Agenda Item No.1:

Confirmation of the Minutes of the 44th Meeting of the Council (NCTE), and reporting by Chairperson, NCTE on Action Taken and other Initiatives.

The minutes of the 44th meeting of the Council (NCTE) was held on 17.03.2015 is placed before the Council for its confirmation (**Annexure-A**, **pp. 2-6**). A report by Chairperson, NCTE on Action Taken and Other Initiatives will present before the Council.



Minutes of the 44th meeting of the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) held on 17th March, 2015

The 44th meeting of NCTE was held on 17th March, 2015 at India International Centre (IIC), New Delhi at 10:30 am. The list of participants is given in Annexure-1.

The Chairperson welcomed all the members, and appraised about the 5 items in agenda for this meeting: post-facto recognition; status on appeals; extension of deadline for pending applications, public notice for 2016-17 session; and confirmation of minutes of 43rd meeting of the Council.

Item No. 1: Consideration the Report of the Committee constituted by NCTE to suggest further course of action in respect of Universities / Institutions which have made admissions to the teacher education course(s) without proper recognition / permission from NCTE

The Chairperson invited Professor Kamlesh Joshipura, the Chairman of the Committee (on Post-Facto Recognition and other items on anomalies in respect of universities) and its member Shri Shardindu (former CP, NCTE) to brief about the recommendations brought out by the Committee for consideration and discussion.

Prof. Kamlesh Joshipura expressed his sincere gratitude to the Chairperson for constitution of this Committee. The 8-member Committee had the following three terms of references to examine and suggest action points.

- 1. A University which had submitted applications without prior permission for recognition from NCTE.
- 2. Universities which had made admissions without prior permission from NCTE (after submission of application to NCTE).
- 3. Universities where curriculum had been approved by the Standing Committee on Innovative Programmes and pending final decision from Regional Committee made admission by and large.
- 4. He added that as far as methodology was concerned, the following were taken into consideration;
- (a) NCTE Act 1993; Rules and Regulation
- (b) JVC Report
- (c) Hon'ble Supreme Court verdicts passed from time to time.

The Committee had made basically three recommendations for consideration (of the Council) in respect of 19 institutions that it had examined:

- (i) Place the recommendation to the NCTE Council to consider post-facto recognition of public institutions as one time measure in public interest.
- Refer the cases to the Government of India to bring an ordinance to this effect. (ii)
- Setting up of a separate Standing Committee for formulation of Regulations on (iii) Innovative Programmes, including norms and standards.

And also that, following this one-time approval for national interest, NCTE should not entertain any such proposal in future.

While putting on record the services rendered by the chair and members of the Committee, CP, NCTE opened the report for further deliberations. After long discussions, the following were arrived at:

- (i) It is not important to look into individual cases as much to look into if post-facto recognition be considered as one-time measure in public interest.
- (ii) Though no data are available on how many other institutions may be running teacher education programme without approval from NCTE, it may not be feasible nor desirable to go for such a search.
- (iii) Suggesting the Government of India to bring an ordinance on post-facto recognition of the considered cases is not viable to be pursued.
- (iv) Since the case put up for post-facto recognition especially for public institutions is important (in view of the constraints to be faced or being faced by thousands of graduates from these institutions), NCTE must consult senior lawyer/additional solicitor general to take legal opinion on how to further proceed on this; and place the legal opinion along with the Report to the Council for further consideration.

Further, the Regulations on Innovative Programmes (including clear specification of diversified innovativeness that teacher education programmes can have) should be expeditiously formulated and put to Council for approval.

Item No. 2: Submission of the status of disposal of Appeals by Appeal Committee during January, 2014 to December, 2014

The status on appeals was present by the Member Secretary, NCTE. While the status was noted, concern was expressed on: i) why so many cases from Regional Committees are referred to Appeal Committee, and ii) why sizeable number of cases are remanded by the Appeal Committee to Regional Committees. This aspect needed to be looked into; and the Appeals Committee needed to be reconstituted with members from the Council as also those who have knowledge on legal aspects and of regulations.

Item No. 3: Reporting on extension of time limit from 3rd March, 2015 to 31st May, 2015 for pending existing applications for the year 2015-2016

The extension of deadlines for pending applications by the Hon'ble Supreme Court was noted; and it was suggested to leave to the Regional Committees to follow various deadlines, but complete the process by May 31, 2015 as the deadline.

Item No. 4: Reporting on Public Notice issued inviting applications for grant of recognition for the session 2016-2017.

The public notice on new applications (except those banned by respective state governments/UTs for 2016-17) was noted. It was underlined that, besides state governments recommendations, the demand-supply data/status be updated; and that each teacher education institution be asked to put on its website year-wise data on how many from the institutions have passed TET/CTET over a period of time.

Item No. 5: Confirmation of the Minutes of 43rd Meeting of the Council held on 28.01.2015

The Minutes of the 43rd meeting of the Council were confirmed.

Under any other item, the issue of allocating two faculty positions for Visual Arts and Performing Arts to other courses to be recruited in composite institution was raised by Professor Poonam Batra and Professor Krishna Kumar. It was decided that since this was not a listed item and that since the cases needs to have some more facts and justifications, NCTE may bring an item on this subsequently if it considers essential. However, Regulations 2014 does not allow shifting of faculty positions and recruitments from one area of study to another area within a programme, except that faculty in each area can be used flexibly in a composite institution.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks.

Consideration of retrospective recognition to the Teacher Education Institutions / Universities which have made admissions in Teachers Education Programmes prior to obtaining recognition from NCTE.

Some Central Universities and institutions had made admission to Teacher Education courses without prior permission/recognition of NCTE. The matter was examined by Committee comprising:

May have up over lover up

The report of the Committee was placed before the Council convened on 17.3.2015 for further course of action to be taken in this regard.

It was decided in the meeting to obtain legal opinion from the senior legal counsel before taking any decision in this regard. The legal opinion dt. 23.5.2015 from the Sh. Tushar Mehta, Additional Solicitor General of India was obtained and is available at **Annexure-B, pp. 15-21**. After taking into consideration various judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the Additional Solicitor General is of the opinion that the Hon'ble Supreme Court held in certain cases that recognition cannot be retrospective but would only be from the date on which it is granted. However, in the present cases being limited number of institutions which are not functioning in commercial basis but are Govt. institutions, the Additional Solicitor General (ASG) opined as follows:

"The facts of the present case, however, concern limited number of institutions that is ten in number which are not functioning on commercial basis but are Government institutions. As held by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in case of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Vs. UOI and others [2013(10)SCC 208], it is possible for a statutory governing body like NCTE to take a considered decision to treat such Government institutions to be a separate class if the NCTE is confronted with a peculiar problem of a temporary nature without making it a precedent. I am informed that while granting recognition for the year 2015-2016 onwards, the NCTE is fully satisfied that these 10 governing institutions are in fact fulfilling all requisite mandatory requirements stipulated under the Act read with the Regulations unlike the private profiteering entities with which the Hon'ble Supreme Court was concerned in case of AdarshShiksha Mahavidalaya case [supra] and Venus Public Education Society [supra].

In case of these ten institutions which has posed a one-time standalone problem the Querist has already given recognition after being satisfied about these Government institutions meeting with mandatory requirements stipulated under the Act read with the Regulations.

However, in light of the above referred legal position and in view of the peculiar facts namely:

- (i) Only 10 colleges are faced with the problem in the entire country;
- (ii) All are Government colleges and not private colleges and
- (iii) The querist has already given recognition for 2015-16 onwards being satisfied about the compliance with all statutory requirements, it is open to the querist to take a considered decision with respect of these ten institution in peculiar facts of the case as a one-time measure treating these Government institutions as a separate class since they are found

to be meeting with all mandatory requirements while not making it a precedent so as to ensure that the future of the students who have already undergone studies in these Government colleges who are found to be compliant with the statutory requirements is not put to jeopardy."

Though referred to as 10 colleges, there are 16 government TEIs/public universities (and also deemed universities partly funded by UGC) as given in the Table.

The matter is placed before the Council to take a decision in this regard.

LEGAL OPINION

Querist: National Council for Teacher Education

- 1. My opinion is sought on the following queries:-
 - I. Whether, under the NCTE Act, 1993 and the Regulations made thereunder, the querist can recognize, teacher training courses of the students who have completed their courses from Government Colleges / institutions which were recognized from the present academic year 2015-16?
 - II. Whether the Querist under the provisions of the NCTE Act, 1993 and the Regulations made thereunder, can treat Government College as a separate class?
- 2. So far as the factual matrix is concerned, it relates to grant of recognition under Section 14 of the National Council for Teachers Training Act, 1993 [hereinafter referred to as the NCTE Act] to approximately 10 institutes which are run by the Central and / or State Governments and are not private institutes.
- 3. The Querist National Council for Teacher Education has been constituted under the provisions of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 [Act No.73 of 1993] which came into force w.e.f. 30.12.1993. The NCTE Act, 1993 was enacted to provide for the establishment of a National Council for Teacher Education with a view to achieve planned and coordinated development of the teacher education system throughout the Country and for the regulation and proper maintenance of norms and standards in the teacher education



system. The querist, amongst others, is primarily responsible to take all such necessary steps for ensuring planned and co-coordinated development of teacher education and for the determination and maintenance of standards for teacher education in the Country. In fact, NCTE takes all necessary steps to achieve excellence in teacher education programmes and for this purpose it undertakes surveys and studies relating to various aspects of teacher education. It also makes recommendations to the Central and State Governments, Universities etc. including the institutions in the matter of preparation of the suitable plans and programmes in the field of teacher education.

- 4. The querist also co-ordinates and monitors teacher education and its development in the Country and lays down guidelines and norms for teacher education, including minimum eligibility criteria for admission therein. Beside others, it is also the duty of NCTE to examine and review periodically the implementation of the norms, guidelines and standards laid down by it and to suitably advise the recognized institutions.
- 5. Chapter-IV of the Act deals with Recognition of Teacher Education Institutions. It also provides for taking action against the institutions in case there is contravention of any of the provisions of the Act, Rules, Regulations and or any condition subject to which recognition under Sub Section (3) of Section 14 or permission under Sub Section (3) of Section 15, was granted.
- Section 14 of the National Council for Teachers Education Act, 1993, deals with recognition of institutions offering courses or training in Teachers Education.
- 7. I have also perused the scheme of the Act and the scheme of the NCTE [Recognition, Norms and Procedure] Regulations, 2014 which




provides for the procedure to be followed for the purpose of grant of recognition by the Querist.

- 8. In the present case the querist NCTE, has been forwarded a large number of representations by the Central Govt. received from various State Governments and Central Universities, who had started the teacher training courses without the prior permission / recognition of the querist, as mandatorily required under the provisions of NCTE Act, 1993, thereby, requesting the querist to recognize the teacher training courses being conducted by them, on the premise that a large number of students had already completed their courses from such institutions which are not private institutions.
- 9. The querist has also received a large number of representations from the students who have completed their teacher training courses from the institutions established by Central and / or State Govts.
- 10. As per the case for opinion, the Querist has already requested these Government institutions to submit their applications in accordance with the provisions of NCTE Act, 1993 and the Regulations made thereunder and after considering their applications and after being satisfied that the infrastructure and technical facilities available in these institutions are meeting with the requirements laid down under the Act read with Regulations, the Querist has already granted recognition to the said institutions from the academic year 2015-16 onwards.
- 11. In other words, the Querist is satisfied that these ten [10] Government institutions, which are not having any profit motive are meeting with all the criterion and mandatory requirements stipulated under the Act and the Regulations.



- 12. The question which requires to be examined is as to whether the Querist can consider the grant of recognition to such Government institutions for a period prior to 2015-16. In this context, the Hon'ble Supreme Court, in the of case Adarsh Mahavidyalaya and Ors. Vs. Subhash Rahangdale and Ors. [2012] (2) SCC 425], considered the scheme of the Act. The Hon'ble Supreme Court in the said case was concerned with the private institutions engaged in conducting teacher training courses / programmes which were indulging in brazen and bizarre exploitation of the aspirants for admission to teacher training courses and rank commercialisation and also the as apparent from the following part of the judgment:
 - We have prefaced disposal of these appeals, which are directed against interlocutory order dated 17.12.2008 and final order dated 13.03.2009 passed by the Division Bench of the Madhya Pradesh High Court in Writ Petition No. 6146 of 2008 and connected matters by highlighting the need for well-equipped and trained teachers because in the last three decades private institutions engaged in conducting teacher training courses / programmes have included in brazen and bizarre exploitation of the aspirants for admission to teacher training courses and ranked commercialisation and the regulatory bodies constituted under the laws enacted by Parliament and State Legislatures have failed to stem the rot. The cases filed by these institutions, many of whom have not been granted recognition due to nonfulfilment of the conditions specified in the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 (for short, 'the 1993 Act') and the Regulations framed thereunder and by the students who have taken admission in such institutions with the hope that at the end of the day they will be able to get favourable order by invoking sympathy of the Court, have choked the dockets of various High Courts and even this Court."
- 13. It clearly appears that not only the Hon'ble Supreme Court was concerned with the private institutions but the private institutions being dealt with by the Hon'ble Supreme Court did not even fulfil the conditions specified under the Act and the Regulations framed thereunder.



"18. One of the four Committees constituted by the Council under Section 20(1) of the 1993 Act is the Western Regional Committee, which is required to perform functions under Sections 14, 15 and 17 in relation to the States of Gujarat, Goa, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra. In the last about 15 years, the Western Regional Committee entertained thousands of applications made by private institutions for starting teacher training courses albeit without ensuring compliance of the mandatory provisions contained in the 1993 Act and the relevant Regulations. Some of these institutions were started in commercial premises like marriage halls and shops, and in the existing school premises without the required infrastructure and staff. They admitted students from different parts of the country, majority of whom did not even know the place from where the institutions were operating. This must have become possible because of the active or tacit connivance of those who were entrusted with the task of ensuring effective implementation of the provisions of the 1993 Act."

- 15. In the context of the facts before the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the Hon'ble Court declined to accede to the prayers made by such defaulter private institutions and summarised its conclusions in para 87 of the said judgment.
- 16. A similar question arose before the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of National Council for Teacher Education and Anr. Vs. Venus Public Education Society and Ors. [2013 (1) SCC 223] which again concerned private institutions. The Hon'ble Supreme Court in the said judgment of Venus Public Education Society [supra] prefaced its judgment in the following terms
 - "I. The factual exposition of the present litigation demonstrably reflects the combat between the truth and falsehood, battle between justice and injustice, the contestation between the accord and discord, the collision between fairness and manipulation, the scuffle betwixt the sacrosanctity of the majesty of law and its abuses and the clash between the mandated principles and invocation of sympathy. Such a controversy emerges because majesty, sanctity and purity of law have been corroded and truth, however, relative it may be in the mundane world, has its own command and the same has been deliberately guillotined forgetting the fundamental fact that none can afford to build a castle in Spain in the realm of truth. It is worthy to note that justice in its connotative expanse engulfs the liberalism of an ocean, the magnanimity of

the Sun, the sternness of a mountain, the simplicity of a saint, the austerity of a Spartan and the humility of a river. The concept of justice has to remain embedded in spite of adversities. It should remain unshaken, unterrified, unperturbed and loyal to the Rule of Law. In the case at hand, as a maladroit effort has been made to give an indecent burial to the command of law and pave the path of injustice, the same has to be dealt with sternly sans sympathy."

- 17. In the said judgment, the Hon'ble Supreme Court took note of the judgment in Adarsh Shiksha case [supra] and held that "Letter of Intent" and "formal recognition" are conceptually different and the High Court committed an error in issuing a writ running contrary to the provisions of law.
- 18. In my opinion, though in both the judgments the Hon'ble Supreme Court did not examine the question of retrospective recognition, eventually it did hold that recognition cannot be retrospective but would only be from the date on which it is granted.
- 19. The facts of the present case, however, concern limited number of institutions that is ten in number which are not functioning on commercial basis but are Government institutions. As held by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in case of Dr. BR Ambedkar vs UOI & ors. [2013 (10) SCC 280], it is possible for a statutory governing body like NCTE to take a considered decision to treat such Government institutions to be a separate class if the NCTE is confronted with a peculiar problem of a temporary nature without making it a precedent. I am informed that while granting recognition for the year 2015-16 onwards, the NCTE is fully satisfied that these 10 governing institutions are in fact fulfilling all requisite mandatory requirements stipulated under the Act read with the Regulations unlike the private profiteering entities with which the Hon'ble Supreme Court was concerned in case of Adarsh Shiksha

Mahavidyalaya case [supra] and Venus Public Education Society [supra]

- 20. In case of these ten institutions which has posed a one-time standalone problem, the Querist has already given recognition after being satisfied about these Government institutions meeting with mandatory requirements stipulated under the Act read with the Regulations.
- 21. However, in light of the above referred legal position and in view of the peculiar facts namely:-
 - (i) Only 10 colleges are faced with the problem in the entire country;
 - (ii) All are Government colleges and not private colleges and
 - (iii) The querist had already given recognition for 2015-16 onwards being satisfied about the compliance with all statutory requirements, it is open to the querist to take a considered decision with respect of these ten institutions in peculiar facts of the case as a one-time measure treating these Government institutions as a separate class since they are found to be meeting with all mandatory requirements while not making it a precedent so as to ensure that the future of the students who have already undergone studies in these Government colleges who are found to be compliant with the statutory requirements is not put to jeopardy.

I opined accordingly.

Agenda Item No.5: Consideration of revision of Regulations including Teacher Educator Qualifications – NET/and Ph.D.

The NCTE Norms & Standards for Teacher Education Programmes (Appendix 1 to 13) of the NCTE (Recognition, Norms & Procedure) Regulations, 2009 inter-alia stipulated the following as one of the eligibility qualifications for appointment of the Teaching Faculty/Staff.

Any other stipulation prescribed by the UGC / affiliating body / State Govt. from time to time for the positions of principal and lecturers shall be mandatory

- 2. However, it is noted that the above stipulation has not been incorporated in the eligibility qualifications for appointment of teaching faculty/staff in the Norms & Standards of teacher Education Programmes i.e. Appendix 1 to 15 of the NCTE (Recognition, Norms & Procedures) Regulations, 2014.
- 3. The University Grants Commission vide UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2010 (Annexure C, pp.25-173) notified the qualifications of Teaching Faculty in Teacher Education Institutions where-under the stipulation of NET/P.h.D. apart from the qualifications laid down by NCTE has also been made.
- 4. In order to resolve the issue, NET and Ph.D may now be incorporated in the NCTE Regulations, 2014 also, wherever the qualifications for appointment of Teaching Faculty/Staff for various courses have been mentioned.
- 5. The matter is placed before the Council for kind consideration and appropriate decision.

UGC REGULATIONS ON MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF TEACHERS AND OTHER ACADEMIC STAFF IN UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES AND MEASURES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF STANDARDS IN HIGHER EDUCATION 2010

No. F.3-1/2009—In exercise of the powers conferred under clause (e) and (g) of sub-section (1) of Section 26 of University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), and in pursuance of the MHRD O.M. No. F.23-7/2008-IFD dated 23rd October, 2008, read with Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure) O.M. No. F.1-1/2008-IC dated 30th August, 2008 and in terms of the MHRD Notification No. 1-32/2006-U.II/U.I(1) issued on 31st December, 2008 and in supersession of the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications, Required for the Appointment and Career Advancement of Teachers in Universities and Institutions affiliated to it) Regulations, 2000, issued by University Grants Commission vide Regulation No. F.3-1/2000 (PS) dated 4th April, 2000, together with all amendments made therein from time to time, the University Grants Commission hereby frames the following Regulations, namely:—

- Short title, application and commencement :
- 1.1 These Regulations may be called the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and other Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2010
- They shall apply to every University established or incorporated by or under a Ceutral Act, Provincial Act or a State Act, every Institution including a constituent or an affiliated College recognized by the Commission, in consultation with the University concerned under Clause (f) of Section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and every Institution deemed to be a University under Section 3 of the said Act.
- 1.3 They shall come into force with immediate effect.
 - Provided that in the event, any candidate becomes eligible for promotion under Career Advancement Scheme in terms of these Regulations on or after 31st December, 2008, the promotion of such a candidate shall be governed by the provisions of these Regulations.
 - Provided further that notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, in the event any candidate became eligible for promotion under Career Advancement Scheme prior to 31st December, 2008, the promotion of such a candidate under Career Advancement Scheme shall be governed by the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications Required for the Appointment and Career Advancement of Teachers in Universities and Institutions affiliated to it) Regulations, 2000 notified vide Notification No. F.3-1/2000 (PS) dated 4 April, 2000, as amended from time to time, read with notifications and guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC) from time to time, in this regard.
- 2. The Minimum Qualifications for appointment and other service conditions of University and College teachers, Librarians and Directors of Physical Education and Sports as a measure for the maintenance of standards in higher education, shall be as provided in the Annexure to these Regulations.
- Consequences of failure of the Universities to comply with the recommendations of the Commission, as provision of Section 14 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956:
 - If any University Grants affiliation in respect of any course of study to any college referred to in sub-section (5) of Section 12-A in contravention of the provisions of the sub-section, or fails within a reasonable time to comply with any recommendations made by the Commission under Section 12 or Section 13, or contravenes the provisions of any rule made under clause (f) of sub-section (2) of Section 25 or of any regulations made under clause (e) or clause (f) of clause (g) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 26, the Commission after taking into consideration the eause, if any, shown by the University for such failure or contravention, may withhold from the university the grants proposed to be made out of the fund of the Commission.

ANNEXURE

UGC REGULATIONS ON MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF TEACHERS AND OTHER ACADEMIC STAFF IN UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES AND MEASURES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF STANDARDS IN HIGHER EDUCATION, 2010

These Regulations are issued for minimum qualifications for appointment and other service conditions of University and College Teachers, Librarians, Directors of Physical Education and Sports for the maintenance of standards in higher education and revision of pay scales.

1.0.0 COVERAGE

1.1.1 For teachers in the Faculties of Agriculture and Veterinary Science, the norms Regulations of Indian Council of Agricultural Research; for Faculty of Medicine. Dentistry, Nursing and AYUSH, the norms/Regulations of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India; for Faculty of Education, the norms/Regulations formulated in consultations with National Council of Teacher Education; for Engineering Technology, Pharmacy and Management/Business Administration, the norms/Regulations formulated in consultations with All India Council for Technical Education, and the qualifications in the field of rehabilitation and special education at Degree, PG Diploma and Masters level, the norms/Regulations formulated in consultations with Rehabilitation Council of India, shall apply.

2.0.0 PAY SCALES, PAY FIXATION FORMULA AND AGE OF SUPERANNUATION. ETC.

- 2.1.0 The revised scales of pay and other service conditions including age of superannuation in central universities and other institutions maintained and/or funded by the University Grants Commission (UGC), shall be strictly in accordance with the decision of the Central Government, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of Education), as contained in Appendix-1.
- 2.2.0 The pay scale shall, in the central universities and other institutions maintained and/or. funded by the UGC, be fixed in accordance with the pay "fixation formula" developed by the UGC and approved by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), as contained in Appendix-II.
- 2.3.0 The pay fixation formula for teachers shall apply for other positions in the Library and Physical Education and Sports cadres in the Central Universities and Colleges thereunder and Institutions Deemed to be Universities whose maintenance expenditure is met by the UGC.

- 2.3.1. The revised scales of pay and age of superannuation as provided in Clause 2.1.0 above, may also be extended to Universities, colleges and other higher educational institutions coming under the purview of the State Legislature and maintained by the State Governments, subject to the implementation of the scheme as a composite one in adherence of the terms and conditions laid down in the MHRD notifications provided as Appendix I and in the MHRD letter No.F.1-7/2010-U II dated 11 May, 2010 with all conditions specified by the UGC in these Regulations and other Guidelines.
- 2.3.2. Subject to the availability of vacant positions and fitness, teachers such as Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor only, may be re-employed on contract appointment beyond the age of superannuation, as applicable to the concerned University, college and Institution, up to the age of seventy years.
 - Provided further that all such re-employment shall be strictly in accordance with the guidelines prescribed by the UGC, from time to time.
- 2.3.3. All other aspects which are not covered in these Regulations, on applicability, financial assistance, date of implementation of revised pay and allowances and payment of arrears, etc. shall be as laid down in the MHRD Notifications provided as Appendix-I of these Regulations and the MHRD letter No.F.1-7/2010-U II dated 11 May, 2010.

3.0.0. RECRUITMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS

- 3.1.0 The direct recruitment to the posts of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors in the Universities and Colleges shall be on the basis of ment through all India advertisement and selections by the duly constituted Selection Committees as per the provisions made under these Regulations to be incorporated under the Statutes/Ordinances of the concerned university. The composition of such committees should be as prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations.
- 3.2.0 The minimum qualifications required for the post of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors, Professors, Principals, Assistant Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Deputy Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Assistant Librarians, Deputy Librarians, Librarians will be those as prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations.
- 3.3.0 The minimum requirements of a good academic record, 55% marks (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) at the master's level and qualifying in the National Eligibility Test (NET), or an accredited test (State Level Eligibility Test SLET/SET), shall remain for the appointment of Assistant Professors.
- 3.3.1. NET/SLET/SET shall remain the minimum eligibility condition for recruitment and appointment of Assistant Professors in Universities / Colleges / Institutions.

Provided however, that candidates, who are or have been awarded a Ph. D. Degree in accordance with the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2009, shall be exempted from the requirement of the minimum eligibility condition of NET/SLET/SET for recruitment and appointment of Assistant Professor or equivalent positions in Universities / Colleges / Institutions.

- 3.3.2 NET/SLET/SET shall not be required for such Masters Degree Programmes in disciplines for which NET/SLET/SET accredited test is not conducted.
- 3.4.0 A minimum of 55% marks (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) will be required at the Master's level for those recruited as teachers at any level from industries and research institutions and at the entry level of Assistant Professors, Assistant Librarians, Assistant Directors of Physical Education and Sports.
- 3.4.1 A relaxation of 5% may be provided at the graduate and master's level for the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Differently-abled (Physically and visually differently-abled) categories for the purpose of eligibility and for assessing good academic record during direct recruitment to teaching positions. The eligibility marks of 55% marks (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and the relaxation of 5% to the categories mentioned above are permissible, based on only the qualifying marks without including any grace mark procedures.
- 3.5.0 A relaxation of 5% may be provided, from 55% to 50% of the marks to the Ph.D. Degree holders, who have obtained their Master's Degree prior to 19 September, 1991.
- **3.6.0** Relevant grade which is regarded as equivalent of 55% wherever the grading system is followed by a recognized university shall also be considered eligible.
- 3.7.0 The Ph.D. Degree shall be a mandatory qualification for the appointment of Professors and for promotion as Professors.
- 3.8.0 The Ph.D. Degree shall be a mandatory qualification for all candidates to be appointed as Associate Professor through direct recruitment.
- 3.9.0. The period of time taken by candidates to acquire M.Phil. and/or Ph.D. Degree shall not be considered as teaching/ research experience to be claimed for appointment to the teaching positions.

