ORDER

WHEREAS, recognition was granted to the institution namely Krishna Teja College of Education, No.131, Chadalawada Nagar, Renigunta Road, Tirupathi, Chittoor District-517506, Andhra Pradesh run by C.V.S. Krishna Murthy Teja Charities, Chittoor District, Andhra Pradesh vide SRC (NCTE) order no. F.SRO/NCTE/B.Ed/2006-2007/2189 dt. 01.05.2007 for conducting B.Ed. course of one-year duration with an annual intake of 100 students from the academic session 2006-2007.

2. **AND WHEREAS**, on promulgation of NCTE Regulations, 2014, the institution is submitted affidavit dt 07.02.2015 for its willingness for adherence of provisions of new Regulations.

3. **AND WHEREAS**, a Revised Provisional Recognition Order was issued to the institution on 14.05.2015 for conducting B.Ed. course of two years duration with an annual intake of 100 (Two basic units) from the academic session 2015-16.

4. **AND WHEREAS**, the SRC in its 363rd meeting held on 17th&19thSeptember, 2018 considered the matter and decided as under;

1. The applicant-institution was running a B.Ed. programme.
2. After notification of the 2014 Regulations, because of the increase in the course-period from 1 to 2 years, because of increased requirements of facilities (especially of built-up area and faculty), they were given a RPRO and required to furnish documents for verification of satisfaction of the new norms/ standards.
3. The applicant in this case has not adequately responded. Therefore, issue a Show Cause Notice for withdrawal of recognition.
4. If they do not respond satisfactorily, we can proceed to withdraw the recognition given.
5. If they respond satisfactorily, then, we will have to cause a VT Inspection to verify the veracity of the claims made.
- 1.1 It upon inspection, all claims are verified to be valid, we can issue a Regular Recognition Order (RRO) under the 2014 Regulations. It is to be recognized that RPROs cannot continue indefinitely, as they are ipso facto 'provisional'.
- 1.2 If upon inspection, the claims are not fully validated, then, we will have to refer the case to NCTE (HQ) for necessary action under section 13 since, according to the Supreme Court decision, we cannot proceed with action for de-recognition based on inspection under section 17.
- 1.3 We had discussed this issue in detail in 351st SRC meeting held on 28th& 29th December 2017 when we authorized the RD to proceed with action in RPRO cases since SRC was

fully engaged in clearing new application cases before the Supreme Court prescribed dateline for issue of FRs.

7. Please put up all such cases together for a common order for similar action.

5. **AND WHEREAS**, as per the decision of SRC a show cause notice was issued to the institution on 17.10.2018. The institution vide letter dated 03.11.2018 submitted reply to the show cause notice. The SRC in its 374th meeting held on 09th – 10th April, 2019 considered the matter and decided as under:-

The original files of the Institution alongwith other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time and documents furnished by the institution were carefully considered by the SRC and the following observations were made:-

- (i) The land is gifted one. Further it is not in the name of the teacher education institution.
- (ii) It is also observed that no land is earmarked for exclusive purpose of teacher education programme.
- (iii) The Land Use Certificate of the said land is not submitted.
- (iv) The Building plan is not approved in the name of teacher education institution.
- (v) The latest faculty list is also not furnished as per the Amended NCTE Regulations, 2017.

Hence, the Committee decided to withdraw the recognition under Section 17 (1) of the NCTE Act.

6. **AND WHEREAS**, as per the decision of SRC, a Withdrawal order no. F.SRO/NCTE/APSO5174/B.Ed/AP/2019/103629-3634 dated 24.04.2019 was issued to the institution.

7. **AND WHEREAS**, aggrieved by the order of the SRC, the institution preferred an Appeal before the Appellate Authority of the NCTE. The Appellate Authority vide order No. F.No.91-22nd/23rd/24th Mtg./2019-/Appeal/81734 dated 03.09.2019 and the Council remands back the case. The operative part of the Appeal order is as under:-

"AND WHEREAS the Committee, noting that the appellant, has submitted all the documents found wanting in the withdrawal order and which are also available in the file of the SRC and the faculty was appointed prior to the amendment of the NCTE Regulations in 2017, concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the SRC with a direction to consider to documents furnished by the appellant and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward to the SRC all the documents submitted in the appeal within 15 days of receipt of orders on the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the Memoranda of Appeal, affidavit, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the SRC with a direction to consider the documents furnished by the appellant, and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward to the SRC all the documents submitted in appeal within 15 days of receipt of orders on the appeal.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Krishna Teja College of Education, Chadalawada Nagar, Ranigunta Road, Tirupathi, Chittoor, Andhra Pradesh to the SRC, NCTE for necessary action as indicated above."

