**Withdrawal Order**

Whereas, the recognition was granted to the institution namely Good Samaritan Teacher Training Institute for women, Uluthukkuppai Mayiladuthorai Taluk, Nagapattinam District, Tamilnadu was granted recognition on dt. 16.01.2008 for conducting D.T.Ed. course of two-years duration with an annual intake of 50 students.

And Whereas, the institution has requested to surrender / close D.El.Ed course due to lack of admission vide letter dated 03.01.2020.

And Whereas, the SRC in its 384<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> February 2020 and considered the matter as under:

“The original files of the Institution along with other related documents, NCTE Act, 1993, Regulations Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time and documents furnished by the institution were carefully considered by the SRC and the following observations were made:

The Committee decided that to withdraw the recognition granted to Good Samaritan Teacher Training Institute for women, Uluthukkuppai Mayiladuthorai Taluk, Nagapattinam District, Tamilnadu for conducting D.T.Ed course under clause 17(1) of NCTE Act, 1993 on the request of the institution vide its letter dated 03.01.2020. However, the FDRs towards Reserve Fund and Endowment Fund/ No Objection Certificate (NOC) for encashment of FDRs will be issued by the Regional Director on the submission of the following:

- NOC from the affiliating body.
- NOC from the staff/faculty.
- Resolution of the management to the effect for closure of the course.”

Further, the institution and affiliating body is hereby informed about the following provision of Section 17(4) of NCTE Act: -

“If an institution offers any course or training in teacher education after the coming into force of the order Withdrawing Recognition under sub-section (1) or where an institution offering a course or training in teacher education immediately before the appointed day fails or neglects to obtain recognition or permission under this Act, the qualification in teacher

education obtained pursuant to such course or training or after undertaking a course or training in such institution, shall not be treated as a valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any School, College or other Educational Body aided by the Central Government or any State Government.”

Further, if the institution is not satisfied with the Order, it may prefer an Appeal u/s 18 of the NCTE Act, 1993, through “online mode” available on NCTE’s website [www.ncte-india.org](http://www.ncte-india.org), with 60 days from the date of issue of this order. The guidelines for filling appeal may be seen on NCTE’s website.
