ORDER

22 JUL 2005

WHEREAS, the institution, namely, Shree Ram Adarsh Mahavidyalaya, Village Mubarakpur – Maraila, Ambedkarnagar Nagar (U.P.) has made an application to Northern Regional Committee (for short NRC) of National Council for Teacher Education (for short NCTE) under Section 14 (1) of NCTE Act, 1993 seeking recognition and to start teacher training programme of B.Ed. from academic session 2004-2005 and the same is received in the office of NRC on 31.12.2003.

2. The inspection of the institution was made on 08.03.2005 by an inspection team of experts constituted by NRC. During inspection, the team noted certain deficiencies in respect of accommodation, library, laboratory etc. as required for proper functioning of the institution for the B.Ed. Course, and the same were intimated to the institution vide communication dated 19 May 2005, providing it a reasonable opportunity for making a written representation. In pursuance thereof, the institution made representation vide communication dated 08.06.2005.

3. AND WHEREAS, the said representation was placed before the NRC in its 93rd meeting held on 27, 28th June, 2005, wherein the Committee after consideration of the entire matter, including inspection report of the experts and the deficiencies pointed out therein, the representation made by the institution and all other relevant documents on the file and being satisfied that the institution does not fulfill the requirements of norms and standards as laid down by the regulations made from time, passed an order refusing recognition to the institution to start B.Ed. course.

4. AND THEREFORE, in terms of above decision of NRC, the application of Shree Ram Adarsh Mahavidyalaya, Village Mubarakpur – Maraila, Ambedkar Nagar (U.P.) seeking recognition to start B.Ed. course is refused under section 14 (3) (b) of the NCTE Act, 1993.

5. Consequently, the institution shall not admit any student in B.Ed. course and the examining body shall cancel the affiliation of the institution and shall not hold examination, whether provisional or otherwise for the B.Ed. course if conducted by the said institution unless the institution is granted permission for the said course by the NRC/NCTE.

6. In accordance with section 17 (4) of the NCTE Act, 1993, the qualification in teacher education, namely B.Ed., obtained pursuant to such course or training in the above institution shall not be treated as valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any School, College or other educational body aided by the Central Government or any State Government.
