WITHDRAWAL ORDER

WHEREAS, the institution namely **Dr. Nalini College of Education, No. 68, Ram Nagar, Palani Road, Achiyur Post, Dharapuram – 638673, Tamil Nadu** was granted recognition for conducting (D.T.Ed) course of two year duration with an annual intake of 50 students SRC, NCTE vide order no.: F.SRO/NCTE/D.T.Ed./2006-2007/8988 dt 08.11.2006.

AND WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of Section 32 of the NCTE Act, 1993 (73 of 1993) the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure), Regulations, 2014 were notified on 01.12.2014 in supersession of the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure), Regulations, 2009.

AND WHEREAS, the SRC in its 237<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 05<sup>th</sup> – 06<sup>th</sup> January 2013, considered the reply of the institution vide letter dt. 25.10.2012, 29.10.2012 & 10.12.2012 and other related documents along with the original file of the institution shifting to new/permanent premises is hereby permitted, subject to submission of approved staff list D.T.Ed. courses duly approved by the affiliating university. Accordingly, an order was issued for granting shifting of premises on 12.03.2013.

AND WHEREAS, the SRC in its 388<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> September 2020 considered the matter and decided to issue Final Show Cause Notice to the institution. Accordingly, as per directed a Final Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on dt. 21.09.2020.

AND WHEREAS, the institution also run B.Ed. course (APS03655) which was Withdrawn on 21.09.2020. The institution has not submitted any reply till date.

AND WHEREAS, the matter was placed before the SRC in its 393<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 5<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 considered and decided as the following grounds:

**"The original files of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time and documents furnished by the institution were carefully considered by the SRC and the following observations were made:**

**1. The institution has not responded to the Final Show Cause Notice issued on 21.09.2020.**

Hence, the Committee decided to **withdraw the recognition** granted to **Dr. Nalini College of Education, No. 68, Ram Nagar, Palani Road, Achiyur Post, Dharapuram – 638673, Tamil Nadu** for conducting **D.T.Ed** course w.e.f. the next academic session under clause 17(1) of NCTE Act, 1993 on the grounds mentioned above."

**NOW THEREFORE**, in exercise of the powers vested u/s 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993, the Southern Regional Committee hereby **withdraws recognition of Dr. Nalini College of Education, No. 68, Ram Nagar, Palani Road, Achiyur Post, Dharapuram – 638673, Tamil Nadu** was granted recognition for conducting **(D.T.Ed)** course of two year duration with an annual intake of 50 students SRC, NCTE vide order no.: F.SRO/NCTE/D.T.Ed./2006-2007/8988 dt 08.011.2006 from the next academic session starts after issuance of this order.

Further, the institution and affiliating body is hereby informed about the following provision of Section 17(4) of NCTE Act: -

"If an institution offers any course or training in teacher education after the coming into force of the order Withdrawing Recognition under sub-section (1) or where an institution offering a course or training in teacher education immediately before the appointed day fails or neglects to obtain recognition or permission under this Act, the qualification in teacher education obtained pursuant to such course or training or after undertaking a course or training in such institution, shall not be treated as a valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any School, College or other Educational Body aided by the Central Government or any State Government."

Further, if the institution is not satisfied with the Order, it may prefer an appeal u/s 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993, through "Online mode" available on NCTE's website [www.ncte-india.org](http://www.ncte-india.org), within 60 days from the date of issue of this order. The guidelines for filling appeal may be seen on NCTE's website.
