
WHEREAS the appeal of R.I.E.T. Vidyapeeth, Pohli, Sardhana Road, Sardhana, Uttar Pradesh dated 18.05.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201615480/Diploma in Elementary Education [D.El.Ed.]/UP/2017-18/2; dated 29/03/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.El.Ed. course on the grounds that "The institution has yet not submitted the latest Non-Encumbrance certificate issued by the Competent Authority indicating that the land is free from all encumbrances. The submitted NEC is only up to the year 2011. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Ankur Agarwal, Adm. Officer and Sh. Sandeep Nagar, Accountant, R.I.E.T. Vidyapeeth, Pohli, Sardhana Road, Sardhana, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "The appellant is a renowned Educational Trust popularly known as Shri Tirupati Educational Welfare Trust, Meerut and has an appreciable contribution in the promotion of general Professional Education in the District. The Trust is basically striving hard to start an additional Course in D.El.Ed. in its existing College for the benefit of the students in and around the area and imparting quality Education for which all the necessary infrastructure and facilities as required under the NCTE Norms was constructed using all the Financial Resources that were contributed by the Society/Trust Members. That the Shri Tirupati Educational Welfare Trust, Meerut has already sent the reply of SCN issued dated 02/03/2017 on 07.03.2017 by speed post along with the relevant documents as desired by the members of the NRC, NCTE, Jaipur. That the latest Non-Encumbrance Certificate is again being submitted for your kind consideration. In the light of the facts explained along with the supporting documents above by the appellant. Impugned order of the NRC in its Emergency Meeting cannot form any bona-fide and prima face ground for the closure of course file of RIET Vidyapeeth, Meerut, Uttar Pradesh, thus needs to be quashed."

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that applicant institution already stands recognised for conducting B.Ed. & D.El.Ed. programme with an annual intake of 100 seats each since the years 2009 and 2016 respectively. After submission of online application dated 31.05.2016 seeking recognition for additional intake of D.El.Ed programme, a Show Cause Notice (SCN) dated 02.03.2017 was issued to appellant institution on grounds of 'non submission of Latest Non Encumbrance Certificate (NEC) for Khasra No. 1687.' Appellant in reply to SCN again submitted NEC dated 06.03.2011 which he understood to be the latest one as possessed by him. Appellant after noting the decision, taken by NRC to reject the application, in the 266th Meeting held from 21st to 24th March, 2017 sent another letter to NRC dated 04.04.2017 enclosing therewith a certificate issued by Sub Registrar, Sardhana (Meerut) intimating that there is no encumbrance found on Khasara No. 1687. The appellant also submitted copy of this NEC before Appeal Committee otherwise found to be available on the regulatory file. Appeal Committee, therefore, decided to remand back the case to NRC for further processing of the applications.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC for further processing the case.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of R.I.E.T. Vidyapeeth, Pohli, Sardhana Road, Sardhana, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Edify Institute of BTC, Shahzadpur, Pauri, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh dated 22.05.2017 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP-15198/266th Meeting (Part-2)/2017/170182 dated 03/04/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed. course on the grounds that "V.T. visited the institution on 11.05.2016. The institution refused for inspection. Accordingly, the institution was given SCN dated 09.09.2016. reply submitted by the institution dated 15.02.2017 is not accepted."


AND WHEREAS Dr. Anil Kumar Gupta, Director, Edify Institute of BTC, Shahzadpur, Pauri, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that Sh. Harsh Bhaskar, Chairperson of the society met with an accident on 10.05.2016 and was admitted in a Hospital. The mobile phone was also lost and so due to non communication with the Inspection Team, Inspection could not be conducted."

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that the Visiting Team Members had recorded an observation dated 19.05.2016 stating that "Chairman of Edify College Mr. Harsh Bhaskar was informed on his Telephone No. 9412255438 that his college will be inspected between 16th May, 2016 to 18th May 2016 but he disagreed for the Inspection."

