## ORDER

WHEREAS, the institution, namely, Translam College of Education, Mawana Road, Rajpura, Meerut-250001, Uttar Pradesh was granted recognition and permission to start B. Ed. course from the academic session 2000-2001 with annual intake of 60 students by Northern Regional Committee (in short NRC) in exercise of powers vested under section 14 (3) (a) of NCTE Act, 1993 vide order No. F.3/UP-416/B.Ed./2000/7088 dated 09.08.2000. Subsequently, vide order No.F.NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP-531/ 2002/1084 dated 28<sup>th</sup> May 2003, the said institution was granted further permission for an additional intake of 40 students from academic session 2003-2004.

2. AND WHEREAS, vide covering letter dated 28.12.2002, the institution again made an application for additional intake of 100 seats (one unit) in B. Ed. Course from academic session 2003-2004. However, permission for additional intake of 100 seats was refused by NRC vide order dated 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2003 as the institution did not fulfill the norms and standards prescribed for the same. The appeal was also rejected by NCTE, New Delhi vide order dated 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2003.

Since, academic session 2003-2004 had expired, the institution made fresh application for additional intake of 100 seats (one unit) in B. Ed. course from the academic session 2004-2005. The said application, as per new format, was sent by the institution vide covering letter dated 31.12.2003 and the same was received in the office of NRC on January 13, 2004. Since the application was lacking with essential documents, the NRC vide its letter dated June 8, 2005 carried forward the application for consideration for the subsequent academic year 2005-2006, as per decision taken by it in its 77<sup>th</sup> meeting.

3. AND WHEREAS, in between the institution filed a Writ Petition (S.B. Civil Writ Petition No. 303/2004) in Rajasthan High Court at Jaipur Bench, Jaipur, which was disposed of vide order dated 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2004, as the learned counsel for the institution expressed that the institution was ready and willing to complete all sort of formalities and will remove the defects pointed out by the respondents. The operative portion of the order of the Writ Petition is as under:

"In view of the submissions made by the parties, the respondents are directed to inspect the petitioner institution. It is also expected from the respondents to complete the formalities prior to commencement of session 2005-06 after providing the opportunity to remove the deficiencies and for making arrangement for that purpose. In case the petitioner institution has completed all requisite requirement and remove the deficiencies, the respondents are directed to examine the case of the petitioner for increase of intake capacity **prospectively** in accordance with the provisions of law".
