
WHEREAS the appeal of KLR College of Education, Khammam, Andhra Pradesh now in Telangana dated 04/05/2013 against the Order No. SRCAPP796/D.El.Ed/AP/2011-12/43158 dated 27/06/2012 of the Southern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.El.Ed. course on the grounds that (1) Approved blue print of the building plan issued by competent civil authority is not submitted; and (2) Notarised land usage certificate from the Revenue Divisional Office stating that the agriculture land converted to non-agriculture for the educational purpose is not submitted, was not admitted by the Council as the delay in appeal was not condoned vide order F.No. 89-340/2013-Appeal/13th Meeting-2013 dt.15.10.2013.

AND WHEREAS the appellant, aggrieved by the order of the Council, filed a Writ Petition No. 9954 of 2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Hyderabad for the States of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. The Hon'ble High Court in their order dt. 09.04.2015, holding that in terms of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Special Leave to Appeal (Civil) Nos. 4247-4248 of 2009 dt. 10.09.2013, the respondents have to reconsider all pending applications as per the new regulations, set aside the impugned order and remitted the matter to the Council for fresh consideration and for passing appropriate orders expeditiously. The Hon'ble High Court also gave liberty to the Council, if it deems appropriate, to remit the matter to the respondent no. 2, namely, the S.R.C. The appellant, in his letter dt. 23.04.2015, enclosing a copy of the order of the Hon'ble High Court, requested the Council to remit their application to the S.R.C for further action.

AND WHEREAS the Committee, in the light of the directions of the Hon'ble High Court, decided to consider the appeal. Sh. Y. Madhusudhan Reddy, Secretary, KLR College of Education, Khammam, Andhra Pradesh now in Telangana appeared before the Committee on 06.05.2015 and reiterated the submissions earlier made in the appeal. The Committee, following the directions of the Hon'ble High Court, concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the S.R.C with a direction to consider the application of the appellant as per the provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 and take further necessary action.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to SRC with a direction to consider the application of the appellant as per the provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 and take further necessary action.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of KLR College of Education, Khammam, Andhra Pradesh to the SRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.
