ORDER

For the purposes and in pursuance of the provisions contained in Section 13 of the NCTE Act, 1993, NCTE Headquarters conducted inspection of the Rajasthan Mahila Teacher Training College, Near Gulab Bagh, Udaipur, Rajasthan on 23.07.2003 and after having received the report / findings from the inspection team and seeking response of the institution on the deficiencies reported by the inspection team, the same were forwarded to the office of the NRC to take further necessary action in accordance with the provisions of the NCTE Act, Rules, Regulations etc. The deficiencies pointed out are as under :-

- (i) The Principal has already crossed the age of superannuation prescribed for staff in the NCTE norms.
- (ii) The institution does not have required number of full time regular lecturers, as laid down in the NCTE norms.
- (iii) Ten out of list of lecturers provided by the institution neither have NET qualification nor they appear to fall in the exempted category.
- (iv) It is not clear as to whether the appointment of teachers in the institution has been approved by the affiliating University.
- (v) The service condition of the teachers have been reported to be very poor.
- (vi) The teachers are paid consolidated salaries that too only for the working days.
- (vii) The infrastructural and instructional facilities like library and labs available with the institution fall short of the requirement specified in the NCTE norms.
- (viii) It is also not clear as to whether the institution has made any arrangements for part-time teachers for teaching art and craft, music, physical education etc.

2. AND WHEREAS, the said report of the inspection team and reply of the institution were placed before the NRC in its 80th meeting. Having considered the same, the Committee was of the opinion that the reply and supporting documents attached therewith are not satisfactory. Therefore, the Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the institution under Section 17(i) of the NCTE Act, 1993. Accordingly, a Show Cause Notice dated 08.08.2004 was issued to the institution, communicating therein the deficiencies observed by the visiting team on inspection made by it under Section 13 of the NCTE Act, 1993, to provide reasonable opportunity of making representation against the proposed action.

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3. The reply submitted by the institution was placed before NRC in its 85th meeting, wherein the NRC decided that a letter be written to the Management of the college to submit a written representation alongwith supporting documents duly authenticated alongwith an Affidavit signed by the authorized signatory of the management.

4. AND WHEREAS, the entire matter was considered by the NRC in its 88th meeting wherein the Committee noted that the reply submitted by the institution is not satisfactory and the deficiencies pointed out still persist. Having considered the entire matter, including the deficiencies and their impact on the quality of teacher education / training, the Committee, being satisfied that the institution has violated norms and standards laid down under the Rules, Regulations and orders made or issued under the Act as well the conditions to which recognition / permission was granted to the institution: decided to withdraw recognition of Rajasthan Mahila Teacher Training College, Near Gulab Bagh, Udaipur Rajasthan for running B.Ed. course with effect from the end of the current academic session 2004-2005.

5. AND THEREFORE, the recognition of Rajasthan Mahila Teacher Training College, Near Gulab Bagh, Udaipur, Rajasthan for B.Ed. Course stands withdrawn from the end of the current academic session i.e. 2004-2005.

6. As a result of this order, Rajasthan Mahila Teacher Training College, Near Gulab Bagh, Udaipur, Rajasthan shall discontinue B.Ed. teacher training course immediately after the academic session 2004-2005 and the concerned University or examining body shall cancel affiliation of the institution in accordance with this order with effect from the end of the current academic session 2004-2005 as provided under Sub-Section (3) of Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993.

7. The qualification in teacher education obtained pursuant so that course or training or after undertaking a course or training in the said institution after the academic session 2004-2005, shall not be treated as valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any School, College or other educational body aided by the Central Government or any State Government as per Sub-Section (4) of the Section 17 of NCTE Act, 1993.

8. Further, if the institution is not satisfied by this order, it can prefer an appeal before NCTE, Headquarters against this order under Section 18 of NCTE Act, 1993, within 60 days of the date of issue of this order. The guidelines for appeal are enclosed.

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
