





This fact should also be brought to the notice of the Hon'ble court.</p> <p>The institution is again directed to furnish the updated faculty list along with Bank statement of last 6 months confirming salary disbursement to the faculty.</p> <p>The affiliating university should also be informed accordingly.</p>

(C) 10869/2022	<p>The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time, were carefully considered by NRC in compliance of orders dated 20<sup>th</sup> July 2022 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, the Committee made the following observations:</p> <p>As per the decision of NRC in its 337<sup>th</sup> meeting withdrawal order was issued to the institution vide dated 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021 from the next academic session 2022-23.</p> <p>The NRC also noted that the appellate authority vide order dated 12/07/2022 has confirm the order of withdrawal issued by NRC dated 16/07/2021 but the institution mislead the Hon'ble Court about this confirmation of withdrawal and created impression that the appeal is pending. The Standing Counsel of NCTE also gave his consent to this fact without taking any instructions/confirmation from NCTE.</p> <p>The matter was considered by NRC in light of directions dated 20/07/2022 of Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P. (C) No. 10869/2022 and decided that the withdrawal order issued by NRC vide dated 16/07/2021 will take effect from the end of the academic session next following the date of communication of withdrawal order.</p>



The institution applied on 30.10.2009</li> <li>2. The recognition was refused by NRC vide order dated 31.1.2011. (175 meeting)</li> <li>3. Appeal also confirmed refusal vide order dated 26.4.2011</li> <li>4. Writ petition no. 1003072/2011 was filed by the institution in the Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad, Lucknow Bench. The Hon'ble court vide order dated 18/7/2022 directed NRC as under: "The matter is remanded to the respondents No. 3 (NRC) to pass the fresh order in terms of the fresh Rules after carrying out fresh inspection"</li> </ol> <p>In compliance of the directions of the court the NRC decided to direct the institution to submit fresh application in hardcopy as per existing NCTE Regulations 2014 amended from time to time. Along with fresh inspection fee Rs. 1.50 lakh in form of Demand Draft in favour of Member Secretary, NCTE, New Delhi.</p>

The institution was issued SCN dated 02/03/2015 as per decision of NRC in its 233<sup>rd</sup> meeting.</li> <li>2. The institution had preferred a Writ in the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana at Chandigarh vide CWP No. 3616/2015 and as per the directions of the Hon'ble Court, the NRC considered</li> </ol>

					<p>the matter and in its 239<sup>th</sup> meeting and made the following observations: -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The institution submitted representation dated 23/01/2015 along with a court order dated 09/01/2015 in which a list of the names of several institutions were mentioned but the name of the applicant institution was not included in this list. NRC inadvertently decided for processing the application of this institution and it amounted to be an error. NRC should not have processed this application.</li> <li>NRC had already rejected the application of the institution for B.Ed. course vide its rejection order dated 08/07/2014. Through this order, the institution was informed that "if the institution is not satisfied by the above order it can prefer an appeal to the Council (NCTE, New Delhi) within 60 days from the issue of this order". However, the institution did not make use of this opportunity within the stipulated time period.</li> </ul> <p>3. The decision of NRC was intimated to the Standing Counsel for NCTE at Chandigarh vide letter dated 09<sup>th</sup> July 2015.</p> <p>4. The institution approached the Hon'ble Court at Chandigarh for withdrawn of its petition and the Hon'ble Court vide order dated 09.09.2015 has passed the dismissing as withdrawn.</p> <p>5. Now the institution has preferred a Writ Petition in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi.</p> <p><b>The NRC decided that a Speaking order highlighting all the above facts be issued to the institution.</b></p>

Trinity Institute of Professional Studies was granted recognition for B.Ed. course at Dwarka, Delhi but without shifting premises, it has run B.Ed. course at Vikaspuri Campus instead of Dwarka Campus which is violation of NCTE norms.</li> <li>2. Affiliation was granted by SCERT, Delhi on the address of Vikaspuri, Delhi by letter No. F- 12(1) affi/ etc/EDDF/ seert/1000 dated 8/01/11.</li> <li>3. A letter of SCERT No. F. 1(2) Exam-cell 2021/ 584 dated 03/03/2021 was presented during meeting by Sri Mukesh Yadav, Govt. Representative, Delhi requesting that the said institute has been closed in 2016.</li> <li>4. Students who passed out from the Vikaspuri Campus are seeking recognition certificate through OTRMS to give this facility.</li> <li>5. NRC, in the interest of the students decided to accept the request of SCERT, Delhi and the matter should also be brought to the notice of NCTE Hqrs.</li> </ol> <p>The matter was again considered in NRC in its 337<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 18/06/2021 and observed as under:</p> <p>The Regional Director/ Convener of the NRC forwarded the matter to the NCTE Hqrs for further guidance in the matter. The matter was discussed in 337<sup>th</sup> meeting of NRC and decided as following:</p> <p><b>1. The matter is sub-judice and is pending in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi. Decision will be taken by NRC after the order of the Court.</b></p> <p>The content of the File No. F. NCTE-Regl018/1/2021-Regulations Section has been placed before the committee for perusal.</p> <p>The Committee considered the entire matter and after detailed deliberation decided to reconfirm its decision taken in 337<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> &amp; 9<sup>th</sup> July 2021.</p>

(ODL)		<p>The original file of the Institution along with other related documents, Directions of MoE u/s 29 of the NCTE Act, NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time, were carefully considered by NRC the Committee decided the following:</p> <p>The condition i.e. any requirement of minimum eligibility for admission to D.El.Ed programme i.e. 50% marks in class 12 to the extent that those who do not fulfil this requirement shall be allowed to take provisional admission for the programme of NIOS" mentioned in Clause III of para (4) and Clause II of Para (5) is hereby relaxed and substituted as "The minimum eligibility for admission to D.El.Ed programme shall be Pass in Senior Secondary (Class - 12")</p> <p>This relaxation is only for all the candidates who cleared the D.El.Ed within the timelines. The following documents are to be submitted in compliance of this provision: -</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Copies of Fixed Deposit Receipt of Endowment Fund &amp; Reserve Fund in the joint account of RD, NRC, NCTE &amp; Society authority along with Bank form "A" verified by the Manager of the Bank.</li> <li>2. Downloaded copies of the website of the institution with hyperlinks of the same as per provisions of 7(14) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014.</li> </ol> <p>List of faculty members duly approved by the affiliating body along with related documents. <b>The institution is required to appoint the faculty as per the provisions of the NCTE Regulations.</b></p>

#### Special instructions to issue advisory:

The committee observed that in many cases the counsels representing NRC in the Hon'ble Court tender their consent to dispose the matter on the very first date of hearing based on advance notice, without taking any instruction from NRC which are sometimes adverse to NRC. Therefore an advisory be issued that counsels should seek appropriate time from the Hon'ble Court to file appropriate response as per instructions of the NRC so that the true facts can be presented before the Hon'ble Court.