4.0.0 DIRECT RECRUITMENT

4.1.0 PROFESSOR

(a) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, all candidates who are required to undertake the physical fitness test shall be required to produce a medical certificate certifying that he/she is medically fit before undertaking such tests.

4.7 Since the UGC has prescribed the above qualifications for teaching positions in all higher education institutions for maintenance of minimum standards in consultation with the Statutory Councils governing the approval of courses respectively, any future modification in qualifications for appointment of teachers in universities/colleges offering such courses will automatically be considered as adopted by the UGC as prescribed qualifications for those courses.

5.0.0. SELECTION COMMITTEES AND GUIDELINESS ON SELECTION

PROCEDURES:

The UGC has evolved the following guidelines on: (a) Constitution of Selection Committees for selection of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, Professor, Assistant Librarian, Deputy Librarian, Librarian, Assistant Director of Physical Education and Sports, Deputy Director of Physical Education and Sports and Director of Physical Education and Sports; and (b) specified selection procedures for direct recruitment and Career Advancement Schemes Regulations for teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges.

5.1.1 Assistant Professor in the University:

- (a) The Selection Committee for the post of Assistant Professor in the University shall have the following composition.
 - 1. The Vice Chancellor shall be the Chairperson of the Selection Committee.
 - Three experts in the concerned subject nominated by the Vice Chancellor out of the panel of names approved by the relevant statutory body of the university concerned.
 - 3. Dean of the concerned Faculty, wherever applicable
 - Head/Chairperson of the Department/School.
 - 5. An academician nominated by the Visitor/Chancellor, wherever applicable.
 - An academician representing SC/ST/OBC/Minority/Women/Differently-abled categories to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor or Acting Vice Chancellor, if any of the candidates representing these categories is the applicant and if any of the above members of the selection committee do not belong to that category.
- (b) At least four members, including two outside subject experts shall constitute the quorum.

5.1.2 Associate Professor in the University

- (a) The Selection Committee for the post of Associate Professor in the University shall have the following composition:
 - 1. Vice Chancellor to be the Chairperson of the Selection Committee.
 - An academician who is the nominee of the Visitor/Chancellor, wherever applicable.
 - Three experts in the concerned subject/field nominated by the Vice Chancellor out of the panel of names approved by the relevant statutory body of the university concerned.
 - Dean of the faculty, wherever applicable.
 - Head/Chairperson of the Department/School.
 - An academician representing SC/ST/OBC/ Minority / Women / Differently-abled categories, if any of candidates representing these categories is the applicant, to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor, if any of the above members of the selection committee do not belong to that category.

At least four members, including two outside subject experts, shall constitute the quorum.

5.1.4 Assistant Professor in Colleges including Private Colleges:

- (a) The Selection Committee for the post of Assistant Professor in Colleges including Private Colleges shall have the following composition:
 - 1. Chairperson of the Governing Body of the college or his/her nominee from among the members of the Governing body to be the Chairperson of the Selection Committee.
 - 2. The Principal of the College.
 - 3. Head of the Department of the concerned subject in the College.
 - 4. Two nominees of the Vice Chancellor of the affiliating university of whom one should be a subject expert. In case of colleges notified/declared as minority educational Institutions, two subject experts not connected with the University to be nominated by the Chairperson of the Governing Body of the College out of the panel of five names, preferably from minority communities, recommended by the Vice Chancellor from the list of subject experts approved by the relevant statutory body of the College.

- (d) For all levels of teaching positions in Constituent college(s) of a university, the selection committee norms shall be similar to that of the posts of departments of the university.

 - The Chairperson of the Governing Body or his or her nominee, from among the members of the Governing body to be the Chairperson of the Selection Committee.
 - 2. The Principal of the College.
 - 3. The Head of the Department of the concerned subject from the college.
 - 4. Two University representatives nominated by the Vice Chancellor, one of whom will be the Dean of College Development Council or equivalent position in the University, and the other must be expert in the concerned subject. In case of Colleges notified/declared as minority educational institutions, two nominees of the Chairperson of the College from out of a panel of five names, preferably from minority communities, recommended by the Vice-Chancellor of the affiliating university from the list of experts suggested by the relevant statutory body of the college of whom one should be a subject expert.
 - 5. - 5. An academician representing SC/ST/OBC/Minority/Women/Differently-abled categories, if any of candidates representing these categories is the applicant, to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor, if any of the above members of the selection committee do not belong to that category.
- (b) At least five members, including two experts, should constitute the quorum.
- (c) All the selection procedures of the selection committee shall be completed on the day of the selection committee meeting itself, wherein, minutes are recorded along with the scoring proforma and recommendation made on the basis of merit with the list of selected and waitlisted candidates/Panel of names in order of merit, duly signed by all members of the selection committee.
- (d) The term of appointment of the college principal shall be FIVE years with eligibility for reappointment for one more term only after a similar selection committee process.
- 5.1.7 Selection Committees for the posts of Directors, Deputy Directors, Assistant Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Librarians, Deputy Librarians and Assistant Librarians shall be the same as that of Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor respectively, except that the concerned expert in Physical Education and Sports or Sports Administration or Library, practicing Librarian/Physical Director, as the case may be, shall be associated with the Selection Committee as one of the subject experts.

6.0.0 SELECTION PROCEDURES:

- 6.0.1 The overall selection procedure shall incorporate transparent, objective and credible methodology of analysis of the merits and credentials of the applicants based on weightages given to the performance of the candidate in different relevant dimensions and his/her performance on a scoring system proforma, based on the Academic Performance Indicators (API) as provided in this Regulations in Tables I to IX of Appendix III.
 - In order to make the system more credible, universities may assess the ability for teaching and/or research aptitude through a seminar or lecture in a class room situation or discussion on the capacity to use latest technology in teaching and research at the interview stage. These procedures can be followed for both direct recruitment and CAS promotions wherever selection committees are prescribed in these Regulations.
- 6.0.2 The Universities shall adopt these Regulations for selection committees and selection procedures through their respective statutory bodies incorporating the Academic Performance Indicator (API) based Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) at the institutional level for University Departments and their Constituent colleges/ affiliated colleges (Government/Government-aided/Autonomous/ Private Colleges) to be followed transparently in all the selection processes. An indicative PBAS template proforma for

direct recruitment and for Career Advancement Schemes (CAS) based on API based PBAS shall also be sent separately by the UGC to the universities. The universities may adopt the template proforma or may devise their own self-assessment cum performance appraisal forms for teachers in strict adherence to the API criteria based PBAS prescribed in these Regulations.

- c.0.4 In all the Selection Committees of direct recruitment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges provided herein, an academician representing Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/OBC/Minority/Women/Differently-abled categories, if any of candidates representing these categories is the applicant and if any of the members of the selection committee do not belong to that category, shall be nominated by the Vice Chancellor or Acting Vice Chancellor of the University, and in case of a college Vice Chancellor or Acting Vice Chancellor of the University to which the college is affiliated to. The academician, so nominated for this purpose, shall be one level above the cadre level of the applicant, and such nominee shall ensure that the norms of the Central Government or concerned State Government, in relation to the categories mentioned above, are strictly followed during the selection process.
 - 6.0.5 (i) Besides the indexed publications documented by various discipline-specific databases, the University concerned shall draw through committee(s) of subject experts and ISBN / ISSN experts: (a) a comprehensive list of National /Regional level journals of quality in the concerned subject(s); and (b) a comprehensive list of Indian language journals / periodicals / official publication volumes of language bodies and upload them on the University website which are to be updated periodically.
 - (ii) In respect of Indian language publications, equivalence in quality shall be prescribed for universities located in a State by a Co-ordination Committee of experts to be constituted by the Chancellor of the concerned State University.
 - (iii) At the time of assessing the quality of publications of the candidates during their appointments/promotions, the selection committees shall have to be provided with the above two lists which could be considered by the selection committees along with the other discipline-specific databases.
 - (iv) The UGC shall constitute a Committee as soon as practicable, in so far as acceptability of the (list of) Indian language journals so developed by Universities / States, to arrive at equivalence in quality of such publications with otherwise accepted and recognized journals.
- 6.0.6 The process of selection of Associate Professor should involve inviting the bio-data with the duly filled Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) proforma developed by the respective universities based on the API criteria provided in this Regulation and template separately provided. Without prejudice, to the requirements provided for selection of Associate Professor under this Regulation, the prescription of research publications for promotion from the post of Assistant Professor to Associate Professor in colleges shall be as follows:

- (a) For those who possess a Ph.D. Degree, a minimum of one publication made during the period of service as Assistant Professor;
- (b) for those with a M.Phil. Degree, a minimum of two publications made during the period of service as Assistant Professor; and
- (c) for those without Ph.D. or M.Phil. degree, at least three publications during the period of service as Assistant Professor.

Provided that in so far as teachers in Universities are concerned, three publications shall be required to be submitted for all the three categories mentioned above for consideration of promotion from Assistant Professor to Associate Professor.

Provided further that such publications shall be provided to the subject experts for assessment before the interview and the evaluation score of the publications provided by the experts shall be factored into the weightage scores while finalizing the outcome of selection by the selection committee.

6.0.7. The process of selection of Professor shall involve inviting the bio-data with duly filled Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) proforma developed by the respective universities based on the API criteria based PBAS set out in this Regulation and reprints of five major publications of the candidates.

Provided that such publications submitted by the candidate shall have been published subsequent to the period from which the teacher was placed in the Assistant Professor stage-II.

Provided further that such publications shall be provided to the subject experts for assessment before the interview and the evaluation of the publications by the experts shall be factored into the weightage scores while finalizing the outcome of selection.

- 6.0.8 In the case of selection of Professors who are from outside the academic stream and are considered under Clause 4.1.0 (B), the universities' statutory bodies must lay down clear and transparent criteria and procedures so that only outstanding professionals who can contribute substantially to the university knowledge system are selected in any discipline as per the requirements.
- 6.0.9 The Academic Performance Indicator (API) scoring system in the process of selection of Principal shall be similar to that of directly recruited College Professors. In addition, the selection committee shall assess the following dimensions with the weightages given below:
 - a. Assessment of aptitude for teaching, research and administration (20%);
 - Ability to communicate clearly and effectively (10%);
 - c. Ability to plan institutional programmes, analyze and discuss curriculum development and delivery research support and college development/administration (20%):

- d. Ability to deliver lecture programmes to be assessed by requiring the candidate to participate in a group discussion or exposure to a class room situation by a lecture (10%); and
- e. Analysis of the merits and credentials of the candidates on the basis of the Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) proforma developed by the affiliating University based on these Regulations (deduced to 40% of the total API score).
- 6.0.10 In the selection process for posts involving different nature of responsibilities in certain disciplines/areas, such as Music and Fine Arts, Visual arts and Performing arts, Physical education and Library, greater emphasis may be laid on the nature of deliverables indicated against each of the posts in these Regulations which need to be taken up by the concerned institution while developing API based PBAS proforma for both direct recruitment and CAS promotions.
- 6.0.11 The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) shall be established in Universities/Colleges as per the UGC/ National Assessment Accreditation Council (NAAC) guidelines with the Vice Chancellor, as Chairperson (in the case of universities), and Principal, as Chairperson (in case of colleges). The IQAC shall act as the documentation and record-keeping Cell for the institution including assistance in the development of the API criteria based PBAS proforma using the indicative template separately developed by UGC. The IQAC may also introduce, wherever feasible, the student feedback system as per the NAAC guidelines on institutional parameters without incorporating the component of students' assessment of individual teachers in the PBAS.

5.1.0 While the API:

- (a) Tables I and III of Appendix III are applicable to the selection of Professors/ Associate Professors /Assistant Professors in universities and colleges;
- (b) Tables IV, V and VI of Appendix III are applicable to Directors/ Deputy Directors/ Assistant Directors of Physical Education and Sports; and
- (c) Tables VII, VIII and IX of Appendix III are applicable to Librarians/ Deputy Librarians and Assistant Librarians for both direct recruitment as well as Career Advancement Promotions.

the ratio / percentage of minimum requirement of category-wise API Score to each of the cadres shall vary from those for university teachers and for UG/PG College Teachers, as given in these Tables of Appendix-III.

6.2.0 The minimum norms of Selection Committees and Selection Procedures as well as API score requirements for the above cadres, either through direct recruitment or through Career Advancement Schemes Regulations, shall be similar. However, since teachers recruited directly can be from different backgrounds and institutions, Table II(c) of

Appendix III provides norms for direct recruitment of teachers to different cadres, while Tables II (a) and Table II(b) provide for CAS promotions of teachers in universities and colleges respectively, which accommodate these differences.

- 6.3.0 In order to remedy the difficulties of collecting retrospective information and to facilitate the implementation of these regulations from 31-12-2008 in the CAS Promotion, the API based PBAS will be progressively and prospectively rolled out. Accordingly, the PBAS based on the API scores of categories I and II as mentioned in these tables is to be implemented for one year, initially based on the existing systems in universities / colleges for one year only with the minimum annual scores as depicted in Table II (a) and II (b) for university and college teachers, or by Librarian/Physical Education and Sports cadres as depicted in Tables V(a) and V (b), Tables VIII(a) and VIII (b) respectively. This annualized API scores can then be compounded progressively asand when the teacher becomes eligible for CAS promotion to the next cadre. Thus, if a teacher is considered for CAS promotion in 2010, one year API scores for 2009-10 alone will be required for assessment. In case of a teacher being considered for CAS promotion in 2011, two years average of API scores for these categories will be required for assessment and so on leading progressively for the complete assessment period. For Category III (research and academic contributions), API scores for this category will be applied for the entire assessment period.
- 6.3.1 A teacher who wishes to be considered for promotion under CAS may submit in writing to the university/college, with three months in advance of the due date, that he/she fulfils all qualifications under CAS and submit to the university/college the Performance Based Appraisal System proforma as evolved by the concerned university duly supported by all credentials as per the API guidelines set out in these Regulations. In order to avoid delays in holding Selection Committee meetings in various positions under CAS, the University/College should immediately initiate the process of screening/selection, and shall complete the process within six months from the date of application. Further, in order to avoid any hardships, candidates who fulfill all other criteria mentioned in these Regulations, as on 31 December, 2008 and till the date on which this Regulation is notified, can be considered for promotion from the date, on or after 31 December, 2008, on which they fulfill these eligibility conditions, provided as mentioned above.
- 6.3.2 Candidates who do not fulfill the minimum score requirement under the API Scoring System proposed in the Regulations as per Tables II(a and b) of Appendix III or those who obtain less than 50% in the expert assessment of the selection process will have to be re-assessed only after a minimum period of one year. The date of promotion shall be the date on which he/she has successfully got re-assessed.
- 6.3.3 The Selection Committee specifications as delineated in Clauses 5.1.0 to 5.1.7 are applicable to all direct recruitments of Faculty Positions and Career Advancement promotions of Assistant Professor to Associate Professor and to that of Associate Professor to Professor

- **6.3.4** CAS promotions from a lower grade to a higher grade of Assistant Professor shall be conducted by a "Screening cum Evaluation Committee" adhering to the criteria laid out as API score in PBAS in the Tables of Appendix-III.
- 6.3.5 The "Screening cum Evaluation Committee" for CAS promotion of Assistant Professors/equivalent cadres in Librarians/Physical Education from one AGP to the other higher AGP shall consist of:

6.3.5.1. For University teachers:

- The Vice Chancellor as the Chairperson of the Selection Committee;
- b. The Dean of the concerned Faculty;
- c. The Head of the Department /Chairperson of the School; and
- d. One subject expert in the concerned subject nominated by the Vice Chancellor from the University panel of experts.

6.3.5.2 For College teachers:

- a. The Principal of the college;
- b. Head of the concerned department from the college;
- Two subject experts in the concerned subject nominated by the Vice Chancellor from the university panel of experts;
- **6.3.5.3** The quorum for these committees in both categories mentioned above shall be three including the one subject expert/ university nominee need to be present.
- 6.3.6 The Screening cum Evaluation Committee on verification/evaluation of API score secured by the candidate through the 'PBAS' methodology designed by the respective university based on these Regulations and as per the minimum requirement specified:

 (a) in Tables II and III for each of the cadre of Assistant Professor; (b) in Tables V and VI for each of the cadre of Physical Education and Sports; and (c) in Tables VIII and IX for each of the cadre of Librarians shall recommend to the Syndicate/ Executive Council /Board of Management of the University about the suitability for the promotion of the candidate(s) under CAS for implementation.
- 6.3.7 All the selection procedures outlined above, shall be completed on the day of the selection committee meeting, wherein the minutes are recorded along with PBAS scoring proforma and recommendation made on the basis of merit and duly signed by all members of the selection committee in the minutes.
- 6.3.8 CAS promotions being a personal promotion to the incumbent teacher holding a substantive sanctioned post, on superannuation of the individual incumbent, the said post shall revert back to its original cadre.
- **6.3.9** The incumbent teacher must be on the role and active service of the Universities/Colleges on the date of consideration by the Selection Committee for Selection/CAS Promotion.

- 6.3.10 Candidates shall offer themselves for assessment for promotion, if they fulfill the minimum API scores indicated in the appropriate API system tables by submitting an application and the required PBAS proforma. They can do so three months before the due date if they consider themselves eligible. Candidates who do not consider themselves eligible can also apply at a later date. In any event, the university concerned shall send a general circular twice a year calling for applications for CAS promotions from eligible candidates.
- 6.3.11 In the final assessment, if the candidates do not either fulfill the minimum API scores in the criteria as per PBAS proforma or obtain less than 50% in expert assessment, wherever applicable, such candidates will be reassessed only after a minimum period of one year.
- 6.3.12 (a) If a candidate applies for promotion on completion of the minimum eligibility period and is successful, the date of promotion will be from that of minimum period of eligibility.
 - (b) If, however, the candidates find that he/she fulfills the eligibility conditions at a later date and applies on that date and is successful, his/her promotion will be effected from that date of application fulfilling the criteria.
 - (c) If the candidate does not succeed in the first assessment, but succeeds in the eventual assessment, his/her promotion will be deemed to be from the later date of successful assessment.
- 6.4.0. STAGES OF PROMOTION UNDER CAREER ADVANCEMENT SCHEME OF INCUMBENT AND NEWLY APPOINTED ASSISTANT PROFESSORS/ ASSOCIATE PROFESSORS/PROFESSORS
- 6.4.1. Entry level Assistant Professors (Stage 1) would be eligible for promotion under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) through two successive stages (stage 2 and Stage 3), provided they are assessed to fulfill the eligibility and performance criteria as laid out in Clause 6.3, of this Regulation.
- **6.4.2.** An entry level Assistant Professor, possessing Ph. D. Degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible, for moving to the next higher grade (stage 2) after completion of four years service as Assistant Professor.
- 6.4.3. An entry level Assistant Professor possessing M.Phil. Degree or post-graduate Degree in professional courses, approved by the relevant statutory body, such as LL.M. / M. Tech., etc. shall be eligible for the next higher grade (stage 2) after completion of five years service as Assistant Professor.
- **6.4.4.** An entry level Assistant Professor who does not have Ph.D. or M.Phil, or a Master's Degree in the relevant professional course, shall be eligible for the next higher grade (stage 2) only after completion of six years service as Assistant Professor.

- **6.4.5.** The upward movement from the entry level grade (stage 1) to the next higher grade (stage 2) for all Assistant Professors shall be subject to their satisfying the API based PBAS conditions laid down by the UGC in this Regulation.
- **6.4.6.** Assistant Professors who have completed five years of service in the second grade (stage 2) shall be eligible, subject to meeting the API based PBAS requirements laid down by these Regulations, to move up to next higher grade (stage 3).
- **6.4.7.** Assistant Professors completing three years of teaching in third grade (stage 3) shall be eligible, subject to the qualifying conditions and the API based PBAS requirements prescribed by these Regulations, to move to the next higher grade (stage 4) and to be designated as Associate Professor.
- 6.4.8. Associate Professor completing three years of service in stage 4 and possessing a Ph.D. Degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible to be appointed and designated as Professor and be placed in the next higher grade (stage 5), subject to (a) satisfying the required credit points as per API based PBAS methodology provided in Table I-III of Appendix IV stipulated in these Regulations, and (b) an assessment by a duly constituted selection committee as suggested for the direct recruitment of Professor. Provided that no teacher, other than those with a Ph.D., shall be promoted or appointed as Professor.
- **6.4.9.** In the case of Associate Professors in Colleges, promotion to the post of Professor under CAS shall be further subject to Clause 6.5.1.and 6.5.2 of this Regulation.
- 6.4.10. Ten percent of the positions of Professors in a university, with a minimum of ten years of teaching and research experience as professor either in the pre-revised scale of Professor's pay or the revised scale pay will be eligible for promotion to the higher grade of Professorship (stage 6), on satisfying the required API score as per Tables I and II through the PBAS methodology stipulated in these Regulations through a duly constituted Expert committee, and such teachers promoted to the higher grade shall continue to be designated as 'Professor'. As this AGP elevation for Professor is applicable to only university departments, additional credentials are to be evidenced by:
 - (a) post-doctoral research outputs of high standard;
 - (b) awards / honours /and recognitions;
 - (c) Additional research degrees like D.Sc., D.Litt., LID, etc.; patents and IPR on products and processes developed / technology transfer achieved in the case of teachers in science and technology.

The selection is to be conducted by the university by receiving duly filled PBAS proformas from eligible professors based on seniority, three times in number of the available vacancies in each faculty. In case the number of candidates available is less than three times the number of vacancies, the zone of consideration will be limited to the actual number of candidates available. The assessment process shall be through an Expert-Committee evaluation of all credentials submitted as stipulated in Table-II(A) of

Appendix-III for teachers in University departments. No separate interview need to be conducted for this category.

6.4.11. Discretionary award of advance increments for those who enter the profession as Associate Professors or Professors with higher merit, high number of research publications and experience at the appropriate level, shall be within the competence of the appropriate authority of the concerned University or recruiting institution based on the recommendations of selection committee(s) while negotiating with individual candidates in the context of the merits of each case, taking into account the pay structure of other teachers in the faculty and other merit- specific factors. Discretionary award of advance increments is not applicable to those entering the profession as Assistant Professor/Assistant Librarian/Assistant Director of Physical Education and Sports and to those who are entitled for grant of advance increments for having acquired Ph. D., M. Phil., M.Tech., etc. However, those entering service as Assistant Professor/Assistant Librarian/Assistant Director of Physical Education and Sports with post-doctoral teaching/research experience after Ph.D. and proven credentials may be eligible for discretionary award of advanced increments to be decided and recorded by the selection committee in its minutes.

6.5.0. PROFESSORS IN UNDER GRADUATE AND POST GRADUATE COLLEGES:

6.5.1. (i) Ten percent of the number of the posts of Associate Professor in an Under Graduate College shall be that of Professors and shall be subject to the same criterion for selection / appointment as that of Professors in Universities,

Provided that there shall be no more than one post of Professor in each Department;

Provided further that one-fourth (25%) of the posts of Professor in Under Graduate Colleges shall be directly recruited or filled on deputation by eligible teachers and the remaining three-fourths (75%) of posts of Professors shall be filled by CAS promotion from among eligible Associate Professors of the relevant department of the Under Graduate College.

For avoidance of doubt, it is clarified that sanctioned posts include the posts approved under both direct recruitment and CAS promotion.

(ii) Identification of posts of Professor in an Under Graduate College for being filled through direct recruitment / deputation shall be carried out by the affiliating/concerned University acting in consultation with the College. Where the number of posts of Professor worked out as a percentage of the number of posts of Associate Professor for CAS promotion or direct recruitment / deputation is not an integer, the same shall be rounded off to the next higher integer.

- (iii) The selection process is to be conducted by the university by receiving PBAS proformas from eligible Associate Professors based on seniority and three times in number of the available vacancies. In case the number of candidates available is less than three times the number of vacancies, the zone of consideration will be limited to the actual number of candidates available. The selection shall be conducted through the API scoring system with PBAS methodology and selection committee process stipulated in these Regulations for appointment of Professors. For direct recruitment of the 25% of the posts, the 'Rota-Quota system shall be followed starting with promotions and the direct recruitment quota shall be rotated in an alphabetical order.
- **6.5.2.** There shall be one post of Professor in each Department of a Post-Graduate College which shall be subject to the same criterion for selection / appointment as that of Professors in Universities, provided that one-fourth (25%) of the posts of Professor shall be filled on deputation/direct recruitment from among eligible teachers and the remaining three-fourths (75%) of posts shall be filled through merit promotion from among the eligible Associate Professors in the relevant department of the Post-Graduate college. Identification of posts of Professor in a Post-Graduate College for being filled through direct recruitment/deputation shall be carried out by the affiliating/concerned University acting in consultation with the College. The decision regarding whether the posts of professor will be for CAS promotion or direct recruitment/deputation shall be within the competence of the University acting in consultation with the College. Where the number of posts of professor for CAS promotion or direct recruitment / deputation worked out as a percentage of the total number of posts in a Post Graduate College is not an integer, the same shall be rounded off to the next higher integer.

The selection process is to be conducted by the university by receiving PBAS proformas from eligible Associate Professors based on seniority and three times in number of the available vacancies. In case the number of candidates available is less than three times the number of vacancies, the zone of consideration will be limited to the actual number of candidates available. The selection shall be conducted through the API scoring system with PBAS methodology, selection committee process stipulated in these Regulations for appointment of Professors. For direct recruitment of the 25% of the posts, the 'Rota-Quota System' shall be followed starting with promotion and the direct recruitment quota shall be rotated in an alphabetical order.

- 6.6.0 STAGES OF PROMOTION UNDER THE CAREER ADVANCEMENT SCHEME FOR ASSISTANT LIBRARIANS, ETC.
- 6.6.1 Assistant University Librarian / College Librarian in the entry level grade, possessing Ph.D. in Library Science, after completing service of four years in the lowest grade, if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC in these Regulations, shall be eligible for the higher grade (stage 2).

