**ORDER**

WHEREAS, the institution, namely, **Kisan P.G. College, Baghaon, Ghazipur (UP)**, has made an application to Northern Regional Committee (for short the NRC) under section 15 (1) of NCTE Act, 1993 seeking permission to start new course of M.P. Ed. from academic session 2004-2005 vide covering letter dated 30.12.2003 and the same was received in the office of NRC on 31.12.2003.

2. AND WHEREAS, the institution was inspected on 26.10.2004 by an inspection team of experts constituted by NRC. The inspection team noted that number of books existing in library were 2250 only. Only 250 books have been added for M.P. Ed. programme which is not sufficient for running the training programme effectively.

3. That in exercise of the powers conferred under clause (f) and (g) of sub-section (2) of section 32 of the NCTE Act, 1993, the National Council for Teacher Education (for short the NCTE) made Regulations amending the NCTE (Form of application for recognition, the time limit of submission of application, determination of norms and standards for recognition of teacher education programmes and permission to start new course or training) Regulations, 2002 dated 13<sup>th</sup> November, 2002 as amended vide notification No. F-48-6/2003-NCTE (N&S) dated 06<sup>th</sup> June 2003, published on 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2003, whereby Clause (iv) of para 8 of the aforesaid NCTE Regulations is substituted by the following:

"No institution shall be permitted to apply for enhancement of its intake over and above the basic unit as indicated in the Appendices 3 to 14 of these regulations and for starting a new course or training in teacher education under sub-section (1) of Section 15 of NCTE Act, 1993 unless (a) it has been granted permanent recognition and has continuously run teacher training programme or course for a period of three years, and (b) it has accredited itself with the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with grade of B+ on a nine point scale developed by NAAC".

4. The NRC considered the entire matter in its 88<sup>th</sup> meeting and having noted the aforesaid amended Regulation dated 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2003 and the fact that the institution has not submitted B+ grade from NAAC as such decided that the institution may be asked to forward an attested copy of certificate awarded by NAAC having B+ grade on 9 point scale.

Consequently vide communication No. F. NCTE/NRC/F-3/UP-1362/2004/14147 dated 09<sup>th</sup> March, 2005 notice was given to the institution providing a reasonable opportunity of making representation within one month from the date of communication before refusing permission of the new course, which was replied by the institution vide its letter dated 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2005.

5. AND WHEREAS, the matter was considered by NRC in its 90<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2005, wherein after careful perusal of the original file of the institution, reply submitted by the institution and other related documents, provisions of the Act, Regulations, guidelines of the NCTE published from time to time, the Committee decided to refuse grant of permission for the proposed M.P. Ed. course as the institution did not have accreditation from NACC.

6. AND THEREFORE, in terms of above decision of NRC, **the application of Kisan P.G. College, Baghaon, Ghazipur (UP) seeking permission for the new course of M.P. ED. is refused under section 15 (3) (b) of the NCTE Act, 1993.**

7. Consequently, the institution shall not admit any student in M. P. ED. course and other concerned body(s) shall not hold examination, whether provisional or otherwise for the M.P.ED. course if conducted by the said institution unless the institution is granted permission for the said course by the NRC/NCTE.

8. In accordance with section 17 (4) of the NCTE Act, 1993, the qualification in teacher education, namely M.P.ED., obtained pursuant to such course or training in the above institution shall not be treated as valid qualification for purposes of employment under the Central Government, any State Government or University, or in any School, College or other educational body aided by the Central Government or any State Government.

9. Further, if the institution is not satisfied by this order, it can prefer an appeal before National Council for Teacher Education, Hans Bhawan, Wing-II, 1, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, Near ITC, New Delhi-110002 against this order under Section 18 of NCTE Act, 1993, within 60 days of the date of issue of this order. The guidelines for appeal are enclosed herewith.