AND WHEREAS since V.T. was able to communicate with Sh. Harsh Bhaskar and could not get a positive response for inspection, the refusal order on the ground that 'Institution refused for Inspection' is justified. Clause 7(7) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 stipulates that inspection shall not be subject to the consent of the institution. Appeal Committee, therefore, decided to confirm the impugned refusal order dated 3.4.2017 issued by NRC, Jaipur.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, the documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the NRC was justified in refusing recognition and therefore, the appeal deserved to be rejected and the order of the NRC is confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Pandit Mahaveer Prasad Tripathi Mahavidyalaya, Vijapur, Sadar, Uttar Pradesh dated 24.05.2017 is against the decision taken in 267th Meeting by the Northern Regional Committee, to refuse recognition for conducting D.El.Ed. course on the grounds that "The applicant institution has not submitted the reply of the SCN issued by the NRC on 02.03.2017 within the stipulated time. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Sh. M. Chaturvedi, President and Sh. Sanjay Srivastava, Representative, Pandit Mahaveer Prasad Tripathi Mahavidyalaya, Vijapur, Sadar, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation following documents were submitted :

- (i) NOC dated 04.01.2017 issued by Mahatama Gandhi Kashi Vidya Peeth, Varanasi.
- (ii) Affiliation letter dated 15.09.2014 to prove composite status.
- (iii) Certified copy of land documents.
- (iv) Building plan.


AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that a Show Cause Notice (SCN) dated 02.03.2017 was issued to appellant institution seeking written representation within 21 days and the decision taken by NRC in its 267th Meeting held between 5th to 7th Appeal, 2017 to refuse recognition on the ground of non submission of reply by the appellant institution was in haste. But never the less the appellant had submitted online application on 27.05.2016 seeking recognition for B.El.Ed. programme without obtaining NOC from the affiliating body. Clause 5(3) of NCTE Regulation, 2014 provide that application shall be submitted alongwith NOC issued by concerned affiliating body and clause 7(1) of the

Regulation stipulate that 'In case an application is not complete, or requisite documents are not enclosed with application, it shall be treated as incomplete, and rejected.

AND WHEREAS in the instant case NOC was issued by affiliating body on 4.1.2017 which in no way could have been enclosed with the application dated 27.5.2016. Appeal Committee, therefore, decided to confirm the impugned decision taken by NRC in its 267th meeting held from 5th to 7th April, 2017.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, the documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the NRC was justified in refusing recognition and therefore, the appeal deserved to be rejected and the order of the NRC is confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Tagore Teachers Training College, Kekri, Tagore Nagar, Ajmer Road, Kekri, Rajasthan dated 25.05.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201616328/B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. – 4 Year Integrated/RJ/2017-18/2 dated 29/03/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on the grounds that “The institution has not submitted the following documents. (i) The certified registered land documents issued by the Registering Authority or civil authority concerned. (ii) Land Use Certificate issued by the Competent Authority to use the land for educational purpose. (iii) Non-Encumbrance certificate issued by the Competent Authority indicating that the land is free from all encumbrances. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution.”

AND WHEREAS Sh. Govind Acharya, Secretary and Dr. Ved Prakash Sharma, Principal, Tagore Teachers Training College, Kekri, Tagore Nagar, Ajmer Road, Kekri, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that “NRC had not objectively considered and appreciated the detailed reply submitted by appellant in response to the show cause notice. The impugned decision is not sustainable for the reason that appellant had submitted the Non-encumbrance certificate with its reply, however, for ready reference and perusal of the appellate authority a copy of Non-Encumbrance certificate issued by competent authority is enclosed. Similarly, the conversion of land use i.e. conversion of land for educational purposes issued by competent Authority is enclosed. Institution again places on record copy of registered land document issued by competent authority. In view of the reply to show cause notice as well as in view of documents placed on record with present appeal, it is apparent that no deficiency exists

with appellant institution and its application deserves to be processed further and recognition be granted to it."

