As per Hon'ble High Court of Delhi Order dated 03.06.2022 passed in W.P.(C) 9379/2022 Namrup College of Teacher Education vs. NCTE & Anr., the Hon'ble Court directs the Respondent at para 4 & 5 of the order as under:

"4. In terms of the second proviso to Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993, the order of withdrawal takes effect at the end of the academic session next following the date when it was passed. It is common ground that the withdrawal order dated 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2022, would take effect from the end of the academic session 2022-23.

5. In view of the above, it is made clear that the petitioner is entitled to take part in counselling and admit students for the academic session 2022-23. NCTE is directed to reflect Petitioner's status as a recognised institution for the year 2022-23 on its portal and also to communicate the same to the Petitioner's affiliating university and the concerned State Government within a period of three days from today."

The aforesaid direction of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi is hereby complied.

1. Issue notice. Ms. Aakanksha Kaul, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of the Respondents. The petition is taken up for disposal with the consent of counsel for the parties.

2. The Petitioner is a recognised institution for 100 seats in B.Ed. course. The Eastern Regional Committee ("ERC") of NCTE, however, ERC *vide* its order dated 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2022 withdrew recognition of the Petitioner institution for B.Ed. course. The Respondents, in terms of the said decision, have observed that the withdrawal would take effect from the academic session 2022-23. The operative portion reads as under: -

*"Hence, recognition granted to B.Ed. course is withdrawn under Section 17(1) of NCTE Act, 1993 from the next academic session 2022-2023. On withdrawal of recognition, the affiliation, if any granted under Clause 8(10) of NCTE Regulations, 2014 by the concerned affiliating body on the next academic session stands withdrawn. Hence, the institution is not entitled to apply or counselling from the next academic session i.e. 2022-2023 and the*

*institution is also not permitted to take any fresh admission of students from the academic session 2022-2023.*

*NOW THEREFORE, recognition granted to Namrup College of Teacher's Education, Parbatpur, Dist. Dibrugarh, Assam-786623 for B-Ed. Course is hereby withdrawn in terms of Section 17(1) of NCTE Act, 1993 with effect from the next academic session 2022-2023 as per the decision taken by ERC."*

3. Mr. Amitesh Kumar, counsel for the Petitioner, states that the Petitioners have already filed appeal dated 2<sup>nd</sup> May, 2022, before the Appellate Committee of NCTE under Section 18 of the Act.
4. In terms of the second proviso to Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act, 1993, the order of withdrawal takes effect at the end of the academic session next following the date when it was passed. It is common ground that the withdrawal order dated 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2022, would take effect from the end of the academic session 2022-23.
5. In view of the above, it is made clear that the petitioner is entitled to take part in counselling and admit students for the academic session 2022-23. NCTE is directed to reflect Petitioner's status as a recognised institution for the year 2022-23 on its portal and also to communicate the same to the Petitioner's affiliating university and the concerned State Government within a period of three days from today.
6. The petition stands disposed of in these terms.