- 6.6.2 Assistant Librarian / College Librarian in the entry level grade, not possessing Ph.D. but only M.Phil. in Library Science, after completing service of five years in the lowest grade, if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC in these Regulations, shall become eligible for the next higher grade (stage 2).
- 6.6.3 Assistant Librarian / College Librarian in the entry level grade, without the relevant Ph.D. or M.Phil. after completing six years in the lowest grade, if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC in these Regulations, shall become eligible for the next higher grade (stage 2).
- 6.6.4. On completion of service of five years, Assistant Librarian (Sr. Scale) / College Librarian (Sr. Scale) shall be eligible for the post of Deputy Librarian/ equivalent posts and being placed in the next higher grade (stage 3), subject to their fulfilling other conditions of eligibility (such as Ph.D. Degree, etc. for Deputy Librarian) as per API scoring system based PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC for CAS promotion in these Regulations. They shall be designated as Deputy Librarian / Assistant Librarian (Selection Grade) / College Librarian (Selection Grade), as the case may be.
- 6.6.5. After completing three years in the above grade, Deputy Librarians /equivalent positions shall move to the next higher grade (stage 4), subject to fulfilling other conditions of eligibility as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC for CAS promotion in these Regulations.
- 6.7.0 STAGES OF PROMOTION UNDER CAREER ADVANCEMENT SCHEME FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS PERSONNEL
- 6.7.1 Assistant DPE&S in the entry level grade/College DPE&S, at the entry level grade, possessing Ph.D. in Physical Education, after completing service of four years in the entry level stage (stage 1), and if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology prescribed by the UGC for CAS promotion in these Regulations, shall become eligible for the next higher grade (stage 2).
- 6.7.2. Assistant DPE&S/College DPE&S in the entry level grade, possessing M.Phil. in Physical Education, after completing service of the five years in the entry level stage (stage 1), and if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology prescribed by the UGC for CAS promotion in these Regulations, shall become eligible for the next higher grade (stage 2).
- 6.7.3. Assistant DPE&S/ College DPE&S in the entry level grade, without the relevant Ph.D and M.Phil. shall, after completing service of six years as Assistant DPE&S/College DPE&S in the entry level stage, and if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology prescribed by the UGC for CAS promotion in these Regulations, shall become eligible for the next higher grade (stage 2).

- 6.7.4 After completing service of five years in the second stage and subject to satisfying API scoring system and PBAS methodology prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations, Assistant DPE&S (Senior Scale) / College DPE&S (Senior scale) shall be promoted to the next higher grade (stage 3). They shall be designated as Deputy DPE&S/ Assistant DPE&S (Selection Grade) / College DPE&S (Selection Grade), as the case may be.
- 6.7.5. After completing service of three years in stage 3 and subject to satisfying API/ scoring system and PBAS methodology prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations, Deputy DPE&S/Assistant DPE&S (Selection Grade) College DPE&S (Selection Grade) shall move to the next higher grade (stage 4). They shall continue to be designated as Deputy DPE&S/Assistant DPE&S (Selection Grade) / College DPE&S (Selection Grade).
- 6.8.0. The Schedule annexed to these Regulations outlines the Pay scales, Designations and stages of promotions under CAS of incumbent and newly appointed teachers and equivalent positions in the Library and Physical Education and Sports cadres in Central Universities and colleges thereunder and Institutions deemed to be Universities whose maintenance expenditure is met by the UGC.
- 7.0.0. SELECTION OF PRO-VICE CHANCELLOR / VICE CHANCELLOR OF UNIVERSITIES:

7.1.0. PRO-VICE-CHANCELLOR:

The Pro-Vice-Chancellor may be a whole time Professor of the University and shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendation of Vice-Chancellor.

7.2.0. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for a period which is co-terminus with that of Vice-Chancellor. However, it shall be the prerogative of the Vice-Chancellor to recommend a new Pro-Vice-Chancellor to the Executive Council, during his tenure. These Regulations, for selection of Pro- Vice- Chancellor shall be adopted by the concerned University through amendment of their Act/Statute.

7.3.0. VICE CHANCELLOR:

- i. Persons of the highest level of competence, integrity, morals and institutional commitment are to be appointed as Vice-Chancellors. The Vice-Chancellor to be appointed should be a distinguished academician, with a minimum of ten years of experience as Professor in a University system or ten years of experience in an equivalent position in a reputed research and / or academic administrative organization.
- ii. The selection of Vice-Chancellor should be through proper identification of a Panel of 3-5 names by a Search Committee through a public Notification or nomination or a talent search process or in combination. The members of the above Search Committee shall be persons of eminence in the sphere of higher education and shall not be connected in any manner with the University concerned or its colleges. While preparing the panel, the search committee must give proper weightage to academic

excellence, exposure to the higher education system in the country and abroad, and adequate experience in academic and administrative governance to be given in writing along with the panel to be submitted to the Visitor/Chancellor. In respect of State and Central Universities, the following shall be the constitution of the Search Committee.

- a) a nominee of the Visitor/Chancellor, who should be the Chairperson of the Committee.
- b) a nominee of the Chairman, University Grants Commission.
- c) a nominee of the Syndicate/ Executive Council / Board of Management of the University.
- iii. The Visitor/Chancellor shall appoint the Vice Chancellor out of the Panel of names recommended by the Search Committee.
- iv. The conditions of service of the Vice Chancellor shall be prescribed in the Statutes of the Universities concerned in conformity with these Regulations.
- v. The term of office of the Vice Chancellor shall form part of the service period of the incumbent concerned making him/her eligible for all service related benefits.
- 7.4.0 The Universities/State Governments shall modify or amend the relevant Act/Statutes of the Universities concerned within 6 months of adoption of these Regulations.
- 8.0. DUTY LEAVE, STUDY LEAVE, SABBATICAL LEAVE

8.1. DUTY LEAVE:

- i. Duty leave of the maximum of 30 days in an academic year may be granted for the following:
 - (a) Attending conferences, congresses, symposia and seminars on behalf of the university or with the permission of the university;
 - (b) Delivering lectures in institutions and universities at the invitation of such institutions or universities received by the university, and accepted by the Vice Chancellor;
 - (c) Working in another Indian or foreign university, any other agency, institution or organization, when so deputed by the university;
 - (d) Participating in a delegation or working on a committee appointed by the Central Government, State Government, the UGC, a sister university or any other academic body; and
 - (e) For performing any other duty for the university.

- ii. The duration of leave should be such as may be considered necessary by the sanctioning authority on each occasion.
- iv. The leave may be granted on full pay. Provided that if the teacher receives a fellowship or honorarium or any other financial assistance beyond the amount needed for normal expenses, he/she may be sanctioned duty leave on reduced pay and allowances.
- v. Duty leave may be combined with earned leave, half pay leave or extraordinary leave.
- vi. Duty leave should be given also for attending meetings in the UGC, DST, etc. where a teacher invited to share expertise with academic bodies, government or NGO.

8.2. STUDY LEAVE:

- (i) Study leave may be granted for the entry level appointees as Assistant Professor/Assistant Librarian/Assistant Director of Physical Education and Sports/College DPE&S after a minimum of three years of continuous service, to pursue a special line of study or research directly related to his/her work in the university or to make a special study of the various aspects of university organization and methods of education.
- (ii) Subject to the terms contained in this Clause 8.2, in respect of granting study leave with pay for acquiring Ph.D. in a relevant discipline while in service, the number of years to be put in after entry would be a minimum of two or the years of probation specified in the university statutes concerned, keeping in mind the availability of vacant positions for teachers and other cadres in colleges and universities, so that a teacher and other cadres entering service without Ph.D. or higher qualification could be encouraged to acquire these qualifications in the relevant disciplines at the earliest rather than at a later stage of the career.
- (iii) The paid period of study leave should be for three years, but two years may be given in the first instance, extendable by one more year, if there is adequate progress as reported by the Research Guide. Care should be taken that the number of teachers given study leave, does not exceed the stipulated percentage of teachers in any department. *Provided* that the Executive Council/Syndicate may, in the special circumstances of a case, waive the condition of two years service being continuous.

Explanation: In computing the length of service, the time during which a person was on probation or engaged as a research assistant may be reckoned provided:

(a) the person is a teacher on the date of the application;

- (b) there is no break in service; and
- (c) the leave is requested for undertaking the Ph.D. research work.
- (iv) Study leave shall be granted by the Executive Council/Syndicate on the recommendation of the concerned Head of the Department. The leave shall not be granted for more than three years in one spell, save in very exceptional cases in which the Executive Council/Syndicate is satisfied that such extension is unavoidable on academic grounds and necessary in the interest of the university.
- (v) Study leave shall not be granted to a teacher who is due to retire within five years of the date on which he/she is expected to return to duty after the expiry of study leave.
- (vi) Study leave may be granted not more than twice during one's career. Provided that, under no circumstances, the maximum of study leave admissible during the entire service should not exceed five years.
- (vii) No teacher, who has been granted study leave, shall be permitted to alter substantially the course of study or the programme of research without the prior permission of the Executive Council/Syndicate. In the event, the course of study falls short of study leave sanctioned, the teacher shall resume duty immediately on the conclusion of such course of study, unless a prior approval of the Executive Council/Syndicate to treat the period of shortfall as ordinary leave has been obtained.
- (viii) Subject to the provisions of sub-clauses (ix) below, study leave may be granted on full pay up to two years extendable by one year at the discretion of the university.
- (ix) The amount of scholarship, fellowship or other financial assistance that a teacher, granted study leave, has been awarded will not preclude his/her being granted study leave with pay and allowances but the scholarship, etc., so received shall be taken into account in determining the pay and allowance on which the study leave may be granted. The Foreign scholarship/fellowship would be set off against pay only if the fellowship is above a specified amount, which shall be determined by the UGC, from time to time, based on the cost of living for a family in the country in which the study is to be undertaken. In the case of an Indian fellowship, which exceeds the salary of the teacher, the salary would be forfeited.
- (x) Subject to the maximum period of absence from duty on leave not exceeding three years, study leave may be combined with earned leave, half-pay leave, extraordinary leave or vacation, provided that the earned leave at the credit of the teacher shall be availed of at the discretion of the teacher. A teacher, who is

selected to a higher post during study leave, will be placed in that position and get the higher scale only after joining the post.

- (xi) A teacher granted study leave shall on his/her return and re-joining the service of the university may be eligible to the benefit of the annual increment(s) which he/she would have earned in the course of time if he/she had not proceeded on study leave. No teacher shall however, be eligible to receive arrears of increments.
- (xii) Study leave shall count as service for pension/contributory provident fund, provided the teacher joins the university on the expiry of his/her study leave.
- (xiii) Study leave granted to a teacher shall be deemed to be cancelled in case it is not availed of within 12 months of its sanction.

Provided that where study leave granted has been so cancelled, the teacher may apply again for such leave.

- (xiv) A teacher availing himself/herself of study leave shall undertake that he/she shall serve the university for a continuous period of at least three years to be calculated from the date of his/her resuming duty on expiry of the study leave.
- (xv) After the leave has been sanctioned, the teacher shall, before availing himself/herself of the leave, execute a bond in favour of the university, binding himself/herself for the due fulfillment of the conditions laid down in sub-clause above and give security of immovable property to the satisfaction of the Finance Officer/Treasurer or a fidelity bond of an insurance company or a guarantee by a scheduled bank or furnish security of two permanent teachers for the amount which might become refundable to the university in accordance with sub-clause (xiv) above.
- (xvi) The teacher shall submit to the Registrar, six monthly reports of progress in his/her studies from his/her supervisor or the Head of the Institution. This report shall reach the Registrar within one month of the expiry of every six months of the study leave. If the report does not reach the Registrar within the specified time, the payment of leave salary may be deferred till the receipt of such report.

8.3. SABBATICAL LEAVE:

(i) Permanent, whole-time teachers of the university and colleges who have completed seven years of service as Reader/Associate Professor or Professor may be granted sabbatical leave to undertake study or research or other academic pursuit solely for the object of increasing their proficiency and usefulness to the university and higher education system.

- (ii) The duration of leave shall not exceed one year at a time and two years in the entire career of a teacher.
- (iii) A teacher, who has availed himself/herself of study leave, would not be entitled to the sabbatical leave.

Provided further that sabbatical leave shall not be granted until after the expiry of five years from the date of the teacher's return from previous study leave or any other kind of training programme of duration one year or more.

- (iv) A teacher shall, during the period of sabbatical leave, be paid full pay and allowances (subject to the prescribed conditions being fulfilled) at the rates applicable to him/her immediately prior to his/her proceeding on sabbatical leave.
- (v) A teacher on sabbatical leave shall not take up, during the period of that leave, any regular appointment under another organization in India or abroad. He/she may, however, be allowed to accept a fellowship or a research scholarship or ad hoc teaching and research assignment with honorarium or any other form of assistance, other than regular employment in an institution of advanced studies, provided that in such cases the Executive Council/Syndicate may, if it so desires, sanction sabbatical leave on reduced pay and allowances.
- (vi) During the period of sabbatical leave, the teacher shall be allowed to draw the increment on the due date. The period of leave shall also count as service for purposes of pension/contributory provident fund, provided that the teacher rejoins the university on the expiry of his/her leave.

8.4 OTHER KINDS OF LEAVE RULES FOR PERMANENT TEACHERS OF THE UNIVERSITIES/ COLLEGES

- (a) The following kinds of leave would be admissible to permanent teachers:
 - (i) Leave treated as duty, viz. Casual leave, Special casual leave, and Duty leave;
 - (ii) Leave earned by duty, viz. Earned leave, Half Pay leave, and Commuted leave;
 - (iii) Leave not earned by duty, viz. Extraordinary leave; and Leave not due;
 - (iv) Leave not debited to leave account –
 - (v) Leave for academic pursuits, viz. Study leave and Sabbatica leave/Academic leave;
 - (vi) Leave on grounds of health, viz. Maternity leave and Quarantine leave.

(b) The Executive Council/Syndicate may grant, in exceptional cases, for the reasons to be recorded, any other kinds of leave, subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem fit to impose.

J.4.1 Casual Leave

- (i) Total casual leave granted to a teacher shall not exceed 8 days in an academic year.
- (ii) Casual leave cannot be combined with any other kind of leave except special casual leave. However, such casual leave may be combined with holidays including Sundays. Holidays or Sundays falling within the period of casual leave shall not be counted as casual leave.

8.4.2 Special Casual Leave

- (i) Special casual leave, not exceeding 10 days in an academic year, may be granted to a teacher:
 - (a) To conduct examination of a university/Public Service Commission/board of examination or other similar bodies/institutions; and
 - (b) To inspect academic institutions attached to a statutory board, etc.
- (ii) In computing the 10 days' leave admissible, the days of actual journey, if any, to and from the places where activities specified above, take place, will be excluded.
- (iii) In addition, special casual leave to the extent mentioned below, may also be granted;
 - (a) To undergo sterilization operation (vasectomy or salpingectomy) under family welfare programme. Leave in this case will be restricted to 6 working days; and
 - (b) To a female teacher who undergoes non-puerperal sterilization. Leave in this case will be restricted to 14 days.
- (iv) Special casual leave cannot be accumulated, nor can it be combined with any other kind of leave except casual leave. It may be granted in combination with holidays or vacation by the sanctioning authority on each occasion;

8.3.3 Earned Leave

- (i) Earned leave admissible to a teacher shall be:
 - (a) 1/30th of actual service including vacation; plus

(b) 1/3rd of the period, if any, during which he/she is required to perform duty during vacation.

For purposes of computation of period of actual service, all periods of leave except casual, special casual and duty leave shall be excluded.

(ii) Earned leave at the credit of a teacher shall not accumulate beyond 300 days. The maximum earned leave that may be sanctioned at a time shall not exceed 60 days. Earned leave exceeding 60 days may, however, be sanctioned in the case of higher study, or training, or leave with medical certificate, or when the entire leave, or a portion thereof, is spent outside India.

For avoidance of doubt, it may be noted:

- When a teacher combines vacation with earned leave, the period of vacation shall be reckoned as leave in calculating the maximum amount of leave on average pay which may be included in the particular period of leave..
- In case where only a portion of the leave is spent outside India, the grant of leave in excess of 120 days shall be subject to the condition that the portion of the leave spent in India shall not in the aggregate exceed 120 days.
- 3. Encashment of earned leave shall be allowed to non-vacation members of the teaching staff as applicable to the employees of Central/State Governments.

8.4.4 Half-pay Leave

Half-pay leave admissible to a permanent teacher shall be 20 days for each completed year of service. Such leave may be granted on the basis of medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner, for private affairs or for academic purposes.

Explanation:

A "completed year of service" means continuous service of specified duration under the university and includes periods of absence from duty as well as leave including extraordinary leave.

8.4.5 Commuted Leave

Commuted leave: not exceeding half the amount of half pay leave due, may be granted on the basis of medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner to a permanent teacher subject to the following conditions:

- (i) Commuted leave during the entire service shall be limited to a maximum of 240 days:
- When commuted leave is granted, twice the amount of such leave shall be debited against the half-pay leave due; and

(iii) The total duration of earned leave and commuted leave taken in conjunction shall not exceed 240 days at a time. *Provided* that no commuted leave shall be granted under these rules unless the authority competent to sanction leave has reason to believe that the teacher will return to duty on its expiry.

8.4.6 Extraordinary Leave

- (i) A permanent teacher may be granted extraordinary leave when:
 - (a) No other leave is admissible; or
 - (b) Other leave is admissible and the teacher applies in writing for the grant of extraordinary leave.
- (ii) Extraordinary leave shall always be without pay and allowances. Extraordinary leave shall not count for increment except in the following cases:
 - (a) Leave taken on the basis of medical certificates;
 - (b) Cases where the Vice Chancellor/Principal is satisfied that the leave was taken due to causes beyond the control of the teacher, such as inability to join or rejoin duty due to civil commotion or a natural calamity, provided the teacher has no other kind of leave to his credit;
 - (c) Leave taken for pursuing higher studies; and
 - (d) Leave granted to accept an invitation to a teaching post or fellowship or research-cum- teaching post or on assignment for technical or academic work of importance.
- (iii) Extraordinary leave may be combined with any other leave except casual leave and special casual leave, provided that the total period of continuous absence from duty on leave (including periods of vacation when such vacation is taken in conjunction with leave) shall not exceed three years except in cases where leave is taken on medical certificate. The total period of absence from duty shall in no case exceed five years in the full working life of the individual.
- (iv) The authority empowered to grant leave may commute retrospectively periods of absence without leave into extraordinary leave.

8.4.7 Leave Not Due

(i) Leave not due, may, at the discretion of the Vice Chancellor/Principal, be granted to a permanent teacher for a period not exceeding 360 days during the entire period of service, out of which not more than 90 days at a time and 180 days in all may be otherwise than on medical certificate. Such leave shall be debited against the half-pay leave earned by him/her subsequently.

- (ii) 'Leave not due' shall not be granted, unless the Vice Chancellor/Principal is satisfied that as far as can reasonably be foreseen, the teacher will return to duty on the expiry of the leave and earn the leave granted.
- (ii) A teacher to whom 'leave not due' is granted shall not be permitted to tender his/her resignation from service so long as the debit balance in his/her leave account is not wiped off by active service, or he/she refunds the amount paid to him/her as pay and allowances for the period not so earned. In a case where retirement is unavoidable on account of reason of ill health, incapacitating the teacher for further service, refund of leave salary for the period of leave still to be earned may be waived by the Executive Council.

Provided that the Executive Council may waive off, in any other exceptional, for reasons to be recorded in writing, the refund of leave salary for the period of leave still to be earned.

8.4.8 Maternity Leave

- (i) Maternity leave on full pay may be granted to a woman teacher for a period not exceeding 180 days, to be availed of twice in the entire career. Maternity leave may also be granted in case of miscarriage including abortion, subject to the condition that the total leave granted in respect of this to a woman teacher in her career is not more than 45 days, and the application for leave is supported by a medical certificate.
- (ii) Maternity leave may be combined with earned leave, half pay leave or extraordinary leave but any leave applied for in continuation of maternity leave may be granted if the request is supported by a medical certificate.

8.4.9 Child Care Leave

Women teachers having minor children may be granted leave up to two years for taking care of their minor children. Child care leave for a maximum period of two years (730-days) may be granted to the women teachers during entire service period in lines with Central Government women employees. In the cases, where the child care leave is granted more than 45 days, the University/College/Institution may appoint a part time / quest substitute teacher with intimation to the UGC.

8.4.10 Paternity Leave

Paternity leave of 15 days may be granted to male teachers during the confinement of their wives, and such leave shall granted only up to two children.

8.4.11 Adoption leave

Adoption leave may be provided as per the rules of the Central Government.

9. RESEARCH PROMOTION GRANT

The UGC or the respective agency (Central/State Governments) may provide a start-up grant at the level of Rs. 3.0 lakhs in Social Sciences, Humanities and Languages and Rs. 6.0 lakhs in Sciences and Technology to teachers and other non-vocational academic staff to take up research immediately after their appointments.

9.1. CONSULTANCY ASSIGNMENTS

The consultancy rules, terms, conditions and the model of revenue sharing between institutions and consultant teachers shall be as per the UGC Consultancy Rules to be provided separately.

10.0 COUNTING OF PAST SERVICES FOR DIRECT RECRUITMENT AND PROMOTION UNDER CAS

- 10.1. Previous regular service, whether national or international, as Assistant Professor, Associate Professor or Professor or equivalent in a University, College, National Laboratories or other scientific/professional Organizations such as the CSIR, ICAR, DRDO, UGC, ICSSR, ICHR, ICMR, DBT, etc., should be counted for direct recruitment and promotion under CAS of a teacher as Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, Professor or any other nomenclature these posts are described as per Appendix III Table No. II provided that:
 - (a) The essential qualifications of the post held were not lower than the qualifications prescribed by the UGC for Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor as the case may be.
 - (b) The post is/was in an equivalent grade or of the pre-revised scale of pay as the post of Assistant Professor (Lecturer) Associate Professor (Reader) and Professor.
 - (c) The candidate for direct recruitment has applied through proper channel only.
 - (d) The concerned Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor should possess the same minimum qualifications as prescribed by the UGC for appointment to the post of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor, as the case may be.
 - (e) The post was filled in accordance with the prescribed selection procedure as laid down in the Regulations of University/State Government/Central Government/Concerned Institutions, for such appointments.
 - (f) The previous appointment was not as guest lecturer for any duration, or an ad hoc or in a leave vacancy of less than one year duration. Ad hoc or temporary service of more than one year duration can be counted provided that:
 - the period of service was of more than one year duration;
 - (ii) the incumbent was appointed on the recommendation of duly constituted Selection Committee; and

- (iii) the incumbent was selected to the permanent post in continuation to the ad hoc or temporary service, without any break.
- (g) No distinction should be made with reference to the nature of management of the institution where previous service was rendered (private/local body/Government), was considered for counting past services under this clause.

11.0 PERIOD OF PROBATION AND CONFIRMATION

- 11.1. The minimum period of probation shall be one year extendable by a maximum period of one more year in case of unsatisfactory performance.
- 11.2. The confirmation at the end of one year shall be automatic, unless extended for another year by a specific order; before expiry of the first year.
- 11.3 Subject to this Clause 11, it is obligatory on the part of the university/the concerned institution to issue an order of confirmation to the incumbents within 45 days of completion of probationary period after due process of verification of satisfactory performance
- 11.4 Probation and confirmation rules are applicable only at the initial stage of recruitment, issued from time to time, by Central Government.
- 11.5 All other Central Government rules on probation and confirmation shall be applicable mutatis mutandis.

12.0 CREATION AND FILLING UP OF TEACHING POSTS

- 12.1. Teaching posts in universities, as far as feasible, may be created in a pyramidal order, that is, for instance, for one post of Professor, there shall be two posts of Associate Professors and four posts of Assistant Professors, per department.
- 12.2. All the sanctioned/approved posts in the university system shall be filled up on an urgent basis.

13.0 APPOINTMENTS ON CONTRACT BASIS

13.1. The teachers should be appointed on contract basis only when it is absolutely necessary and when the student-teacher ratio does not satisfy the laid down norms. In any case, the number of such appointments should not exceed 10% of the total number of faculty positions in a College/University. The qualifications and selection procedure for appointing them should be the same as those applicable to a regularly appointed teacher. The fixed emoluments paid to such contract teachers should not be less than the monthly gross salary of a regularly appointed Assistant Professor. Such appointments should not be made initially for more than one academic session, and the performance of any such entrant teacher should be reviewed for academic performance before reappointing her/him on contract basis for another session.

14.0 TEACHING DAYS

14.1. The Universities/Colleges must adopt at least 180 working days, i.e. there should be a minimum of 30 weeks of actual teaching in a 6-day week. Of the remaining period, 12 weeks may be devoted to admission and examination activities, and non-instructional days for co-curricular, sports, college day, etc., 8 weeks for vacations and 2 weeks may be attributed to various public holidays. If the University adopts a 5 day week pattern, then the number of weeks should be increased correspondingly to ensure equivalent of 30 weeks of actual teaching with a 6 day week.

14.2. In lieu of curtailment of vacation by 2 weeks, the university teachers may be credited with 1/3rd of the period of earned leave. However, colleges may have an option of a total vacation of 10 weeks in a year and no earned leave except when required to work during the vacations for which, as in the case of University teachers, 1/3 of the period will be credited as Earned Leave.

5.0. WORKLOAD

15.1. The workload of the teachers in full employment should not be less than 40 hours a week for 30 working weeks (180 teaching days) in an academic year. It should be necessary for the teacher to be available for at least 5 hours daily in the University/College for which necessary space and infrastructure should be provided by the University/College. Direct teaching-learning process hours should be as follows:

Assistant Professor

16 hours

Associate Professor and Professor

14 hours

15.2 A relaxation of two hours in the workload may, however, be given to Professors who are actively involved in extension activities and administration. A minimum of 6 hours per week may have to be allocated for research activities of a teacher.

16.0 SERVICE AGREEMENT AND FIXING OF SENIORITY

- 16.1. At the time of recruitment in Universities and Colleges, a service agreement should be executed between the University/College and the teacher concerned and a copy of the same should be deposited with the Registrar/Principal. Such service agreement shall be duly stamped as per the rates applicable.
- 16.2. The self-appraisal or linked Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) methodology shall form part of the service agreement/Record.
- 16.3. Inter-se seniority between the direct recruited and teachers promoted under CAS

The inter-se seniority of a direct recruit shall be determined with reference to the date of joining and for the teachers promoted under CAS with reference to the date of eligibility as indicated in the recommendations of the selection committee of the respective candidates. The rules and regulations of the respective Central/State Government shall apply, for all other matters of seniority.

17.0. CODE OF PROFESSIONAL ETHICS

I. TEACHERS AND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES:

Whoever adopts teaching as a profession assumes the obligation to conduct himself / herself in accordance with the ideal of the profession. A teacher is constantly under the scrutiny of his students and the society at large. Therefore, every teacher should see that there is no incompatibility between his precepts and practice. The national ideals of education which have already been set forth and which he/she should seek to inculcate among students must be his/her own ideals. The profession further requires that the teachers should be calm, patient and communicative by temperament and amiable in disposition.

