

F.SRO/NCTE/APSO6232/TN/B.Ed./2021/22675-2680 Date: 8 JAN 2021

Withdrawal Order

WHEREAS, the institution namely St. Basil College of Education for Women, Mahendrapuri, Near Housing Board, Vercaud main road, Chinnahirupathi Post, Salem – 636008, Tamilnadu was granted recognition vide SRC (NCTE) order no. F.SRO/NCTE/B.Ed./2006-2007/14119 dt. 06.11.2007 for conducting B.Ed. (Secondary) course of one year duration with an annual intake of 100 students from the academic session 2006-2007.

AND WHEREAS, on promulgation of NCTE Regulations, 2014, the institution has submitted affidavit dt. 13.01.2015 for its willingness of two units in B.Ed. course and adherence of provisions of new Regulations.

AND WHEREAS, provisional revised recognition order was issued to the institution on 05.05.2015 for conducting B.Ed. course of two years duration with an annual intake of 100 (two basic units) from the academic session 2015-16.

AND WHEREAS, the institution submitted written representation regarding the admitted students for one basic unit dt. 05.11.2015.

AND WHEREAS, the request was placed before SRC in its 323rd meeting held on 16th & 17th November 2016 the committee decided to send a letter to the institution dt. 30.11.2016 regarding submission of documents.

AND WHEREAS, the institution submitted a reply along with relevant documents on 19.12.2016 along with relevant documents. The request for reduction of two units to one unit was placed before SRC in its 343rd meeting held on 1st – 2nd August 2017 wherein the committee decided to issue an order. an order was issued to the institution on dt. 12.09.2017.

AND WHEREAS, the institute preferred an appeal under section 18 of NCTE Act, 1993 and the appellate authority issued an order dt. 18.02.2019 and the operative part of the same is reproduced below:

AND WHEREAS, Appeal Committee noted that appellant institution by its letter dated 29.10.2015 which was received in the office of SRC on 05.11.2015 had simply informed SRC that for the academic session 2015-16 they had admitted 50 students. The appellant institute nowhere in this letter requested for reduction of the sanctioned intake of 100 seats.

AND WHEREAS, on verification, Appeal Committee noted that averments made in para 3 of the impugned order dated 12.09.2017 are not correct and there may be some misunderstanding on part of SRC. Appeal Committee, therefore, decided that impugned order dated 12.09.2017 deserves to be set aside.

AND WHEREAS, after perusal of the memorandum of Appeal, affidavit, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the hearing. Appeal Committee concluded to set aside the impugned order dated 12.09.2017 issued by SRC.

AND WHEREAS, the Council hereby remands back the case of St. Basil College of Education for Women, Mahendrapuri Chinnathirupathi Post, Yercaud Main Road, Salem, Tamilnadu to the SRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.”

AND WHEREAS, the matter was placed before the SRC in its 374th meeting held on 09th – 10th April 2019 and the committee decided as the following ground:

“The Committee decided in issue a SCN to the institution for submission of all documents as required under NCTE Regulations, 2014 along with notarized translation of relevant document if the same is in regional language.”

AND WHEREAS, as per the decision a Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution on 15.04.2019. The institution in its letters dt.15.07.2019 and dt. 17.08.2019 mention that: *With due respect we submit a few lines for your kind information and consideration. St. Basil College of Education for Women (11828) is being run as per the reference nos. 1.2 and 3 from the academic year 2007-2008. As per the consideration on 06.05.2019 to rectify the student strength from 50 to 100. Still this time. we are not getting any order from your office regarding this. The student admission application for 2019-2020 must be uploaded online to the Tamilnadu Teachers Education University website. Of this, only 50 students will be uploaded instead of 100 students.*

When contacted to our university. they told us that they could only change 50 to 100 if they got permission from NCTE. So, I humbly request you to enroll 100 students in this academic year in our college. We are waiting for our favorable reply. ”

AND WHEREAS, the institution has submitted its reply on 17.08.2019 in respect of SCN issued above. Thereafter, the matter was placed before the SRC in its 381st meeting held on 31st October to 01st November 2019 and decided as under:

“The Committee decided to issue Final Show Cause Notice before withdrawal of the recognition on the grounds mentioned above to the institution. The institution is required to submit the documents within 21 days from the date of issue of Final Show Cause Notice.”

AND WHEREAS, in compliance of the above SRC decision, a Final Show Cause Notice was issued to the institution dated 04.11.2019. The institution submitted its reply on 25.11.2019

AND WHEREAS, the SRC in its 393rd meeting held on 05th & 06th January 2021 and considered the matter as under: -

The original files of the Institution along with other related documents. NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time and documents

furnished by the institution were carefully considered by the SRC and the following observations were made: -

1. The LUC is not in proper format of State Government.
2. The institute did not submit notarized English translation of NEC.
3. The total Build up area is not adequate as per Building Completion Certificate submitted by the institution under NCTE Regulations, 2014 for running 2 basic units of B.Ed. Course.

Now Therefore, the Committee decided to Withdraw the Recognition to **St. Basil College of Education for Women, Mahendrapuri, Near Housing Board, Vercaud main road, Chinnahirupathi Post, Salem – 636008, Tamilnadu** for conducting **B.Ed.** course w.e.f. the next academic session under clause 17(1) of NCTE Act, 1993 on the grounds mentioned above.

Further, the institution and affiliating body is hereby informed about the following provision of Section 17(4) of NCTE Act: -

“If an institution offers any course or training in teacher education after the coming into force of the order Withdrawing Recognition under sub-section (1) or where an institution offering a course or training in teacher education immediately before the appointed day fails or neglects to obtain recognition or permission under this Act, the qualification in teacher education obtained pursuant to such course or training or after undertaking a course or training in such institution, shall not be treated as a valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any School, College or other Educational Body aided by the Central Government or any State Government.”

Further, if the institution is not satisfied with the Order, it may prefer an Appeal u/s 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993, through “online mode” available on NCTE’s website www.ncte-india.org with 60 days from the date of issue of this order. The guidelines for filling appeal may be seen on NCTE’s website.
