| <p>The Agenda was approved as proposed. The proposal from QCI was discussed and it was agreed to give them the go ahead with the following caveat:-</p> <p>a) QCI will be engaged for a period of 4 years, but at the end of one year there will be a thorough review based on which a decision will be taken to carry on or terminate.</p> <p><u>b) The accreditation process will be operated on the basis of an SOP, the Intellectual Property Rights of which will be owned by NCTE. If QCI wants to use this in India, they will be free to do so after acknowledging the IPR of NCTE. However, if QCI wishes to use it outside India, they will have to take the written prior permission of NCTE.</u></p> <p><u>In addition to the fees of Rs.1.30 lacs being charged by QCI for Ranking and Accreditation, there will be an administrative fee of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees twenty thousand only) to be charged by NCTE.</u></p> | <p>The Agenda was approved as proposed.
