At the outset, Regional Director, NRC welcomed the Chairperson and all other members, apprised of the urgent compliance of Court orders in O/o NRC in pursuance of the directions received from Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and High Court of Allahabad. 	The NRC is in receipt of the orders passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad. The common and primary issue involved in these matters pertain to the withdrawal of recognition of the B.ED course by NRC, NCTE on account of non-fulfilment of the regulatory requirements stipulated under the NCTE regulations, 2014 read with the provisions of NCTE Act.



	<p>It has been observed that the TEIs, whose recognition has been withdrawn, have approached the Hon'ble High Courts seeking interim relief against such withdrawal. In most of the writ petitions referred below, the Hon'ble Courts have been pleased to grant restoration of recognition to the petitioner institutions and have further permitted them to participate in the counselling process for the forthcoming academic session 2025-2026.</p> <p>In terms of the above, the NRC Committee observed as follows:-</p>		
1.	W.P.C 12429 OF 2025/UP-269	Nagarik Degree College, Jaunpur, Uttar Pradesh (Before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi)	B.ED

The Committee noted that the petitioner institution was granted recognition to run the B.ED course on 24.07. 2000. As per the requirement under the NCTE regulations, 2014, the institution was required to submit an affidavit stating its compliance with the prescribed conditions. The institution failed to submit the required affidavit. Accordingly, An SCN on 19.01.2021 followed by a final SCN on 16.06.2023 was issued. Thus, failure to reply to the SCNs attracted withdrawal of the recognition for the B.ED course on 25.07.2023. Accordingly, the matter was taken up in appeal where it was remanded back to NRC with a direction to verify the documents submitted from the concerned Institution. Meanwhile, the petitioner approached the Hon'ble Court seeking intervention against the withdrawal of recognition.

Decision of NRC

In compliance of directions passed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide its order dated 22/08/2025 in W.P. (C) 12429/2025 and after due consideration, it was resolved to pass an order of restoration of recognition in favor of the said petitioner institution for B.ED course with an annual intake of 60 students and for allowing the said Institute to participate in the ongoing counselling for the academic session 2025-2026. However, the file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee. The Committee found that the Institution has not submitted the replies of the earlier Show cause notices issued on 19/01/2021 and 16/06/2023 and is still deficient on several grounds. The Committee considered the matter of the institution and observed that the Show Cause Notice be issued to the Institution on the following grounds under the Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993 :

- Whether the institution has submitted affidavit to NRC for issuance of Revised Recognition order. If yes, please submit proof of the same and if not, then furnish reasons of non- submission of the affidavit to NRC.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The institution has to submit whether they had submitted compliance with the conditions prescribed under Regulations, 2014 (Enhanced FDRs, Revised staff profile, additional built up area etc) for consideration and decision of the Committee without issuance of revised recognition order and after submission of affidavit from the list attached. If the institution does not fall in any of above two categories, then institution is required to inform NRC about their status in respect of revised recognition order compliance matters. <p>In view of the above, the Northern Regional Committee decided to issue an order of restoration of recognition in favor of petitioner institution for B.Ed. Course with an annual intake of 60 students and also to issue a show cause notice on the above grounds.</p>			
2.	W.P.C 12420 of 2025/ U.P-173	Shri Ganesh Rai Post Graduate College, Dhobi, Jaunpur-222149, Uttar Pradesh (Before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi)	B.ED
<p>The Committee noted that the recognition was granted to the institution for B.ED course on 18.02.1988. An SCN was issued to the concerned TEI on 19.01.2021 for noncompliance to NCTE, Regulations, 2014 followed by another SCN on 16.06.2023. Since, no replies have been received by NRC-accordingly, withdrawal order was issued to the institution on 08.08.2023. The matter was taken up in appeal which was remanded back to NRC with a direction to verify the documents submitted in appeal from the affiliating university/authority concerned. The institution has submitted reply as per the directions contained in the appeal order to NRC. Meanwhile, the petitioner approached the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi seeking intervention against the withdrawal of recognition.</p> <p><u>Decision of NRC</u></p> <p>In compliance of directions passed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide its order dated 22/08/2025 in W.P. (C) 12420/2025 and after due consideration, it was resolved to pass an order of restoration of recognition in favor of the petitioner institution for recognition of the B.ED course with an annual intake of 90 students and for allowing the said Institute to participate in the ongoing counselling for the academic session 2025-2026. However, the file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee. The Committee observed that the institution has not submitted reply to the first SCN dated 19/01/2021 and the Final SCN was issued to the institution on 16/06/2023. The committee considered the reply dated 4/7/2023 and observed that the Institute is still deficient on the following grounds and Show Cause Notice may be issued to the Institution on the following grounds:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The institution has submitted a representation dated 04/07/2023 without any documentary evidence and thus the Institution may submit the documentary evidence. Whether the institution has submitted affidavit to NRC for issuance of Revised Recognition order. If yes, please submit proof of the same and if not, then furnish reasons of non- submission of the affidavit to NRC. The institution has to submit whether they had submitted compliance with the conditions prescribed under Regulations, 2014 (Enhanced FDRs, Revised staff profile, additional built-up area etc) for consideration and decision of the Committee without issuance of revised recognition order and after submission of affidavit from the list attached. If the institution does not fall in any of above two categories, then institution is required to inform NRC about their status in respect of revised recognition order compliance matters. <p>In view of the above, the Northern Regional Committee decided to issue an order of restoration of recognition in favor of petitioner institution for B.Ed. Course with an annual intake of 90 students and also to issue a Show cause notice on the above grounds.</p>			
3.	W.P.C 6100 of 2025/U.P-2613	Balmukund Bazari College of Education, Near Raunkata Railway Station, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (Before the Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad)	B.ED
<p>The Committee observed that the recognition was granted to the institution for B.ED course on 29.02. 2008. The institution has not filled PAR for the academic session 2021-2022 & 2022-2023. The institution has submitted the reply to SCN in this regard but the reply being unsatisfactory and PAR also not filled resulted in withdrawal of recognition on 08.06.2025. The Institution filed writ petition before the Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad wherein the Hon'ble Court has given directions to the petitioner to file fresh representation before NRC within a period of one week from 26.06.2025. The petitioner has further filed a contempt petition on 21.08.2025 in this regard.</p> <p>Decision of NRC</p>