Teachers should:

- Adhere to a responsible pattern of conduct and demeanour expected of them by the community;
- (ii) Manage their private affairs in a manner consistent with the dignity of the profession;
- (iii) Seek to make professional growth continuous through study and research;
- (iv) Express free and frank opinion by participation at professional meetings, seminars, conferences etc. towards the contribution of knowledge;
- (v) Maintain active membership of professional organizations and strive to improve education and profession through them;
- (vi) Perform their duties in the form of teaching, tutorial, practical, seminar and research work conscientiously and with dedication;
- (vii) Co-operate and assist in carrying out functions relating to the educational responsibilities of the college and the university such as: assisting in appraising applications for admission, advising and counseling students as well as assisting the conduct of university and college examinations, including supervision, invigilation and evaluation; and
- (viii) Participate in extension, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities including community service.

II. TEACHERS AND THE STUDENTS

Teachers should:

- (i) Respect the right and dignity of the student in expressing his/her opinion;
- (ii) Deaf justly and impartially with students regardless of their religion, caste, political, economic, social and physical characteristics;
- (ii) Recognize the difference in aptitude and capabilities among students and strive to meet their individual needs;
- (iv) Encourage students to improve their attainments, develop their personalities and at the same time contribute to community welfare;
- (v) Inculcate among students scientific outlook and respect for physical labour and ideals of democracy, patriotism and peace;
- (vi) Be affectionate to the students and not behave in a vindictive manner towards any of them for any reason;
- (vii) Pay attention to only the attainment of the student in the assessment of merit;

- (viii) Make themselves available to the students even beyond their class hours and help and guide students without any remuneration or reward;
- (ix) Aid students to develop an understanding of our national heritage and national goals; and
- (x) Refrain from inciting students against other students, colleagues or administration.

III. TEACHERS AND COLLEAGUES

Teachers should:

- (i) Treat other members of the profession in the same manner as they themselves wish to be treated;
- (ii) Speak respectfully of other teachers and render assistance for professional betterment;
- (iii) Refrain from lodging unsubstantiated allegations against colleagues to higher authorities; and
- (iv) Refrain from allowing considerations of caste, creed, religion, race or sex in their professional endeavour.

IV. TEACHERS AND AUTHORITIES:

Teachers should:

- (i) Discharge their professional responsibilities according to the existing rules and adhere to procedures and methods consistent with their profession in initiating steps through their own institutional bodies and/or professional organizations for change of any such rule detrimental to the professional interest;
- (ii) Refrain from undertaking any other employment and commitment including private tuitions and coaching classes which are likely to interfere with their professional responsibilities;
- (iii) Co-operate in the formulation of policies of the institution by accepting various offices and discharge responsibilities which such offices may demand;
- (iv) Co-operate through their organizations in the formulation of policies of the other institutions and accept offices;
- (v) Co-operate with the authorities for the betterment of the institutions keeping in view the interest and in conformity with dignity of the profession;
- (vi) Should adhere to the conditions of contract;

- (vii) Give and expect due notice before a change of position is made; and
- (viii) Refrain from availing themselves of leave except on unavoidable grounds and as far as practicable with prior intimation, keeping in view their particular responsibility for completion of academic schedule.

V. TEACHERS AND NON-TEACHING STAFF:

- (i) Teachers should treat the non-teaching staff as colleagues and equal partners in a cooperative undertaking, within every educational institution; and
- (ii) Teachers should help in the function of joint staff-councils covering both teachers and the non-teaching staff.

VI. TEACHERS AND GUARDIANS

Teachers should:

(i) Try to see through teachers' bodies and organizations, that institutions maintain contact with the guardians, their students, send reports of their performance to the guardians whenever necessary and meet the guardians in meetings convened for the purpose for mutual exchange of ideas and for the benefit of the institution.

VII. TEACHERS AND SOCIETY

Teachers should:

- Recognize that education is a public service and strive to keep the public informed of the educational programmes which are being provided;
- (ii) Work to improve education in the community and strengthen the community's moral and intellectual life;
- (iii) Be aware of social problems and take part in such activities as would be conducive to the progress of society and hence the country as a whole;
- (iv) Perform the duties of citizenship, participate in community activities and shoulder responsibilities of public offices;
- (v) Refrain from taking part in or subscribing to or assisting in any way activities which tend to promote feeling of hatred or enmity among different communities, religions or linguistic groups but actively work for National Integration.

- 1.0. Persons entering the teaching profession in universities and colleges shall be designated as Assistant Professors and shall be placed in the Pay Band III of Rs.15,600 Rs. 39,100 with AGP of Rs. 6,000. Lecturers already in service in the pre-revised scale of Rs. 8,000 Rs.13,500, shall be re-designated as Assistant Professors with the said AGP of Rs. 6,000. Their CAS promotions would be subject to the API criteria based PBAS system norms laid out in these regulations
- 1.1. An Assistant Professor with completed service of four years, possessing Ph. D. Degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible, for moving to AGP of Rs.7,000.
- 1.2. An Assistant Professors possessing M.Phil. Degree or post-graduate degree in professional courses approved by the relevant statutory Body, such as LL.M. / M.Tech., etc. shall be eligible for the AGP of Rs. 7,000 after completion of five years service as Assistant Professor.
- 1.3. An Assistant Professors who do not have Ph.D. or M.Phil. or a Master degree in the relevant Professional course shall be eligible for the AGP of Rs. 7,000 only after completion of six years' service as Assistant Professor.
- 1.4. The upward movement from AGP of Rs. 6,000 to AGP of Rs. 7,000 for all Assistant Professors shall be subject to their satisfying the API criteria based PBAS conditions as laid down by the UGC in these Regulations.
- 2.0. The pay of the incumbents to the posts of Lecturer (senior scale) (i.e. the unrevised scale of Rs. 10,000 Rs.15,200) shall be re-designated as Assistant Professor, and shall be fixed at the appropriate stage in Pay Band III of Rs.15,600 Rs. 39,100 based on their present pay, with AGP of Rs. 7,000.
- 2.1. Assistant Professors with completed service of five years at the AGP of Rs. 7,000 shall be eligible, subject to other API requirements laid down by these UGC Regulations, to move up to the AGP of Rs. 8,000.
- 3.0. Posts of Associate Professor shall be in the Pay Band IV of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000, with AGP of Rs. 9,000. Directly recruited Associate Professors under these Regulations shall be placed in the Pay Band IV of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000 with an AGP of Rs. 9,000, at the appropriate stage in the Pay Band in terms of the conditions of appointment.
- 3.1 Incumbent Readers and Lecturers (Selection Grade) who have completed three years in the current pay scale of Rs. 12,000 – Rs. 18,300 on 1 January, 2006 shall be placed

Incumbent Readers and Lecturers (Selection Grade) who had not completed three years in the pay scale of Rs.12,000 Rs.18,300 on or after 1 January, 2006 shall be placed at the appropriate stage in the Pay Band of Rs.15,600 Rs. 39,100 with AGP of Rs. 8,000 till they complete three years of service in the grade of Lecturer (Selection Grade) / Reader, and thereafter shall be placed in the higher Pay Band IV of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000 and accordingly re-designated as Associate Professor.
- 3.3. Readers/Lecturers (Selection Grade) in service at present shall continue to be designated as Lecturer (Selection Grade) or Readers, as the case may be, until they are placed in the Pay Band of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000 and re-designated as Associate Professor in the manner described in 3.1 and 3.2. above.
- 3.4. Assistant Professors completing three years of teaching in the AGP of Rs. 8,000 shall be eligible, subject to the qualifying conditions prescribed by these Regulations, to move to the Pay Band IV of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000 with AGP of Rs. 9,000 and to be designated as Associate Professor.
- 3.5. Associate Professor completing three years of service in the AGP of Rs. 9,000 and possessing a Ph.D. Degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible to be appointed and designated as Professor, subject to satisfying the required credit points as per API based on PBAS methodology provided in Appendix IV, Table I-III stipulated in these Regulations and assessment by a duly constituted selection committee as suggested for the direct recruitment of Professor. No teacher other than those with a Ph.D. shall be promoted or appointed as Professor. The Pay Band IV for the post of Professors shall be Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000 with AGP of Rs. 10,000.
- 4.0. The pay of a directly recruited Professor shall be fixed at a stage not below Rs.43,000 in the Pay Band IV of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000, with the applicable AGP of Rs.10,000.
- 4.1. Ten percent of the positions of Professors in a university shall be eligible to be placed in the higher AGP of Rs.12,000. However, teachers promoted to the posts with higher AGP of Rs.12,000, shall continue to be designated as Professor. Eligibility for elevation as a Professor in the higher Academic Grade Pay of Rs.12,000, shall be a minimum of ten years of teaching and research experience as professor either in the pre-revised scale of Professor's Pay of Rs.16,400 Rs. 22,400 or the revised scale of Pay Band IV of Professor with AGP of Rs.10,000 on satisfying the required API score as per Tables I and II through the PBAS methodology stipulated in these Regulations through a duly constituted Expert committee;

5.0. PAY SCALES OF PRINCIPALS IN COLLEGES:

2.1 PRINCIPAL OF UNDER GRADUATE COLLEGES:

The posts of Principal in Under Graduate Colleges shall be in the Pay Band of Rs. 37,400 – Rs. 67,000 with AGP of Rs.10,000, plus a Special Allowance of Rs. 2,000 per month and shall also be fixed at a stage not below Rs. 43,000 as in the directly recruited

5.2 PRINCIPAL OF POST GRADUATE COLLEGES:

Posts of Principal in Post Graduate Colleges shall also be in the Pay Band of Rs. 37,400 – Rs. 67,000 with AGP of Rs.10,000, plus a Special Allowance of Rs. 3,000 per month and shall also be fixed at a stage not below Rs. 43,000 as in the case of directly recruited Professors. All Principals in service shall be appropriately fixed in the Pay Band IV with the AGP of Rs.10,000.

- (i) Assistant University Librarian (Sr. Scale)/ College Librarian (Sr. Scale) in the prerevised scale of pay of Rs.10,000 - Rs. 15,200 shall be placed in the Pay Band of Rs.15,600 - Rs. 39,100 with AGP of Rs.7,000.
- (ii) Assistant University Librarian / College Librarian possessing Ph.D. in Library Science, after completing service of four years in the AGP of Rs. 6,000, and if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system, and PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC in these Regulations, shall be eligible for the higher AGP of Rs. 7,000 with the Pay Band of Rs.15,600 − Rs. 39,100.
- (iii) Assistant Librarian / College Librarian not possessing Ph.D. but only M.Phil. in Library Science at the entry level after completing service of five years in the AGP of Rs. 6,000, if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC in these Regulations, shall become eligible for the higher AGP of Rs. 7,000.
- (iv) After completing service of six years in the AGP of Rs. 6,000 Assistant Librarian / College Librarian without the relevant Ph.D. and M.Phil. shall, if otherwise eligible as per API scoring system and PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC in these Regulations, move to the higher AGP of Rs. 7,000.

(v) The pay of the existing Assistant Librarian (Sr. Scale) / College Librarian (Sr. Scale) in the pre-revised scale of pay of Rs.10,000 – Rs.15,200 shall be fixed in the Pay Band of Rs.15,600 – Rs. 39,100 with AGP of Rs.7,000 at an appropriate stage based on their present pay.

6.3. DEPUTY LIBRARIAN / ASSISTANT LIBRARIAN (SELECTION GRADE) / COLLEGE LIBRARIAN (SELECTION GRADE):

- (i) Deputy Librarians who are directly recruited shall be placed in the Pay Band of Rs. 15,600 Rs. 39,100 with AGP of Rs. 8,000
- (ii) On completion of service of five years, Assistant Librarian (Sr. Scale) / College Librarian (Sr. Scale) shall be eligible for the post of Deputy Librarian/ equivalent posts in Pay Band of Rs.15,600 Rs. 39,100, with Academic Grade Pay of Rs. 8,000, subject to their fulfilling other conditions of eligibility (such as Ph.D. degree, etc. for Deputy Librarian) as per API scoring system based PBAS methodology laid down by the UGC for CAS promotion in these Regulations. - (v) Incumbents to the posts of Deputy Librarian / Assistant Librarian (Selection Grade)/College Librarian (Selection Grade) who have completed three years in the pre-revised pay scale of Rs. 12,000 Rs. 18,300 on 1 January, 2006 shall be fixed at an appropriate stage in the Pay Band of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000 with an AGP of Rs. 9,000. They shall continue to be designated as Deputy Librarian / Assistant Librarian (Selection Grade)/College Librarian (Selection Grade)
- (vi) Incumbents to the posts of Deputy Librarian / Assistant Librarian (Selection Grade) /College Librarian (Selection Grade) who have not completed the requirement of three years in the pre-revised pay scale of Rs.12,000 Rs. 18,300, for being eligible to be placed in the higher Pay Band of Rs. 37,400 Rs. 67,000, shall be placed at an appropriate stage with Academic Grade Pay of Rs. 8,000 till they complete three years of service as Deputy Librarian / Assistant Librarian (Selection Grade)/College Librarian (Selection Grade)

INCENTIVES FOR Ph.D. / M.Phil. AND OTHER HIGHER QUALIFICATION TO TAKE 9.0. EFFECT FROM 01-09-2008.

- 9.1. Five non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible at the entry level of recruitment as Assistant Professor to persons possessing the degree of Ph.D. awarded in a relevant discipline by the University following the process of admission, registration, course work and external evaluation as prescribed by the UGC.
- 9.2. M.Phil. Degree holders at the time of recruitment to the post of Assistant Professor shall be entitled to 2 non-compounded advance increments.
- Those possessing Post-graduate degree in the professional course such as °9.3. LL.M./M.Tech./M.Arch./M.E./M.V.Sc./M.D., etc. recognized by the relevant statutory body / council, shall also be entitled to 2 non-compounded advance increments at the entry level.
 - 9.4 Teachers who complete their Ph.D. Degree white in service shall be (i) entitled to 3 non-compounded increments if such Ph.D. is in a relevant discipline of the discipline of employment and has been awarded by a University complying with the process prescribed by the UGC for enrolment, course work, evaluation, etc.
 - However, teachers in service who have already been awarded Ph.D. by (ii) the time of coming into force of these Regulations or having been enrolled for Ph.D. have already undergone course-work as well as evaluation, if any, and only Notification in regard to the award of Ph.D. is awaited, shall also be entitled to the award of 3 non-compounded increments even if the

university awarding such Ph.D. has not yet been notified by the UGC as having complied with the process prescribed by the Commission.

- 9.5. In respect of every other case, a teacher who is already enrolled for Ph.D. shall avail the benefit of 3 non-compounded increments only if the university awarding the Ph.D. has been notified by the UGC to have complied with the process prescribed by the Commission for the award of Ph.D. in respect of either coursework or evaluation or both, as the case may be.
- 9.6 Teachers in service who have not yet enrolled for Ph.D. shall therefore derive the benefit of 3 non-compounded increments on award of Ph.D., while in service only if such enrolment is with a university which complies with the entire process, including that of enrolment as prescribed by the UGC.
- 9.7 Teachers who acquire M.Phil. Degree or a post graduate degree in a professional course recognized by the relevant Statutory Body/Council, while in service, shall be entitled to one advance increment.
- 9.8 Five non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible to Assistant Librarian / College Librarian who are recruited at entry level with Ph.D. degree in the discipline of library science from a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC in respect of enrolment, course-work and evaluation process for the award of Ph.D. in Library Science.
- 9.8.1 (i) Assistant Librarian / College Librarian acquiring the degree of Ph.D. at any time while in service, in the discipline of library science from a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC in respect of enrolment, course-work and evaluation shall be entitled to 3 non-compounded advance increments.
 - (ii) However, persons in posts of Assistant Librarian / College Librarian or higher positions who have already been awarded Ph.D. in library science at the time of coming into force of these Regulations or having already undergone course-work as well as evaluation, if any, and only Notification in regard to the award of Ph.D. is awaited, shall also be entitled to the award of 3 non-compounded increments, even if the university awarding such Ph.D. has not yet been notified by the UGC as having complied with the process prescribed by the Commission.
- 9.8.2 In respect of every other case of persons in the posts of Assistant Librarian / College Librarian or higher positions who are already enrolled for Ph.D. shall avail the benefit of 3 non-compounded increments only if the university awarding the Ph.D. has been notified by the UGC to have complied with the process prescribed by the Commission for the award of Ph.D. in respect of either coursework or evaluation or both, as the case may be.
- 9.8.3. Assistant Librarian / College Librarian and others in higher Library positions in service who have not yet enrolled for Ph. D. shall therefore derive the benefit of a non-compounded increments on award of Ph.D. while in service only if such

enrolment is with a university which complies with the entire process, including that of enrolment as prescribed by the UGC.

- 9.8.4. Two non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible for Assistant Librarian / College Librarian with M.Phil. degree in Library Science at the entry level, Assistant Librarian / College Librarian and those in higher positions acquiring M. Phil. degree in Library Science at any time during the course of their service shall be entitled to one advance increment.
- 9.9 Five non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible to Assistant Director of Physical Education and Sports / College Director of Physical Education and Sports who are recruited at entry level with Ph.D. degree in the discipline of Physical Education from a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC in respect of enrolment, course work and evaluation process for the award of Ph.D. in Physical Education.
- 9.10. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing clauses, those who have already availed the benefits of advance increments for possessing Ph.D. / M.Phil. at the entry level under the earlier Schemes / Regulations shall not be entitled to the benefit of advance increments under these Regulations.
- 9.11. Teachers, Library and Physical Education cadres who have already availed the benefits of increments as per the then existing policy for acquiring Ph.D. / M. Phil while in service, shall not be entitled to advance increments under these Regulations.
- 9.12. For posts at the entry level where no such advance increments were admissible for possessing Ph.D./M. Phil under the earlier Schemes / Regulations, the benefit of advance increments for possessing Ph.D./M. Phil shall be available to only those appointments which have been made on or after the coming into force of these Regulations.

10.0 OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

10.1. INCREMENTS

- 10.2. Each annual increment shall be equivalent to 3% of the sum total of pay in the relevant Pay Band and the AGP as applicable for the respective stage in the Pay Band.
- 10.3. Each advance increment shall also be at the rate of 3% of the sum total of pay in the relevant Pay Band and the AGP as applicable and shall be noncompoundable.
- 10.4. The number of additional increment(s) on placement at each higher stage of AGP shall be as per the existing Schemes / Regulations of increment on promotion from lower Pay Scale to higher Pay Scale; however, in view of the considerable raise in effective pay between the two Pay Bands, there shall be no

additional increment on movement from the Pay Band of Rs.15,600 - Rs. 39,100 to the Pay Band of Rs. 37,400 - Rs. 67,000.

10.5 All issues relating to grant of advance increments to teachers engaged in engineering / technical courses in the university system shall be subject to recommendations of the Committee separately constituted by the Central Government for pay review of teachers in technical education.

11.0 ALLOWANCES:

11.1. Allowances such as Leave Travel Concession, Special Compensatory Allowances, Children's Education Allowance, Transport Allowance, House Rent Allowance, Deputation Allowance, Traveling Allowance, Dearness Allowance, area based Special Compensatory Allowance etc. as applicable to teachers and Library and Physical Education Cadres, shall be at par with that of Central Government employees.

Sir.

I am directed to say that the Government of India have decided, after taking into consideration the recommendations made by the University Grants Commission (UGC) based on the decisions taken at the meeting of the Commission held on 7-8 October 2008, to revise the pay scales of teachers in the Central Universities. The revision of pay scales of teachers shall be subject to various provisions of the Scheme of revision of pay scales as contained in this letter, and Regulations to be framed by the UGC in this behalf in accordance with the Scheme given below. The revised pay scales and other provisions of the Scheme are as under:-

1. General

- (i) There shall be only three designations in respect of teachers in universities and colleges, namely, Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors. However, there shall be no change in the present designation in respect of Library and Physical Education Personnel at various levels.
- (ii) No one shall be eligible to be appointed, promoted or designated as Professor, unless he or she possesses a Ph.D. and satisfies other academic conditions, as laid downy the University Grants Commission (UGC) from time to time. This shall, however, not affect those who are already designated as 'Professor'.
- (iii) The pay of teachers and equivalent positions in Universities and Colleges shall be fixed according to their designations in two pay bands of Rs. 15600-39100 and Rs.37400-67000 with appropriate "Academic Grade Pay" (AGP in short). Each Pay Band shall have different stages of Academic Grade Pay which shall ensure that teachers and other equivalent cadres covered under this Scheme, subject to other conditions of eligibility being satisfied, have multiple opportunities for upward movement during their career.

- (iv) Posts of Professors shall be created in under-graduate (UG) colleges as well as in post-graduate (PG) colleges. The number of posts of Professors in a UG College shall be equivalent to 10 percent of the number of posts-of Associate Professors in that College. There shall be as many posts of Professors in each PG College as the number of Departments in that College. No new Departments shall be created in UG or PG Colleges without prior approval of the UGC.
- (v) Up to 10% of the posts of Professors in universities shall be in the higher Academic Grade Pay of Rs. 12000 with eligibility conditions to be prescribed by the UGC.
- (vi) National Eligibility Test (NET) shall be compulsory for appointment at the entry level of Assistant Professor, subject to the exemptions to the degree of Ph.D. in respect of those persons obtaining the award through a process of registration, course-work and external evaluation, as have been/ or may be laid down by the UGC through its regulations, and so adopted by the University. NET shall not be required for such Masters' programmes in disciplines for which there is no NET.
- 2. Revised Pay Scales, Service conditions and Career Advancement Scheme for teachers and equivalent positions:

The pay structure for different categories of teachers and equivalent positions shall be as indicated below:-

- (a) Assistant Professor / Associate Professors / Professors in Colleges & Universities
- (i) Persons entering the teaching profession in Universities and Colleges shall be designated as Assistant Professors and shall be placed in the Pay Band of Rs.1560039100 with AGP of Rs,6000. Lecturers already in service in the pre-revised scale of Rs. 8000-13500, shall be redesignated as Assistant Professors with the said AGP of Rs. 6000.
- (ii) An Assistant Professor with completed service of 4 years, possessing Ph.D Degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible, for moving up to AGP of Rs. 7000.
- (iii) Assistant Professors possessing M.Phil degree or post-graduate degree in professional courses approved by the relevant Statutory Body, such as LL:M/M.Tech etc. shall be eligible for the AGP of Rs. 7,000 after completion of 5 years service as Assistant Professor.
- (iv) Assistant Professors who do not have Ph.D or M.Phil or a Master's degree in the relevant Professional course shall be eligible for the AGP of Rs. 7,000 only after completion of 6 years' service as Assistant Professor.
- (v) The upward movement from AGP of Rs. 6000 to AGP of Rs. 7000 for all Assistant Professors shall be subject to their satisfying other conditions as laid down by the UGC.
- (vi) The pay of the incumbents to the posts of Lecturer (senior scale) (i.e. the unrevised scale of Rs. 10,000-15200) shall be re-designated as Assistant Professor, and shall be fixed at the appropriate stage in Pay Band of Rs.15600-39100 based on their present pay, with AGP of Rs. 7000.
- (vii) Assistant Professors with completed service of 5 years at the AGP of Rs. 7000 shall be eligible, subject to other requirements laid down by the UGC, to move up to the AGP of Rs.

- (viii) Posts of Associate Professor shall be in the Pay Band of Rs.37400-67000, with AGP of Rs.9000. Directly recruited Associate Professors shall be placed in the Pay Band of Rs. 37400-67000 with an AGP of Rs. 9000, at-the appropriate stage in the Pay Band in terms of the conditions of appointment.

- (xiv) The pay of a directly recruited Professor shall be fixed at a stage not below Rs. 43000 in the Pay Band of Rs. 37400-67000, with the applicable AGP of Rs. 10000.
- (xv) Ten percent of the posts of Professors in a university shall be in the higher AGP of R 12000, however, teachers appointed to the posts shall continue to be designated as Professor. Eligibility for appointment as a Professor in the higher Academic Grade Pay shall be as may be laid down by the UGC, and such eligibility conditions shall, inter alia, include publications in peer reviewed/ refereed Research Journals, and the requirement of at least 10 years of teaching as Professor and post-doctoral work of a high standard. No person appointed directly as Professor in the AGP of Rs. 12000 shall be fixed at a stage less than Rs. 48000 along with the AGP.
- (xvi) For initial direct recruitment at the level of Associate Professors and Professors, the eligibility conditions in respect of academic and research requirements shall be as may be or have been prescribed by the UGC through Regulations and as may be laid down by the

(xvii) Discretionary award of advance increments for those who enter the profession as Associate Professors or Professors with higher merit, high number of research publications and experience at the appropriate level, shall be within the competence of the appropriate cuthority of the concerned University or recruiting institution while negotiating with individual candidates in the context of the merits of each case, taking into account the pay structure of other teachers in the faculty and other specific factors.

(b) Professors in Under Graduate and Post Graduate Colleges:

(xviii) Ten percent of the number of sanctioned posts of Associate Professor in an Under Graduate College shall be that of Professors and shall be subject to the same criterion for selection/ appointment as that of Professors in Universities, provided that there shall not be more than one post of Professor in each Department; and provided further that One-fourth (25%) of the posts of Professor in UG Colleges shall be directly recruited or filled on deputation by eligible teachers and the remaining three-fourths (75%) of posts of Professors shall be filled by merit promotion from among eligible Associate Professors of the relevant department of the sinder Graduate College. Identification of posts of Professor in an Under Graduate College for being filled through direct recruitment/deputation shall be within the competence of the University acting in consultation with the College. Where the number of posts of Professor worked out as a percentage of the number of posts of Associate Professor for merit promotion or direct recruitment/ deputation is not an integer, the same shall be rounded off to the next higher integer.

(xix) There shall be one post of Professor in each Department of a Post Graduate College and shall be subject to the same criterion for selection/ appointment as that of Professors in Universities, provided that One-fourth (25%) of the posts of Professor shall be filled on deputation/direct recruitment from among eligible teachers and the remaining three-fourths (75%) of posts shall be filled through merit promotion from among the eligible Associate Professors in the relevant department of the Post Graduate College. Identification of posts of postsor in a Post Graduate College for being filled through direct recruitment/deputation shall be within the competence of the University acting in consultation with the College. Where the number of posts of professor for merit promotion or direct recruitment/ deputation worked out as a percentage of the total number of posts in a Post Graduate College is not an integer, the same shall be rounded off to the next higher integer. The UGC shall issue separate guidelines to ensure availability of minimum standards of academic infrastructure (library, research facilities etc.) for starting Post Graduate Courses in Colleges.

3. Pay Scales of Pro Vice Chancellor / Vice Chancellor of Universities:

(i) Pro-Vice Chancellor

The posts of Pro-Vice Chancellor shall be in the Pay Band of Rs.37400-67000 with AGP of Rs. 10000 or Rs. 12000, as the case may be, along with a Special Allowance of Rs.4000 per month, subject to the condition that the sum total of pay in the Pay Band, the Academic Grade Pay and the Special Allowance shall not exceed Rs. 80,000.