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that appellant institution submitted online application dated 13.06.2016 seeking recognition for grant of 4 year Integrated programme of B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed. Appeal Committee noted that in the online application the name of parent society i.e. 'Tagore Bal Niketan Samiti Kekri' has nowhere been mentioned whereas the documents enclosed with the online application such as (i) certificate of Registration of Society and (ii) Land documents do mention the name of Society. The appellant institution is already conducting B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. programmes recognised by the NCTE.


AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noting that a reply to SCN was submitted by appellant institution on 21.03.2017 has reason to believe that a SCN was issued which otherwise could not be located on the relevant regulatory file. The documents submitted by the appellant in reply to SCN were not considered to be satisfactory. Appellant during the course of appeal presentation on 25.08.2017 submitted copies of Non Encumbrance Certificate (NEC) and Land Use Certificate both dated 21.04.2017 issued by Tehsildar Kekri. The institution is already recognised for B.Ed. & D.El.Ed. programmes and is situated within the jurisdiction of Nagar Palika, Kekri supports these documents. As regards certified copy of land documents, the applicant is time and again enclosing zerox copy of the certified land documents instead of original certified land documents. Appeal Committee is of the opinion that submission of zerox copy and not the original certified copy of land documents alone in respect of an existing institution should not be held as a valid ground for refusal.

AND WHEREAS Since the appellant institution has applied for 4 year Integrated course of B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed., it would have been more important for the Regional Committee to have verified whether the appellant institution is well equipped to fulfil the condition laid down in para 1.1 of Appendix 13 of the Norms and Standards for the 4 year programme. If the appellant institution can satisfy integrating general studies comprising Science (B.Sc., B.Ed.) and Social Sciences or Humanities (B.A, B.Ed.) and professional studies comprising foundation of education, pedagogy of school subjects and maintain a

balance between theory and practice, the application may be processed further. With the above observation the case is remanded back to NRC. Appellant institution is required to submit to NRC, Jaipur original certified copy of land documents within 15 days of the issue of appeal orders.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC for further processing of the application. Appellant institution is required to submit to NRC, Jaipur original certified copy of land documents within 15 days of the issue of appeal orders.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Tagore Teachers Training College, Kekri, Tagore Nagar, Ajmer Road, Kekri – 305404, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Shri Ramprasad Bohara College, Buhana, Rajasthan dated 23.05.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201616551/B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. – 4 Year Integrated/RJ/2017-18/2 dated 29/03/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on the grounds that "The institution has submitted two LUCs regarding Khasra no. 2480/2171 and 2479/2171 which show that converted land is only 2500 sq. mtr. It is not sufficient for existing as well as proposed courses. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Manoj Kumar, Lecturer and Sh. Jitendra Yadav, Secretary, Shri Ramprasad Bohara College, Buhana, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "We have applied LUCs regarding Khasra no. 2480/2171 and 2479/2171 of total land area 5000 sq. mtrs. but at the time of reply of show cause notice we had received LUC of 2500 sq. mtr. only which we submitted. LUC of another 2500 sq. mtr. was pending at that time. we will show the LUC for total 5000 sq. mtr. land at the time of hearing. we have got 5000 sq. mtrs. of land converted with us."

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted submission made by appellant with regard to the institution conducting degree course (B.A., B.Sc., B.Com) since 2003 and Post Graduate Courses since 2006. The appellant during the course of appeal presentation also submitted Land Use Certificate dated 04.08.2017 issued by Tehsildar, Bahana, Dist. Jhunjhunu. According to the CLU, land measuring 5000 Sq. Meters owned by the applicant society has been converted for being used for educational purpose.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noting the development, decided to remand back the case to NRC, Jaipur for further processing of the application. Appellant institution is required to make available a copy of land use certificate to NRC, Jaipur within 15 days of the issue of appeal orders.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC for further processing of the application. Appellant institution is required to submit a copy of Land Use Certificate to NRC within 15 days of the issue of Appeal Orders.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Shri Ramprasad Bohara College, Buhana – 333502, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Yaduvanshi College of Education, Sohali, Buhana – Mahendergarh Road, Buhana, Rajasthan dated 23.05.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201616378/B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. – 4 Year Integrated/RJ/2017-18/2; dated 11/04/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on the grounds that “The institution has submitted photo copy of certified land documents issued by registering authority, but original copy not submitted. The institution has not submitted the approved Building plan signed by the Competent Govt. Authority indicating the name of the course, name of the institution, Khasra No./Plot No., total land area, total built-up area and the measurements of the Multi-purpose Hall as well as the other infrastructural facilities such as class rooms etc. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution.”

