

NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP-1425/2004/428

ORDER

WHEREAS, the institution, namely, Mangalmai Institute of Management and Technology, Plot No. 8 & 9, Knowledge Park – II, Greater Noida – 201303 has made an application to Northern Regional Committee (in short NRC) under section 15 (1) of NCTE Act, 1993 to seek permission to start new course of NTE from academic session 2004-2005 vide covering letter dated 23.01.2004 and the same was received in the office of NRC on 27.01.2004.

2. The institution was inspected on 02.12.2004 by an inspection team of expert constituted by NRC. The inspection team noted certain deficiencies in its report submitted and the same was considered by NRC in its 87th meeting held on 28-29 January, 2005 alongwith the original file of the institution.

3. After careful perusal of the file, inspection report of the experts and other related documents, the Committee, in the above meeting, being satisfied that the institution did not fulfill the requirements laid down in sub clause (a) of section 15 (3) of NCTE Act, 1993 decided that the institution be given a reasonable opportunity for making representation drawing its attention with following deficiencies existed vis-à-vis NCIL norms:

- (i) The institution has procured 450 books only in the library whereas the committee is of the view that a minimum of 1500 books are required for conducting the NTE course effectively.
- (ii) The institution has not provided documentary proof with regards to purchase of various equipments/ instruments/ chemical and consumable items for the proposed NTE course as per NCTE norms.

Consequently, as per above decision, letter No. F. NRC/NCTE/F-3/UP-1425/2004/13082 dated 10.02.2005 was issued communicating the above deficiencies to the institution with an opportunity to make representation within one month before passing an order refusing permission to the new course of NTE.

4. The institution submitted its written representation vide letter No. NII dated 24.02.2005 which was received in the office of NRC on 01.03.2005. The said representation was placed before the NRC in its 89th meeting held on 21st March, 2005 wherein the Committee, after consideration of the entire matter including the deficiencies referred to above, being of the opinion that the institution does not fulfill the requirements relating to norms and standards laid down for the same, passed an order refusing permission to the institution for the new course of NTE.