(ii) Vice Chancellor

The posts of Vice Chancellor shall carry a fixed pay of Rs. 75000 along with a Special

7. Incentives for Ph. D./M.Phil and other higher qualification:

- (i) Five non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible at the entry level of recruitment as Assistant Professor to persons possessing the degree of Ph.D. awarded in the relevant discipline by a university following the process of registration, coursework and external evaluation as prescribed by the UGC.
- (ii) M.Phil degree holders at the time of recruitment to the post of Assistant Professor shall be entitled to two non-compounded advance increments.
- (iii) Those possessing Post Graduate degree in a professional course such as LL.M/M.Tech etc., recognised by the relevant Statutory Body/Council, shall also be entitled to 2 non-compounded advance increments at the entry level.
- (iv) Teachers who complete their Ph.D. degree while in service shall be entitled to three non-compounded increments if such Ph.D. is in the relevant discipline and has been awarded by a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC for enrolment, course-work and evaluation etc.
- (v) However, teachers in service who have been awarded Ph.D. at the time of coming into force of this Scheme or having been enrolled for Ph.D. have already undergone course-work, if any, as well as evaluation, and only notification in regard to the award of Ph.D. is awaited, shall also be entitled to the award of three non compounded increments even if the university awarding such Ph.D. has not yet been notified by the UGC as having complied with the process prescribed by the Commission.

- (xi) However, persons in posts of Assistant Librarian/College Librarian or higher positions who have been awarded Ph.D. in library science at the time of coming into force of this Scheme or having been enrolled for Ph.D. in library science have already undergone course-work, if any, as well as evaluation, and only notification in regard to the award of Ph.D. is awaited, shall also be entitled to the award of three noncompounded increments even if the university awarding such Ph.D. has not yet been notified by the UGC as having complied with the process prescribed by the Commission.
- (xii) in respect of every other case of persons in the posts of Assistant Librarian/ College Librarian or higher positions who are already enrolled for Ph.D. shall avail the benefit of three non-compounded increments only if the university awarding the Ph.D. has been notified by the UGC to have complied with the process prescribed by the Commission for the award of Ph.D. in respect of either course -work or evaluation or both, as the case may be.
- (xiii) Assistant Librarian/ College Librarian and others in higher Library positions in service who have not yet enrolled for Ph.D. shall therefore derive the benefit of three non-compounded increments on award of Ph.D. while in service only if such enrolment is with a university which complies with the entire process, including that of enrolment as prescribed by the UGC.
- (xiv) Two non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible for Assistant Librarian/ College Librarian with M.Phil degree in Library Science at the entry level. Assistant Librarian/ College Librarian and those in higher positions acquiring MPhil degree in Library Science at any time during the course of their service, shall be entitled to one advance increment.
- (xv) Five non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible to Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College Director of Physical Education who are recruited at entry level with Ph.D. degree in the discipline of Physical Education from a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC in respect of enrolment, course-work and evaluation process for the award of Ph.D. in Physical Education.
- (xvi) Persons in posts of Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College DPE or higher positions acquiring the degree of Ph.D in the discipline of Physical Education, at any time while in service from a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC in respect of enrolment, course-work and evaluation shall be entitled to three noncompounded advance increments.
- (xvii) However, persons in posts of Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College DPE or higher positions who have been awarded Ph.D. in Physical Education at the time of coming into force of this Scheme or having been enrolled for Ph.D. in Physical Education have already undergone course-work, if any, as well as evaluation, and only notification in regard to the award of Ph.D. is awaited, shall also be entitled to the award of three non-compounded increments even if the university awarding such Ph.D. has not yet been notified by the UGC as having complied with the process prescribed by the Commission.
- (xviii) In respect of every other case of persons in the posts of Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College DPE or higher positions who are already enrolled for Ph.D. in Physical Education shall avail the benefit of three non-compounded increments only if the university

awarding the Ph.D. has been notified by the UGC to have complied with the process prescribed by the Commission for the award of Ph.D, in respect of either course-work or evaluation or both, as the case may be.

- (xix) Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College DPE and others in higher Physical Education positions in service who have not yet enrolled for Ph.D. shall therefore derive the benefit of three non-compounded increments on award of Ph.D,
- while in service only if such enrolment is with a university which complies with the entire process, including that of enrolment as prescribed by the UGC.
- (xx) Two non-compounded advance increments shall be admissible for Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College DPE with M.Phil degree in Physical Education at the entry level. Assistant Director of Physical Education/ College DPE and those in higher positions acquiring MPhil degree in Physical Education at any time during the course of their service, shall be entitled to one advance increment.
- (xxi) Not withstanding anything in the foregoing clauses, those who have already availed the benefits of advance increments for possessing Ph.D./ M.Phil. at the entry level under the earlier scheme shall not be entitled to the benefit of advance increments under this Scheme.
- (xxii) For posts at the entry level where no such advance increments were admissible for possessing Ph.D/ M.Phil. under the earlier scheme, the benefit of five advance increments for possessing Ph.D./ M.Phil. shall be available to only those appointments which have been made on or after the coming into force of this Scheme.
- (xxiii) Teachers, Library and Physical Education cadres who have already availed the benefits of increments as per existing policy for acquiring Ph.D./M.Phil while in service, would not be entitled to benefits under this Scheme.

8. Other terms and conditions:

- (a) Increments:
- (i) Each annual increment shall be equivalent to 3% of the sum total of pay in the relevant Pay Band and the AGP as applicable for the stage in the Pay Band.
- (li) Each advance increment shall also be at the rate of 3% of the sum total of pay in the relevant Pay Band and the AGP as applicable and shall be non-compoundable.
- (iii) The number of additional increment(s) on placement at each higher stage of AGP shall be as per the existing scheme of increment on promotion from lower Pay Scale to higher Pay Scale; however, in view of the considerable raise in effective pay between the two Pay Bands, there shall be no additional increment on movement from the Pay Band of Rs. 15600-39100 to the Pay Band of Rs. 37400-67000.
- (iv) All issues relating to grant of advance increments to teachers engaged in engineering/technical courses in the university system shall be subject to recommendations of the Committee separately constituted by the Central Government for pay review of teachers in technical education.

(b) Pay fixation formula':

The pay 'fixation formula' recommended by 6th Central Pay Commission as accepted by the Central Government shall be adopted for teachers and equivalent positions in the Library and Physical Education Cadres.

(c) Allowances:

- (i) Allowances such as Leave Travel Concession, Special Compensatory Allowances, Children's Education Allowance, Transport Allowance, House Rent Allowance, Deputation Allowance, Travelling Allowance, Dearness Allowance, area based Special Compensatory Allowance etc. as applicable to teachers and Library and Physical Education Cadres, shall be at par with those accepted by the Central Government for Central Government employees on the recommendations of 6th Central Pay Commission and shall be applicable from 1.09.2008.
- (ii) For teachers and equivalent positions in Library and Physical Education cadres in UGC maintained universities/colleges and institutions deemed to be universities, the rates of allowances as applicable to Central Government Group 'A' employees shall be adopted.
- (iii) Teachers and equivalent positions in Library and Physical Education cadres, in UGC maintained universities/colleges and institutions deemed to be universities, with visual, orthopedic hearing or other disabilities under the provisions of 'Persons with Disabilities 'Protection of Rights, Equal Opportunities and Full Participation) Act, 1995' shall be entitled to twice the normal rate of transport allowance as accepted by the Central Government on the recommendations of 6th CPC for Central Government Employees with disabilities.

(d) Study Leave:

(i) University Grants Commission shall revise its guidelines in respect of granting study leave with pay for acquiring M. Phil etc. and Ph.D. in the relevant discipline while in service by relaxing the number of years to be put in after entry while keeping in mind the availability of vacant positions for teachers and other cadres in colleges and universities, so that a teacher and other cadres entering service without Ph.D. or M.Phil. or higher qualification could be encouraged to acquire these qualifications in the relevant disciplines at the earliest rather than at a later stage of the career.

(e) Research Promotion Grant:

(i) University Grants Commission shall prescribe a scheme with appropriate guidelines for providing by way of appropriate 'start up grants' to teachers and other cadres taking up research in all disciplines including basic science research as recommended by 'Prof. M.M. Sharma Committee on Strengthening of Basic Science Research' and suitably adopted for research in social sciences/humanities and other disciplines by the UGC.

(f) Age of Superannuation:

(i) In order to meet the situation arising out of shortage of teachers in universities and other teaching institutions and the consequent vacant positions therein, the age of superannuation for teachers in Central Educational Institutions has already been enhanced to sixty five years,

vide the Department of Higher Education letter No.F.No.119/2006-U.II dated 23.3.2007, for those involved in class room teaching in order to attract eligible persons to the teaching career and to retain teachers in service for a longer period. Consequent on upward revision of the age of superannuation of teachers, the Central Government has already authorized the Central Universities, vide Department of Higher Education D.O. letter No.F.1-24/2006-Desk(U) dated 30.3.2007 to enhance the age of superannuation of Vice- Chancellors of Central Universities from 65 years to 70 years, subject to amendments in the respective statutes, with the approval of the competent authority (Visitor in the case of Central Universities).

- (ii) Subject to availability of vacant positions and fitness, teachers shall also be reemployed on contract appointment beyond the age of sixty five years up to the age of seventy years. Reemployment beyond the age of superannuation shall, however, be done selectively, for a limited period of 3 years in the first instance and then for another further period of 2 years purely on the basis of merit, experience, area of specialization and peer group review and only against available vacant positions without affecting selection or promotion prospects of eligible teachers.
- (ii) Whereas the enhancement of the age of superannuation for teachers engaged in class room teaching is intended to attract eligible persons to a career in teaching and to meet the shortage of teachers by retaining teachers in service for a longer period, and whereas there is no shortage in the categories of Librarians and Directors of Physical Education, the increase in the age of superannuation from the present sixty two years shall not be available to the categories of Librarians and Directors of Physical Education.

(g) Pension:

- (i) For teachers and other cadres in UGC maintained institutions in receipt of pension, the Central Government rules for pension and gratuity as applicable to Central Government employees shall be applicable. Recommendations of Sixth Central Pay Commission in respect of pension for Central Government employees, including eligibility for full pension i.e. 50% of average pay or last pay drawn whichever is higher after 20 years of qualifying service, shall be adopted for only those teachers and other cadres who are already on pension in Central Universities/ colleges and other institutions deemed to be universities coming under the purview of the UGC
- (ii) In view of the new pension scheme effective from 1.1.2004, no new cases of conversion to pension scheme shall be allowed.

(h) Family Pension:

(i) Family Pension facilities as approved by the Central Government in respect of Central Government Employees on the recommendations of Sixth CPC shall be available to teachers and other cadres in Central Universities and other UGC maintained institutions who are eligible for such Pension at present.

(i) Additional Quantum of Pension to senior pensioners:

(i) The facility of additional quantum of pension accepted by the Central Government on the recommendation of 6th CPC for senior pensioners of the Central Government shall be extended to persons who are or were in teaching and other cadres on attaining the age of eighty years if they are already in pension scheme in Central Universities and other UGC

maintained institutions.

- (j) Gratuity and Encashment of Leave: Facilities of gratuity and encashment of leave accepted by the Central Government on the recommendation of 6th CPC for Central Government employees shall be extended to teachers and other cadres in Central Universities and other UGC maintained institutions.
- (k) Ex-Gratia Compensation: Families of teachers and other cadres who die in performance of their bona fide duties shall be compensated in the same manner as similarly placed families of Central Government Employees.

(I) Provident Fund:

(i) In view of the present policy in regard to Contributory Provident Fund, the status quo shall continue.

(m) Consultancy Assignments:

(i) University Grants Commission shall work out a suitable model, for which the models of revenue sharing between institutions and consultant-teachers prevailing in the Indian Institutes of Technology, Indian Institutes of Management and other institutions may be taken into consideration.

(n) Anomalies of the last PRC:

(i) Anomalies and unimplemented recommendations of the last Pay Review Committee, if any, shall be examined by the University Grants Commission in Consultation with the Ministry of Human Resource Development.

(o) Other recommendations of PRC and UGC:

(i) Recommendations made by the Pay Review Committee and the UGC in regard to the various selection processes, service and working conditions, training/ refresher courses etc. shall be considered appropriately by University Grants Commission with the approval of the Central Government, wherever required, or under the Commission's Regulations in accordance with the provisions of the University Grants Commission Act.

(p) Applicability of the Scheme:

- (i) This Scheme shall be applicable to teachers and other equivalent cadres of Library and Physical Education in all the Central Universities and Colleges there-under and the Institutions Deemed to be Universities whose maintenance expenditure is met by the UGC. The implementation of the revised scales shall be subject to the acceptance of all the conditions mentioned in this letter as well as Regulations to be framed by the UGC in this behalf. Universities implementing this Scheme shall be advised by the UGC to amend their relevant statutes and ordinances in line with the UGC Regulations within three months from the date of issue of this letter.
- (ii) This Scheme does not extend to the cadres of Registrar, Finance Officer and Controller of Examinations for which a separate Scheme is being issued separately.

- (iii) This Scheme does not extend to the Accompanists, Coaches, Tutors and Demonstrators. Pay and Grade Pay of the said categories of employees shall be fixed in the appropriate Pay Bands relative to their existing Pay in each university/ institution corresponding to such fixation in respect of Central Government employees as approved by the Central Government on the basis of the recommendations of 6th Central Pay Commission.
- (iv) This Scheme does not extend to the posts of professionals like System Analysts, Senior Analysts, Research Officers etc. who shall be treated at par with similarly qualified personnel in research/ scientific organizations of the Central Government.
- (v) This Scheme may be extended to universities, Colleges and other higher educational institutions coming under the purview of State legislatures, provided State Governments wish to adopt and implement the Scheme subject to the following terms and conditions:
- (a) Financial assistance from the Central Government to State Governments opting to revise pay scales of teachers and other equivalent cadre covered under the Scheme shall be limited to the extent of 80% (eighty percent) of the additional expenditure involved in the implementation of the revision.
- (b) The State Government opting for revision of pay shall meet the remaining 20% (twenty percent) of the additional expenditure from its own sources.
- (c) Financial assistance referred to in sub-clause (a) above shall be provided for the period from 1.01.2006 to 31.03.2010.
- (d) The entire liability on account of revision of pay scales etc. of university and college teachers shall be taken over by the State Government opting for revision of pay scales with effect from 1.04.2010.
- (e) Financial assistance from the Central Government shall be restricted to revision of pay scales in respect of only those posts which were in existence and had been filled up as on 1.01.2006.
- (f) State Governments, taking into consideration other local conditions, may also decide in their discretion, to introduce scales of pay higher than those mentioned in this Scheme, and may give effect to the revised bands/ scales of pay from a date on or after 1.01.2006; however, in such cases, the details of modifications proposed shall be furnished to the Central Government and Central assistance shall be restricted to the Pay Bands as approved by the Central Government and not to any higher scale of pay fixed by the State Government(s).
- (g) Payment of Central assistance for implementing this Scheme is also subject to the condition that the entire Scheme of revision of pay scales, together with all the conditions to be laid down by the UGC by way of Regulations and other guidelines shall be implemented by State Governments and Universities and Colleges coming under their jurisdiction as a composite scheme without any modification except in regard to the date of implementation and scales of pay mentioned herein above.

9. Date of implementation of revised pay and allowance and payment of arrears:

(i) The revised Pay and revised rates of Dearness Allowance under this Scheme shall be effective from 1.01.2006. The revised rates of all other applicable allowances such as House Rent Allowance. Transport Allowance, Children Education Allowance etc. and the non-

compounded advance increments shall take effect from 1.09.2008.

- (ii) Payment of arrears up to 40% of the total arrears shall be made during the current financial year i.e. 2008-09, after deduction of admissible income tax.
- (iii) An undertaking shall be taken from every beneficiary under this Scheme to the effect that any excess payment made on account of incorrect fixation of pay in the revised Pay Bands or grant of inappropriate Pay Band/ Academic Grade Pay or any other excess payment made shall be adjusted against the future payments due or otherwise to the beneficiary in the same manner as provided in this Ministry's O.M. No. F.23-7/2008IFD dated 23.10.2008., read with Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure) O.M.No.F.1-1/2008-IC dated 30.8.2008.
- 10. The revised Pay in the relevant Pay Band and the Academic Grade Pay together with the applicable allowances including arrears of salary as mentioned above shall be paid to all eligible beneficiaries under this Scheme pending issue of Regulations by the UGC.
- 11. This Scheme is subject to the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure) vide OM No. 7-23/2008-E.III dated 30.09.2008.
- 12. Anomalies, if any, in the implementation of this Scheme may be brought to the notice of the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, for clarification/decision of the Central Government.

Explanatory note for Tables II (a) and II (b)

- All universities / colleges will set up verifiable systems for the API related information required in these tables within THREE months of notification of these regulations. They will have to be documented and collated annually by the Internal Quality Assessment cells (IQACs) of the universities / colleges for follow up by the universities / college authorities. In order to facilitate this process, all teachers shall submit the duly filled-in Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) proforma to the IQAC annually.
- However, in order to remedy the difficulties of collecting retrospective information and to facilitate the
 implementation of these regulations from 31-12-2008 in the CAS Promotion, the API based PBAS will be
 progressively and prospectively rolled out.
- Accordingly, the PBAS based on the API scores of categories I and II as mentioned in these tables is to be implemented for one year, initially based on the existing systems in universities / colleges for one year only with the minimum average scores as depicted in Table II (a) and II (b) in rows I to III. This annualized API scores can then be compounded progressively as and when the teacher becomes eligible for CAS promotion to the next cadre. Thus, if a teacher is considered for CAS promotion in 2010, one year API scores for 2009-10 alone will be required for assessment. In case of a teacher being considered for CAS promotion in 2011, two years average of API scores for these categories will be required for assessment and so on leading progressively for the complete assessment period.
- 4. As shown in Table II, the aggregate minimum API score required (given in row III) can be earned from any of the two broad categories, subject to the minimum prescribed in each category. This will provide for due weightage to teachers who contribute additionally through any of the components given in Categories 1 and II also for the differing nature of contributions possible in different institutional settings.
- 5. For Category III (research and academic contributions), maintenance of past record is done on a normal basis by teachers and hence no difficulty is envisaged in applying the API scores for this category for the entire assessment period. In this category, an aggregate minimum score is required for promotion over each stage. Alternatively, a teacher should acquire the required minimum aggregate score over two previous stages, taken together. In the case of promotion to Professor, the publication requirement shall be met over the two previous stages.
- 6. Candidates should offer themselves for assessment for promotion, if they fulfill the minimum API scores indicated in Tables I and II, by submitting an application and the required proforma. They can do so three months before the due date if they consider themselves eligible. Candidates who do not consider themselves eligible, can also apply at a later date.
- If however, on final assessment, candidates do not either fulfill the minimum criteria under Rows III and IV
 of Tables II(A) and II (B) or obtain less than 50% in the expert assessment, they will be reassessed only
 after a minimum period of one year.
- 8 (a) If a candidate applies for promotion on completion of the minimum eligibility period and is successful, the date of promotion will be deemed to be the minimum period of eligibility.
 - (b) If however, the candidate finds that she / he fulfills the eligibility conditions at a late date and applies on that date and is successful, her / his promotion will be deemed to be from that date of application
 - (c) If the candidate does not succeed in the first assessment, but succeeds in an eventual assessment, her / his promotion will be deemed to be from the later date.

III. Summary of API Scores

As stated in the UGC Regulations 2010, the API scoring will be progressively rolled out for categories I and II, beginning with assessment of one year for selection committees in 2010-2011, annual averages of two years in 2011-2012 and so on. But for Category III, scores will be computed for the entire assessment period as already indicated in the Regulations.

IV. Similar PBAS proforma could be developed by the universities for the Cadres of Librarian / Deputy Librarian / Assistant Librarian and Director of Physical Education & Sports / Deputy Director of Physical Education & Sports / Assistant Director of Physical Education & Sports based on the API Scoring pattern outlined in Appendix III: Tables - IV to IX of the UGC-Regulations, 2010.

Agenda Item No.6A: Inspection of Teacher Education Institutions- A Policy Framework.

To achieve its objectives, the NCTE causes inspections of TEIs by teams of experts called Visiting Teams (VT) under Section 13, Section 14 and Section 15 of the NCTE Act, 1993. While the inspection under Section 13 of an already recognized institution is got conducted by the Council at New Delhi, inspection under Section 14 and Section 15 are got conducted by the Regional Committees of the NCTE, which are empowered under the NCTE Act to grant or refuse recognition for a teacher education programme. Inspection under Sections 14 and 15 are mandatory for deciding suitability or otherwise of the applicant institution for recognition/ permission for conducting a programme or training in teacher education programme.

Section I3 of the NCTE Act empowers the Council to ascertain whether the recognized institutions are functioning in accordance with the provisions of the Act, Rules and Regulations, for which the Council causes inspection of the institutions with prior notice and communicates its views in regard to the results of any such inspection.

The NCTE requires the services of experts for conducting inspections of TEIs, for which it has to maintain a VT database. Empanelment of experts is a continuous process and the Panel is updated regularly.

The Inspection Policy Framework developed by a Group of experts describes the purpose of Inspections under Sections 13, 14 and 15 of the NCTE Act and further explains the procedure to be followed for the development of Panel and for conducting inspection under different sections. The Policy Framework also includes guidelines for the composition of a Visiting Team and the guidelines to be followed by the visiting teams in connection with the conduct of inspections and submission of report.

A copy of the Policy Framework is placed before the Council for its consideration and approval (Annexure-D, pp. 175-187).

CHAPTER - 1

VISION AND MISSION OF NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR TEACHER EDUCATION

Vision

To achieve planned and coordinated development of the teacher education system throughout the country, regulation and maintenance of norms and standards in the teacher education system and matters connected therewith.

Mission

- (a) Undertake surveys and studies relating to various aspects of teacher education and publish the result thereof;
- (b) Make recommendations to the Central and State Governments, Universities, University Grants Commission and recognized institutions in the matter of preparation of suitable plans and programmes in the field of teacher education;
- (c) Co-ordinate and monitor teacher education and its development in the country;
- (d) Lay down guidelines in respect of minimum qualifications for persons to be employed as teachers in schools or in recognized institutions;
- (e) Lay down norms for any specified category of courses or training in teacher education, including the minimum eligibility criteria for admissions and the method of selection of candidates, duration of the course, course contents and mode of curriculum;
- (f) Lay down guidelines for compliance by recognized institutions, for starting new courses or training, and for providing physical and instructional facilities, staffing pattern and staff qualifications;
- (g) Lay down standards in respect of examinations leading to teacher education qualifications, criteria for admission to such examination and schemes of courses or training;

- (h) Lay down guidelines regarding tuition fees and other fees chargeable by recognized institutions;
- (i) Promote and conduct research and innovation in various areas of teacher education and disseminate the results thereof;
- (j) Examine and review periodically the implementation of the norms, guidelines and standards laid down by the Council and to suitably advise the recognized institutions;
- (k) Evolve suitable performance appraisal system, norms and mechanism for enforcing accountability on recognized institutions;
- (l) Formulate schemes for various levels of teacher education and identify recognized institutions and set up new institutions for teacher education programmes;
- (m) Take all necessary steps to prevent commercialization of teacher education; and
- (n) Perform such other functions as may be entrusted to it by the Central Government.

CHAPTER - 2

INPECTION POLICY

2.1 The Context

The National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) was set up by an Act of Parliament (No. 73 of 1993) with a view to achieving planned and coordinated development of the teacher education system throughout the country, the regulation and proper maintenance of norms and standards in the teacher education system and matters connected therewith.

The Act empowers the Council to lay down guidelines for compliance by recognized institutions, for starting new courses and for providing physical and instructional facilities, staffing pattern and staff qualifications. The Council is empowered to examine and review periodically the implementation of the guidelines, norms and standards laid down, and to suitably advise the recognized institutions. The Council is also empowered to co-ordinate and monitor teacher education and its development in the country, to take all necessary steps to prevent commercialization of teacher education and to perform such other functions as may be entrusted to it by the Central Government.

Inspections are conducted by teams of experts called Visiting Teams (VT) constituted by the NCTE as per the existing policy under Section 13, Section 14 and Section 15 of the NCTE Act, 1993. While the inspection under Section 13 of an already recognized institution is got conducted by the Council at New Delhi, inspection under Section 14 and Section 15 are got conducted by the Regional Committees of the NCTE, which are empowered under the NCTE Act to grant or refuse recognition for a teacher education programme. Inspection under Sections 14 and 15 are mandatory for deciding suitability or otherwise of the applicant institution for recognition/ permission for conducting a programme or training in teacher education programme.

Section 13 of the NCTE Act empowers the **Council** to ascertain whether the recognized institutions are functioning in accordance with the provisions of the Act, Rules and Regulations. It also authorizes the **Council** to cause inspection of the institutions with prior notice and communicate its views in regard to the results of any such inspection.

Section 14 deals with recognition of the institutions offering programme in teacher education. Sub-section 3(a) of Section 14 of the Act provides that on receipt of an application by the Regional Committee, if it is satisfied that such institution has adequate financial resources, accommodation, library, qualified staff, laboratory and that it fulfils such other conditions as are required for proper functioning of the institution for a programme in teacher education, as may be determined by regulations, may pass an order granting recognition to such institution, subject to such conditions as may be determined by regulations.

Section 15 of the Act deals with grant of permission to a new programme to an already recognized institution. Inspection of applicant institution with a view to assess availability of adequate infrastructural, instructional and other facilities with it in accordance with the provisions of the NCTE Act/Rules/ Regulations is a mandatory requirement before deciding grant of recognition or otherwise for a programme / a new programme or training in teacher education under Section 15 of the Act.

2.2 Empanelment of Experts

To monitor the functioning of recognised Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs) from time to time and to grant recognition to new TEIs/ Programmes the NCTE has to cause inspection with the help of experts for which the council maintains a Panel/ VT Database. Empanelment of experts is a continuous process and the panel is updated regularly. Efforts will be made to empanel experts of considerable experience, expertise and through a process of transparency in the academic field. As per Regulation 2014, there will be a Centralised VT Database at NCTE-Hqrs. to be utilised by all the Regional Committees and the Hqrs. for causing any inspection. The Council is developing an On-line Database for the purpose.

Criteria for the Selection of Experts as Visiting Team Member for Empanelment for Inspection of TEIs are as:

- 1. At least 10 years of experience in the field of Teacher Education (including Art and Physical Education)/ Educational Administration.
- 2. (a) Serving/ Retired Professor/ Associate Professor in Education and Art and Physical Education as per Regulation 2014 in Universities or recognised TEIs;
 - (b) Serving/ Retired Principal of NCTE Recognised Teacher Education Institution or Head of Department of Education in a multifaculty institution;

(c) Serving/ Retired Educational Administrator such as Director/ Joint Director of SCERT/ SIE, Joint Commissioner in KVS/ NVS or Officer holding equivalent positions in MHRD/ UGC/ Central/ State Education Board/ State Education Department;

OR

(d) Serving/ Retired Professor/ Associate Professor in Educational Research Organizations like NCERT etc.

