# Minutes of the 47<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the General Body of NCTE held on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2018

The meeting of the 47<sup>th</sup> General Body of the NCTE was held in Indian National Science Academy (INSA), 2, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, New Delhi – 110002 on 28.03.2018. The list of the members who attended the meeting is attached as **Annexure-A**.

The Chairperson, NCTE welcomed the Members of the Council and briefed about several initiatives being taken up by NCTE. Special mention was made of the National Teacher Portal, named DIKSHA, which was also announced in the FM's Budget Speech on 1stFebruary, 2018. The flagship DIKSHA programme would be for capacity building of teachers. The Chairperson also informed about thebroad contours of a four-year B.Ed. programme presently named the Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) This programme would result in a specialization to prepare a teacher for elementary or secondary school education as also teachers for physical education and art education.

Thereafter, each agenda item was taken up for discussion and decision. The decisions taken by the General Body are as follows:

# Action Taken Report and confirmation of the minutes of 46th Meeting of the Council

Agenda Item No.1: Consideration of Inclusion of Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) in the list of teacher education programmes notified under Regulation, 2014.

NCTE has been established with a view to achieve planned and coordinated development of teacher education system and matters connected therewith throughout the country. Prior to Regulation, 2014 there were 13 teacher education programmes under which NCTE had been granting recognition to the teacher education institutions. The Report of the Justice Verma Commission(JVC) in one of its recommendations mandated NCTE to commence Integrated teacher education programmesso as to improve quality of teachers. Therefore, in the Regulation 2014, three more teacher education programmes were added. The four-year integrated B.Ed. programme was one of them.

- 2. Thereafter the Group of Secretaries in a meeting held in 2016 recommended an action plan prescribing "Introduction of 4 years integrated programme" This matter has been taken up and a new programme called Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) is being devised. Salient features of this programme are as follows:
- 1. Entry into this programme will be +2 with minimum 50% marks.
- The candidates may opt for teaching as their career from very beginning unlike after graduation or post- graduation.
- 3. A rigorous program of this kind is expected to give a thorough grounding in skills required for becoming an effective teacher.
- More time in studying the skills, techniques and methodologies of teaching- learning would help teacher-pupils to imbibe the required skills in the process of becoming teachers.

**Expected Gains:**-Overall improvement in Quality of teachers would be brought about through a newly designed curriculum. All categories of teachers to come out through a common basic programme.

Note:- The Norms & Standards of this programme are under preparation. Preferably another meeting will be called for seeking approval of the Council. However, since we are working against a very tight time schedule brought in due to announcement in the budget speech on 1.2.2018 by the Finance Minister for a roll out in 2019-20, it may not be possible to organize a Council meeting in time. Also, the Norms & Standards are required to be legally vetted by Ministry of Law and Justice, which brings in an element of uncertainty when it comes to adhering to strict timelines. Accordingly, the Chairperson, NCTE may be authorized to approve the Norms and Standards with the same being placed before the next meeting of the Council for ratification.

### DECISION OF THE COUNCIL \*\*

The agenda item was approved as proposed with the observation that while some General Body Members of academic background (Education) will be invited to participate in the workshop to be held in NCERT tentatively on 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018, some other GB Members would be invited for a day long discussion on the eve of the workshop so that their views can be placed before the larger workshop to be conducted in subsequent days for their consideration. Such consultation with GB Members would ensure that their views are considered appropriately.

### Agenda Item No. 2: Consideration of Annual Report of NCTE for the year 2016-2017

Annual Report of NCTE for the year 2016-2017 has been prepared and printed versions of the report separately in Hindi and English is placed before the Council. As per provision contained in Section 25 of NCTE Act 1993, there is a provision for laying of Annual Report before both the Houses of Parliament once in every year. Section 25 of NCTE Act is reproduced below:

"The Council shall prepare once every year, in such form and at such time as may be prescribed, an annual report giving a true and full account of its activities during the previous year and copies thereof shall be forwarded to the Central Government and that government shall cause the same to be laid before both Houses of Parliament".

- 2. It may be mentioned that on several occasions the Annual Report could not be placed before both Houses of Parliament within the stipulated time because of which NCTE had to give detailed explanations and a delay statement in submission of Annual Report to the MHRD and subsequently to the Parliament. In order to avoid delayed submission of the Annual Report 2016-2017 in both Houses the Annual Report was sent to MHRD with the approval of Chairperson, NCTE.
- 3. The Council is requested to consider the Annual Report 2016-2017 and ratify the decision taken by the Chairperson NCTE in view of the circumstances and the time frame fixed for laying of the Annual Report of NCTE 2016-2017. (Annual report for the year 2016-2017 is being placed on the table separately)

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### **DECISION OF THE COUNCIL**

The agenda item was approved as proposed.

Agenda Item No 3: Reconstitution of the Regional Committees of NCTE-Nomination of the member of the Council in the RCs.

1. The Agenda for re-constitution of the Regional Committees of NCTE was placed before the General body of NCTE in its 46<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2017.

The Council discussed the issue in detail and decided the following: -

- 1. The Council Members decided to discuss among themselves through e-mail or other mode and thereafter recommend to Chairperson:
  - i. To recommend four Council Members for each of the Regional Committee.
  - To recommend the names of suitable persons for selecting the Regional Committee Members as per NCTE Regulations dated 07th February 2011.
- iii. To recommend the name of two Council Members for selecting the Regional Committee Members from the names to be submitted by the Members nominated for (ii) above.

The Council decided that such names would be given within two weeks of the circulation of the minutes in the form of recommendation to Chairperson, NCTE.

- 2. While, the action on the decision of the Council is underway, meantime, the MHRD videletterNo. F.11-29/2016-EE-10 dated 08<sup>th</sup> February 2018 has informed that the Hon'bleHRM has approved the proposal of NCTE to reconsider the decision of nominating Sh.Ajit Kumar Pandey, Member of the GB of NCTE Council and nominate some otherexpert in his place under sub-clause (i) of clause (m) of sub-section (4) of Section 3 ofthe NCTE Act.
- 3. As most of the members have suggested the name of Shri Ajit Kumar Pandey, as a nominee of the Council in ERC under section 20 (3) (a) of the NCTE Act, the matter isplaced before the Council for review and nominating some other member of Councilin place of Sh. Ajit Kumar Pandey.

**DECISION OF THE COUNCIL** 

The agenda item was considered and the General Body noted the developments about the reconstitution of Regional Committees which is under consideration of Ministry of HRD. The GB Members selected Dr. Rajeev Pandya, Principal, Shaskiya Uchcha Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh for representing the General Body in ERC.

# Agenda Item No 4: Resignation of Prof. ManojSoni as Member of Council and nomination of Prof. Shashi Ranjan Yadav, Vice Chancellor, IITE, Gandhinagar by MHRD.

- Prof. ManojSoni, had tendered his resignation as a Member of Council, which
  wasforwarded to MHRD and MHRD had accepted the resignation of Prof.
  ManojSoniand nominatedProf. ShashiRanjan Yadav, Vice Chancellor, Indian Institute
  of Teacher Education, Gandhinagar, Gujarat under sub-clause (iv) of clause (m) of
  sub-section (3) of the NCTE Act.
- 2. The above is submitted for information of the Council please.

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### **DECISION OF THE COUNCIL**

The agenda item was considered and the decision of the Ministry of HRD was noted.

