requisite permissions being granted the petitioner would be entitled to admit the students for Academic Session 2022-23 as per the sanction granted by NCTE for the Academic Session 2023-24.
- 4. The cut-off date fixed by this court in Maa Vaishno Devi Mahila Mahavidyalaya v. State of Uttar Pradesh and Other (2013) 2 SCC 617, is extended in the facts of these case.