The experts willing to undertake inspection may submit their application online in he prescribed format (Annexure-I) which is uploaded on NCTE website.

The NCTE ensures that only well qualified and experienced experts are deputed to undertake inspection on its behalf. The VT members are expected to have the following essential qualities:

- Ability to make objective judgement: Objectivity is decisive for inspection of an institution. The prejudices or interests of the members should not influence the inspection report. The inspection is expected to be totally fact-oriented with logical reasoning, fairness, genuineness and an in-depth understanding of the institution. The VT Members should have the ability to base their judgements on facts and not on subjective impressions.
- Ability to write a precise and unambiguous report: The members are expected to write report precisely and without any ambiguity or inconsistency.
- Ability to handle VT reporting online

Besides, the members should have desirable personal qualities, such as persistence self-discipline, inquisitive attitude, honesty, professionalism, excellent listening, freedom from bias, indifference to popularity/unpopularity etc. They should have the ability to work in a team and take clear decision based on facts. The VT members should be known for their integrity and honesty. VT members or his/ her family members should not have any direct interest in the running/ administration of the concerned TEI. He/ she should not have any Vigilance/ CBI criminal case pending against him/ her.

2.3 Composition of Visiting Team (VT)

- (i) The NCTE assesses the institutions with the help of a team comprising external members. A VT comprises two members at least one of whom should be from Govt. institution.
- (ii) At least one member of the VT should be from the field of teacher education preferably with experience of the course which is proposed to be taken up by the concerned institute.
- (iii) As far as possible representation to women, minorities, SC, ST, OBC and other disadvantaged categories is given in the panel of VT.
- (iv) A member of the VT is not assigned inspection of more than 5 institutions in an academic year.
- (v) Each of the VT member is required to certify that he or his family members have no direct or indirect interest, whatsoever in the running or administration of the applicant institution. He / she is also required to certify that he/ she has no stake in the concerned institution.

2.4 Schedule for Inspection under Section 14 and 15

By following the extant regulation in place, the inspection shall be caused for the institution as indicated in the Regulation and as recommended by the Regional Committee.

- (i) List of the institutions ready for inspection is displayed on the website and regularly updated by addition / deletion of institutions.
- (ii) The schedule of sending visiting teams to the institutions is drawn up well in advance and is also displayed on the website of the Regional Committee.

2.5 Schedule for Inspection under Section 13

Every recognized TEI should be inspected periodically. The inspection under Section 13 may be conducted depending on: complaints received; as recommended by concerned RC; as decided by Council for periodic inspection; or as directed by any Hon'ble Court.

The outcome of the inspection should be communicated to the concerned Regional Committee for compliance as per rules. In case of the institutions offering more than one Teacher Education programme, a composite inspection of all the Teacher Education programmes should be conducted by the same VT. In case of Teacher Education programmes in a composite setting offering Undergraduate and Post-graduate courses besides than Teacher Education Programmes, the VT should conduct inspection of TE programmes only.

In the beginning of an academic year, the NCTE should draw a detailed plan for conducting inspection of TEIs under Section 13, besides inspection required based on complaints received and such other exigencies.

2.6 Payment of TA/ DA.

TA/ DA and honorarium to the VT members shall be paid under Section 14 and 15 by the office of the RD concerned, and under Section 15 by the NCTE Hqrs. and no advance, however shall be is paid to the VT members for undertaking inspection. The VT members shall not accept honorarium or any kind of hospitality from the concerned TEI.

2.7 Performance Monitoring.

The performance of the VT members shall be monitored regularly through all possible sources of information, including the quality of the report submitted by the VT. In case the VT Report is found to be vague and incorrectly drafted to mislead the Regional Committee/NCTE, a serious view in the matter shall be taken. The NCTE may not consider them for future assignment and may also initiate any other action deemed appropriate.

2.8 Documents supplied to VT Members.

- (i) Relevant Regulations and Norms and Standards of the teacher education course for which inspection is to be conducted.
- (ii) A copy of complete application submitted by the applicant institution (Section 14 & 15).
- (iii) Inspection Proforma.
- (iv) A copy of the manual for Visiting Teams.
- (v) TA/ DA form.
- (vi) Self Assessment Report submitted by the applicant institution (under Section 13).

CHAPTER - 3

GUIDELINES FOR THE VISITING TEAMS

3.1 Introduction

Approval for the establishment of new institution or permission for starting a new programme in an already recognized institution is granted by the NCTE on the basis of a thorough assessment of the physical infrastructure and instructional facilities and faculty for imparting quality teacher education. The performance of already recognized TEIs is also assessed periodically through the mechanism of inspection which shall be transparent and objective. The NCTE, therefore, solicits co-operation of the VT members in this regard and requests them to follow strictly the guidelines given in this section.

3.2 Guidelines

Each member of the VT Team is required to:

- certify that he/ she or any member of his/ her family has no direct or indirect interest in the running/ administration of the institution being inspected and has no financial or other interest in its management;
- (2) obtain a copy of the order of recognition of all the courses run in the same premises from the applicant institution;
- (3) take special care in verifying facilities of the TEI in case institutions/ programmes other than teacher education are also being run in the same premises;
- (4) study and understand the importance and implications of each column given in the inspection proforma and fill it objectively with full facts and observations, keeping in view the provisions in the NCTE Act/ Rules/ Regulations/ Norms and Standards.
- (5) obtain from the institution all the relevant original documents and examine the same thoroughly;

- (6) scrutinize various records pertaining to purchases made by the institution of computers, equipments, chemicals, books and journals by verifying the original voucher/ bills, stock registers/ ledgers and stamping on books and journals;
- (7) collect videotapes/ CD and photographs covering the entire physical infrastructure, i.e. building, labs, library, amenities, workshops etc on the same day;
- (8) report if the furniture, equipments, etc. belong to the institution or have been shifted temporarily or hired by the institution for the inspection day;
- (9) interact with the management, community, if possible and academic and non-academic staff individually or in groups, if they are in position, to elicit information about their service conditions including salaries, allowances and other benefits;
- (10) verify the records relating to the selection, appointment and joining of the staff from the concerned institution;
- (11) be polite and ensure that interaction with all concerned is educative in nature without giving any scope for complaint or bias;
- (12) ensure that videography covers all important infrastructural and instructional facilities, that is building outerview, administrative wing, library, classrooms, multipurpose hall, toilet, ramp, lift for specially abled persons as determined by Regulation 14.
- (13) ensure that each page of the filled in proforma submitted by the institution is signed by the authorized representative of the institution;
- (14) ensure that under no circumstances any column is left unfilled as the entire information solicited is extremely important for taking a final decision;
- (15) ensure that copies of all the documents specified in inspection proforma, duly verified, have been appended to the report;
- (16) give a certificate in the prescribed proforma about the correctness of the report;

- (17) prepare the report on completion of the visit and immediately submit it on the same day alongwith the video recordings to concerned RD of the Regional Committee under Section 14 and 15 and the NCTE HQ under Section 13. The report is to be signed by all members of the team;
- (18) accept no gift, travel expenses, honorarium, fees, etc or any other remuneration in any form from the institution or from any individual.
- (19) mention if any pressure was exerted on the VT members or any canvassing was done by management of the institution in any form to get a favourable report. This information may be submitted to the concerned Regional Director of NCTE or the concerned official at NCTE Hqrs. separately in a sealed cover;
- (20) give no indication of assessment/ opinion to any office-bearer of the institution;
- (21) keep in mind that any wrong reporting by the VT will bring bad name to the NCTE in general and the VT members in particular as the reputation of the NCTE and VT depends on the authenticity of the VT report. The VT report along with the names of the members will be put on the website of the Regional Committee after the report has been considered by the Regional Committee/ NCTE HQ
- (22) ensure quality and in-depth inspection of an institution, VT should devote at least one day for one institution/programme.

Agenda Item No.6B: Consideration of Centralized Visiting Team Selection Criteria, and approval of 2007 Visiting Team Database and 2015 M.P. Court Inspection for VT of RCs.

- I. The NCTE Act 1993 empowers the NCTE and Regional Committees to cause inspections of Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs) under its Sections 13, 14 and 15. The inspections of TEIs under Section 13 are conducted by the NCTE Hqrs to monitor the functioning of recognized teacher education institutions and inspections under Section 14 and 15 are caused by the Regional Committees for granting recognition to new institutions /programmes or for additional programmes/intake. So far, the NCTE Hqrs has been maintaining a Panel for Section 13 Inspections and the Regional Committees maintain their own Panels for Inspections under Section 14 and 15. However, the NCTE Regulations, 2014 stipulate that a centralised Panel of VT members shall be maintained for the use of both NCTE Hqrs and Regional Committees under different sections.
- II. In the year 2006, the NCTE had issued the following guidelines to Regional Committees suggesting the categories of persons to be involved in the Inspection work:
 - As regards category of persons for composition of VT, normally persons should be from university department of education, university college, Govt. College, deemed universities, central Autonomous Bodies in the field of education, grant-in-aid college and from self financing institutions in teacher education provided that he has been serving the self financing/private college continuously for the last at least seven years. In cases where one member is from self-financing institution the other member has to be from the other categories mentioned in this para.
- III. In the context of a PIL, the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh passed an order in June, 2014 directing the NCTE to conduct inspection of all 392 B.Ed. colleges in the State under Section 13 of the NCTE Act. The inspections were conducted utilising the services of Experts included in the NCTE's approved Panel of the year, 2007. However, due to non-availability of VT members in adequate number from the panel. It was decided to update the Panel for which the NCTE issued a Public Notice inviting applications for empanelment as VT members. More than 800 applications were received in response to the Public Notice and Letters Written to Deans of Education in the Universities. A Committee comprising of following members constituted to scrutinise the applications:

- IV. The Committee developed the following criteria for the selection of applicants for empanelment:
 - 1. At least 20 Years of Experience in the field of Education/Teacher Education/Educational Administration.
 - 2. Age: Between 50 to 75 years as on 31.07.2015
 - 3. Serving/Retired Professor/Associate Professor in Education, in universities including deemed universities.

OR

Serving/Retired Principal of NCTE recognised Teacher Education Institutions or Head of Department of Education in a multi-faculty Institution.

OR

Serving/Retired Educational Administrator such as Director/Joint Director SCERT/SIE/Joint Commissioner in KVS/NVS/or officers holding equivalent positions in MHRD/UGC/State Education Board/State Education Department

OR

Serving/Retired Associate Professor/Professor in Research organisations like NCERT, NUEPA, etc.

- V. Against the criteria mentioned above, the Committee selected 345 experts (Annexure-E, pp.191-260) from all the states for empanelment as VT members. It suggested that the Panel comprising the selected 345 experts (Flag A) be approved as a Centralised Panel for the use of NCTE Hqrs as well as Regional Committees.
- VI. The Committee was also required to recommend a shorter panel of 100-150 experts specifically for Madhya Pradesh inspections in 2-3 categories in order of priority. In order to minimise the cost of inspections, the Committee decided to include experts possessing minimum 30 years' professional experience from Delhi and five neighbouring states in category A and experts from other six states in Category B and experts possessing minimum 25 years' professional experience from all the twelve states in category C. The details of three categories are as under:

Category A: Experts with minimum 30 years' of Professional experience from the states of Delhi, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and Uttar Pradesh (47).

Category B: Experts with minimum 30 years' of Professional Experience from the states of Haryana, Punjab, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand, Uttarakhand (45).

Category C: Experts with minimum 25 years' of Professional experience from the above mentioned states (60).

Total 152 (Annexure- F at pp. 261-289)

The services of experts from only Category A and Category B lists have been utilised in connection with the inspections conducted in Madhya Pradesh in the month of September, 2015. The names and other details of 152 experts included in three categories (A, B and C) are placed before the Council for information and ratification.

Agenda Item No.7: Consideration of extension of the last date of 31st Oct 2015 for the compliance of provisions in the NCTE Regulation 2014 related to additional Faculty/Staff, infrastructure etc. during 2nd year of B.Ed., B.P.Ed. and M.Ed. Programmes.

NCTE Regulation 2014 provides for 2 years duration for the B. Ed, B.P.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes. In case of B.Ed./B.P.Ed. programmes, the basic unit of admission was 100 students in NCTE Regulation 2009. However, in the NCTE Regulation 2014, the basic unit has been reduced to 50 students. The institutions which had approved intake of 100 students were allowed to either continue to admit 100 students (two Units) during the first year of admission or else reduce it to 50 students (one Unit). The TEIs which have opted for one unit of 50 students in B.Ed./B.P.Ed. programmes are not required to appoint any additional faculty & staff or provide for any additional infrastructure, under NCTE Regulation 2014 during second year of the programme. However, the TEIs which have opted for two units of 50 students each, are required to appoint full complement of the Faculty / Staff as per para 5.1 and para 5.3 of Appendix- 4&5 of NCTE Regulation 2014 related to B.Ed. and B.P.Ed. programmes respectively. Also, these TEIs are required to provide an additional infrastructure, of a built up area of 500 Sqm. in accordance with para 6.1 of Appendix-4 of the Regulation 2014 for B.Ed. and B.P.Ed. programmes respectively.

- 2. Regulation 2014 also provides for an Endowment Fund of Rs. 5.00 Lakhs and Reserve Fund of 7 lakhs per unit per programme, which is to be kept in a term deposit jointly in the name of the Institution and NCTE. Thus an additional FDR of Rs 4.00 lakhs is to be submitted towards the increase in the reserve fund in respect of each programme. TEIs having opted for two units of the B.Ed./B.P.Ed. programme are required to submit an FDR of Rs 4.00 lakhs for one unit and an additional FDR of Rs 12.00 Lakhs for the second unit of the programme.
- 3. In case of M.Ed. programme as well additional staff is required to be provided during the 2nd year of the programme, and FDRs in the joint account due to increase in the amount of reserve fund.
- 4. NCTE, vide its letter dated 24th December 2014 issued Guidelines for processing of pending applications under Regulation 2014. The guidelines were issued as per decision taken by the NCTE council vide its 41st meeting held on 27.11.2014. These guidelines inter-alia provides that institution willing to offer two basic units of B.Ed./B.P.Ed. programmes can be given formal recognition before 3rd March 2015, but it shall create additional built-up area, create additional infrastructure, adhere to staff norms, qualification for staff, pay the difference in Endowment and Reserve Found etc. by Oct 31, 2015 and inform Regional Committee with necessary documents. The Regional Committee shall arrange for inspection of these premises, verification of documents and check adherence to these conditions by 29 Feb, 2016. If the institution fails to comply with these requirements the permission given for one basic unit out of two basis units will have to be withdrawn.
- 5. With reference to the above said guidelines issued by NCTE on various aspects of implementation of Regulation 2014, representations have been received from Institutions and their Associations, wherein the following demands have been made in the context of additional provisions under NCTE Regulation 2014 for the B.Ed./B.P.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes and adherence to do so by the target date of 31st Oct. 2015
 - i. Due to lack of adequate number of admissions in the programmes in TEIs, particularly self-financing institutions are suffering with a resources crunch and are therefore unable to provide additional funds required, additional infrastructure and appoint additional

faculty /staff as per NCTE Regulation 2014. Also there is no need to increase the physical infrastructure of the TEIs, in view of lower number of admissions to various programmes. Moreover, with the present level of revenue of TEIs, it is not possible even to maintain the existing infrastructure and faculty.

- ii. Even when the TEIs have been sanctioned intake capacity of 100 students for B.Ed. / B.P.Ed. course, they should be allowed to manage with the existing faculty in case the total number of students admitted do not increase to 100 students.
- iii. Since the additional staff to be appointed under NCTE Regulations 2014 for B.Ed. / B.P.Ed. programme having sanctioned intake capacity of 100 are required only in academic session 2016-2017, appointing them by 31st October 2015 is not reasonable and will be a financial constraint to the TEls. The time limit given up to 31st October 2015 for creating additional infrastructure is not sufficient and needs extension.
- 6. NCTE HQrs obtained reports from the Regional Directors about compliance by the TEIs by the target date of 31st Oct 2015 on the above aspect. It has been reported by the RD, NRC that only 20% of the institutions have submitted the compliance report up to 31st Oct 2015 and maximum number of institutions have not submitted compliance in respect of additional faculty as required under the provisions of the NCTE Regulation 2014. The RD, ERC has informed that only 53% of the institutions have submitted compliance report and representations have also been received from the institutions citing difficulty faced by them, with a request for extending the time. Similarly RD, WRC reported that only 310 of the B.Ed. institutions sent the compliance report by the due date.
- 7. NCTE, vide its order No 49.01/2015/NCTE/N&S(Pt) dated 18th Nov 2015, constituted a Committee under the chairmanship of Prof.N.K. Jangira to review various representations received from different Teachers Education Institutions (TEIs) Universities and their associations for relaxing the prescribed date of 31.10.2015(Annexure- G at pp. 295-348), with regard to appointment of additional teachers, providing of additional infrastructure etc. for the second year of the B.Ed. B.P.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes, wherein the duration of the programmes has been increased from one year to two years. A copy of the recommendations of the expert committee is enclosed.
- 8. After careful consideration of the demands raised by TEIs and their Associations, in the light of the various provisions under NCTE Regulations 2014 and the guidelines dated 24.12.2014(Annexure- H at pp. 349-354) issued there under and after due consideration of the recommendations made by the expert committee, the matter is placed before the Council for consideration with the following suggestions for further modifying the guidelines issued by NCTE on 24th December 2014: regarding providing of additional Faculty / Staff, infrastructure and submission of FDRs in the joint account towards Endowment Fund / Reserve Fund.
 - (a) The additional faculty/Staff in TEIs required for the two years B.Ed. / B.P.Ed. / M.Ed. programmes having a sanctioned intake of 100 students or more for B.Ed / B.P.Ed. and 50 students for M.Ed. programme, as per NCTE Regulation 2014 should be in position latest by 30th May 2016.
 - (b) The process of recruitment for the additional faculty/staff, should be initiated latest by 31st December, 2015. by issue of an advertisement and letter to the concerned affiliating body for constitution of the selection committee.TEIs must submit a copy

of the advertisement and letter to the affiliating body to the concerned Regional Committee latest by 15th January, 2016.

- (c) The recruitment process for the full complement of faculty/staff must be completed by 15th April 2016 and approval of the affiliating body, wherever required must be obtained by that date.
- (d) The appointment order to the faculty/staff selected must be issued latest by 30th May, 2016, and a consolidated statement giving details of the qualification etc. about the faculty appointed must be submitted to the concerned Regional Committee latest by 30th May 2016, well before admitting the students for the academic session 2016-2017.
- (e) Regarding additional infrastructure and providing FDR for additional amount towards Endowment Fund / Reserve Fund, the TEIs must comply with the requirement as per NCTE Regulations 2014 latest by 30th May, 2016 and submit the required documents in this regard along with the list of faculty / staff appointed latest by 30 May 2016 to the RC.
- (f) The TEIs, who fail to comply with the requirement of additional faculty / staff, infrastructure and Endowment Fund / Reserve Fund, may be issued a Show Cause Notice by the concerned Regional Committee to reduce their intake capacity and make it as per provisions under NCTE Regulations 2014.

Subject: Request for extension of last date i.e. 31 October 2015 for the compliance of NEW REGULATION 2014 as mentioned in the Revised Recognition Orders.

Sir,

With reference to the revised recognition orders issued by regional committees to all the colleges of education. We would like to point out that in the recognition orders the regional committees requires the colleges to inform them with required documents about the physical and human resources infrastructure i.e.

(a) Additional built up area.

- (b) Additional infrastructure
- (b) Additional funds by 31st October 2015.
- (d) Adhere to staff norms as per regulations, 2014

by 31 October 2013.

Sir, we most humbly submit as under:-

- 1. That all most all the affiliating bodies in the country even after repeated requests and representations by the association of educational colleges of their states kept on lingering the request of the colleges to implement/adhere to the staff qualifications (B.Ed. and M.Ed. Courses) as per new norms regulations 2014.
- 2. Now after a lot of pursuance by the associations of colleges of the concerned states the affiliating universities has issued the letter regarding qualifications of the faculties and has prepared their own qualification totally violating new NCTE regulations 2014.
- 3. Hence the colleges are in dilemma firstly regarding the qualifications of the staff and secondly regarding the no. of staff to the appointed in a composite institution running B.Ed., D.Ed., M.Ed. Courses. But the affiliating university does not agree with this. Hence it is not possible for the colleges to appoint the staff as per the new norms in time to comply with the recognition order.
- 4. Sir, due to increase in duration of the B.Ed. and M.Ed. Courses from one year to two years approximately 50% seats are lying vacant in the state. Also admission process in some of the states is still in progress. List of students admitted in B.Ed. course in different colleges in the state of Haryana as on today is enclosed as annexure no. 6.
- 5. As we are self financing colleges of education and the only source of income is from the prescribed fees collected from the admitted students. It is evident from the no. of students



0

admitted that the colleges are financially starved and crippled for no fault of their. Hence it is difficult for the colleges to create additional built up area, additional infrastructure and additional funds as per the regulation.

6. Also we would like to submit that when there are no admissions in the colleges of education and the already existing infrastructure is lying unutilized therefore there is no need to create additional infrastructure. Also due to the increase in duration of courses the colleges of education have suffered huge unrecoverable financial losses.

Therefore it is prayed in the interest of all concern that the last date i.e 31st October 2015 for compliance of the new recognition order may please be extended for two years as it is practically not possible for the colleges of education and all concern to survive under the present circumstances. We also suggest that the duration of the course may be reduces from two years to one year because this situation is across the whole country therefore the decision regarding the duration of B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses need retrospection immediately before the education system related to the colleges of education collapses.

We hope for favorable consideration please.



Subject:- Regarding reducing the duration of B.Ed./M.Ed. course from two years to one year.

Respected Sir,

With due respect we would like to draw your attention towards the increased duration of B.Ed. and M:Ed. courses.

Prior to the academic session 2015-16 the duration of the above said courses was one year but the NCTE has increased its duration from one year to two years in its new norms resulting in the following impacts on these courses/colleges/students.

- 1. Due to the undue increase in the duration of the above said courses the students have lost interest in taking admission in B.Ed. & M.Ed. courses resulting in steep fall in the admissions which is clearly evident from the number of admissions and approximately 50% seats are still lying vacant in the colleges of education in the state of Haryana and other state.
- 2. Due to the increase in duration to two years the financial burden on the students or parents/guardians has doubled resulting in drastic reduction in the admissions in the above mentioned courses.
- 3. Sir, we are self financing institutions and the only source of income is the prescribed fee collected from the students but due to the increase in duration of B.Ed. & M.Ed. courses 50 to 75% seats are lying vacant in different colleges thereby resulting in huge financial loss to the educational institutions.
- 4. We would also like to point out that the NCTE has increased the physical infrastructure in the colleges of education to be complied with on or before 31/10/2015 failing which the NCTE will penalize the institutions by reducing the intake to half. Sir, it is not possible for any self financing institution to increase the physical infrastructure in accordance to the NCTE new norms 2014 as there is hardly any admissions in the educational colleges? In the present scenario it will not be possible to maintain the existing physical infrastructure and human resource.

- 5. Dear sir we should also keep in mind the socio economic background of the students seeking admissions in B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses. These students are generally from the lower middle class families and from rural & semi urban backgrounds and also how long will a student go on studying and continue being a burden on their parents and when will the student start earning his/her livelihood.
- 6. Due to the above mentioned facts the colleges of educations have been crippled for no faults of their and are on the verge of closure. The closure of these colleges of education will not only be a loss of the trusts/societies running these colleges but also a loss to the nation as these colleges served the nation by producing quality teachers for our future generations. Hence it calls for immediate action to be taken on your part by exercising the powers to relax the NCTE norms as mentioned in the gadget of India extraordinary section 4 page no. 98 Para 12 which reads as:

" on the recommendations of the central government, or state government, or union territory administration concerned, or in case of removal of any hardship caused in adhering to the provisions of these regulations, keeping view the circumstances to the said government or union territory, it shall be open to the chairperson, for reusons to be recorded in writing, to relax any of the provisions of these regulations, in respect of any class or category of the institution in the concerned state or union territory, or central government institutions to such an extent and subject to such conditions, as may be specified in the order and decisions shall be brought to the notice of the council in the next meeting. In exceptional cases and for reasons to be recorded in writing, the chairperson, shall be competent to relax any of the provisions of these regulations and the related norms and standards subject to its ratification by the council?.

It is therefore most humbly prayed that you will exercise your powers and will reduce the duration of M.Ed. & B.Ed. courses from two years to one year.

- 11. Academic Calendars.—(1)Itshall be incumbent upon the affiliating body to regulate the process of admission in teacher education institutions by prescribing the schedule or academic calendar in respect of each of the programmes specified in Appendix 1 to 15 under these regulations, at least three months in advance of the commencement of each academic session and to give due publicity by providing the following details, namely:
 - (a) date for the publication of notice inviting applications for admissions;
 - (b) last date of receipt of applications for admissions for each programme;
 - (c) date of selection test or interview;
 - (d) date of publication of 1st, 2nd and 3rd list of candidates and last date of closure of admissions.
- The entire process shall be completed within a period of sixty days from the date of publication of the admission notice. The affiliating body shall strictly adhere to the schedule or academic calendar notified by it. After closure of the admission, each teacher education institution shall submit the list of students admitted in each programme within two days from the last date of closure of admission to the respective affiliating or examining budies and shall be made available on the website of the institution.
- 12. Power to relax.—(1) On the recommendations of the Central Government, or State Government, or Union territory Administration concerned, or in cases for removal of any hardship caused in adhering to the provisions in these regulations, keeping in view the circumstances peculiar to the said Governments or Union territory, it shall be open to the Chairperson, for reasons to be recorded in writing, to relax any of the provisions of these regulations, in respect of any class or category of institutions, in the concerned State or Union Territory, or of Central Government institutions to such an extent and subject to such conditions, as may be specified in the order and decisions shall be brought to the notice of the Council in the next meeting. In exceptional cases and for reasons to be recorded in writing, the Chairperson, shall be competent to relax any of the provisions of these regulations and the related norms and standards subject to its ratification by the Council.
- 13. Repeal and savings.—(1)The National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2009 is hereby repealed.
- (2) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or any action taken or purported to have been done or taken under the regulations hereby repealed shall, in so far as it is not inconsistent with the provisions of these regulations, be deemed to have been done or taken under the corresponding provisions of these regulations.