Agenda Item No. 5:

Agenda pertaining to the decision on the appeal filed under Rule 23 of CCS (CC&A) Rules, 1965 by Shri Anil Kumar, Section Officer, Shri Pramod Pandit, Assistant and Shri Chetan Mishra, Stenographer Grade-D against the penalty imposed on them vide order dated 19<sup>th</sup> November, 2017

Common departmental proceeding were initiated against S/Shri Anil Kumar, Section Officer, Pramod Pandit, Assistant and Chetan Mishra, Stenographer Grade-D under Rule 14 of CCS (CCA) Rules, 1965 for major penalty vide charge memorandum dated 9.2.2009. After following the prescribed procedure, the matter was considered by the Chairperson, NCTE in his capacity as the Disciplinary Authority and the major penalty of reduction to a lower stage (by one stage), in the time-scale of pay for three (3) years with further direction that they will not earn increments of pay during the period of such reduction and the reduction will not have the effect of postponing the future increments of their pay, was imposed on all these three officers/officials.

- 2. All these officers/officials preferred appeals to the Council of NCTE. These appeals were considered by the General Body in its 46<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 28<sup>th</sup>March, 2017 as Table Agenda "A" to "C". The General Body decided to constitute a two member committee consisting of two members of the Council viz. Prof. ManojSoni, former Vice Chancellor, Ambedkar Open University, Gujarat and Prof. (Dr.) Medha Somaiya, Tata Chair, TISS, Mumbai with direction that they would examine the issues raised and responses given and give their recommendations to the Council for taking a decision in the matter in its next meeting.
- 3. The two member committee so constituted, has since submitted its report wherein it has recommended that "the contentions made by the Charged Officers are not plausible and therefore untenable". The Committee has further observed that "Considering the gravity of the deliberate irregularities, and the procedural fairness of the inquiry proceedings, this Committee observes that the penalty awarded to all the charged officers seem to bestow undeserved leniency, possibly, at the cost of deterrence, to warn and caution against the repetition of such deliberate lapses and irregularities in future."
- 4. The recommendations of the Committee constituted as per decision of the General Body's 46<sup>th</sup> meeting are being placed before the General Body for consideration on the issue of continuance of the penalty, enhancement of the penalty or reduction of the quantum of penalty as deemed fit by the General Body based on the recommendations and findings of this two member committee, on each of these three officers/officials i.e. S/Shri Anil Kumar, Pramod Pandit and Chetan Kumar Mishra. The different penalties that may be imposed by the General Body indicated in Rule 11 of CCS (CCA) Rules, 1965, in exercise of the power of Appellate Authority are indicated as under: -

### **Minor Penalties:**

- i. Censure;
- ii. Withholding of his promotion;



- iii. Recovery from his pay of the whole or part of any pecuniary loss caused by him to the Government by negligence or breach of orders;(a) reduction to a lower stage in the time-scale of pay by one stage for a period not exceeding three years, without cumulative effect and not adversely affecting his pension.
- iv. Withholding of increments of pay.

### Major Penalties:

- iv. Save as provided for in Clause (iii)(a), reduction to a lower stage in the time-scale of pay for a specified period, with further directions as to whether or not the Government servant will earn increments of pay during the period of such reduction and whether on the expiry of such period, the reduction will or will not have the effect of postponing the future increments of his pay;
- v. Reduction to lower time-scale, grade, post or Service for a period to be specified in the order of penalty, which shall be a bar to the promotion of the Government servant during such specified period to the time-scale of pay, grade, post or service from which he was reduced, with direction as to whether or not, on promotion on the expiry of the said specified period
  - a. The period of reduction to time-scale of pay, grade, post or service shall operate to postpone future increments of his pay, and if so, to what extent; and
  - b. The Government servant shall regain his original seniority in the higher time-scale of pay, grade, post or service.
- vi. Compulsory retirement;
- vii. Removal from service which shall not be disqualification for future employment under the Government;
- viii. Dismissal from service which shall ordinarily be a disqualification for future employment under the Government.
- 5. The Committee may also like to authorise the Member Secretary, NCTE to communicate the decision of the General Body taken in the capacity of Appellate Authority to the concerned officials.
- The matter is therefore placed before the General Body of the NCTE for consideration and approval please.

### DECISION OF THE COUNCIL \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

The agenda item was considered. It was decided that the appeals preferred by Sh. Anil Kumar, the then Section Officer and Sh. Pramod Pandit, Assistant are hereby rejected and the order passed by the Disciplinary Authority imposing the penalty on all three officers was upheld.

It was noted with concern that the punishment awarded by the then Chairperson, NCTE was lenient, considering the gravity of the charges and the GB wanted recording of strictures on the leniency shown to the erring officers / officials by the then management of NCTE.

The fact of withdrawal of appeal by Sh. Chetan Kumar Mishra, Stenographer Grade 'D' was noted by the General Body.

### Agenda item No.6:

Review of the decision taken in 46<sup>th</sup> General Body regarding allotment of UID Number to Teacher-pupils, teachers and Teacher Educators

The matter regarding allotment of UID Number to Teacher-pupils, teachers and Teacher Educators in the system was discussed in the 46<sup>th</sup> meeting against the Agenda Item No. 14. The decision of the Council is as under:

- Build and maintain a data base that is constantly updated of all teacher educators, teacher pupils and teachers in the country. This data base would, among other things, have details on qualifications, work experience, benchmarking results etc. of each teacher educator, teacher pupil and teacher and be seeded with their respective Aadhar numbers, mobile phone number, bank account numbers, email addresses and PAN.
- 2. Ensure that all teacher educators, teacher pupils and teachers get a nationally unique id in the national teacher data base.

The matter requires reconsideration at the level of Council as there is no need to get a nationally Unique ID for teacher educators and teacher-pupils as the purpose can be fulfilled through Aadhar or any other unique identification prescribed by MHRD.

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### **DECISION OF THE COUNCIL**

The agenda item was approved as proposed.

### Agenda Item No. 7:

Review of the decision taken in 46<sup>th</sup> General Body regarding development of SOP for processing of applications for recognition by Regional Committees of NCTE.

The matter regarding SOP for processing of applications for recognition by Regional Committees of NCTE was discussed in 46<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Council wherein the Council decided as under:

"The Council approved the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) as proposed"

2. Since, several rounds of discussion have taken place with vendors referred by NIC. It transpires that implementing this decision is going to be extremely expensive and thus a simpler system on the pattern of the existing system needs to be implemented.

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### **DECISION OF THE COUNCIL**

The agenda item was approved as proposed.

## Agenda Item No 8: Recall and constitution of Committee for re-examination of the Recruitment Regulations.

In the 45<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Governing Council of NCTE held on 26.11.2015, the Council had approved the amendment to the Recruitment Regulations of NCTE. The matter was taken up with the Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of School Education & Literacy), Govt. of India on 3.2.2016 for issue of Gazette Notification for amendment to the Recruitment Regulations as approved by the Council.

