Pursuant to the 238th meeting held on 9th January 2015, the NRC issued the SCN dated 26.05.2015, wherein the requirement of NOC was one of them. The NRC again considered the matter in its 241st meeting held from 3rd to 7th August 2015 decided to issue SCN to the institution and issued the SCN dated 08.09.2015 wherein the requirement of NOC and Composite institution were present. The institution replied to the SCN which was received in the office of the NRC on 25.06.2025. The NRC in its 246th meeting held from 9th to 12th December 2015 decided to refuse the recognition/permission to the institution u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act 1993 on the ground of non-submission of NOC and proof of composite institution. Pursuant to the 246th meeting of the NRC held from 9th to 12th December 2015, the NRC issued the refusal order dated 28.12.2015.

Being aggrieved by the Refusal Order issued by the NRC dated 28.12.2015, the Respondent institution filed a Writ Petition no. 3417/2018 before this Hon'ble Court. The Ld. Single Judge of this Hon'ble Court vide Order dated 12.04.2018 in W.P.(C) No. 3417/2018 directed the NRC to reconsider the institute's application for recognition of its B.Ed. course in accordance with law within four months from the date of Order.</p> <p>6. The NRC in its 285th meeting held from 5th to 8th June 2018 decided to constitute a Visiting Team (VT) in order to ascertain & scrutinize the essential documents such as land documents, building plan, CLU, BCC, Non-Encumbrance Certificate and all required documents in original and verify its authenticity with reference to NCTE Regulations, 2014 and mention the status/position of these documents. In addition, the VT shall verify the infrastructure and instructional facilities created by the institution so as to assess the preparedness of the institution as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014.</p> <p>7. The NRC in its 306th meeting held from 28th to 30th August 2019 decided to issue a SCN to the respondent institution on the ground of non-submission of NOC. Pursuant to the 306th meeting held from 28th to 30th August 2019, the NRC issued the SCN dated 18.09.2019 to the institution.</p> <p>8. The institution filed Writ Petition no. 4705/2021 before this Hon'ble Court. The Ld. Single Judge of this Hon'ble Court vide Order dated 15.04.2021 in W.P.(C) No. 4705/2021 ("Impugned Order") directed the NRC to reconsider the Respondent's application for recognition of its B.Ed. course in accordance with law within eight weeks from the date of the Order.</p> <p>9. The NRC in its 336th (Virtual) Meeting held on 18th and 21st June 2021 decided to issue a SCN to the respondent institution to rectify certain deficiencies and accordingly the NRC issued the SCN dated 24.06.2021 to the respondent institution, wherein the requirement of NOC was not one of them.</p> <p>10.