APPENDIX-I

Norms and standards for diploma in early childhood education programme leading to Diploma in Preschool Education (DPSE)

- 1 Preamble
- 1.1 Preschool education aims at total child development in a learning environment that is joyful, child-centered, play and activity based. The present programme of DPSE, earlier known as Diploma in Early Childhood Education (D.E.C.Ed.), aims at preparing teachers for preschool programmes which are offered under different nomenclature such as nursery schools, kindergarten schools and preparatory schools. The programme shall cover children in the age group 3 to 6.
- 2 Duration and Working Days
- 2.1 Duration

The DPSE programme shall be of a duration of two academic years. However, the students shall be permitted to complete the programme within a maximum period of three years from the date of admission to the programme.

- 2.2 Working Days
 - (a) There shall be at least two hundred working days each year, exclusive of period of examination and admission.

Further by having the higher percentage i.e. 50% as eligibility criteria you are also barring the 🗀 students for any scope of improvement & opportunity to excel in life and his/her choice of education & livelihood which is unconstitutional.
- 4. Sir, as the admission in D.El.Ed., B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses are done on the basis of merit throughout the country therefore this decision of reducing the eligibility percentage to 40% will not affect the right of any meritorious students rather it would help in the optimum use of infrastructure available in all the colleges of education.

The colleges with earlier intake of one unit (i.e. 100 students) were assured of sanction of 2 units of 50 each right from the date of notification of new norms, as per the earlier NRC/NCTE explanatory letters. (letter no nil dated 24/12/2014 and letter no NRC/231ST meeting/2015 dated 29-01-2015) (Annexure-II & III) respectively as well as FAQ on NCTE website (Annexure-IV). On the other hand there was no confirmation regarding allocation wirit institutions seeking more than 2 units till, this delayed the preparation of these institutions regarding Infrastructure, selection of employees by University approved committee and other requirements.

The institutions with 2 units of intake as per NCTE regulations, 2014 had 11 months till October, 2015 for fulfilment of requirements, we had only 3 months to complete the same. Heavy rain fall in the month of July and August in our state of Himachal Pradesh added to our difficulties.

I request your worthy self and National Committee NCTE to direct NRC NCTE Jaipur to extend the 31st October deadline for our institutions and similarly placed colleges as per principles of natural justice and grant us equal time and opportunity to fulfil the requirements.

We have already earmarked the necessary endowment and reserve funds, a total land area of 3500 sq mts of society's own land, with land use for education has also been allocated for demarcation for the institution—as per new norms. Advertisements has also been placed in leading dailies of the state for recruitment and appointment of teaching and non teaching staff.

Every effort is being made by the society and college to fulfil the requirements even though the process of B.Ed. admissions is still not over. However the 3 month time period available to us is not sufficient. We suggest that the time period for us be extended to 30th April,2016 in view of severe time constraint faced by us, as number of institutions with more than 2 units is relatively few it will not be difficult for NCTE to conduct and complete inspections of such institutions in time for next session.

Once again I request your worthy office to consider our request sympathetically and grant us an equal, fair and just opportunity to fulfil the norms.

PROCESSING OF PENDING APPLICATIONS AS PER NCTE REGULATIONS, 2014 BY REGIONAL COMMITTEES: GUIDELINES

Background

National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014 have come into force with effect from 1-12-2014. As per these regulations, new applications for starting new programmes shall be received w.e.f. 1st March, 2015 for the session 2016-2017. However, in the offices of Regional Committees a large number of applications received in earlier years are still pending as processing to their case has not been completed so far due to certain reasons including the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 10-09-2013, which is reproduced below:

"....Those who are desirous of establishing teacher education colleges / institutions shall be free to make application in accordance with the new regulations. Their applications shalt be decided by the competent authority keeping in view the relevant statutory provisions. All the pending applications shall also be decided in accordance with the new regulations...."

Pending Applications mean the applications of any kind received from new institutions or existing Teacher Education Institutions before the date of notification of Regulations, 2014 in respect of which processing has not been started or has not been completed. Such applications can be categorized as under:

- Applications : eking recognition permission. On offering new programes under Section 14 of the NCTE Act
- Applications by existing TEIs seeking permission for offering additional program no or additional intake in the existing programme under Section 15 of the NCTE Act.

- Remand cases referred to the Regional Committees by the NCTE's Appellate Authority or by the Courts.
- · Applications seeking permission for shifting of premises.
- Complaints/inspection reports received from the affiliating body / state governments.
- Miscellaneous applications such as complaints received from individuals, change in the name of institution, closure of institution / programmes, change in the management etc.

The processing of an application might have reached at some definite stage when it was decided to keep it pending for the time being, such as issuance of DL / SCN / LOI etc. Further processing of the applications will obviously depend on the category of application on the one hand and the stage of processing already reached on the other. However, some broad guidelines for the processing of pending applications are given below:

1. A letter has to be sent by the Regional Offices to all pending applicant -institutions asking for their consent to consider their case under New Regulations 2014. This consent is to be given in the form of an affidavit prescribed by the NCTE on a stamp paper of Rs.100/-. A copy of the letter to be sent to the pending applicant institutions and affidavit - format is attached for ready reference.

Such fetters to all pending applicant institutions should be despatched by RCs within a week from the receipt of this communication. In case an institution is not willing to adhere to the revised norms, it may ask for withdrawal of its application.

- 2. Application fee and processing fee for all these pending cases have already been received at the old rates. They need not be required to pay additional fee under the new Regulations. In case any re-inspection is required, the institution may be asked to pay re-inspection fees as per the old Regulations 2009.
- 3. Under the new Regulations, the amount of the Reserve Fund has been increased from Rs.3.00 lakhs to Rs.7.00 lakhs. The pending applicant institutions seeking recognition for

- 4. In respect of B.Ed. programme, under new Regulations 2014, there is a change in basic unit size and required infrastructure, staff pattern, etc. If pending applicant institutions seek Formal Recognition for two basic units, the following conditions will apply:
 - The institutions willing to offer two besic units can be given Formal Recognition before 3rd March, 2015. However, the institution shall create additional built-up area, create additional infrastructure, achere to staff norms, qualifications of staff pay the difference in Endowment and Reserve Fund etc. by Oct 31, 2015 and inform Regional Committees with necessary documents.
 - ii) But the institution must comply with suff requirement and Endowment and Reserve Funds as per no. Regulations for one 1 sie unit before issue of FR.
 - iii) The Regional Committees shall arrange for inspection of these premises, verification of documents and check adicrence to these co-ditions by 29 Feb. 2016. If the institution fails to comply with these requirements, the permission given for one basic unit out of two basic units will have to be withdrawn.
 - iv) While giving LOI, the institution shall be informed at the profision of offering two basic units initially and the requirements they have to fulfill. The issuance of FR will depend on their decision to offer one or two units.
- 5. If a pending-applier 1-institution asks for still-alone programme, it will be permitted by the Regional Committee, 1 wever, the institution will be asked to switch over to composite institution status grad. Aly
- 6. Regulations 2-14 provide for two situations in which opportunity is to be given to the institutions before passing an or ler of refusal.

- a) A show cause notice in case of furnishing false information or concealment of facts in the application; and.
- b) an opportunity of being heard' to the institution, after receiving the inspection report, before passing an order refusing to allow any further opportunity for removal of deficiencies.
 - i) In addition, if the pending applicant institution has failed to fulfill the prescribed norms before VT inspection, they will be given one show cause notice providing opportunity to rectify the deficiencies within 21 days from the date of receipt of the letter, and provide the proof of such rectification wherever possible. In case if the defects are not rectifiable like not possessing the land either on ownership basis or on Lease from Government, on the date of application, the application shall be rejected.
 - ii) The clause mentioned in Regulation 7 (17) 'opportunity of being heard' does not mean giving an opportunity of being personally heard: it only means an opportunity to be given to file a written representation.
- 7. There may be a pending application requesting for closure of one programme, out of the programmes offered by the institution. A doubt may arise, if one programme is allowed to be closed it might lead to existence of a stand alone institution. In such cases, it is clarified that closure of one programme may be allowed but implications of becoming a stand alone institution be intimated to it, that is, it shall have to gradually move to a composite situation in due course. The applicant shall be required to submit reply within 21 days from the receipt of the communication reconfirming or withdrawing the application in the light of the said provision in the New Regulations.
- 8. In respect of applications pending seeking closure of programmes/institutions, the concerned institution will be required to enclose its request letter with resolution of the society/trust, a NOC from affiliating body and an affidavit by the institution stating that they

- 9. The new applications received after December 1, 2014 (the date of notification of Regulation 2014) for change of premises (shifting), the institution should be requested to wait till NCTE makes arrangements to receive applications on-line.
- 10. As per the Regulations 2014, the duration of the courses for, B.Ed, M.Ed and B.P.Ed has been increased to 2 years. Therefore, formal recognition henceforth for these courses shall be granted for the concerned programme with a duration of two years.
- There are applications pending for change of names of the institutions/or society. In all such cases, change of name can be permitted subject to the condition that the request is supported by a Resolution of the Society, a NOC from the Registrar of Societies or concerned registering authority as the case may be and a NOC from the affiliating body
- 12. There are also pending applications requesting for change of Management. In such cases, the request can be considered subject to the condition that the request is supported by a Resolution of the Society or the concerned registering, authority as the case may be, a NOC from the Registrar of Societies and NOC from the affiliating body.
- 13. In respect of cases where recognition has been refused and which have gone in appeal with NCTE (HQ) or Courts, action will be taken on a case to case hasis in accordance with the direction of the Appellate Authority or the Court of Law concerned.
- 14. In respect of cases pending for shifting of premises, if fresh inspections are required, the applicants will be required to pay an inspection fee of only Rs.50000/- as prescribed in the old Regulations (2009).
- 15. In respect of pending applications for additional intake in the B.Ed. programme, the applicant institution shall be asked to clarify if its application should be considered for additional unit of 50 students or for two additional units of 50 each. The applicant institution shall have to create infrastructure and deposit Endowment and Reserve Funds for one unit or two units as the case may be.

- 16. NCTE Regulations 2014 has approved only 15 programmes. If any application is pending for recognition of a Programme other than the 15 courses notified, the Regional Office has to follow the existing policy relating to the programme concerned.
- 17. The new Regulations provide that an institution will have to apply along with No Objection Certificate of the affiliating body besides other documents. The condition of NOC of the affiliating body will not apply to the pending applications.
- 18. The new Regulations provide for a 2nd reminder to be sent to the State Govt, for obtaining their recommendation / comments on the application of the institution. This shall not be applicable in the case of pending applications.
- 19. In case of application submitted for change of premises and the application is pending with the Regional Committee, the fee as per NCTE Rules (Amendment), 2014 shall not be taken from the institution.
- 20. Pending application for innovative programmes will have to be processed as per current practice.
- 21. The NCTE Regulations provide for constituting a VT out of a Panel of experts approved by the Council. The Regional Committees shall continue to constitute the VTs from their own panel till the Panel of Experts is finalized by the Council.
- 22. The Formal Recognition order to be issued to Teacher Education Institutions shall make a mention of all those conditions that they shall have to fulfill as per the requirements of the New Regulations.

Agenda Item No.8: Consideration of proposal for Re-Constitution of the Regional Committees of NCTE.

The present Regional Committees of NCTE were constituted vide Gazette Notification No. 187 dated 23.9.2011 (Annexure-I, pp.355-357) under the provision of section 20 (3) (c) of the NCTE Act, 1993, for a tenure of two years.

- 2. Further, the Council had decided to nominate Council's representatives to each of the Regional Committees of NCTE in its 31st Meeting held on 29th July, 2013under Section 20(3) (a) of the NCTE Act, 1993 vide Gazette Notification No.36 dated 31.1.2013(Annexure-J, pp.358-360).
- 3. In the NRC, Jaipur, its Chairperson Mrs. Alka Kala, resigned on 27.12.2011. The slot was filled up through nomination of Shri Sudhir Verma, Former Secretary, Department of Higher and Technical Education, Government of Rajasthan vide Gazette Notification No. 257 dated 29th December, 2011 (Annexure- K, pp.361). One of the members in NRC, namely Prof. Daljit Gupta also resigned and he was replaced through nomination by Prof. (Mrs.) Divya Prabha Nagar, Former Vice-Chancellor, Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth University, Udaipur, Rajasthan vide Gazette Notification No. 200 dated 19.9.2012 (Annexure-L, pp.362).
- 4. The tenure of the RCs was to be over on 22.9.2013, therefore, the following course of action was proposed for consideration of the Council in its 32nd meeting held on 24.5.2013:
 - (i) Fill up casual vacancy caused by the resignation of Prof. M.A. Khadar from SRC, Bangalore.
 - (ii) To extend the tenure of the present Regional Committees for a further tenure of Two Years.
 - (iii) To re-constitute the Regional Committees, as per the extant Regulations.
- 5. The Council after due deliberations decided that the existing Regional Committees shall continue with their present composition till 31st March, 2014. Simultaneously, it was also decided to constitute a Selection Committee to be chaired by Ms. Anshu Vaish, with Prof. Poonam Batra and Prof. Khadar as members to recommend suitable names for appointment as members of the Regional Committees. The Committee submitted its recommendations for nominations of members in the RCs to Chairperson, NCTEon 10th March, 2014 for further appropriate action. The recommendations of Mrs. Anshu Vaish Committee were to be considered by Chairperson, NCTE and other two members nominated by the Council namely Prof. R. Govinda and Prof. Venita Kaul
- 5. NCTE initiated action for nomination of the recommended names to the respective RCs, but in the meantime the Election Commission of India announced Lok Sabha Elections and the model Code of Conduct came into force. Accordingly, NCTE requested the Ministry of HRD to seek clarifications from the Election Commission whether the Nomination could be notified. The Ministry after consultation with ECI informed NCTE vide their letter F.No.11-08/2014-EE-10 dated 16.4.2014 together with letter No.437/6/CG/2014-CC&BE/37355 dated 7.4.2014 (Annexure- M, pp.363-364) that the notification of the nominated Members may be deferred till the completion of the election process.
- 6. After election process was over in May, 2014, the NCTE resumed the process of nomination of the members in the RCs but at the same time two writ petitions, No.14550 of 2014 at Hon'ble High Court of Hyderabad by Dr. S. Vijay Kumar and another vide No.14652 of 2014 at in the same Court by Dr. R. Surender Reddy were filed praying therein for consideration of their candidatures for nomination as Chairperson/Member in the Southern Regional Committee, (Bengaluru). Two more

similar cases were filed, one by Dr. K. Rayar (WP. NoNo.13494/2014 in the Hon'ble High Court Madras) challenging the procedure of constitution of Regional Committee and for his nomination SRC, and another by Ch. Vankat Reddy (Writ Petition No.11370/2014Hon'ble High Court of Andh-Pradesh at Hyderabad) challenging the procedure of Nomination. The Hon'ble Courts disposed the above said petitions with the directions to consider the nomination of the petitioners to the RCs merit basis.

- 7. Before implementation of the directions of the Courts, the matter was referred by NCTE June, 2014to NCTE Legal Counsel Shri Amitesh Kumar seeking his opinion but he returned the case in the last week of July, 2014 without giving any legal opinion, due to his termination of services NCTE legal Counsel. Then, the matter was referred to Advocate Sh. Arjun Harkauli, Legal Counsel of NCTE and he tendered his opinion on 22.10.2014 stating that the selection process for Members SRC is over and as per directions of the Hon'ble High Court the candidature of these applicants be considered on merit.
- 8. Due to the reasons given above and other administrative exigencies, the nominations of the Chairperson/Members to the Regional Committees could not be finalized. Now, since the recommendations given by the Selection Committee are too old, it may not be prudent to act on their Therefore, it will be desirable to have fresh names for nomination to the RCs. It is also pertinent to mention here that some of the recommended names are not eligible to be appointed as members. Also names of the existing Chairpersons/Members have also been recommended by the Committee. Keeping in view the sensitive nature of assignment, it may not be appropriate to repeat the nominations in the RCs.
- 9. Accordingly, following course of action is proposed for consideration of the Council:
 - (i) A new Selection Committee, with at least one representative from the State Government may be formed for giving fresh recommendations for nomination of Chairpersons/Members in the RCs.

or

(ii) Expand the existing Selection Committee by including a representative of the State Governments to review / recommend persons (in the existing list) of applicants for nomination to the Regional Committees of NCTE (12 names for each RC).
This is placed before the Council for their consideration and decision.



Shri Mahavir Prasad Berwal (SC), President of Meghwal Samaj Samiti, Nawalgarh, Dist. Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan has submitted an application (Annexure-N, pp.367-370) to Dr. P.L.Puniah, Chairman, National SC/ST Commission, Government of India, New Delhi, received at NCTE through MHRD, inter alia stating that there is no provision for reservation of SC/ST and OBC candidates in appointment of teachers in teacher education institutions. He alleged that NCTE did it knowingly in violation of Constitution of India and requested to include provisions of reservation for SC/ST & OBC under NCTE Regulations, 2014.

2. On examination of the relevant provisions stipulated in the NCTE Norms & Standards for Teacher Education Programmes (Appendix 1 to 15) of the NCTE Regulations 2014 (Annexure-O will be placed on the Table Separately) w.r.t. ने भारत के भविष्य का निर्माण करने वाले अध्यापक की शिक्षा के केन्द्रों अर्थात् बी.एड., एम.एड. आदि कं। कॉलेजों में लगने वाले अध्यापक--शिक्षकों के लिए योग्यता निर्धारण एवं भरती में किसी प्रकार के आरक्षण क कोई प्रावधान ही नहीं रखा। भारत के इस राजपत्र ने हमारे सर्वोपिर कहे जाने वाले "संविधान" का यह मजाव नहीं तो क्या बनाया है? यह कोई सामान्य घटना नहीं बल्कि जानबुझकर की गयी हरकत महसूस होती है क्योंकि मूल अध्यादेश जारी होने के बाद प्रस्तुत किये जाने वाले संशोधन में भी इसे छोड़ दिया गया है। अतः यह मात्र मानवीय भूल नहीं बल्कि जानबुझकर की गयी कारस्तानी है।

विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग (युजीसी) जिसका गठन भी भारतीय संसद द्वारा पारित अध्यादेश से हुआ है, के द्वारा जच्च रिक्षा में अध्यापन के लिए राष्ट्रीय पात्रता परीक्षा (नेट) का आयोजन करवाया जाता है जिसमें अनुस्चित जाति / अनुस्चित जनजाति / अन्य पिछंडे वर्ग के लिए अपने बेवेषय में 50 प्रतिशत अंक पर ही योग्यंने प्रदान की जाती है, जो कि आरक्षण के लिए प्रदत्त संवैधानिक अधिकार की अनुपालना में होता है। किन्त एनसीटीई द्वारा पारित नये अध्यादेश में यह छंट प्रदान नहीं की गयी है जिससे आरक्षित वर्ग के अन्यधियों की युजीसी का नियम हाते हुए भी महाविद्यालय में अयोग्य करार दिया जा रही है। इस प्रकार अनेक अध्यादेश को दिया को रही अविध की सेवा के जपरानों मी अयोग्य करार देकर सेवा समाप्ति करवायी जो रही है।

अत मान्यवर से निवेदन है कि ''संविधान'' में अनुसूचित जाति/अनुसूचित जनजाति/अन्य पिछड़े वर्ग आदि को प्रदत्त आरक्षण के अधिकार को भी नये नियम एवं कानून — 2014 में शामिल करवाया जाये तथा इस प्रकार प्रशासन के उच्चतम स्तर पर की गयी इस <u>ज्ञानसहित भ्रामक त्रुटि</u> के दोषी अधिकारियों पर कठोर कार्यवाही करवाने की कार्यवाही भी करने का निर्देश प्रदान करे।

मान्यवर से यह भी निवेदन है कि भविष्य में इस प्रकार की <u>ज्ञानसहित भ्रामक त्रुटियों की घटनाओं की पुनरावृत्ति</u> रोकने के लिए केन्द्र/राज्य सरकार/अन्य विधिसम्मत संगठनों के लिए नियम बनाने वाली समितियों में आरक्षित वर्ग का प्रतिनिधि होना आवश्यक करवाकर हितों को सुरक्षित करवाने की कृपा करें।

The NCTE (Recruitment Rules), Regulations 2003 were notified vide Gazette of India No. 36 dated 28th March, 2003. There are 123 Sanctioned posts. Out of them 3 posts viz; Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Member Secretary are nominated posts from Government of India. Apart from this three posts, the following sanctioned posts in NCTE were notified as mentioned above in the year 2003.

- 2. Subsequently, the Recruitment Rules for the categories of Stenographer Grade C and Under Secretary/Research Officer were subsequently amended vide Gazette of India No. 22 dated 21st February, 2008 and Gazette of India No. 84 dated 23rd May, 2009 respectively.
- 3. After acceptance of recommendations of the 6th Central Pay Commission, the DOPT vide their O.M. NO. AB.14017/61/2008-Estt. (RR) dated the 24th March, 2009 advised all the Ministries/Departments to amend the existing Recruitment Rule of the posts, based on the new pay scales etc. Accordingly, the Recruitment Rules for 17 categories of posts operating in NCTE have been prepared and placed before the Council for approval.

Agenda Item No.11: Creation of full time post of Central Vigilance Officer (CVC) for NCTE.

As per instructions of CVC dated 15th October, 2009, the Corporations established by or und any Central Act, Govt companies, Societies, Local authorities owned or controlled by the Central Gord (apart from Govt of India Deptt/Ministries, PSUs, Banks and Insurance Companies) should have an i house vigilance set up in place, headed by a Chief Vigilance Officer or a Vigilance Officer-Accordingly, CVOs of all Ministries have been requested to ensure that a proper/structured vigilance set-up is put in place, if it does not exist already, in every organization of this type.

- 2. Further, the DOPT vide their OM dated 12th July, 2012 has also desired for creation of post of CVO by the concerned Ministries/Deptts in respect of Autonomous bodies, Statutory bodies, Societie Trusts etc.
- 3. NCTE is a statutory body under the Ministry of HRD established under NCTE Act, 1993. Even though, a separate Vigilance Cell has been established vide order dated 10.3.2014 comprising of Und Secretary, Section Officer, Assistant and PA but there is no full time CVO and Shri Manik Mandai, Deputy Secretary in MHRD has been appointed by MHRD as part-time CVO in NCTE and he joint NCTE on 18.3.2014. The CVO being part-time basis, it creates problem of lack of close supervision of staff of NCTE. The CVO in any organization like NCTE is responsible for regular and surprisin inspection of sensitive areas of work, streamlining and reviewing of procedures in areas which are susceptible and have the scope of misconduct and corruption. There are various dimensions a vigilance e.g. (i) Preventive Vigilance (ii) Punitive Vigilance and (iii) Surveillance and detection. The NCTE is dealing with the regulatory matters which are sensitive from vigilance angle. In view of this it is imperative to have a full-time CVO for NCTE which will have the following advantages:
 - i) Systematic handling of vigilance matters would take place.
 - ii) Delay in investigation and completion of disciplinary proceedings may be eliminated Presently, there are a large number of pending vigilance cases.
 - iii)Presence of CVO right within the NCTE would be a great deterrent to tainted behaviour.
 - iv)Presence of CVO will enable implementation and compliance of the instructions issued by CVC and other such bodies from time to time.
- 4. There is, therefore, an urgent need of an independent CVO for NCTE for which a post of CVO and attendant staff viz., one PA and one Peon is required to be created. The Ministry of HRD hav also desired for creation of full time post of CVO. Keeping in view the size of NCTE and quantum of work, it is felt that the post may be created at the level of Director to the Govt of India in the Pay Ban 4 (Rs. 37400-67000) and Grade Pay of Rs. 8700/-.
- 5. Being a Group 'Á' post, approval of Central Govt (Ministry of HRD) is required. However, before the proposal is referred to MHRD, approval of Council is solicited for creation of the post of CVO on full-time basis along with the attendant staff (one PA and one Peon).

In pursuance the NCTE constituted a Committee to deliberate on the issue. The recommendations of the Committee were notified by a Gazette Notification No. 158 dated 2nd August, 2011. The qualifications of Elementary School Teachers made it necessary for teachers in elementary schools. The NCTE then constituted a committee which deliberated on the structure and related aspects of TET, on the basis of which the NCTE issued Guidelines on 11th February, 2011 to the states for the conduct of TET. MHRD authorised CBSE to conduct CTET for CBSE schools and the States/UTs which could not conduct the Test. All the States are requested to establish TET Cell with Nodal Officers for conducting

TET. Considering the gravity of the situation TET Cell need be constituted in NCTE. The details

Structure and Function of NCTE TET Cell

structure and role of the cell is as under:

With teacher Eligibility Test (TET) being an essential eligibility condition for recruitment of teachers from class I to VIII and since NCTE is supposed to prescribe the parameters of TET for being conducted in different parts of the Country it is necessary that the NCTE should take necessary steps for streamline its conduct.

To fulfil this responsibility the NCTE has decided to set up an separate TET Cell.

The Functions of TET Cell will be as under:

- To keep regular contact with the States TET Cells within the agencies conducting TET
- To issue guidelines for the conduct of TET from time to time
- To lay dow the qualification for taking the TET
- To suggest the structure and design of the tests related to TET

- To guide the TET Cells in regard to the problems faced from time to time.
- To maintain a data bank regarding the TETs conducted by different agencies.
- To conduct comparative research studies on TETs conducted by different agencies.
- To monitor the progress of TETs conducted by different agencies.

Structure of TET Cell

Head of the TET (one post) - of the rank of Professor as per NCTE norms.

Under Secretory (one post) - as per NCTE's Recruitment Rules.

Research Assistant (Two post) - with the qualification of M.Ed. with Mathematics/Statistics at Graduate level

UDC (one post) - as per NCTE's Recruitment Rules.

LDC (one post) - as per NCTE's Recruitment Rules.

Peon (one post) - as per NCTE's Recruitment Rules.

The TET Cell of the NCTE will be guided by the TET Committee in its projects and programmes in view of their in-depth familiarity with the conduct of TET in the country and the problems it has faced. The Committee was constituted by the NCTE vide letter No. 1176-4/2010/NCTE/Acad dated 18th June, 2013.

TOR of the Committee will be as follows:

- 1. The Committee will analyse the data so received from the States Governments/CBSE.
- The Committee will also take into consideration the representations received from Committee will also take into consideration the representation received from general public regarding TET.
- 3. To hold consultation with the stake holders, wherever necessary.
- 4. Analyse recommendation on revamping of TET.

- 5. Formation of fresh guidelines for the TET.
- 6. The tenure of the Committee will be for a period of three months.
- 7. TA/DA/Sitting fee to the members will be paid as per NCTE rules.

The Council may consider and approve this agenda.

Minutes of the 45th Meeting of the Council National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) held on 26th November, 2015 at The Janpath Hotel, New Delhi

The 45th Meeting of the NCTE Council was held on November 26, 2015 at Hotel Janpath, New Delhi at 2:00 P.M. The list of participants is given in Annexure 1. The following agenda items were taken up for discussion and decision.

