PREAMBLE

Vivekananda B.Ed. College, Kandukur was accorded recognition for the year 2000-2001 with an annual intake of 100. Nagarjuna University vide its letter dt. 17.11.2000 has informed NCTE that the admission process for the academic year 1999-2000 commenced only on 16.8.2000. Since the admissions for 1999-2000 were made during August 2000, the institution was advised that no fresh admissions should be made to the institution either by Ed.CET or by institution and that the students admitted should be set off against academic session 2000-2001.

In response to the said order, the institution vide its letter dt. 10.1.2001 had submitted that the NCTE had accorded recognition vide order dt. 23.3.2000 for an intake of 110 students for the year 1999-2000. After receiving the order from the NCTE, the institution has stated that they have contacted the University frequently for the grant of affiliation for the academic year 1999-2000. The University had appointed the inspection commission and have inspected the institution and submitted the report. On 5.7.2000 the University granted affiliation for the year 1999-2000.

After receiving the orders from Nagarjuna University the institution has stated that they have processed the admissions in obedience to the Government norms.

Later, the institution has received NCTE recognition order dt. 17.7.2000 with an intake of 100 students for the academic session 2000-2001.

In response to the NCTE order the institution has approached Nagarjuna University authorities for the grant of affiliation for the academic year 2000-2001. Prof. R. Venkateswara, Principal, Padmaavathi Mahila University, Tirupathi who was appointed as the Chairman for the inspection commission has inspected the college and submitted the report after which affiliation for the year 2000-2001 is obtained vide the University procds. Dt. 17.10.2000.

After receipt of the affiliation orders from the University for the year 2000-2001 the institution has submitted the proposals for the approval of academic calendar for the year 1999-2000 and 2000-2001. All Sundays the college will be functioning and only on national and religious festival days the college will be closed. The University have approved the academic calendar on 17.11.2000 for both the years 1999-2000 and 2000-2001.

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For the course of 1999-2000 batch, the College begins working from 16th August 2000 and will be completed by the end of February 2001, the total working days will be 183.

The classes for the academic year 2000-2001 will be started from March 2001 and will be closed by September 2001, by making the total number of working days 209.

The institution has approached the Government of Andhra Pradesh for grant of permission to make admissions into the B.Ed. course for the year 2000-2001. The Government has stated that since NCTE is refusing to give orders for making admissions for the year 2000-2001, for the colleges which have made admissions in the month of June, July and August 2000 for the academic year 1999-2000 as there will be shortage of working days.

The institution states that the number of working days have been detailed as above which have been taken into consideration by the authorities of Nagarjuna University who have approved the academic calendar year for 2000-2001, the permission is requested from NCTE to make admissions for the year 2000-2001 at the earliest. Institution has given a latest list of staff available in the college in order to consider for grant of restoration of intake.

This matter was placed in the 35th SRC meeting and has decided that the request of the Institution cannot be agreed to.

In the meanwhile, the institution has submitted its representation along with a letter No. 540/N2-2/2001 dt. 3.3.2001 from the Director of School Education requesting NCTE to accord permission to the college to make admissions during the year 2000-2001. Hence the following order.

ORDER

In exercise of the powers vested under Section 14(3)(a) of the National Council For Teacher Education (NCTE) Act, 1993, the Southern Regional Committee grants recognition to **Vivekananda B.Ed., College, KGT Road, Kandukur - 523105. Prakasam District, Andhra Pradesh** for **B.Ed Course** of One year duration from the academic session **2000-2001** with an annual intake of **100**, subject to fulfilling the following conditions:

1. Institution has to complete total number of 180 teaching days as per para 4.2 of NCTE norms without affecting the summer vacation.

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2. Teacher-Pupil ratio is to be maintained as per para 2.1 of NCTE norms.
 3. Number of working days to be ensured as per para 4.2 of NCTE norms.
 4. Practice teaching days to be completed as per para 4.2 of NCTE norms.
 5. The institution and the University shall ensure that the total number of teaching days including practice teaching as prescribed in the NCTE norms for the course should be scrupulously adhered to for the students admitted for the academic session 1999-2000.
 6. Teaching days including practice teaching should not be less than the number fixed in the NCTE norms for the course from the academic session 2000-2001 onwards.
 7. The institution shall function with 10 teaching staff in addition to Principal, Lecturer for Physical Education and other supporting staff possessing the qualifications as laid down in the NCTE norms and in the salary structure prescribed by the UGC/Central Government/State Government as the case may be.
 8. The institution shall ensure library, laboratories and other instructional infrastructure as per the NCTE norms.
 9. The admission to the approved course shall be given only to those candidates who are eligible as per the regulations governing the course and in the manner laid down by the affiliating University / State Government.
 10. Tuition fee and other fees will be charged from the students as per the norms of the affiliating University / State Government till such time NCTE regulations in respect of fee structure come into force.
 11. Curriculum transaction, including practical work / activities, should be organized as per the norms and standards for the course and the requirements of the affiliating University / examining body.
 12. The institution, if unaided, shall maintain endowment and reserve funds as per NCTE norms.
 13. The institution shall continue to fulfil the norms laid down under the regulations of the NCTE and submit to the Regional Committee the Annual Report and the Performance Appraisal Report at the end of each academic year. The performance appraisal report should inter alia give the extent of compliance of the conditions indicated above.

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If **Vivekananda B.Ed., College, KGT Road, Kandukur - 523105. Prakasam District, Andhra Pradesh** contravenes any of the provisions of the NCTE Act or the rules, regulations and orders made or issued thereunder or fails to fulfill the above conditions, the Regional Committee may withdraw this recognition under the provisions of Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act.