AND WHEREAS Sh. Satish Kumar, Secretary and Sh. Karmveer, Lecturer, Yaduvanshi College of Education, Sohali, Buhana – Mahendergarh Road, Buhana, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that “By mistake our institution have not submitted the original copy of certified land documents issued by the registering authority because we were under the impression that the photocopy is to be submitted, however the original copy is with us and we will show the same during hearing. The institution has already got the approved building plan signed by the government authority indicating the name of the course, name of the institution, Khasara No. Plot No. total land area, total build-up area and the measurements of the Multipurpose hall as well as the other infrastructural facilities such as classroom etc as the institution is already running bachelor of education 4units since 2008 the institution have submitted the

certificate of the same certified by the competent authority. we will submit the original building plan at the time of hearing.”

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that impugned refusal order dated 11.04.2017 was issued on two grounds namely:

- i) Non submission of original certified land documents.
- ii) Non submission of approved building plan signed by competent authority indicating the name of course, Khasra No. / Plot number, total proposed built up area, measurement of multipurpose hall and other infrastructural facilities.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committed noted that appellant institution is already conducting B.Ed. & D.El.Ed. programme since 2007. Appellant during the course of appeal presentation on 25.08.2017 showed copy of original certified copy of land documents and a building plan containing necessary details. Appellant was advised to submit these documents to NRC as and when required.


AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee, however, noted that appellant institution is not affiliated for conducting degree course and thus apparently does not fulfil the requirement of para 1.1. of Appendix 13 of the Norms and Standards for 4 year Integrated programme which aims at integrating general studies comprising science (B.Sc. B.Ed.) and social sciences or humanities (B.A. B.Ed.), and professional studies comprising foundation of education.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee after noting the facts of the case, decided to remand back the case to NRC for revisiting the matter after the appellant submits original certified copy of land documents and copy of approved building plan within 15 days of the issue of appeal orders. NRC should, however, keep in view Para 1.1 of Appendix 13 of the Norms and Standards for 4 year Integrated programme.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC for revisiting the matter after the appellant submits original certified copy of land documents and copy

of approved building plan within 15 days of the issue of appeal orders. NRC should, however, keep in view Para 1.1 of Appendix 13 of the Norms and Standards for 4 year Integrated programme.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Yaduvanshi College of Education, Sohali, Buhana – Mahendergarh Road, Buhana – 333515, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Indian Institute of Education, Naul, Shyampur, West Bengal dated 25.05.2017 is against the Order No. ER/7-208.8.11/ERCAPP3237/(B.Ed.)/2016/44862 dated 22/03/2016 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.Ed. course on the grounds that "(i) The land documents (Registered land deed) is in the name of S.K. Golam Ehiya i.e. in the name of individual which is not acceptable as per NCTE Regulation 2014. In view the above, the committee decided as under: The committee is of the opinion that application bearing code No. ERCAPP3237 of the institution regarding recognition for B.Ed. is refused under section 14(3)(b) of NCTE Act, 1993."