- 2. However, it was observed by the MHRD that they had already approved the Recruitment Regulations in 2010 which were not notified. In the meantime, certain representations were received from the employees of NCTE to re-visit some of the provisions of the amendment to the Recruitment Regulations as approved by the Council. The DOPT had also notified model Recruitment Rules for certain categories of posts. Further, the 7<sup>th</sup> Pay Commission had approved the new pay scales which were required to be incorporated in the new Recruitment Regulations. After considering all the aspects, it was proposed to comprehensively review the Recruitment Regulations. Therefore, with the approval of the Chairperson (to be placed before the next meeting of the Governing Council for ratification), the MHRD was requested to allow withdrawal of the proposals already sent to them for notification which was approved by MHRD vide their letter dated the 6.11.2017(Annexure A).
- 3. For comprehensive review of Recruitment Regulations, a Committee of experts has been constituted on 21.12.2017 (Annexure B). In the Terms of Reference (ToR) of the Committee, the Committee while proposing amendment to the Recruitment Regulation has also been asked to consider up gradation of one post of Deputy Secretary to that of Director exclusively for Finance and Administration. The Committee has also been requested to consider up gradation of certain other categories of posts viz., Accounts Officer, CPPMO, SO/PS, one post of PS as PPS and creation of 2 posts of Assistants.
- 4. The first meeting of the Committee was held on 8.2.2018. The Committee has been requested to submit their proposals on priority basis.
- 5. Approval of the Governing Council is solicited for withdrawal of the proposals for amendment to the Recruitment Regulations from the MHRD and comprehensive review of the Regulations by the Committee due to the reasons indicated in para 2 above.

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### **DECISION OF THE COUNCIL**

The agenda was approved with the decision that the Committee constituted for revisiting the Recruitment Regulations of NCTE will submit its report in NCTE which will be considered by the Chairperson, NCTE and may be sent to the Ministry of HRD for legal vetting and notification etc. Further, the Recruitment Rules so approved by the Chairperson will be placed before the Council in its next meeting for purposes of ratification.

- The Committee may into the following aspects while proposing amendment to the Recruitment Regulations of NCTE:
  - (a) The Committee shall work out savings through surrender of some Group 'C' posts. Also, the Committee shall consider upgrading the post of one Deputy Secretary to that of Director exclusively for Finance and Administration.
  - (b) The Committee shall meet the employees of NCTE to look into their hardships/grievances to address the issue of stagnation in their respective endres to provide the opportunities of their career advancement.
  - (c) The Committee shall take into account the instructions of DOPT to amend the existing RRs in view of implementation of 7th Pay Commission.
  - (d) In addition to the above the Committee shall also consider the following:
    - (i) Accounts Officer Since this post is lying vacant since last five years despite being advertised thrice to be filled up on deputation, it was proposed to upgrade the post from the existing grade of Rs. 4600/- to Rs. 5400/- to make it attractive for the future applicants and to modify the RRs accordingly. It may, however, be stated that the DOPT have brought out Model RRs for the post of Accounts Officer. As per these RRs, two separate sets of RRs have been prescribed - one in the GP of Rs. 4800/- and the other in GP of Rs. 4600/-. We may, therefore, adopt the RRs in the GP of Rs. 4800/- by upgrading the existing post from GP of Rs. 4600 - to Rs. 4800 -.
    - (ii) CPPMO This post also could not be filled despite efforts for many years. Since its mode of recruitment is through deputation, the possibilities for getting adequate number applications is very less. It is proposed to upgrade the post from existing PB-2 with GP Rs. 4600/- to PB-3 with GP Rs. 6600/-. Matching savings will need to be worked out.

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### Agenda Item No. 9:

1. Consideration for reconstitution of Appeal Committee &

2. Review the decision of the Council regarding implementation of SOP to replace the existing system of disposal of Appeal in the NCTE Hqrs.

It is reiterated that the Council in its 46<sup>th</sup> meeting had decided that the appeals preferred under Section 18 of the NCTE Act against the impugned order of the Regional Committee by the TEIs for grant of recognition to the course applied for shall be disposed of by three benches of three members each consisting of one member of the Council and two experts using technology intensive procedures using approved Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). The disposal of appeals shall be done by adopting the SOP using an IT Platform, custom built for the purpose. As per SOP, the members of the benches/appeal committee shall hear the appellant institutions through audio/video conferencing from their headquarter and appellant institution shall present their case through Skype etc. from wherever they want, if they so wish. After hearing the appellant, each member shall record final yes/no with reference to allowing the Appeal. The Appeal shall be decided on the basis of majority online votes of a 3-member bench.

- 2. It is stated that under the existing system, the appeals are disposed of after being allowing hearing to the appellant institution by the Appeal Committee in person complying with the procedure laid down in the NCTE Rules, 1997 which are extracted below:-
  - "(1) On receipt of memorandum of appeal, the Council shall call for the records of the case from the Regional Committee concerned which passed the order appealed against and after giving theappellant a reasonable opportunity of being heard pass suchorders as it may deem fit.
  - (2) The appellant shall be entitled to be represented by an employee or officer of the appellant institution.
  - (3) The Council shall decide every appeal as expeditiously as possible and ordinarily every appeal shall be decided on a perusal of documents, memorandum of appeal, written argument, if any, affidavits and after hearing such oral arguments as may be advanced.
  - (4) The Council shall endeavor to dispose of every memorandum of appeal within a period of three months from the date of its filing.
  - (5) The Council shall not ordinarily allow more than three adjournments in any appeal."
- 3. However, under the proposed new system it is possible that the legal requirement of quasi-judicial functioning may not be entirely fulfilled. Thus, a simple Yes/No kind of deliberation leading to delivery of a verdict would certainly not amount to a speaking order. Secondly, the deliberation and discussion inherent in a Committee based system would be effectively annulled if the so-called Appeal Committee Members are sitting at remote locations and deciding the matter independently of each other. Lastly, the proposed SOPs also indicate that the software system would throw up suggestive answers based on some unspecified algorithm and in case any Appeal Committee Members wants to differ with the suggestive answers then he is to record his dissent to the suggestive answers in a few cryptic

sentences; this itself would prevent the quasi-judicial functionary from applying his mind independently and without influence, leading to a possible fatality in law. These three illustrations have been determined after discussion with some empanelled counsels and with some software developers who have pointed out the inherent difficulties if we are to implement the decision as approved by the General Body.

- 4. The present Appeal Committee was constituted in June 2013 and this needs to be reconstituted. The composition of the proposed Appeal Committee is as under:
  - a. A retired Judge of a High Court or District or Sessions court- Chairman of the Committee
  - b. NCTE Council Member; an academician, to be nominated by the Chairperson.
  - c. Three members retired from Govt. not below the rank of Joint Secretary or Director/ Deputy Secretary
  - 5. It is proposed that the sitting fee and TA/DA to members of the Appeal Committee may be as under: -
    - (a) Sitting Fees
    - (i) Chairman of the Appeal Committee Rs. 4000/- per sitting.

      In the absence of Chairman, the NCTE Council Member shall take the Chair and preside over the meetings of the Appeal Committee. In that case, the acting Chairman shall be paid at the same rate of sitting fee as is due to the Chairman.
    - ii. Other members Rs.2000/- per sitting.
    - (b) Allowances to the Appeal Committee Members

Entitlement to travel by Economy Class (Air) or AC-II Tier by train. However, if at the time of retirement, the entitlement was of AC-Ithen in case travel by train is required, then any appeal committee member can travel by AC-Ist class.

