RECOGNITION ORDER

217660

Whereas, the Western Regional Committee, (NCTE) had granted permission to the **OM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, PLOT NO. 1147, VILLAGE-MILKAPUR, POST- MANCHAL, BEHROR, DISTRICT-ALWAR, RAJASTHAN-301701**, for conducting **B.ED.** Course, with an annual intake of 100 students (two units of 50 students each) from the academic session 2022-2023 vide order of even No. **WRC/NCTE/RJ-1995/B.ED./341ST/RAJ./2021/217494-217499 dated 06.09.2021.**

2. Aggrieved by the decision of WRC in granting permission for the academic session 2022-2023, the institution approached the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India **W.P. (C) No. 956/2021** and the Hon'ble Court had passed an order directing as under:-

"We allow the writ petitions in the following terms:

- (i) The cut -off dated fixed by this court in *Maa Vaishno Devi Mahila Mahavidyalaya (supra)* is extended in the fact of these cases.
- (ii) It is held and declared that the petitioners would be entitled to the recognition granted by respective order passed by NCTE or its Regional committees from the Academic Session **2021-2022** instead of Academic Session **2022-2023**.
- (iii) The Respondent- NCTE and its Regional committee are directed to issue formal orders/ notifications in that regard within a period of three days from today.
- (iv) The State and other Authorities would consider grant of affiliation and/ or other requisite permissions within a period of **15 days** from today.
- (v) We will make it clear that subject to the grant of affiliation and other requisite permission been granted, the petitioners would be entitled to admit the students for Academic Session **2021-2022** as per the sanction granted by NCTE for the Academic Session **2022-2023**.
- (vi) The name of the petitioner-college/institutions shall be included in the counselling programme for admissions".

3. Accordingly, as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the WRC decided to issue the revised recognition order to the institutions under clause 7 (16) of NCTE Regulations 2014 for running B. Ed course of two years duration with an annual intake of 100 (two Units) from the academic session 2021-2022.


4. The WRC further decided that the Affiliating body be directed to ensure that minimum working days as specified in clause 2.2 of Appendix 4 of NCTE Regulations 2014 are fulfilled."

5. Now therefore, in exercise of the powers vested under Section 14(3) (a) of the NCTE Act, 1993 and in accordance with the Regulations, 2014, **the Western Regional Committee, (NCTE) hereby grants permission for conducting B.ED. course with an annual intake of 100 (two units of 50 students each) from the academic session 2021-2022 to OM COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, PLOT NO. 1147, VILLAGE-MILKAPUR, POST- MANCHAL, BEHROR, DISTRICT-ALWAR, RAJASTHAN-301701.**

6. The institution is required to ensure about the availability of the regular staff for teaching B.ED. courses.

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7. The institution shall comply with various other norms and standards prescribed in the NCTE regulations, as amended from time to time.
8. The institution shall make admissions only after it obtains affiliation from the examining body in term of clause 8(10) of the NCTE (Recognition Norms & Procedure) Regulations, 2014.
9. The institution shall ensure that the required number of academic staff for conducting the course is always in position.
10. The recognition is subject to fulfilment of other requirements as may be prescribed by other regulatory bodies like UGC, affiliating University/Body, State Government etc. as applicable.
11. The Norms of staff qualification administrative and professional staff / terms and conditions of service etc shall be as per the provisions of NCTE Regulations 2014.
12. The institution shall submit to the Regional Committee a Self- Appraisal Report at the end of each academic year along with annual statement of accounts duly audited by a Chartered Accountant.
13. The institution shall maintain & update its website as per provisions of NCTE Regulations and always display the following as mandatory disclosure: -
 - a) Sanctioned programmes along with annual intake in the institution.
 - b) Name of faculty and staff in full as mentioned in school certificate along with their qualifications, scale of pay and photograph.
 - c) Name of faculty members who left or joined during the last, quarter.
 - d) Names of Students admitted during the current session along with qualification, percentage of marks in the qualifying examination and in the entrance test, if any, date of admission, etc.
 - e) Fee charged from students.
 - f) Available infrastructural facilities.
 - g) Facilities added during the last quarter.
 - h) Number of books in the library, journals subscribed to and additions, if any, in the last quarter.
 - i) The affidavit with enclosure submitted along with application.
 - j) The institution shall be free to post additional relevant information. if it so desires.
 - k) Any false or incomplete information on website shall render the institution liable for withdrawal of recognition.
14. In case if the land is in the name of the Society/trust, the land is to be transferred within six months in the name of the institution, failing which action shall be initiated to withdraw the recognition. It shall be essential on the part of the institution concerned to get the needful done in this regard and intimate about the same to the respective Regional Committee along with the new land documents within the stipulated time.
15. The Educational Institution shall follow Uniform Accounting System as brought out by ICAI and accepted by MHRD.
16. The institution shall fill the GIS Application within one month of issue of this order.
17. If the institution contravenes the provision of the NCTE Act, Rules, Regulations and Orders made and issued there under, the institution will render itself liable to adverse action including withdrawal of recognition by the Regional Committee under the provision of Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993.



Further, if the institution is not satisfied with the order, it may prefer an appeal under Section 18 of NCTE Act, 1993 in the "online mode" available on NCTE's website www.ncte.gov.in within 60 days from the date of this order. The guidelines for filing appeal may be seen on NCTE's website.

19. The previous order issued vide No. WRC/NCTE/RJ-1995/B.ED./341ST/RAJ./2021/217494-217499 dated 06.03.2021 may be treated as withdrawn.