AND WHEREAS Sh. S.K. Golam Ehiya, Secretary and Sh. Rafik Ali Khan, Representative, Indian Institute of Education, Naul, Shyampur, West Bengal presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "The applicant Trust, submitted its online application for grant of recognition for the academic session 2016-17 on 30/05/2015 for D.El.Ed. programme (ERCAPP3235) with an annual intake for 50 (one basic unit) and for B.Ed. programme (ERCAPP3237) with annual intake of 100 (two basic units) as a composite institute in the name of "Indian Institute of Education" under "Ankur Educational and Welfare Trust". Relevant documents and an application fee of Rs. 3,00,000/- (Rs. 1, 50,000/- each programme) by local courier. The application trust obtained NOC from West Bengal Board of Primary Education and the University of Calcutta in the name of the Institution" besides, all other relevant documents including building plan in favour of the institution/trust. The applicant trust, in its reply dated 11/02/2016 against show cause notice vide proceedings of 202nd Meeting held on 18th-23rd January 2016 by ERC, NCTE, Bhubaneswar, submitted in its written submission alongwith relevant documents with a prayer of consideration for both the applications, which was unfortunately not considered by ERC, NCTE. The applicant trust, at the time of submitting online application was in possession of 3723.08 sq. mts. (92.734 decimal) of Land and 3553.75 sq. mts. of Built-up area in the name of the institute "Indian Institute of Education" which satisfied the norms for composite institution as per NCTE Regulation, 2014. The applicant Trust, before its online application, having all significant documents (Land Position Certificate, Land Mutation Certificate, Non-Encumbrance

Certificate, etc. issued by concerned BL & LRO, Govt. of West Bengal) in the name of the "Indian Institute of Education" to establish its land position/ownership in favour of the institution. Hence such a point can't be ground of rejection. The applicant Trust found an order passed by Hon'ble Appeal Committee vide F.No. 89-168/2016 Appeal/7th Meeting-2016, dated 04/07/2016 filed by one Dr. Grahams Homes, Kalimpong, Darjeeling, West Bengal, wherein the case was remanded back to ERC, NCTE with undermentioned observation/facts/ground: "...Committee further noted the submission made by the appellant stating that land was allotted to the founder member of the society during early years of last century. The appellant institution has furnished copy of land title certificate issued by paying fee to District Sub-Registrar, Darjeeling, Certificates issued by Dist. Land & Land Reforms officer and Non-Encumbrance Certificate issued by Block Land and Land Reforms Officer, Kalimpong also support the fact that land is recorded in the name of Kalimpong also support the fact that land is recorded in the name of Dr. Graham's Homes Board of Management. Appeal Committee is of the opinion that registered land documents does not necessarily mean copy of sale deed of land documents registered in the office of Registrar/Sub-Registrar. Legal ownership and possession of land can also be through land allotment or some other certificates issued by competent authority....". ERC, NCTE without consideration of the facts and documents including affidavit/undertaking rejected both the applications of D.El.Ed. (ERCAPP3235) Programme vide order No. ER/7-208.8.12/ERCAPP3235/(D.El.Ed.)/2016/44868, dated 22/03/2016 and B.Ed. (ERCAPP3237) Programme vide order No. ER/7-208.8.11/ERCAPP3237/(B.Ed.)/2016/44862, dated 22/03/2016 applied for the academic session 2016-17 with liberty to file an appeal to the Applicant Institution as per NCTE Act, 1993. ERC, NCTE, after passing of 9 month 10 days (approx.) from the receipt of the hard copies of the online application (12/06/2015) to issuance of rejection order/(s) (22/03/2016) ultimately refused both the applications for D.El.Ed. (ERCAPP3235) Programme and B.Ed. (ERCAPP3237) Programme. The applicant trust submitted the facts that NCTE issued public notice dated 9th March 2016 inviting online application for the academic session 2017-18, however it was also noted on the NCTE Public Notice that "In case of Tamil Nadu and West Bengal the decision about restriction on the TE courses shall be taken on receipt of the input of the respective State Govt." it is to be observed that the Government of West Bengal did not provide any recommendation to NCTE regarding ban for the academic session 2017-18. Hence, the applicant Trust/Institute has lost the opportunity to file a fresh application for the academic session 2017-18. The applicant Trust also submitted the facts that NCTE issued public notice deciding not to invite/accept applications for the academic session 2018-19 for grant of teacher training institutions/programmes, published in the NCTE website <http://ncte-india.org>. Thus, the Applicant Trust/Institute has lost all the opportunity to file a fresh application for the academic session 2018-19. The applicant trust affirms that "Indian Institute of Education"

