ORDER-

WHEREAS the appeal of Baihata Chariali B.Ed. College, Kamrup, Assam dated the 01/02/2005 is against the Order No. ERC/7-51(ER-51.7.4)/2004/3604 dated the 09/12/2004 of the Eastern Regional Committee, withdrawing recognition for conducting B.Ed. course on the ground that the institutions does not pay salary to its teaching and non-teaching staff as prescribed by State Govt./University whereas the latest NCTE norms for Secondary Teacher Education Programme provides that the academic and other staff of the institution (including part-time staff) should be paid such salary as may be prescribed by the concerned State Government/University from time to time.

AND WHEREAS the Correspondent, Baihata Chariali B.Ed. College (hereinafter referred to as the appellant), preferred an appeal dated the 01/02/2005 to the National Council for Teacher Education, New Delhi (hereinafter referred to as the Council) under Section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the said Order.

AND WHEREAS Mr. Phulesuvar Dhing, President & Mr. Madan. Ch. Deka, Member, Baihata Chariali B.Ed. College, Kamrup, Assam presented the case of the appellant institution on 26/4/2005. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that the new Governing Body of the College constituted on 16.2.2005, had decided to pay monthly salary to the employees by cheque with effect from Feb, 2005. It was further submitted that the reconstituted Governing Body has also decided to pay monthly salary to the part time lecturer @ Rs.1,000 per month as per the practice in vogue in other colleges under Guwahati University. It was also stated that the leaching and non teaching staff of the college were paid salary as per State Government's pay scale as was approved ealier and it was committed that pay scale would further be revised in terms of revision effected by the state govt. It was also submitted that there was no fixed pattern of pay scale for teachers training institutions in the state of Assam and different institutions were following different pay packages for its employees.

AND WHEREAS after taking note of the written submissions as well as the commitment of the institute to pay its employees as per State Govt. pay scale, it was decided that the orders dated 09.12.2004 passed by the ERC, Bhubaneshwar be set aside.

AND NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby reverses the Order appealed against