- 6. Quorum will be of minimum 3 members.
- 7. In view of the above the followings are placed before the Council for decision: -
  - Reconsideration/reviewing its earlier decision to dispose of appeal through voting system using Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) by three-member benches.
  - II. Reconstitution of Appeal Committee comprising of members as described above.
  - III. The Appeal Committee Orders to be conveyed by the US/DS in-charge of Appeal Division.

### DECISION OF THE COUNCIL \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

The agenda item was approved with the observation that the Appeal Committee shall consist of one retired judge (District / Sessions Judge), one retired Director / Joint Secretary of Ministry of HRD and one officer not below the rank of Under Secretary from NOTE Further, it was also decided that the decisions taken by the Appeal Committee shall be communicated by the representative of NCTE who is part of the Appeal Committee.

### Agenda Item No. 12: Modification of Legal Guidelines for NCTE approved by the Council during the 46<sup>th</sup> General Body meeting held on 28.3.2017.

It deserves to be mentioned that the legal policy as approved by the General Body of the NCTE on its meeting held on 28.03.2017 contains a clause about an aspiring advocate to have either03 or 05 reported judgements (i.e. Judgements reported in reputed journals like AIR, SCC, etc.) to qualify as either a panel advocate or standing counsel (i.e. one authorised to receive notices). After such approval by the General Body of NCTE, it was realized that advocates having reported judgements against their names within a specified time period are indeed difficult to find. Enquiries with UGC, AICTE and CVC has revealed that in none of these organisations, is there any insistence for having advocates with only reported judgements. It has been revealed from enquiries made with these three organisations that they only insist on a certain number of quality judgements from any advocate desiring to become a panel lawyer.

- 2. Accordingly, with approval of the Chairperson, an amendment was made in the guidelines to remove the condition of reported judgements as a pre-condition for considering empanelment of lawyerso make the legal policy practical and implementable. Kindly peruse the (Annexure E) in which the S.No. 1. II(a)(v) & (vi) and S.No.2 (b)(v) & (vi) have been deleted.
- 3. The alteration to the legal guidelines as approved Chairperson, is being placed before the 47<sup>th</sup> General Body of NCTE for ex-post facto approval

Inclusion of State Level Eligibility Test (SLET) / SET to be conducted by the concerned State in National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) (Amendment) Regulations, 2017.

The National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) (Amendment) Regulations, 2017 was notified on 09.06.2017 inter-alia amending the Appendix 3, 4 and 13 of NCTE Regulations, 2014 i.e. the qualifications of faculty in TEI. In these amendments NET was added as a compulsory qualification to be a teaching faculty in TEIs. Since UGC prescribes SLET / SET also along with NET, this may be added in the qualification by bringing an amendment notification. The proposed amendment is as under:

TET Guidelines for Elementary to Sr. Secondary Level Teachers.

Section 12 of the NCTE Act 1993, states that one of the functions of the NCTE is to:

(d) lay down guide-lines in respect of minimum qualifications for a person to be employed as a teacher in schools or in recognized institutions;

After coming into existence of the RTE Act, 2009 and simultaneously declaring the NCTE as Academic Authority by MHRD Govt. of India, the NCTE brought an Amendment in the NCTE Act 1993 inserting 12A (2011) in the Section of the Principal Act as follows:

"12A for the purpose of maintain standards of education in schools, the Council may, be regulations, determine the qualifications of persons for being recruited as teachers in any pre-primary, Primary, upper primary, secondary, senior secondary or intermediate school or college by whatever name called, established, run, aided authority:

Provided that nothing in this section shall adversely affect the continuance of any person recruited in any pre-primary, Primary, upper primary, secondary, senior secondary or intermediate school or colleges, under any rule, regulation or order immediately before the commencement of the National Council for Teacher qualifications as may be specified by the Council:

Provided further that the minimum qualifications of teacher referred to in the first provision shall be acquired within the period specified in this Act or under the Right of children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009."

Also as per the Order dated 25.07.2017 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Civil Appeal No. 4347-4375 of 2014 arising out of State of UP and others etc., versus Shiv Kumar Pathak Court is quoted below:

"There is no manner of doubt that the NCTE, acting as an academic authority' under Section 23 of the RTE Act, under the Notification dated 31st March, 2010 issued by the Central Government as well as under Sections 12 and 12A of the NCTE Act, was competent to issue Notification dated 23rd August, 2010 and 11th February, 2011."

Previously TET guidelines were framed under the RTE Act, 2009 in 2011. The MHRD constituted a High Powered Committed under the Director, NCERT to revisit the TET guidelines. While the report of this High-Powered Committee was under consideration, it was felt that using the RTE Act restricted the TET to Class 8th teachers only.

Sanjay Awasthi (I.R.s.) Member Secretary In light of discussion above, especially the portion extracted from the Hon'ble Supreme Court's judgement, it is deemed necessary to have TET as an eligibility criteria for all category of teachers up to class 12<sup>th</sup>. With this in view a Committee was constituted under Prof. S. C. Panda to include and holistically merge the guidelines prepared by the MHRD TET Committee with guidelines for Secondary and Sr. Secondary levels. The same has done and is placed for approval of the Council.



### Guidelines for Conducting Teacher Eligibility Test for Teachers at the Elementary, Secondary and Senior Secondary Levels of Education

### Introduction

The NCTE has already developed guidelines for Teacher Eligibility Test for elementary level of teachers under the RTE Act 2009 and as empowered by the NCTE Act 1993 and subsequent amendment in the NCTE Act, 2011.

- 2. As per the NCTE Act 1993 Section 12, one of the functions of the NCTE is as follows:
  - (d) lay down guide-lines in respect of minimum qualifications for a person to be employed as a teacher in schools or in recognized institutions;

After coming into existence of the RTE Act, 2009 and simultaneously declaring the NCTE as Academic Authority by MHRD Govt. of India, the NCTE brought an Amendment in the NCTE Act 1993 inserting 12A (2011) in the Section of the Principal Act as follows:

"12A for the purpose of maintain standards of education in schools, the Council may, be regulations, determine the qualifications of persons for being recruited as teachers in any pre-primary, Primary, upper primary, secondary, senior secondary or intermediate school or college by whatever name called, established, run, aided or recognized by the Central government or a State Government or a local or other authority:

Provided that nothing in this section shall adversely affect the continuance of any person recruited in any pre primary, Primary, upper primary, secondary, senior secondary or intermediate school or colleges, under any rule, regulation or order made by the Central government, a State Government, a local or the authority immediately before the commencement of the National Council for Teacher Education (Amendment) Act, 2011 solely on the ground of non-fulfillment of such qualifications as may be specified by the Council:

Provided further that the minimum qualifications of teacher referred to in the first proviso shall be acquired within the period specified in this Act or under the Right of children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009."

<sup>3.</sup> Also as per the Order dated 25.07.2017 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in Civil Appeal No.. 4347-4375 of 2014 arising out of State of UP and others etc. versus Shiv Kumar Pathak and others etc., the relevant operative portion (Para 16) of the judgement of the Hon'ble Apex Court is quoted below:

"There is no manner of doubt that the NCTE, acting as an academic authority' under Section 23 of the RTE Act, under the Notification dated 31st March, 2010 issued by the Central Government as well as under Sections 12 and 12A of the NCTE Act, was competent to issue Notification dated 23rd August, 2010 and 11th February, 2011."