has diligently portrayed its true position of the land and building on the aforementioned address. Hence the applicant trust submitted its prayer for condoning the delay and allows/reconsiders the Appeal Application. The applicant trust found proceedings from internet (NCTE website), where the Hon'ble Appeal Committee considered many cases and reverted back the matter to the ERC, NCTE for reconsideration, analogous to the Applicant Trust/Institution. The Applicant Trust/Institute had no other alternative but to file an Appeal under Section 18 of the NCTE Act 1993, with clean hand before the Hon'ble Appeal Committee to save the future of the institute. The applicant trust/institute thus seeks for reconsideration of the case with the provision for remanding back to the ERC, NCTE for further processing of the applications."

AND WHEREAS appellant requested for condoning the delay in preferring appeal as secretary of the institution was seriously ill during the period. Appeal Committee decided to condone the delay and take up the appeal on its merits.


AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that rejection order is only on the ground that 'Land documents are in the name of SK Golam Ehiya i.e. in the name of individual which is not acceptable.' Appeal Committee noted that the name of Sh. Golam Ehiya is mentioned as Secretary of the Indian Institute of Education in all the sale deed documents including the Memo of consideration. To support the possession and ownership of land by the 'Indian Institute of Education', the applicant had furnished following documents:

- i) Non Encumbrance Certificate dated 13.11.2013 issued by Block Land and Land Reforms Officer, Howrah.
- ii) Change of Land Use Certificate dated 29.10.2013 issued by office of Sub Divisional Land and Land Reforms Officer, Uluberia, Howrah.
- iii) Land Possession Certificate dated 28.05.2015 issued by Block Land and Land Reforms Officer, Shyampur-II, Howrah.
- iv) Building Plan in the name of India Institute of Education approved on 22.05.2015 by Nirman Sahayak, Nakole Gram Panchayat.
- v) Building Completion Certificate dated 19.01.2016 issued by Asstt. Engineer, Howrah Zila Parishad.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee after going through the details of case does not have any iota of doubt about the ownership of land which rests with the 'Indian Institute of Education'. Appeal Committee, therefore, decided to set aside the impugned refusal order dated 22.3.2016 and remand back the case to ERC, Bhubaneshwar for further processing of the case.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to ERC for further processing of the case.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Indian Institute of Education, Naul, Shyampur – 711312, West Bengal to the ERC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Vinayak P.G. Degree College, Shivsinghpura, Nawalgarh Road, Sikar, Rajasthan dated 24.05.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201615121/B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. – 4 Year Integrated/RJ/2017-18/2; dated 11/04/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on the grounds that "The institution has not submitted following documents. LUC of Khasra No. 645/1 as mentioned in online application not submitted. The institution has submitted LUC of Khasra No. 719/1. The institution has not submitted the Non-Encumbrance certificate issued by the Competent Authority indicating that the land is free from all encumbrances. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Abhishek Sharma and Sh. Hemant Jangir, Representative, Vinayak P.G. Degree College, Shivsinghpura, Nawalgarh Road, Sikar, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "Application has already forwarded to NRC the required documents."


AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that appellant institution in reply to the Show Cause Notice (SCN) as well as during appeal presentation has submitted copies of i) Land Use Certificate dated 03.02.2014 for Khasra No. 645/1 and Non Encumbrance Certificate dated 03.02.2014 issued by office of SDM, Sikar.