It was observed that the NRC is unable to locate the representation submitted by the petitioner institute. After due deliberations, it is decided that the representation shall be sought afresh from the petitioner within a period of one week from today through a formal letter to be issued by the concerned for further necessary action.

Decision of NRC

In compliance of the order dated 26.08.2025 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P.(C)11742 of 2025 and after thorough deliberations, the following decisions were taken:

- An order for restoration of recognition of the institution in respect of one unit of 50 seats for B.Ed. course be issued.
- Further, the name of the petitioner institution be included in the ongoing counselling for academic session 2025-26 in respect of a unit of 50 seats and a public notice be issued in this regard and the status of the petitioner institution be updated on the website thereby intimating all concerned, including state authority, affiliating body and counselling authorities that the petitioner has been permitted to participate in counselling and admit students for academic session 2025-2026.
- It was further, resolved to send the file of the petitioner institution to the Administration/Headquarters for initiating a process of internal enquiry regarding the forgery of recognition order/corrigendum and tampering with official website of NCTE.
- In addition to the above, NRC further decided to issue a fresh show cause notice to the petitioner institution with regard to issuance of fake recognition order and corrigendum, as mentioned in the withdrawal order dated July 17, 2025 issued by the NRC.

The above may be issued accordingly.

The Committee noted that the petitioner institution was granted recognition for running the B.ED course. The institution subsequently failed to comply with the regulatory requirements of NCTE. Accordingly, two show cause notices were issued to the said TEI. In view of non-compliance, the recognition to run the B.ED course was withdrawn. The matter was taken up in Appeal Committee, wherein the case was remanded back to NRC for reconsideration. Meanwhile, the petitioner approached the Hon'ble Court seeking intervention against the withdrawal of recognition.

Decision of NRC

In compliance of directions passed by Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide its order dated 22/08/2025 in W.P. (C) 12049/2025 and after due consideration it was resolved to pass an order of restoration in favor of the petitioner institutions for B.ED course with an annual intake of 100 and for allowing the said Institute to participate in the ongoing counselling for the academic session 2025-2026. The file of the institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations, SOP, guidelines issued from time to time were placed before the Northern Regional Committee and the Committee observed that the Institution is found to still deficient on several grounds. The recognition was granted to the institution namely A.R. Institution of Management and Technology, Plot/Khasra No. 185/4, 186/3 Village/Town Shalarpur Jalalapur, Post office- Medical, Tehsil/ Taluka-Meerut, Town City-Meerut, State-UP, District- Meerut (UP), Pin Code-250002 for conducting B.Ed. course of two-year duration with an annual intake 100 students vide order dated 24/02/2016. As per the decision of NRC Show Cause Notices were issued to the institution on 07/02/2024 and 09.5.2024. The institution had not submitted the replies to Show Cause Notices. The Committee observed that the documents may be sought from the Institution under Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993 and undertake verification of affiliation and functioning of the said TEI on the following grounds:

1. The institute submitted approval of faculty issued by the CCS University in 2015. The institute is required to submit the latest approval.
2. Administrative and professional staff have not been appointed as required under clause 5.3 of Appendix 4 of NCTE Regulations, 2014.
3. The institute did not submit bank statements duly certified the bank in respect of Account of college and all individual faculty and other staff for last 3 months as required under clause 10(2) of NCTE Regulations, 2014 showing disbursement of salary through bank account.
4. The institution has not submitted additional information as per Clause 7(14), 8(6) 10 (3) of the NCTE Regulation 2014 and Clause 2 (C) of the NCTE Regulations dated 28.04.2017.

5.	The Institute did not submit the notarized/ certified copies of latest NEC, CLU, land documents, fire Safety and differently abled friendly building certificate.		
6.	The institute did not submit details of FDRs with Form 'A' towards Endowment and Reserve Funds.		
7.	The institution is required to submit a copy of the affiliation orders of the last three years with intake capacity issued by the concerned affiliating body for each course being run by the institution / society.		
In view of the above, the Northern Regional Committee decided to issue an order of restoration of recognition in favor of petitioner institution for B.Ed. Course with an annual intake of 100 students and also to issue a show cause notice on the above grounds.