- 4. Moreover, this is also pointed out that the NCTE had notified the National Council for Teacher Education (Determination of Minimum Qualifications for Recruitment of Teachers in Schools) Regulations, 2001 amended from time to time under the Section 12 of the NCTE Act, 1993.
- 5. Taking the above facts into consideration, it is quite obvious that the NCTE is fully empowered to regulate the qualification of teachers to be appointed in schools. Since, till date the NCTE has not introduced TET as an essential qualification for teachers to be appointed in schools for classes IX to XII, the NCTE has decided to stipulate the TET guidelines for classes IX to XII. For the purpose, this High Level Committee has been constituted consisting of the following members to examine the TET guidelines already developed by a committee constituted by the NCTE under the Chair of Prof.H.S.Srivastava:

### PART-I

REVISED GUIDELINES (ELEMENTARY) 2018 FOR CONDUCTING TEACHER ELIGIBILITY TEST INCORPORATING MHRD TET COMMITTEE SUGGESTIONS

### Overview

1.1 The implementation of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory
Education (RTE) Act 2009, requires the recruitment of a large number of
teachers across the country in a time bound manner. Inspite of the enormity
of the task, it is desirable to ensure that requirement of quality for the
recruitment of teachers can not be diluted at any cost. It is, therefore,
necessary to ensure that persons recruited as teachers possess the essential

aptitude and ability to meet the challenges of teaching at the primary and upper primary levels.

- 1.2 In accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 23 of the RTE Act 2009 the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) has laid down the minimum qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in classes I to VIII, notified through the Gazette Notification No. 158 dated 2<sup>nd</sup> August, 2011. A copy of the Notification is attached. Qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in any of the schools referred to in clause (n) of section 2 of the RTE Act is that he/she should qualify the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) which will be conducted by the appropriate Government.
- 1.3 The TET establishes the basic eligibility of a candidate to become a teacher for classes I to VIII. It is required for teachers of all schools under all types of managements irrespective of their affiliation / recognition. Subject to the amendment of RTE 2009 Gazette of India notification no. 32 of June, 2012. It is an eligibility test and not a test for recruitment.
- 1.4 The TET examination may be conducted by the State Governments, CBSE and or any other Central body specialized in the areas of school education in accordance with the NCTE Guide-lines issued hereafter.

### 2. Eligibility

- 2.1 Only those who possess qualifications as prescribed by the NCTE from timeto-time will be eligible to take the TET examination.
- 2.2 A Person who is pursuing any of the teacher education programmes in its final

year (recognized by the NCTE or the RCI, as the case may be) specified in the Gazette of India notification dated 2<sup>nd</sup> August, 2011, as amended from time to time, provided she/he conforms to criteria laid down.

### Structure and Content of TET

The examining body is expected to strictly adhere to the structure and content of the TET specified below:

- a) All questions will be Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) with four alternative answers, out of which only one will be correct. Each question shall carry one mark. There will be no negative marking. In each content area approximately 40% of the questions should be on pedagogical understanding of that subject making the weightage to content and pedagogy in the ratio of 60:40.
- b) There will be two question papers of the TET. Paper I will be for candidates who intend to be teachers for classes I to V, and Paper II will be for aspirants who intend to be teachers for classes VI to VIII.
- c) A person who intends to be a teacher at both the levels (classes I to V as well as classes VI to VIII) will be required to appear for both papers and submit separate application forms.
- d) Duration allowed for each of the test shall be 150 Minutes.

It may be noted from above table that this examination shall focus on the following major aspects:

- Understanding of Child Development and Pedagogy in accordance with D.El.Ed syllabus as applicable.
  - A separate paper as an alternative to the paper on Child Development and Pedagogy may be set in accordance with D.El.Ed. syllabus prescribed by RCI for recruitment of teachers in Special Education.
- ii. Language competence as mentioned in the following paras under 3.1.1.
- iii. Content competencies in Mathematics up to class VIII level as per the syllabus of the state concerned. For CTET, CBSE or any other Central examination conducting body shall follow the NCERT syllabus.
- iv. Content competencies in Environmental Studies emanating from environmental issues and concerns dealt with in Social Studies and General Science up to class VIII of the relevant syllabus.
- v. The weightage to content and pedagogy would be in ratio 60:40.

#### 3.1.1 Designing Questions for Paper I

While designing and preparing the questions for Paper I, the examining body shall take the following factors into consideration:

- The instructions to test writers of *Child Development and Pedagogy* should clearly state that since D.El.Ed is the minimum eligibility qualification for the candidates taking TET, the questions should correspond to the D.El.Ed. syllabus of the State concerned. A copy of the D.El.Ed. syllabus prescribed by the State govt. may be sent along with instructions to test writers. In case of CTET, CBSE or any other Central examination conducting body will follow D.El.Ed. syllabus prescribed by the NCTE (2009) and as revised from time to time.
- The test items on Child Development and Pedagogy will focus on psychology of teaching and learning relevant to the age group of 6-11 years. These will focus on the understanding the characteristics and needs of diverse learners, interaction with learners and the attributes and qualities of a good facilitator of learning. Current issues and developments in the field of education may also be given some space.

- Language I refers to the medium of instruction. The questions should focus
  on basic proficiencies of the candidates in comprehension and
  communication of the language. The questions should also include those
  testing their pedagogical understanding and how children learn language.
  - Language II will be from among the prescribed options other than Language I. The candidate will be required to specify his or her choice of Language II in the application form. The test items in Language II will also focus on the elements of language, communication and comprehension abilities, as well as on how children learn a second language.
- The test items in Mathematics and Environmental Studies will focus on the concepts, problem solving abilities and related pedagogy / Teaching Methodology of these subjects. Questions should not be based merely on recall of facts / information. In all these subject areas, the test items shall be well distributed over different divisions of the syllabus of that subject from the State prescribed syllabus for classes I-VIII. For CTET, CBSE or any other Central examination conducting body shall follow NCERT syllabus instead.
- Duration allowed for the test shall be 150 Minutes.

It may be noted from the above table that this examination shall focus on the following major aspects:

- Understanding of Child Development and Pedagogy in accordance with D.El.Ed. syllabus as applicable.
  - A separate paper as an alternative to the paper on Child Development and Pedagogy may be set in accordance with D.El.Ed. syllabus prescribed by RCI for recruitment of teachers in Special Education.
- ii. Language competencies as mentioned in the following paras under 3.2.1
- Content competencies in Mathematics, Science and Social Studies, will be tested up to Class X level as per the syllabus of the State concerned for State TETs and that of NCERT for CTET.
- iv. In case of special Teachers in Languages, Physical Education and others, the content competencies up to class X level of the relevant States syllabus for States TETs and that of NCERT syllabus for CTET.
- v. The weightage to content and pedagogy would be in ratio of 60:40.

# 3.2.1 Designing Questions for Paper II

While designing and preparing the questions for Paper II, the examining body shall take the following factors into consideration:

- The instructions to test writers of *Child Development and Pedagogy* should clearly State that since D.El.Ed is the minimum eligibility qualification for the candidates taking TET, the questions should correspond to the D.El.Ed syllabus of the State concerned, which should be sent along with the instructions to question paper setters. In case of CTET, CBSE or any other Central examination conducting body shall follow D:El.Ed. syllabus prescribed by the NCTE in force and as revised from time to time.
- The test items on Child Development and Pedagogy will focus on educational psychology of teaching and learning, relevant to the age group. These will focus on understanding of the characteristics, needs and psychology of diverse learners, interaction with learners and the attributes and qualities of a good facilitator of learning.

