ORDER

09 DEC 2005

WHEREAS, on the application of the institution, namely, Major Dhyan Chand Institute of Physical education, Bundelkhand University, Jhansi (UP), was granted recognition for B.P. Ed. course of one year duration from the academic session 2002-2003 with an annual intake of 50 students by the Northern Regional Committee, Jaipur (for short the NRC) vide its order No. NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP-599/2002/6470 dated 14th June 2002 subject to certain condition including that the institution shall ensure library, laboratories and other instructional infrastructure as per norms.

2. AND WHEREAS, on inspection of the institution on July 9, 2004 by a inspection team of experts appointed by NRC, the following deficiencies were noted vis-a-vis NCTE norms: -

- i) The institution has not created separate Library facilities.
- ii) The number of books existing for B.P. Ed. programme is 502, which are not sufficient.

3. AND WHEREAS, the NRC in its 80th meeting held on 26th and 27th July, 2004 after considering the inspection report, the original file and related documents and being satisfied to the above deficiencies decided to give an opportunity to the institution to make written representation within 30 days, before withdrawing the aforesaid recognition of B.P. Course under Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993. Pursuant thereof, the institution was intimated by the NRC vide its communication No. NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP-601/5710 dated August 9, 2004 about the deficiencies and providing it an opportunity to make written representation within 30 days from the date of issuance of the letter. However, the institution did not make any representation. Hence, the NRC in its 97th meeting held on 27th and 28th October, 2005 after being satisfied that the defects pointed out to the institution still persist, decided to withdraw the recognition of the institution in exercise of the powers vested under Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993.

4. AND THEREFORE, in terms of the above decision the recognition of the aforesaid institution for B.P.Ed. Course stands withdrawn from the end of current academic session i.e. 2006-2007.

7. As a result of this order, the aforesaid institution shall discontinue B.P. Ed. teacher training course immediately after the academic session 2005-2006 and the concerned University or examining body shall cancel affiliation of the institution in accordance with this order with effect from the end of the current academic session 2005-2006, as provided under sub-section (3) of section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993.

8. The qualification in teacher education obtained pursuant to that course or training or after undertaking a course or training in the said institution after the academic session 2005-2006, shall not be treated as valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any School, College or other educational body aided by the Central Government or any State Government as per sub-section (4) of the Section 17 of NCTE Act, 1993
