ORDER

WHEREAS, the Institution, namely, **Krishak Mahavidyalaya, Ukraun, Baherabad, Ghazipur (UP)** has made an application to Northern Regional Committee under section 15(1) of NCTE Act, 1993 to seek permission to start new course of BTC from academic session 2004-2005 vide covering letter dated 24.01.2004 and the same was received in the office of NRC on 27.01.2004.

2. The Institution was inspected on 29.10.2004 by an inspection team of expert constituted by NRC. The inspection team noted certain deficiencies in its report submitted and the same was considered by NRC in its 85th meeting held on 4th - 5th November 2004 alongwith the original file of the institution.

3. After careful perusal of the file, inspection Report of the experts and other related documents, the committee, in the above meeting, being satisfied that the Institution did not fulfill the requirements laid down in sub clause (a) of section 15(3) of NCTE Act, 1993 decided that the Institution be given a reasonable opportunity for making representation drawing its attention with following deficiencies existed vis-à-vis NCTE Norms:

- **Accommodation for classrooms, Hall and laboratories not provided at all.**
- **Accommodation for Faculty Room, Office Room and Store Room not provided.**
- **Sports facilities not provided.**
- **Multiple sets of apparatus not provided in Science lab.**
- **Equipments for Science lab not provided at all.**
- **Instruments and simple experiments related to educational psychology not provided.**
- **Facilities in the psychology lab are not adequately provided.**
- **Facilities for use and accessing of digital learning resources not provided.**
- **Computers are not provided.**
- **Access to Internet not provided.**
- **Equipments for the Educational Technology lab not provided.**
- **Accommodation for library not provided.**
- **Books and journals not provided at all in the library.**

4. Consequently as per above decision, letter no. F.NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP-1399/2004/10548 dated 11.11.2004 was issued communicating the above deficiencies to the Institution with an opportunity to make representation within one month before passing an order refusing permission to the new course of BTC.

5. AND WHEREAS, The institution submitted its written representation vide letter No. Nil dated 10.12.2004. The said representation was placed before the NRC in its 86th meeting held on 16th - 17th December 2004 wherein the Committee decided to defer the decision based on the interim orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

6. The matter was again placed in the 87th meeting of NRC held on 28th - 29th January 2005, whereby the Regional Committee decided that a second inspection may be conducted to verify the facts about removal of deficiencies mentioned in the affidavit submitted by the Institution. As per decision of NRC, second inspection of the institution was conducted on 19.07.2005.

7. The VTR was placed before the NRC at its 94th meeting held on 21st – 23rd July 2005. After careful perusal of the file, inspection Report of the experts and other related documents, the committee, in the above meeting, being satisfied that the Institution did not fulfill the requirements laid down in sub-clause (a) of section 15(3) of NCTE Act, 1993 decided that a third inspection of the institution be conducted. As per decision of NRC the second inspection of the institution was conducted on 11.12.2005.

8. The VTR was placed before the NRC at its 101st meeting held on 22nd – 24th February 2006. On careful perusal of the original file of the institution, Original Visiting Team Report, reply received from the institution, other related documents, Act of NCTE 1993, Regulations and guidelines of NCTE published from time to time laid on the table of the committee, the Regional Committee noted that the following deficiencies still persists: -

- **Reserved Fund for the proposed BTC course not provided at all.**
- **Website of the institution is not launched as per para 7(6) of NCTE Regulation dated 13th January 2006**
- **Affidavit on Rs. 100 Stamp Paper not submitted as per para 8(6) of NCTE Regulations dated 13th January 2006.**

9. Accordingly, a notice dated 14.03.2006 was issued to the institution and the institution has submitted its reply vide letter dated 24.04.2006 alongwith an affidavit. The matter was placed in 104th meeting of NRC held on 15th – 17th July 2006 wherein the Regional Committee noted that the Reserve Fund was not provided for the proposed new course and therefore, NRC decided to refuse grant of recognition for the proposed BTC course and close the file.

10. AND THEREFORE, in terms of above decision of NRC, the application of Krishak Mahavidyalaya, Ukraun, Baherabad, Ghazipur (UP) seeking permission for the new course of BTC is refused under section 15(3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993.

11. Consequently, the institute shall not admit any students in BTC Course and other concerned body(s) shall not hold examination, whether provisional or otherwise for the BTC Course if conducted by the said institution unless the institution is granted permission of the said course by the NRC / NCTE.

12. In accordance with section 17(4) of the NCTE Act, 1993 **the qualification in teacher education, namely BTC, obtained pursuant to such course or training in the above institution shall not be treated as valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any school, college or other educational body aided by the Central Government or any State Government.**