The Chairperson welcomed all members to the 45th meeting of the Council, especially two Hon'ble Members of Parliament, Dr. Hari Babu Kambhampati and Shri Srinivas Kesineni who attended this Council for the first time. As desired, for their understanding of the functioning of NCTE, Chairperson presented a brief on the structure and functioning of NCTE, Regulations 2014, and the new initiatives.

As part of E-Governance, besides applications and the payment being online, RT1 and Grievance Redressal have been made online along with a national toll free number 1800-1100-39 for NCTE Call Centre. GIS of institutions is online and above 10,000 TEIs have filled up GIS - the work is being expedited so that this will further lead to development of online Institutional Database, Faculty Database, annual E-Monitoring of TEIs, and Accreditation in every 5 years of each TEI. For accreditation at higher education level, an MOU was signed with NAAC/UGC, and the process, parametres and proforma (distinct from the ongoing accreditation by NAAC) are being looked into to be finalised soon so that accreditation can be started toward the first quarter of 2016. Similarly, after discussion with MHRD and with reference to the letter of reference received from the Secretary, Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India to Secretary (SE&L), MHRD, subsequent discussions took place with the Quality Council of India to have an MoU on nomination basis to undertake the task of accreditation of TEIs/programmes at diploma level (DPSE, D.El.Ed., DVA, DPA, D.P.Ed.) The tasks, processes, parametres, timelines and costing are being waked out. While the process and platform development shall be costed for QCl, NCTE shall take care of orientation workshops to develop awareness among TEIs. The annual e-monitoring fee per institution shall be within Rs.4000/and the accreditation fee to be borne by each TEI shall be less than what NAAC/UGC and NBA/AICTE

Complete E-Regulation shall be in place soon; the online centralised VT Database with provision of computerised randomised selection process shall be in place within the next three weeks; and NCTE is currently undergoing the process of ISO-9001. To accomplish the above tasks, a few new Units/specialised areas of work have been created at HQ – TET, Demand-Supply, Resources and Publications, E-Governance, Monitoring and Accreditation, ISO-9001, Public Relations, and Databases. The Regional Committees/Centres are also being facilitated to create an IT Unit, Database Unit, and mechanisms for completion of GIS Database and D-S Study. NCTE is also in the process of engaging a few more consultants and research assistants to help in the above tasks.

Further, it was reported that: NCTE has completed regional and national consultations on Teacher Education for the upcoming National Policy on Education, and the report has been submitted to MHRO. In October 2015, NCTE Review Committee was appointed by MHRO with 9 terms of reference and to submit its report within six months' time. NCTE building at Dwarka is coming up fast with completion of basement, ground and first floors, and the next three floors along with other facilities shall be completed by the next 8 months as planned.

The above efforts and achievements by NCTE were noted and appreciated by the Council. With this, the items in the Agenda were taken up one by one.

Item 1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the 44th Meeting of the Council (NCTE), and Action Taken thereof.

The Minutes of the 44th meeting of the Council as circulated earlier was discussed. Action taken on the first item on further course of action on those TEIs who had started TE programmes without prior

recognition from NCTE is being put up as Agenda Item 2 below. For the second item, Appeal data were discussed, and the reasons for gap between appeals submitted and appeals disposed off were noted; and also that reconstitution of the Appeals Committee is being examined by NCTE and MHRD. Action on the third item is being taken up as Agenda Item 7 below. In case of the fourth item of the 44 meeting on expediting the demand-supply data/status, NCTE has undertaken a Demand-Supply study for 2015-16 to 2015-26. A comparison of 2008-09 study and 2015-16 study on important differences is given in the following table:

The study proposes to take data of passed out students for each teacher education course in individual Teacher Education Institutions (recognised by NCTE) for the year 2014-2015 and enrolled student-teachers for the year 2015-2016.

Prof. V.P. Garg, advisor to D-S study, presented the details of the study – UDISE data up to 2014-15 are being obtained; age-cohort population data for 2011 census are being collated; State Education Secretaries have been requested to depute nodal officers to furnish the requisite information on Demand and Supply study; and questionnaire and platform are being developed with free-of-cost support by Central Square Foundation. The above study was highly appreciated by the members. It was pointed out that such demand-supply should be level-wise, district-wise and subject-wise; a longitudinal study should be undertaken; help of experts from NUEPA and Institution of Manpower Planning may be obtained; the expansion vis-à-vis RMSA and increasing number of children along with 2011 census should be taken into account; this should be carefully considered by NCTE while issuing public notice in future for ban of state-wise programmes, otherwise the ban may be challenged in the court of law.

The "any other item" from the Minutes of 44th Meeting was discussed. It was decided to place this item along with other anomalies and suggestions on Regulations 2014 received by NCTE as decmed appropriate in the subsequent meeting of the Council.

Item 2: Consideration of retrospective recognition to the Teacher Education Institutions / Universities which have made admissions in Teachers Education Programmes prior to obtaining recognition from NCTE.

On this issue, the report of Prof. Joshipura Committee constituted by NCTE was placed before the Council in the 44th Meeting on March 17, 2015. While the Council did not agree to the two alternative recommendations of the Committee, [i.e. i) the Council should give ex-post-facto approval to public/public-funded TEIs/TE programmes, or ii) make a case to Government of India to take the Ordinance route], it had advised NCTE to take further legal opinion from a senior Legal Counsel and place in the next meeting of the Council for taking appropriate decision. Accordingly, legal opinion on the matter was obtained from Shri Tushar Mehta, Additional Solicitor General, Government of India and was placed before this Council for consideration and approval.

A few members again argued for taking the Ordinance route of Govt. of India which was disagreed by many and especially by the Hon'ble Members of Parliament (present in the meeting) who also pointed out that in the interest of the graduates, the legal opinion given by the Hon'ble ASG may be approved. Further, in the course of discussion, it was pointed out that distinction cannot be made between various types of institutions (public-funded, state/UGC part-funded, and private) listed in the table of institutions requiring ex-post-facto recognition. The Council then approved the item as follows (except that dissent was given by Prof. Poonam Batra and Prof. Janaki Rajan who had desired that this needs to be recorded in the Minutes):

"Based on the legal opinion obtained from ASG Shri Tushar Mehta and keeping in view the career of students/graduates of the TEIs listed (as on date), which could not approach NCTE for recognition of their programmes earlier, the matter was considered by the Council. While as per NCTE Act, the Council does not have power for granting retrospective recognition, it approved the legal opinion obtained. This, along with list of programmes of all listed institutions, shall further be referred to MHRD for legal vetting by the Ministry of Law and Justice and for guzette notification by Govt. of India."

Item 3: Consideration of Audited Annual Accounts of NCTE for the year 2013-2014 and Un-Audited Annual Accounts for the Financial Year 2014-2015.

The audited accounts for 2013-14 and unaudited annual accounts for 2014-15 were presented by the Member Secretary. While these were approved, it was pointed out that in future the unaudited accounts be first passed by the Finance Committee and then be placed with its recommendations before the Council for approval (and, this be hence placed in Finance Committee too and discrepancy if any be brought to the notice of the Council); and also that the Central government should reconsider the current status and support NCTE financially with annual budgetary provisions.

Item 4: Consideration of Annual Report for the year 2013-14 and 2014-15.

The Annual Report for 2013-14 was approved, while that for 2014-15 needed to be put in a proper format and be placed before the Council. Further, the NCTE should develop a proper Format of Annual Reports and circulate to members for consideration and approval to be adhered to in future.

Item 5: Consideration of Revision of Regulations relating Teacher Educator Qualifications for NET/and Ph.D.

The Council approved that NET and Ph.D. (in Education) (as required by UGC to be essential qualification across all disciplines) be added in Norms and Standards as essential to teacher educator qualification for TE programmes at higher education level, wherever these were not mentioned as "essential".

Item 6A: Consideration of Centralised Visiting Team Selection Criteria and VT/Inspection Policy, 2015; and

6B: Approval of 2007 Visiting Team Database and 2015 VT Database for Inspection of TEls under Hon'ble M.P. High Court, and to be used by RCs.

6(A): Regulations 2014 provides for developing a Centralised Database of Visiting Teams to be utilised by all RCs and the HQ for inspection of TEIs for recognition and post-recognition. For this, NCTE had initiated the process a few months back as part of E-Governance and E-Regulation. A programme for centralised database of VTs with computerised randomised selection process has been developed and is being put online at NCTE Home Page for eligible experts to apply online. Once the criteria for selection of visiting team are approved by the Council, the existing VT Selection Committee of NCTE shall select the experts as per the criteria to be put to database by the vendor (Xchanging). After discussion, the following criteria were approved by the Council:

- 1. At least 10 years of experience in the field of Teacher Education (including Art and Physical Education)/ Educational Administration.
- 2. (a) Serving/Retired Professor/Associate Professor of Education (and Art and Physical Education) in Universities or recognized TEls;

OR

3. (b) Serving/Retired Principal of NCTE Recognized Teacher Education Institutions or Head of Department of Education in multi-faculty institutions/departments;

OR

(c) Serving/Retired Educational Administrator such as Director/Joint Director of SCERT/SIE, Joint Commissioner in KVS/NVS or officer holding equivalent position in MHRD/UGC/Central/State Education Board/State Education Department;

OR

(d) Serving/Retired Professor/Associate Professor in Educational Research Organizations like NCERT etc.

Further, the following variables/fields for programming the VT selection database were approved.

- a) Professor
- b) University
- c) Government
- d) Private
- e) Minority
- f) Gender
- g) Programme
- h) State

There is no deadline for making online application, though the VT Committee shall select experts for VT Database based on the above criteria on continuous basis (weekly or fortnightly) as would be required.

Also, the Council approved the NCTE VT/Inspection Policy 2015 presented to it (which had taken into consideration the existing approved 2006 Policy, NCTE developed 2011 policy, and Regulations 2014).

6 (B): Since the development of centralised online VT database will take some more time, the Council approved for RCs to use: i) the 2007 HQ approved database of experts, ii) the database of 345 experts developed by the VT Committee (for ongoing inspection of TEIs under Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh), and iii) use of VTs by RCs for the small number of inspections that have already taken place at RCs with their existing database. However, it was underlined that once the Centralised Online VT Database with selected experts gets active, the RCs will use only the centralised database of VTs for inspection for recognition. Also, till the above comes up, for Section 13 inspection, the Database of 345 experts along with the 2007 Database could be used.

Further, the Council approved the list of 345 experts (as given) developed by the VT Committee (through a transparent process of online application to which above 800, having 20 years and above experience in

education/teacher education, had applied) which was used for inspection carried out under Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh in 2014-15.

Item 7: Consideration of extension of the last date of 31st October 2015 for the compliance of provisions in the NCTE Regulations 2014 related to additional faculty/staff, infrastructure etc. for 2nd year of B.Ed., B.P.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes.

The grievances and suggestions received from various TE associations and institutions relating to difficulties faced in complying to this by October 31, 2015 (and the fact that for teaching in the 2nd year, which will start in July 2016, it may not be feasible to appoint faculty by October 2015) were considered and discussed by the Council.

The Council decided that, for the two year programmes of B.Ed., B.P.Ed. and M.Ed. (which are in the first year of operation for the first time), the stipulated number of faculty/staff should be identified / selected by TEIs or Education Department of University and approval of the affiliating university (or parent university) be obtained latest by 29th February, 2015, and the same be conveyed to the concerned Regional Committee by that date, in the existing prescribed manner and in the prescribed proforma, giving details of qualification and experience of the faculty/staff selected along with the letter of approval of the affiliating /parent university.

The Council also agreed that the additional built up area and additional FDR in the joint account as per NCTE Regulations, 2014 may be provided by 30th May, 2015, and the concerned Reginal Committee be informed in the prescribed manner with required documents to substantiate the claim immediately thereafter. This is a one-time measure, and be applicable for 2015-16 batch only. For subsequent batches, separate decisions may be taken later.

Item 8: Consideration of proposal for Re-constitution of the Regional Committees of NCTE.

The present Regional Committees of NCTE were constituted vide Gazette Notification No. 187 dated 23.9.2011 under the provision of section 20 (3) (c) of the NCTE Act, 1993, for a tenure of two years.

- 2. Further, the Council had decided to nominate Council's representatives to each of the Regional Committees of NCTE in its 31st Meeting held on 29th July, 2013 under Section 20(3) (a) of the NCTE Act, 1993 vide Gazette Notification No.36 dated 31.1.2013.
- 3. In the NRC, Jaipur, its Chairperson Mrs. Alka Kala resigned on 27.12.2011. The slot was filled up through nomination of Shri Sudhir Verma, Former Secretary, Department of Higher and Technical Education, Government of Rajasthan vide Gazette Notification No. 257 dated 29th December, 2011. One of the members in NRC, namely Prof. Daljit Gupta also resigned and he was replaced through nomination by Prof. (Mrs.) Divya Prabha Nagar, former Vice-Chancellor, Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth University, Udaipur, Rajasthan vide Gazette Notification No. 200 dated 19.9.2012.
- 4. The tenure of the RCs was to be over on 22.9.2013, therefore, the following course of action was proposed for consideration of the Council in its 32nd meeting held on 24.5.2013:
 - (i) Fill up casual vacancy caused by the resignation of Prof. M.A. Khadar from SRC, Bangalore.
 - (ii) To extend the tenure of the present Regional Committees for a further tenure of Two Years.

OR

- (iii) To re-constitute the Regional Committees, as per the extant Regulations.
- 5. The Council after due deliberations had decided that the existing Regional Committees shall continue with their present composition till 31st March, 2014. Simultaneously, it had also decided to constitute a Selection Committee to be chaired by Ms. Anshu Vaish, with Prof. Poonam Batra and Prof. M.A. Khadar as members to recommend suitable names for appointment as members of the Regional Committees. The Committee submitted its recommendations for nominations of members in the RCs to Chairperson, NCTE

- on 10th March, 2014 for further appropriate action. The recommendations of Mrs. Anshu Vaish Committee were to be considered by Chairperson, NCTE and other two members nominated by the Council namely Prof. R. Govinda and Prof. Venita Kaul.
- 5. Following this, the NCTE initiated action for nomination of the recommended names to the respective RCs, but in the meantime the Election Commission of India announced Lok Sabha Elections and the model Code of Conduct came into force. Accordingly, NCTE requested the Ministry of HRD to seek clarifications from the Election Commission whether the Nominations could be notified. The Ministry after consultation with ECI informed NCTE vide their letter F.No.11-08/2014-EE-10 dated 16.4.2014 together with letter No.437/6/CG/2014-CC&BE/37355 dated 7.4.2014 that the process of constitution of new Regional Committees needs to be deferred till the completion of the election process.
- 6. After the election process was over in May, 2014, the NCTE resumed the process of nomination of the members in the RCs, but at the same time two writ petitions No.14550 of 2014 at Hon'ble High Court of Hyderabad by Dr. S. Vijay Kumar and another vide No.14652 of 2014 in the same Court by Dr. R. Surender Reddy were filed praying therein for consideration of their candidatures for nomination as Chairperson/Member in the Southern Regional Committee (Bengaluru). Two more similar cases were also filed one by Dr. K. Rayar (WP. No.13494/2014 in the Hon'ble High Court of Madras) challenging the procedure of constitution of Regional Committee and for his nomination to SRC, and another by Ch. Vankat Reddy (Writ Petition No.11370/2014 Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh at Hyderabad) challenging the procedure of nomination. The Hon'ble Courts disposed off the above said petitions with the directions to consider the nomination of the petitioners to the RCs on merit basis.
- 7. Before implementation of the directions of the Courts, the matter was referred by NCTE in June, 2014 to its the then Legal Counsel Shri Amitesh Kumar seeking his opinion, but he returned the case in the last week of July, 2014 without giving any legal opinion. Then, the matter was referred to Advocate Sh. Arjun Harkauli, Legal Counsel of NCTE and be tendered his opinion on 22.10.2014 stating that the selection process for members of SRC is over and as per directions of the Hon'ble High Court the candidature of these applicants be considered on merit.
- 8. Due to the reasons given above and other administrative exigencies, the nominations of the Chairperson/Members to the Regional Committees could not be finalized. It also came to notice that some of the recommended names do not possess eligibility as prescribed in Regulations. Further, the names of some of the existing Chairpersons/Members have also been recommended by the Committee. Keeping in view the sensitive nature of assignment, it may not be appropriate to repeat the nominations in the reconstituted RCs.
- 9. Accordingly, following course of action was proposed for consideration of the Council:
 - (i) A new Selection Committee, with at least one representative from the State Governments, may be formed for giving fresh recommendations for nomination of Chairpersons/Members in the RCs.

OR

(ii) Expand the existing Selection Committee by including a representative of the State Governments to review / recommend persons (in the existing list) of applicants for nomination to the Regional Committees of NCTE (12 names for each RC).

The Council deliberated on this item, and pointed out that since March 3, 2016 deadline for completion of the process of existing applications is nearing, a new RC for each region may take time to understand the process which may delay the entire process, and subsequent anomalies and court cases may increase. Hon'ble MP also pointed out that there are no nominations from the states of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana which should be considered. Also it was voiced that the then Chairperson of the Recommendation Committee may be consulted if nominations can be reconsidered. The Council after deliberations decided that the present Council should be expeditiously reconstituted with new members which should then form a new Committee to follow a widely circulated transparent process and suggest names for 4 RCs to the Chairperson, NCTE for necessary action. The Hon'ble MPs also assured to help expediting the reconstitution of the Council.

Item 9: Consideration of the proposal to Amendment in the clause "Terms & Conditions of Service" of the Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff stipulated in the Appendix 1 to 15 of the NCTE (Recognition, Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014.

The item pertained to Regulation 2014 where reservation of posts was advertently not mentioned. Subsequently, in this regard, the Council had received representation from Shri Mahavir Prasad Berwal (SC), President of Meghwal Samaj Samiti, Nawalgarh, Dist. Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan who had submitted an application to Chairman, National SC/ST Commission, Government of India (received at NCTE through MHRD) inter alia stating that there is no provision for reservation of SC/ST and OBC candidates in appointment of teachers in teacher education institutions. He alleged that NCTE did it knowingly in violation of Constitution of India and requested to include provisions of reservation for SC/ST & OBC under NCTE Regulations, 2014.

In order to address and resolve the hardship being faced by the candidates from reserved categories it shall be appropriate that the extant provision stipulated in NCTE Regulations 2014 tabulated at Column No. 4 may be substituted as per NCTE Regulations, 2009 in respect of each course from Appendix 1 to 15 by making an amendment. The Council approved the following to be added to Regulations 2014 appropriately in Norms and Standards of 15 programmes it had recognised.

"The reservation for SC/ST/OBC and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government/State Government,"

Item 10: Consideration of Revision of National Council for Teacher Education (Recruitment Rules), Regulations, 2003.

The NCTE (Recruitment Rules), Regulations 2003 were notified vide Gazette of India No. 36 dated 28th March, 2003. There are 123 sanctioned posts in NCTE, out of which 3 posts viz; Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and Member Secretary are filled up by MHRD, Government of India.

- 2. Subsequently, the Recruitment Rules for the categories of Stenographer Grade C and Under Secretary/Research Officer were amended vide Gazette of India No. 22 dated 21st February, 2008 and Gazette of India No. 84 dated 23rd May, 2009 respectively.
- 3. After acceptance of recommendations of the 6th Central Pay Commission, the DOPT vide their O.M. NO. AB.14017/61/2008-Estt. (RR) dated the 24th March, 2009 advised all the Ministries/Departments to amend the existing Recruitment Rule of the posts, based on the new pay scales etc. Accordingly, the revised Recruitment Rules for 17 categories of posts operating in NCTE were placed before the Council for approval.
- 4. The Council discussed and approved amendment to the Recruitment Rules 2015 for the sanctioned posts of Deputy Secretary/Regional Director, Under Secretary/Research Officer, Section Officer/Programme Officer, Account Officer, Senior Personal Assistant, Computer Programmer-cum-Planning and Monitoring Officer, existing post Librarian-cum-Documentation and Production Officer (LDPO), Junior Account Officer, Assistant, Technical Assistant, Stenographer Grade-"D", LDC and Staff Car Driver to be forwarded to MHRD for final approval by the Central Government.
- 5. The amendments proposed for the posts operating in NCTE were based on the guidelines issued by DoP&T vide their OM dated 24.03.2009. In the majority of the posts, the amendments proposed were cosmetic in nature i.e. replacement of pay scale etc. The amendments as worked out by NCTE-appointed Committee and as further revised after discussion with Director, DoPT, Gol and finalized are given as below:

6. In addition to the above amendments, an error occurred inadvertently while circulating the agenda in the recruitment rules for the post of Under Secretary, wherein the Sr. Personal Assistant who, among others, is in feeder category of promotion, was left out. The same has been corrected in the above table.

The above (Sl. 5 and 6) were approved by the Council.

Item 11: Consideration of Creation of full time post of Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO) for NCTE.

As per instructions of CVC dated 15th October, 2009, the Corporations established by or under any Central Act, Govt. companies, Societies, Local authorities owned or controlled by the Central Govt. (apart from Govt. of India Deptt/Ministries, PSUs, Banks and Insurance Companies) should have an in-house vigilance set up in place, headed by a Chief Vigilance Officer or a Vigilance Officer. Accordingly, CVOs of all Ministries have been requested to ensure that a proper/structured vigilance set-up is put in place, if it does not exist already, in every organization of this type.

Further, the DOPT vide their OM dated 12th July, 2012 has also desired for creation of post of CVO by the concerned Ministrics/Deptts in respect of Autonomous bodies, Statutory bodies, Societies, Trusts etc.

NCTE is a statutory body under the Ministry of HRD established under NCTE Act, 1993. Even though, a separate Vigilance Cell has been established vide order dated 10.3.2014 comprising of Under Secretary, Section Officer, Assistant and PA but there is no full time CVO, and Shri Manik Mandal, Deputy Secretary in MHRD had been appointed by MHRD as part-time CVO in NCTE since 18.03.2014. The CVO being part-time basis, it creates problem of lack of close supervision of staff of NCTE. The CVO in any organization like NCTE is responsible for regular and surprise inspection of sensitive areas of work, streamlining and reviewing of procedures in areas which are susceptible and have the scope of misconduct and corruption. There are various dimensions of vigilance e.g. (i) Preventive Vigilance (ii) Punitive Vigilance and (iii) Surveillance and detection. The NCTT is dealing with the regulatory matters which are sensitive from vigilance angle. In view of this, it is imperative to have a full-time CVO for NCTE which will have the following advantages:

- i) Systematic handling of vigilance matters would take place.
- ii) Delay in investigation and completion of disciplinary proceedings may be eliminated. (Presently, there are a large number of pending vigilance cases.)
- iii) Presence of CVO right within the NCTE would be a great deterrent to tainted behaviour.
- iv) Presence of CVO will enable implementation and compliance of the instructions issued by CVC and other such bodies from time to time.

There is, therefore, an urgent need of an independent CVO for NCTE for which a post of CVO and attendant staff viz., one PA and one Peon is required to be created. The Ministry of HRD have also desired for creation of full time post of CVO. Keeping in view the size of NCTE and quantum of work, it is felt that the post may be created at the level of Director to the Govt. of India in the Pay Band 4 (Rs. 37400-67000) and Grade Pay of Rs. 8700/-.

The Council considered this item and approved creation of a full-time CVO with one full-time PA and MTS as above. This shall be put up to MHRD for the final approval of the Central Government.

Item 12A: Consideration of Proposal for Provision of Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) Cell in NCTE and

(B) Consideration of Proposal for approval of Report of the Committee for Developing Revised Guidelines for Teacher Eligibility Test (Elementary-2015).

12(A): Creation of a TET Cell at HQ was approved for which human resources shall be deployed by NCTE as would be required and as resources permit. At present, one Consultant, guided by a TET Committee, is taking care of the activities relating to TET. The States/UTs shall be provided guidelines and be asked to create a separate TET Cell in States/UTs.

12(B): The Report of the Committee on revised Guidelines for TET Elementary 2015 was presented by Prof. H.S. Srivastava, Chairperson, TET Committee, NCTE for discussion in the meeting as under:

- Rationale of revision the TET Guidelines 2011
 - Necessity of testing essential competence to meet the challenges for teaching.
 - The provision of seeking relaxation for different provisions of TET Guidelines is over as the five year period is over.
 - The Academic and Professional Qualifications need to adhere to the Gazette Notification of India dated 2nd August, 2011 indicating TET as minimum qualification.
 - Qualifying TET is mandatory for teachers to be appointed in all types of schools, viz Govt., Govt. Aided, Local Body, Private Unaided schools throughout the country.
 - Different hurdles experienced by conducting agencies based on:
 - a) Material received from the State Nodal Officers of TET in States & CBSE.
 - b) Inputs received through regional meetings and a national meeting of TET Nodal Officers.
 - c) Representations received from various organizations/individuals and some court cases.
- Major deviations by the States from NCTE Guidelines 2011 in conducting TET/CTET.
 - Adopting own structure, ignoring the NCTE Guidelines.
 - > Child Development & Pedagogy section being not adequately emphasized.
 - > Setting poor quality Test Items ignoring the right paper setting and moderating procedures.
 - Inclusion of subjects other than prescribed by the NCTE Guidelines.
 - ➤ Violating the Eligibility Criteria and reservations for SC/ST, OBC/Physically challenged.
 - Absence of Common Core Syllabus.
- Modifications envisaged in TET Guidelines 2011 and the likely gains out of the same:
 - Enhancement of duration of testing time from 90 min to 150 min
 - > Focus has been on testing in-depth knowledge of content and methodology of teaching relevant subjects at Primary and Upper Primary levels; subject area questions are restricted to class VIII in case of Primary (Paper I) and class X in case of Upper Primary (Paper II).
 - The testing standard has not been diluted as eligibility criteria has been maintained at 60 percent.
 - Since child development, subject knowledge and their teaching pedagogy are the major components of TET and proficiency in all of them is equally essential for teachers, securing at least 33 percent marks in each of the components has been introduced.
 - > Teams for setting and moderation of quality papers involving content, pedagogy and practicing teacher.
 - > Involvement of D.El.Ed. level pedagogues in paper setting.
 - Validity limit of Certificate being made lifelong.

- Specific format for supplying information, application forms and certificates provided.
- Establishment of TET Cell at NCTE and States/UTs.
- No weightage for TET score in recruitment process. However, reference to qualifying TET to be included as eligibility condition in Recruitment Rules.
- In paper II there is provision for Specialised Teachers (Language, Physical Education and others for classes VI to VIII).

States should accept CTET certificate and they may accept TET certificate of other States at their discretion.

The revised Guidelines (Elementary 2015) — Eligibility, Structure and Content Paper I & II, Qualifying Marks, Applicability, Frequency of Conduct of TET, Validity Period of the TET Certificate, Procedure for Conduct of the Test, Legal Disputes, Award of TER Certificate were discussed and appreciated, and the Revised TET Guidelines Elementary-2015 was approved by the Council for further necessary action.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.
