## ORDER

Pt. Sujan Singh Degree College, Surajkund, Road, Meerut had been granted recognition for an intake of 120 seats for B Ed programme vide NCTE Headquarter's letter dated 4.12.2001.

The institution submitted representations dated 30.11.2002, 14.12.2002 and 14.2.2003 seeking confirmation that it has got recognition for 2 units of 100 seats each i.e. a total of 200 seats from the academic session 2002-2003. The institute has made this representation taking the plea that as per earlier NCTE norms, the institute had recognition for 2 streams of 60 seats each. Consequent on increase in the basic unit from 60 to 100 seats, it should have recognition for 200 seats.

The institution was informed vide letter No. NRC/NCTE/UP-447/2002 dated 28.2.2003 that NCTE has granted recognition to the institution for B Ed. course with 120 seets vide order dated 4.12.2001. The institution was further informed that the B Ed. programme of Pt. Sujan Singh Degree College stands recognized with 120 intake (seats) and the recognition will continue till further decision of the competent authority of NCTE. The institute again submitted a representation dated 3.3.2002 seeking continuation that it has been granted recognition for 200 seats. The institute is informed that there is no provision in NCTE norms for recognition for number of units. Only the basic unit for B.Ed has been fixed at 100 seats. Increase in intake in excess of 100 seats is allowed depending availability of leachers, number of years for which the course has been conducted etc. Further, NCTE grants recognition for specified number of seats and not in terms of units.

Nonetheless, the representations of the institute were considered by the NRC in its 62<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 18 & 19 April, 2003. The Regional Committee noted that for increase in intake in excess of what has already been recognized an institution is required to apply in the prescribed form along with the various essential documents including the NOC from the State Government. The Regional Committee noted that such application for 2002-2003 was required to be submitted by 31.12.2001. Since the institution has not made any such application for increase in intake, the Committee decided that the request for
