 - i) The matter related to transition of 4-year B.El.Ed. programme (Appendix-3) of NCTE Regulations, 2014 was discussed in detail and it was observed by the Committee that the Norms & Standards for 4-year ITEP for Foundation, Preparatory, Middle and Secondary stages are already notified by the NCTE *vide* Gazette Notification dated 26.10.2021.Therefore, the Committeedecided that this course be considered for transition into ITEP from the academic session 2026-27.
