The report of the Local Inquiry Committee for the academic year 2024-25 is attached. The renewal of affiliation is subject to the specified student intake limits. The college must submit a compliance report within 15 days, addressing the deficiencies mentioned in the Local Inquiry Committee's report and improving the institution accordingly. Failure to rectify the deficiencies and submit the compliance report will result in non-renewal of affiliation for the next academic year.


Decisions:

1. The conditions specified by the Local Inquiry Committee must be strictly followed.
2. As per the Government Order No: ED 29 UNE 2021 dated: 12-02-2021, the college must take necessary steps to fulfill all the eight recommendations mentioned in the Local Inquiry Committee report within the next two years.
3. As directed by the Government, admissions to integrated courses must mandatorily be done through the Government's UUCMS portal.
4. If the approved student intake limit is exceeded, the university will not approve the excess admissions.
5. No additional branches/sections may be introduced in any course(s) without prior permission from the university.

6. While admitting students to undergraduate courses, the reservation policies issued by the government from time to time must be strictly followed.
7. The university rules/regulations and orders regarding students, teaching and non-teaching staff must be followed. Admissions to courses should be done without violating the student intake limits or eligibility criteria prescribed by the university in accordance with the university's coordination notification.
8. For postgraduate courses, admissions must be made from the students sponsored by the university to the extent of 50% of the sanctioned intake (100% for government colleges), without exceeding the admission and other fee structures prescribed by the university from time to time.
9. In relation to the Vishakha v/s State of Rajasthan case, as per the Supreme Court judgment dated 13-08-1997, any form of harassment, especially sexual harassment, by any person (teaching/non-teaching/administrative/students) in the college or office premises is a punishable offense. If anyone is found participating in such activities, they can be dismissed from service or expelled from the institution. A grievance committee must be established in the college as per the Supreme Court's directives to curb such offenses.
10. The teaching methods for the courses should be improved to ensure the academic development of students. Principals/management must show empathy toward both students and the teaching staff.
11. Marks cards and other documents submitted by students for admission approval must be promptly returned to them after approval and reported to the university.
12. The college must issue marks cards, degree certificates, and other documents to students within three months. If not issued within this period, the Registrar (Evaluation) must be informed regarding the retained documents.
13. If a student applies for a transfer certificate, it must be issued without causing any inconvenience. Except for the tuition fee for the incomplete year/semester, no additional fees may be charged unless permitted by regulations.
14. The college is prohibited from collecting any kind of capitation fee.
15. Kannada must be mandatorily used in administrative activities.
16. The college must compulsorily submit an application for renewal of course affiliation for the academic year 2025–26.
17. Colleges that have completed five years must immediately obtain NAAC accreditation.
18. The Principal must mandatorily submit the list of eligible teachers for evaluation duties to

the respective Chairpersons of the Boards of Studies. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of the college's affiliation.