8. AND WHEREAS, the institution vide letter dated 07.01.2019 submitted a written representation along with the documents. The SRC in its 381st meeting held on 31st October – 01st November, 2019 considered the matter and decided as under;

The original files of the Institution alongwith other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time and documents furnished by the institution were carefully considered by the SRC and the following observations were made:-

On the perusal of the original documents and records made available in the file. The Committee decided that the Continuation Order be issued to Krishna Teja College of Education, No.131, Chandalawada Nagar, Renigunta Road, Tirupathi, Chittoot District-517506, Andhra Pradesh for B.Ed programme for 2 units (50 students each unit).

9. NOW THEREFORE, this order is issued permitting the institution i.e. Krishna Teja College of Education, Sy.No.131, Chadalawada Nagar, Renigunta Village, Tirupati Rural, Chittoor District-517506, Andhra Pradesh run by C.V.S. Krishna Murthy Teja Charities, Chittoor District, Andhra Pradesh for continuation of recognition for B.Ed course of two years duration with an intake of 100 students (two units) of 50 each subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:

- I. The Endowment fund of Rs. 5 lakhs and Reserve fund of Rs. 7 lakhs kept in joint account with Regional Director of NCTE should be maintained perpetually. Raising loan against the FDRs or mortgaging them shall not be done.
- II. The institution shall comply with the various other norms and standards prescribed in the NCTE Regulations, 2014 as amended from time to time.
- III. The institution shall make admissions only after it obtains affiliation from the examining body in terms of clause 8(10) of the NCTE (Recognition Norms & Procedure) Regulations, 2014.
- IV. The institution shall ensure that the required number of academic staff duly approved by affiliating body for conducting the course should always remain in position.

10. Further, the institution is required to fulfill all such other requirements as may be prescribed by other regulatory bodies like UGC, affiliating University /Body, the State Government etc as applicable.

11. The institution shall submit to the Regional Committee as Self – Appraisal Report at the end of each academic year along with the statement of annual accounts duly audited by a Chartered Accountant.

12. The institution shall maintain its Website with hyperlink to the Council and the Southern Regional Committee, covering, inter – alia, the details of the institution, its locations, name of the programme(s) with intake; available of physical infrastructure, such as land, building, office, classrooms, and other facilities of amenities; instructional facilities, such as laboratory and laboratory and library and the particulars of their teaching faculty and non-teaching staff with

photographs, for information of all concerned. The information with regard to the following shall also be made available on the website namely:-

- a. Sanctioned programme(s) along with annual intake in the institution;
- b. Name of faculty and staff in full as mentioned in school certificate along with their qualifications, scale of pay and photograph.
- c. Name of faculty members who left or joined during the last quarter;
- d. Name of Students admitted during the current session along with qualification, Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination and in the entrance test, if any, date of admission, etc.;
- e. Fee charged from students;
- f. Available infrastructural facilities;
- g. Facilities added during the last quarter;
- h. Number of books in the library, journals subscribed to and additions, if any, in the last quarter;
- i. The affidavit with enclosure submitted along with application.
- j. The institution shall be free to post additional relevant information, if it so desires.
- k. Any false or incomplete information on website shall render the institution liable for withdrawal of recognition.

13. The institution shall adhere to the mandatory disclosure in the prescribed format and display up-to-date information on its official website.

14. The institution shall make available the list of students admitted on its official website.

15. The institution shall fill the information on GIS Portal on the NCTE Website.

If the institution contravenes any of the above conditions or the provision of the NCTE Act, Rules, Regulations and orders made or issued there under, the institution will render itself vulnerable to adverse action including withdrawal of recognition by the Southern Regional Committee under the provision of Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993.

Also order that a copy of this Order be published in the official Gazette.