- The Language I refers to the medium of instruction. The questions should focus on basic proficiencies of the candidates in comprehension and communication of the language. The questions should also include those that test their pedagogical understanding and how children learn language.
- Language II will be from among the prescribed options other than Language I. The candidate will be required to specify his or her choice of Language II in the application form. The test items in Language II will also focus on the elements of language, communication and comprehension abilities as well as on how children learn a second language.
- The test items in *Mathematics, Science and Social Studies, Language(s)* in lieu thereof and Physical Education should focus on the concepts, problem solving abilities and related pedagogy / methodology of teaching of these subjects. Questions should not be based merely on recall of facts / information. In all these subject areas, the test items shall be well distributed over different divisions of the syllabus of that subject prescribed by the State for classes VI-X. For CTET, CBSE or any other Central body specialized in the areas of school education.
- The test items in Mathematics and Science will be of 30 marks each.
   Similarly, the test items in Social Studies should be evenly distributed across
   Political Science and Economics (10 marks each) and for History and Geography (20 Marks each).
- The Competence of Specialized Teachers in Languages shall be tested through 60 MCQs. It may be a language from L1 or L2 or a different one out of those provided by the examining body. Alternatively, candidates may choose to be tested in two languages out of those provided by the examining body through 30 MCQs each, which may either be one from L1 and L2 and one different from L1 and L2 or both other than L1 and L2.
- The competence of special teachers of Physical Education and other specialised subjects shall be tested through 60 MCQs from the field of their respective specialization.

 The level of items in case of test for teachers of Languages / Physical education / other similar subjects will correspond to the State prescribed syllabi for class VI to X. For CTET, NCERT syllabus shall be followed.

Both the question papers, Paper I and Paper II, except in languages shall at least be bilingual – (i) in language(s) as decided by the appropriate Government, and (ii) English.

# 3.3 General Guidelines for Preparing Test Items of Question Papers

The examining bodies must take extra care in identifying the right kind of paper setters who are well versed with the subjects and pedagogy at the elementary stage for each section of the papers I and II. The question papers may be got set through teams identified section wise as per NCTE Guidelines. Further moderation be got done through different set of persons and keys developed. Keys may be displayed on the web-site of the State after the examination.

The following are some broad suggestions for framing questions and developing question papers. These are only indicative and not exhaustive ones.

## Test Items for Question Papers

Questions may be specifically worded to pin point the expected answers and be within the effortless comprehension of the candidates.

Questions being multiple choice type, should follow the rules governing them mainly that:

- The stem should comprehensively contain the central problem.
- The language of alternatives should go with the language of the stem.
- There may be only four alternatives of which only one should be correct.
- The correct alternative should change places (A/B/C/D) or (1/2/3/4) randomly in different questions.
- The alternatives should all be homogenous and plausible as far as possible.
- The 'all of the above' and 'none of the above' alternatives must be avoided.
- The alternatives should all be approximately of the same physical length.
- Comprehension passages to be given should neither be too lengthy or too short. Normally it should be of about 350 words.
- Question should justifiably be from the announced syllabus.
- Language of questions should not be confusing.

 The Content-cum-pedagogy questions should focus on the Pedagogy of relevant stage.

#### **Question Papers**

- All questions in each section, required to be attempted by a candidate, are to be compulsory.
- Questions be distributed over different abilities and questions testing memorised information may be discouraged.
- Questions may be distributed over the different sections of the prescribed syllabus.
- All questions of different estimated difficulty levels may be incorporated.
- The questions set should not be either too easy or too difficult.
- Test should be a power test and not a speed test.

#### 3.4 Qualifying Marks

- a) To qualify in TET a candidate must score at least 33.33 percent (10 out of 30; 20 out of 60) marks in each section separately along with an aggregate score of 60 percent in the Paper I and/or Paper II separately for qualifying for Primary and Upper Primary levels respectively.
- b) The agencies conducting TET may give concessions to persons belonging to SC, ST, OBC and Divyang (PH) persons in accordance with the existing policy and norms of the Staff Selection Commission /State Public Service Commission of the respective States or Union Public Service Commission as the case may be. Such concessions will be admissible only on the aggregate marks and not in sections separately. For example, if 5 percent relaxation is to be given in aggregate marks, the qualifying marks shall be 82 out of 150 for the particular category.
- c) Schools of all the managements will need to abide by these norms.

#### Applicability

- a) TET shall be mandatory for appointment as teacher at elementary stage, throughout the country irrespective of affiliation or type of management (government/private aided/private unaided).
- b) TET as eligibility qualification needs to be incorporated in recruitment rules and made a part of the State web-site.

- c) TET conducted by the Central Government (CTET) shall apply to all schools referred to in sub-clause (i) of clause (a) of section 2 of the RTE<sub>o</sub>Act 2009 which covers a school established, owned or controlled by the Central Government or the Administrator of Union Territory, having no legislature. Further, schools affiliated to CBSE, CISCE may opt for CTET or TET
- d) TET conducted by a State Government/UT with legislature shall apply to a school referred to in sub clause i-iv of clause (n) of Section 2 of the RTE Act in the State/UT:
  - a school established, owned or controlled by the appropriate Government or a local authority;
  - an aided school receiving aid or grants to meet whole or part of its expenses from the appropriate Government or the local authority;
  - iii. a school belonging to specified category; and
  - iv. an unaided school, not receiving any kind of aid grants to meet its expenses from the appropriate Government or the local authority;
  - e) In addition to its own TET, a State may accept TET certificates awarded

by another State/UT with legislature or CTET conducted on behalf of the Central Government. In case a State Government/UT with legislature decides not to conduct a TET, it can consider the TET conducted by another State or the Central Government. Appointment of teachers in any school will not be exempted from TET on any ground. However, the requirement of TET will not apply to part-time instructors for art education, health and physical education and work education etc.

- f) In case of violation of TET Guidelines, the TET Conducted by the State/UT/CBSE or any other Central body specialized in the areas of school education will be declared invalid by the NCTE.
- g) TET for Pre-Primary teachers need to be developed separately keeping in view the skills and competency involved in that area.

# Frequency of Conduct of TET and Validity Period of TET Certificate:

TET should be conducted at least once every year. There will be no restriction on the number of attempts a person can take for acquiring a TET Certificate. The validity of TET qualification will be for life time.

#### 6. Procedure for Conduct of the Test

- i. With a view to inducting pedagogically proficient individuals as teachers it shall be imperative to have significant involvement of faculty members from Universities Department of Education, SCERT and organisations dealing with D.El.Ed. in development of question paper and conduct of the test.
- ii. The examining body shall formulate a detailed procedure and lay down instructions for conduct of the TET. Candidates should be informed that a very serious view will be taken if any malpractice or impersonation isnoticed.
- iii. Experts for preparing and moderating the test should be selected carefully. A team of 2-3 persons may be formed for setting each paper. Experts should have the skills in writing Multiple Choice Questions testing different abilities in their respective subjects. The tests should be vetted by another team of subject experts. Having expert(s) independently solve the paper and check mismatches is a good practice.
- iv. The examining agency could charge a reasonable fee from the candidates. The surplus funds should be used for maintaining a TET cell, conducting relevant research and capacity building of test writers.
- v. Key to the questions shall be displayed in the website after the conduct of TET.
- vi. The examining agency shall declare TET/CTET result within 6 weeks of conduct of the test and place it in public domain (Website).
- vii. The questions set in both papers I and II should not be too easy. The percentage of easy questions should not exceed 20 percent in any case.

