ORDER

WHEREAS, in terms of section 14(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993, **Ram Murti Devi Girls College, Khasra No.506, Khata No.209, Vill. Shakoopur, Post-Mohiuddinpur, Distt. Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh** had submitted an application to the Northern Regional Committee of NCTE for grant of recognition for starting B.Ed. Course of One year duration with an annual intake of 100 (One hundred Only) students on 10.03.2008.

AND WHEREAS, the inspection of the institution under section 14 was conducted on 17.10.2008.

AND WHEREAS, the original file of the institution, VTR, other related documents, VCD, Act of NCTE, 1993 Regulations and guidelines of NCTE published from time to time were considered by the committee in its 137th Meeting held on 28th February & 1st March, 2009 and committee decided to issue Show cause notice before refusing the recognition to the institution. Accordingly, Show-cause notice issued to the institution on 12.03.2009 on the following grounds:-

- o Land is in the name of society but not in the name of Institution.
- o CLU is not enclosed

AND WHEREAS, reply received from the institution along with all other related documents, Act of NCTE, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines of NCTE published from time to time were considered by the committee in its 139th meeting held from April 10-12, 2009 and the committee decided to issue letter of intent prior to recognition under clause 7(9) of Regulation 2007. Accordingly, Letter of intent prior to recognition issued to the institution on 02.05.2009.

AND WHEREAS, the original file of the institution, reply of the institution submitted in compliance of letter of intent issued under clause 7(9) along with all other related documents, affidavits, Act of NCTE, 1993, Regulations and Guidelines of NCTE published from time to time, etc. were considered by NRC in its 142nd Meeting held from June 14-16, 2009 and the committee directed the Institution to submit clarification. Accordingly, Clarification letter was issued to the institution on 25.06.2009 on the following points:-

- o The selected Principal is not qualified.

AND WHEREAS, the matter was taken up in the 145th Meeting held on July 26-28, 2009 and it was decided to refuse recognition. Accordingly, refusal order issued to the institution on 28.08.2009 on the following grounds:-

- o The reply of the Institution has not been received in the stipulated time.

AND WHEREAS, the above said Institution, thereafter, preferred an appeal to the NCTE, New Delhi under section 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993 against the aforesaid decision. After perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, affidavit, VT, Report and considering oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Council reached the conclusion that there was adequate ground to accept the appeal set aside NRC's decision taken in the 145th Meeting held on July 26-28, 2009 and remanded back the case to NRC vide order dated 06.11.2009 to issue formal recognition order after verifying the qualification of the Principal.

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AND WHEREAS, as per direction of the Appellate Authority, the qualification and experience of the Principal appointed by the institution has been scrutinized by NRC in its 175th Meeting held on December 30-31, 2010 and found the documents in order. Hence, NRC decided to issue recognition to the institution for B.Ed. course under clause 7(11) of NCTE Regulations 2009 and in terms of section 14(3)(a) of NCTE Act, 1993 with an annual intake of 100 students subject to usual terms and conditions.

AND WHEREAS, the NCTE has issued letter No.48-6/PT-III/ NCTE (N&S) dated 31.08.2010 in which it was stated that the matter regarding issue of recognition order under clause 7(9) or 7(11) of NCTE Regulations to the institution which were found eligible for grant of recognition order on merit but where order could not be issued due to the ban imposed by the NCTE on 26th July, 2009 has been considered by the Council and it is clarified that such pending orders now be issued. This is due to the consideration that the present ban is only on fresh receipt of application for the academic session 2011-2012 and therefore the old pending cases are to be disposed on merit without any reference to the ban.

AND WHEREAS, the above letter of NCTE, Headquarter was considered by NRC in its 166th Meeting held on 9th September, 2010 and NRC decided that the recognition order under section 7 (11) of NCTE, Regulations in all such pending cases where NRC or Council (NCTE) had decided to grant recognition under section 7 (11) of NCTE Regulations be issued from the session 2010-2011 subject to the following condition:-

- The admission of students shall be made only after affiliation by the examining body before the commencement of the academic session and the admission of students shall be completed well before the cut off date prescribed by the examining body for the academic session 2010-2011 failing which the recognition will be effective from the academic session 2011-2012.
- Formal orders for recognition/permission will operate for 2010-2011 only if the requirement of 180 teaching days in the session is fulfilled as per calendar of the University/Affiliating Body failing which the recognition will be effective from the academic session 2011-2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers vested under Section 14(3) (a) of the NCTE Act, 1993, the Northern Regional Committee hereby grants recognition to **Ram Murli Devi Girls College, Khasra No.506, Khata No.209, Vill. Shakoorpor, Post-Mohiuddinpur, Distt. Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh** for conducting B.Ed Course of Secondary (Level) of one year duration with an annual intake of 100 (One hundred Only) students from the academic session 2010-2011 under clause 7(11) of NCTE Regulations subject to the following conditions:-

- The admission of students shall be made only after affiliation by the examining body before the commencement of the academic session and the admission of students shall be completed well before the cut off date prescribed by the examining body for the academic session 2010-2011 failing which the recognition will be effective from the academic session 2011-2012.
- Formal orders for recognition/permission will operate for 2010-2011 only if the requirement of 180 teaching days in the session is fulfilled as per calendar of the University/Affiliating Body failing which the recognition will be effective from the academic session 2011-2012.
- The institution shall, within one month of the receipt of recognition order, convert the endowment fund and reserve fund accounts into joint accounts to be operated along with an officer of the Northern Regional Committee.
- The institution shall comply with the various other norms and standards prescribed in the NCTE regulations, as amended from time to time.
- The institution shall make admission only after it obtains affiliation from the examining body in terms of clause 8(12) of the NCTE Regulations, 2007 notified on 10-12-2007.

Further, the recognition is subject to fulfillment of all such other requirements as may be prescribed under relevant norms and standards of NCTE for other regulatory bodies like UGC, the State Government etc, wherever applicable.

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The institution shall submit to the Regional Committee a Self-Appraisal Report at the end of each academic year along the statement of annual accounts duly audited by a Chartered Accountant together with statement of T.D.S. in respect of the salary paid to the staff. A copy of the format is enclosed with the order.

If the institution contravenes any of the above conditions or the provisions of the NCTE Act, Rules, Regulations and Orders made or issued there under, the Regional Committee shall withdraw the recognition as stipulated provisions of Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act.

The institution shall maintain & update its Web-site as per provisions of NCTE Regulations and always display following as mandatory disclosure: -

- Copy of the Application Form
- Land and Building Particulars
- Staff Profile
- Recognition letter
- Information for having fulfilled the norms & standard and other required conditions.

In case if the land is in the name of the Society, you must transfer the land within six month in the name of the institution failing to which action shall be initiated to withdraw the recognition. It shall be essential on the part of the institution concerned to get the needful done in this regard and intimate the respective Regional Committee along with the new land document within the stipulated time.
