ORDER

WHEREAS, the Institution, namely, **Swatantra Girls Degree College, Sneh Nagar, Alambagh, Lucknow (UP)** has made an application to Northern Regional Committee under section 15(1) of NCTE Act, 1993 to seek permission to start new course of BTC from academic session 2004-2005 vide covering letter dated Nil and the same was received in the office of NRC on 30.01.2004.

2. The Institution was inspected on 15/17.07.2004 by an inspection team of expert constituted by NRC. The inspection team noted certain deficiencies in its report submitted and the same was considered by NRC in its 87th meeting held on 28th - 29th January 2005 alongwith the original file of the Institution.

3. After careful perusal of the file, inspection Report of the experts and other related documents, the committee, in the above meeting, being satisfied that the Institution did not fulfill the requirements laid down in sub clause (a) of section 15(3) of NCTE Act, 1993 decided that the Institution be given a reasonable opportunity for making representation drawing its attention with following deficiencies existed vis-à-vis NCTE Norms:

- **The Institution has not provided Reserved Fund.**
- **Fixed pay has been proposed for the staff, which is not as per NCTE Norms.**
- **Qualification of the staff could not be verified by the Inspection Team.**

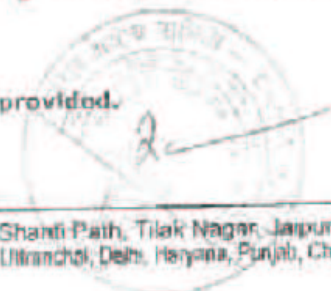
Consequently, as per above decision, letter no. F.NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP 1443/2004/13084 dated 10.02.2005 was issued communicating the above deficiencies to the Institution with an opportunity to make representation within one month before passing an order refusing permission to the new course of BTC.

4. The institution submitted its written representation vide letter No. Nil dated 17.03.2005. The said representation was placed before the NRC in its 89th meeting held on 21st March, 2005 wherein the Committee, after consideration of the entire matter including the deficiencies referred to above, being of the opinion that the Institution does not fulfill the requirements relating to norms and standards laid down for the same, passed an order refusing permission to the Institution for the new course of BTC. The said decision was communicated to the Institution vide order No. NRC/NCTE/F-7/UP-1443/2004/550-558 dated 21.04.2005.

5. AND WHEREAS, the Institution preferred an appeal to the Appellate Authority, whereby the Appellate Authority, NCTE HQs., New Delhi remanded back the case for causing another inspection particularly to verify that duly qualified faculty has been identified vide order no. F.No.89-97/2005 Appeal/4/127 dated 28.09.2005.

The case was further processed at the office level and inspection was got conducted on 09.12.2005. The whole case with VTR and other documents were considered by NRC, wherein NRC decided to refuse application seeking grant of recognition for BTC Course on account of the following deficiencies:-

- > **The institution is running B.Ed., B.Sc., B.A. etc courses in the same premises, the space shown for proposed BTC is already being used for other courses.**
- > **Educational journals are not subscribed.**
- > **Furniture is inadequate.**
- > **Staff for existing programme as well as proposed programme are not in position.**
- > **Psychological lab is not available.**
- > **Access to Internet not provided.**
- > **Accommodation in library room is inadequate.**
- > **Reserve fund for the proposed BTC programme not provided.**

6. If the institution contravenes any of the above conditions or any of the provisions of the NCTE Act, Rules, Regulations and/or order made or issued there under, the Regional Committee may withdraw the recognition under the provisions of Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993.