#### LEGAL DISPUTES

All legal disputes with regard to conduct of TET shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the appropriate Government.

#### AWARD OF TET CERTIFICATE

The appropriate agency conducting the test shall award a TET Certificate to all successful candidates as per NCTE format. The certificate should contain the name and address of the candidate, date of birth, registration number, social category, year/month of award of Certificate. Though the pass marks are an aggregate 60 percent for each exam but to remove any doubt about giving any weightage to scores, the certificate should mention only the fact of qualifying the exam.

The certificate may be electronically generated with adequate security features. The appropriate agency may consider utilizing the services of specialized agencies for issuing dematerialized (demat) TET certificates as a security feature to avoid any kind of malpractice. The NCTE format to be used by all the agencies conducting the Teacher Eligibility Test.

#### MONITORING

The following measures should be taken for monitoring the quality and administration of the TET:

- (a) The NCTE shall establish a TET cell to suggest the design of question papers; oversee, monitor the tests; and provide academic support to the State/UT/CBSE or Central body specialized in the areas of school education to undertake analysis of results.
- (b) The appropriate TET conducting agencies should establish a TET CELL and appoint a Nodal Officer for the purpose of conducting TET.
- (c) Every appropriate Government testing agency should forward a report of each TET to the NCTE in the prescribed format.
- (d) The NCTE shall maintain a database and be the repository of experts and resources.

#### Part -II

# The Guide-lines for the Teacher Eligibility Test (Secondary and Senior Secondary)

 The TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) establishes the basic eligibility of a candidate to become a teacher at the secondary stage. It is required for teachers of all schools under all types of managements, irrespective of their affiliation/recognition.

# TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) is not a test for recruitment.

- 2. The purpose of prescribing the TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) as an essential eligibility requirement for a person to be appointed as a teacher is:
  - to establish standards and benchmark teacher quality in the recruitment process;
  - to ensure that teacher education institutions and their students further improve their performance standards;
  - to send a positive signal to all concerned that the Government lays special emphasis on teacher quality.
- 3. The TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) should be conducted by an established examining body designated by the Government concerned for the purpose. The designated agency will advertise the conduct of TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) and invite applications from eligible candidates. A suggested format of application for Teacher Eligibility Test (Secondary and Senior Secondary) is provided in Annexure I.

#### Eligibility

 Candidates aspiring to become secondary and senior secondary teachers (Classes IX-XII) as per NCTE norms should fulfil the following qualifications;

5. The examining body should strictly adhere to the structure and content of the TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) specified above.

All questions will be Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) with four alternatives out of which only one will be correct. Each question shall carry one mark. There will be no negative marking.

In each of the Content and Pedagogy sections, 60% of the questions should be on the content and 40% on pedagogical understanding of that subject.

6. Suggested content of different sections of the test may include the following:

#### (A) Secondary

i) Teaching and Learning at the Secondary

(40 Questions: 40 Marks)

- Understanding adolescence: aspects of cognitive, physical social and emotional development; individual differences, creativity and multiple intelligence.
- Fundamentals of teaching and learning: application of theories of learning as appropriate for the secondary level; dealing with diverse needs of learners; learning as a socio-cultural concept; cooperative and participative learning; use of various sources of learning; approaches for enhancing learning.
- Action Research and case studies.
- Current issues and developments in the field of education: critical perspectives of quality in Secondary Education; education of the first generation school goers; inclusive education; socially disadvantaged groups; international understanding; understanding of child rights; Information Communication Technology (ICT) and its educational implications.
- Teacher aptitude and attitude relating to the needs and concerns of the learner; cooperation & collaboration with peers and principals.
- ii) & iii) Language I and Language II (20+20=40 Questions): (20+20 Marks each) This section will test proficiency of candidates in two languages to be used as medium of instruction. Candidates will choose two languages (any two out of the list provided by the examining body). The question papers for both will be set at

the Class X level. The test will cover reading comprehension (one passage not exceeding 300 words), vocabulary and language usage.

#### **Educational Assessment** iv)

(20 Questions: 20 Marks)

The section would cover procedures and techniques of assessment relevant to different dimensions of learning; continuous and comprehensive evaluation; process and product evaluation, assessment as learning techniques of different kinds, their uses; recording, analysis and reporting of results for feedback and improvement of quality.

# v) & vi) Content and Pedagogy of one School Subject

(40+40 Questions: 40 +40 Marks)

The test will focus on expected subject competencies pertaining to the classes IX and X with special reference to and implications for teaching at the secondary level. The weightage of content and pedagogy will be kept in the ratio of 60:40. Questions will be set on pedagogical analysis of the content. Emphasis will be on testing of concepts, reflections, reasoning and application. Important aspects/topics of the subject may be given sufficient weightage. Questions straight from the textbook and those merely testing memory/recall should be avoided. The test items should also be free from urban/gender bias.

#### (B) Senior Secondary

# i) Teaching and Learning at the Senior Secondary Stage

(50 Questions: 50 Marks)

- Understanding adolescence: aspects of cognitive, physical social and emotional development; individual differences, creativity and multiple intelligence.
- Fundamentals of teaching and learning: application of theories of learning as appropriate for the senior secondary level; dealing with diverse needs of learners; learning as a socio-cultural concept; cooperative and participative

learning; use of various sources of learning; approaches for enhancing learning.

- Action Research and case studies.
- Current issues and developments in the field of education: critical perspectives of quality in Secondary Education; education of the first generation school goers; inclusive education; socially disadvantaged groups; international understanding; understanding of child rights; Information Communication Technology (ICT) and its educational implications.
- Teacher aptitude and attitude relating to the needs and concerns of the learner; cooperative & collaboration with peers and principles.
- ii) & iii) Language 1 and Language 2 (20+20=40 Questions): (20+20 Marks each) This section will test proficiency of candidates in two languages to be used as medium of instruction. Candidates will choose two languages (any two out of the list provided by the examining body). The question papers for both will be set at the Class X level. The test will cover reading comprehension (one passage not exceeding 300 words), vocabulary and language usage.

#### **Educational Assessment** V)

(20 Questions: 20 Marks)

The section would cover procedures and techniques of assessment relevant to different dimensions of learning; continuous and comprehensive evaluation; process and product evaluation, assessment as learning techniques of different kinds, their uses; recording, analysis and reporting of results for feedback and improvement of quality, presenting data in different and their interpreters.

# v) & vi) Content and Pedagogy of two School Subjects

(42+28 Questions: 70 Marks)

The test will focus on expected subject competencies pertaining to post graduate level related to the topics dealt in classes XI and XII. The weightage of content and pedagogy will be kept in the ratio of 60:40. Questions will be set on pedagogical analysis of the content. Emphasis will be on testing of concepts, reflections, reasoning and application. Important aspects/topics of the subject may be given sufficient weightage. Questions straight from the textbook and

those merely testing memory/recall should be avoided. The test items should also be free from urban/gender bias.