AND WHEREAS the Non Encumbrance Certificate (NEC) dates back to year 2014 and appellant ought to have submitted a latest copy of the NEC. Appeal Committee decided to remand back the case to NRC for giving the appellant another chance to submit latest NEC which shall be subjected to due verification. Also as the applicant has

applied for 4 year Integrated programme of B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed. due care shall be taken to ensure that the applicant institution fulfils condition laid down in para 1.1. of Appendix 13 of the Norms and Standards of the NCTE Regulations, 2014.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC for giving appellant another opportunity to submit latest Non Encumbrance Certificate and evidence of fulfilling requirement of para 1.1. of Appendix 13 of the Norms and Standards pertaining to 4 year Integrated programme i.e. B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Vinayak P.G. Degree College, Shivsinghpura, Nawalgarh Road, Sikar – 332001, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Sardar Patel Teacher Training College, Losal, Dantaramgarh, Rajasthan dated 24.05.2017 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP201615187/B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. – 4 Year Integrated/RJ/2017-18/2 dated 11/04/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on the grounds that "i) Society bye-laws not submitted. ii) Submitted affiliation order is not readable. iii) The institution has not submitted the certified registered land documents issued by the Registering Authority or civil authority concerned. iv) The institution has not submitted the Land Use Certificate issued by the Competent Authority to use the land for educational purpose. v) The institution has not submitted the Non-Encumbrance Certificate issued by the Competent Authority indicating that the land is free from all encumbrances. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Vinod Kumar Lamba, L.D.C, Sardar Patel Teacher Training College, Losal, Dantaramgarh, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "NRC, NCTE issued a Show Cause Notice in which certain deficiencies were mentioned. That this institution has submitted reply of SCN through E-mail on 28.03.2017 along with all required documents and the same has been despatched to NRC, NCTE office. That this institution has again submitted the copy of reply letter along with required documents to NRC, NCTE on 18.04.2017. That NRC, NCTE has rejected the application of this institution vide letter No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201615187/BA.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed.-4Years Integrated/RJ/2017-2018/2 dated 11.04.2017. That this institution has already submitted society registration certificate and bye laws with hard copy of application. Copy of registration certificate and bye laws are again submitted. That affiliation order for U.G.

and P.G. courses for session 2015-16 has already been submitted along with reply of SCN to NRC, NCTE. Now affiliation order for 2015-16 and 2016-17 is annexed. That certificate copy of registration land documents has already submitted along with application. Now certified copy of Registered Land Documents are annexed. That the Land Use Certificate for educational purpose has been submitted along with reply letter. That the copy of Non-Encumbrance certificate has been submitted along with reply letter. Now the Non-Encumbrance certificate is annexed. It is prayed that the rejection order issued by NRC, NCTE be set aside."

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that none of three hard copies of application submitted by applicant contains copy of land documents. The Registration Certificate of the society are found to be enclosed with the application. Appeal Committee further noticed from the application form that appellant institution is already recognised for conducting 4 year Integrated B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed. programme with an intake of 200 seats since 17.05.2016 and the present application is for a proposed additional intake of 50 seats.

AND WHEREAS the appellant in the reply to the decision of NRC taken in its 265th Meeting to issue a Show Cause Notice, has submitted replies dated 28.03.2017 and 18.04.2017. The second reply dated 18.04.2017 which was of course after the issue of impugned order 11.04.2017 contains copies of certified land document, Land Use Certificate, Non Encumbrance Certificate and approved building plan.


AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee further noted that affiliating University has issued NOC dated 17.05.2016 for 4 year Integrated Course B.A. B.Ed. /B.Sc. B.Ed. only to the existing Colleges as a matter of policy adopted by the state government. NRC Jaipur should have examined the case in view of the policy of the state and also keeping in view the fact that 4 units (200 seats) of the BA B.Ed./B.Sc B.Ed programme have already been recognised for the appellant institution.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee finally decided to remand back the case to NRC for revisiting the case in light of the facts that NOC for the programme was issued by affiliating body as per policy of the State Government of Rajasthan and the appellant

institution is already recognised for conducting 4 units (200 seats) of the programme since 17.5.2016.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC for revisiting the case in light of the facts that NOC for the programme was issued by affiliating body as per policy of the State Government of Rajasthan and the appellant institution is already recognised for conducting 4 units (200 seats) of the programme since 17.5.2016.

