ORDER

In terms of Section 14(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993 DBHPS Rajiv Gandhi College of Education, D.C. Compound, Dharwad – 580001, Karnataka had submitted an application to the Southern Regional Committee of NCTE for grant of recognition to for B.Ed Course of one year duration.

AND WHEREAS the Southern Regional Committee, after considering the report of the visiting team as well as other relevant materials granted recognition to the institution for offering B.Ed course with an intake of 60 students order dated 10.07.2000.

A Complaint was received on 18.11.2009 from the Secretary, Hindi Prachar Mandali, Bijapur, Karnataka addressed to the Chairperson, NCTE, New Delhi regarding misappropriation of funds and Mal-administration of DBHPS institutions in Karnataka. The Complaint was forwarded to SRC from NCTE, Delhi on 10.12.2009. The complainant has requested NCTE to make investigation and to punish the real culprits and the officials concerned.

AND WHEREAS SRC in its 188th meeting held on 28-29 January 2010 considered the complaint and decided to call for the remarks from the institution on the allegations made against DBHPS in Karnataka. Accordingly, letter was issued to the institution on 08.03.2010. The institution submitted its written representation on 30.03.2010. SRC in its 191st meeting held on 20-21 April 2010 considered the written representation submitted on 30.03.2010 and decided to cause inspection under section 17. Accordingly, inspection was carried out on 02.06.2010

AND WHEREAS accordingly, inspection was carried out on 01.06.2010 and the Committee considered the Report and decided to withdraw recognition for B.Ed. course for the following reasons :-

- As per VT Report and as countersigned and admitted by the institution, the total built-up-area of the building comes to 7963 sq.ft. It is far short of the NCTE norm of 16,000 sq.ft.
- As per VT Report and as admitted by the institution, one Lecturer and Principal do not possess requisite qualification and are not qualified as per NCTE norms.
- Records were not produced to verify the quantum of admissions done by the College giving room for suspecting the credentials.


Under the above grounds, the Committee decided to withdraw the recognition for B.Ed. course with immediate effect. It is made clear that the institution is debarred from making any further admission subsequent to the date of issue of this order.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered that recognition accorded to DBHPS Rajiv Gandhi College of Education, D.C. Compound, Dharwad – 580001, Karnataka to B.Ed course is withdrawn.