# 7. Design and Development of Test Items

While designing and preparing the questions, the examining body shall take the following into considerations:

- The examining agency of the State would need to develop a common syllabus for sections I, IV, V & VI (for secondary) and I, IV and V (for Senior Secondary) from the B.Ed. Syllabi of all the affiliating universities in the state in the context of suggested guidelines.
- The core syllabus for CTET (Secondary and Senior Secondary), to be organised
  by the agency nominated by the central government should be developed taking
  into account the syllabi of the different universities across the country.
- The instructions to test writers of the Section on Teaching Learning at the Secondary Stage should clearly state that since B.Ed. is the minimum eligibility qualification for the candidates taking TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary), the questions should correspond to the B.Ed. syllabi as given by the examining body of the state. Broad outlines have been suggested in this document.
- Language I is envisaged to be the medium of instruction. The questions should be related to the basic proficiencies of the candidates in comprehension and communication of the language.
- Language II will be a language other than Language I from among the prescribed options in respect of both the languages. The candidate will be required to specify his or her choice of Language II in the application form. The test items in Language II will also focus on the elements of language communication and comprehension abilities.
- The test items in Educational Assessment should focus on problems and techniques of assessment relevant in different dimensions of learning.
- The test items in content and pedagogy should focus on the concepts, problem solving abilities and related pedagogy of the subject. Questions should not be based merely on recall of facts / calculations / information. In all these subject areas, the test items shall be well distributed over different divisions of the

- syllabus of the subject prescribed for classes XI to XII with relevance and implications for teaching classes XI and XII.
- 9. The question paper shall be bilingual (i) in language(s) as decided by the appropriate Government and (ii) English.
- 10. (a) To qualify in TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) a candidate must score at least 40% in each of the five sections and have an aggregate score of 60%.
  - (b) The agencies conducting TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) may give concessions to persons belonging to SC/ST, OBC and differently abled persons in accordance with the existing policy of the Staff Selection Commission of the respective State/UT. Such concessions will be admissible only on the aggregate marks.
- 11. Qualifying the TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) does not confer a right on any person for recruitment/employment as it is only an eligibility criterion.

#### Applicability

12. TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) will be conducted by a State Government /UT with legislature and shall apply to all schools regardless of management. TET (Sec) conducted by an agency on behalf of the central government shall apply to schools run by central government organisations, States/UTs, local and private bodies / institutions which may opt for it.

In addition to its own TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary), a state may accept TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) certificates awarded by another state/UT with legislature or the TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) conducted on behalf of the central government. In case a state government/UT with legislature decides not to conduct a TET, it can consider the TET conducted by another state or the central government.

**Note** TET for specialized teachers like physical education, music, dance, art etc. need to be developed separately keeping in view the skills involved in those areas at both the levels.

The requirement of TET may not be insisted upon for part-time teachers.

Candidates eligible through TET will be considered for appointment of teaching classes XI and XII.

Candidates eligible through TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) will be considered for appointment for teaching classes IX, X, and XI, XII respectively.

# 13. Frequency of Conduct of TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) and Validity period of The Certificate

The Government concerned should conduct TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) at least once every year. There will be no restriction on the number of attempts a person can make for acquiring a TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) certificate. Validity of the TET Certificate will be life-long.

# 14. Procedure for Conduct of the Test

- (a) The examining body shall formulate a detailed procedure and lay down instructions for the conduct of the TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary).
- (b) Experts for preparing the test should be selected carefully. A team of 2-3 persons may be constituted for setting each paper. Experts should have the skills in writing Multiple Choice Questions in their respective subjects.
- (c) Each test should be vetted by an independent subject expert who should solve the question paper independently. The question paper may be revised in the light of the responses and comments thus received.
- (d) The language validity of the translated items needs to be reviewed with care.
- (e) The examining agency should charge a reasonable fee from the candidates which may be adequate for conducting the examination, maintaining an independent TET cell and conducting relevant research and programmes for capacity building of test writers.
- (f) The examining body should continuously analyse the results for improving the conduct of test.

## 15. Legal Disputes

All legal disputes with regard to conduct of TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the appropriate Government.

# 16. Award of TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) Certificate

The appropriate Government conducting the test shall award a TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary) certificate to all successful candidates. The certificate should contain the name, photograph and postal address of the candidate, date of birth, registration number, year/month of award of certificate and marks obtained in each section and in the aggregate. The certificate may be electronically generated with security features. A suggested format is provided in Annexure II.

#### 17. Monitoring

Monitoring should be an essential activity of the agency conducting the TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary). The following measures should be taken for monitoring the quality and administration of the TET (Secondary and Senior Secondary):

- (i) The NCTE should establish a dedicated TET cell to oversee and monitor the tests conducted in the states and undertake analysis of results and research studies. The cell will look after all TETs. NCTE should also organize meetings of the state Nodal Officers at least once every year for exchange of experiences and fine-tuning conduct of the tests.
- (ii) Every agency conducting TET should forward a report to the NCTE in the prescribed format. (Annexure III)
- (iii) The NCTE shall maintain a database and be the repository of experts and resources, including the technological support system for conduct of the TETs and share it with the agencies conducting the TETs.
- (iv) The NCTE should have a Standing Committee on TETs to oversee the conduct of TETs in the country and to provide academic and technical guidance.

# Major Concerns in TET

- The agencies conducting TET must follow the NCTE Guidelines in letter and spirit.
- ii. Qualifying a TET must be treated as an eligibility criterion for recruitment of teachers for all stages of school education irrespective of their recognition, affiliation or kind of management. The *Recruitment Rules* of all teacher employing agencies must invariably incorporate TET as part of their Recruitment Rules.
- iii. The States/agencies conducting TET should also establish TET Cells to streamline the processes of test designing, administration, maintenance of test records, analysis of test results & monitoring of all related operations.
- iv. It is desirable that the agencies conducting the TET should conduct orientation programmes for the paper setters and moderators as an ongoing activity before each test. A copy of the D.El.Ed syllabus prescribed by the concerned State/UT may be forwarded to paper setters along with the instructions.
- v. The Question Papers should be prepared and moderated by the teachers involved in teacher education programmes and school teachers.
- vi. TET is an Eligibility Test and should be used as such.
- vii. The following formats developed by the Committee may be used for purposes of uniformity:
  - Application Forms
  - TET Certificates
  - Format for maintenance of TET Records.
- viii. The practice of Team Setting and moderation of question papers should be adopted.
- ix. As candidates from the entire country appear at CTET, it is imperative that the CBSE or any other Central examination conducting body should follow the syllabus of elementary teacher education i.e. D.El.Ed. (2009) prescribed by the NCTE as amended from time to time for Child

Development and Pedagogy and the NCERT syllabus for relevant classes for test in School subjects.

Possibilities may be explored for on-line conduct of TET or a hybrid model for enhancing transparency and accuracy

- It was observed that in case quality of Teacher Education Programmes could be assured then there should ideally be no test like TET.
- 3. NCTE should take urgent steps to ensure that a robust programme for capacity building of Teacher Education is put in place as approved by the GB in its 46<sup>th</sup> meeting. Concerns were voiced about the absence of teaching experience in school for determination of eligibility for becoming the Principal / Head in a Teacher Education Institution.