NOW THEREFORE; the Council hereby remands back the case of **Sardar Patel Teacher Training College, Losal Dhod Road, Losal, Dantaramgarh – 332025, Rajasthan** to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of S.G.R. Mahavidyalaya, Yaduvansh Nagar, Talgram, Uttar Pradesh dated 31.5.2017 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/UP-3219/266th (Part-4) Meeting/2017/171215 dated 13/04/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, withdrawing recognition for conducting B.Ed. course on the grounds that "letter from the District Magistrate, Kannauj dated 28.09.2016 reveals that the CLU No. 578 dated 02.06.2005 submitted by the institution is fake. The Committee, therefore, decided to withdraw the recognition of the institution for B.Ed. course under Section – 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993 for the next academic session."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Ajay Pal Singh, Chairman, S.G.R. Mahavidyalaya, Yaduvansh Nagar, Talgram, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "The Letter no 578 dated 02.06.2005 stated to be CLU is not a CLU and it has never been claimed to be. We had applied Seeking recognition of B.Ed. Course to the NRC NCTE Jaipur on 24.10.2008 The application was rejected on the following grounds (i) Resolution of Panchayat regarding approving of building plan not submitted (ii) CLU not submitted Consequently, we had approached to the Appeal Committee vide Appeal dated 18.08.2009 at that point of time. The appeal committee was shown the CLU issued by UP Sanchalak Chakbandi Kannauj on 15.05.2009. There after the appeal committee justifying the validity of the CLU dated 15.05.2009 remanded the case to NRC vide order dated 08.10.2009. In the appeal order the CLU was categorically discussed and accepted. A copy of the same is again enclosed which is a verifiable fact. The Letter No. 578 dated 02.06.2005 was got issued by an employee working with us through his relative (who was working) in ADM Office at that point of time. When we realized that the employee has cheated us in the form of taking money and arranging fraud document we have sacked him. Infact the Letter no 578 dated 02.06.2005 was not meant for B.Ed course at all, but due to my sickness the same was attached with file submitted to the NRC NCTE Jaipur which consequently resulted into rejection of our application and could be reconsidered only after the issuance of CLU dated 15.05.2009 submitted to the Appeal Committee. It is important to mention here that after remanding our case to NRC an inspection was carried out and at that time also our file was rejected due to certain deficiencies including the one on CLU. We had appealed at that point of

time also at the second time. The Appeal Committee again having observed the CLU is genuine document, remanded to the NRC-NCTE Jaipur and thereafter due consideration of the said CLU recognition was granted. Therefore, the reason/ ground of withdrawal of recognition is neither based on fact nor justified as the CLU is not the document stated in the Complaint letter nor recognition was granted on the basis of the so-called CLU dated 02.06.2005. The above explanation may please be considered and recognition be restored which is the demand of the justice."

AND WHEREAS Clause 7(3) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 reads as follows:

"Furnishing any false information or concealment of facts in the application which may have a bearing on the decision making process or the decision pertaining to grant of recognition, shall result in refusal of recognition of the institution beside other legal action against its management".

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that impugned order of withdrawal dated 13.4.2017 was issued after giving the appellant due opportunity to submit a written representation on the grounds on which it was proposed to withdraw recognition. Appellant institution submitted its reply dated 20.3.2017. Appeal Committee further noted that whereas appellant has admitted submitting to NRC a letter no. 578 dated 2.6.2005 purported to have been issued by the office of D.M. Kannauj as a change of land use certificate, the appellant has also stated that the letter was obtained by an ex-employee of the institution through one of his relatives. The letter dated 2.6.2005 was admitted to be a forged document but it was not reckoned to be a valid document for grant of recognition as the appellant had subsequently submitted another CLU dated 15.5.2009 issued by Dy. Director, Chakbandi, Kannauj. Appeal Committee noted that the appellant did not derive any benefit on account of a bogus CLU dated 2.6.2005 and has admitted its mistake.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee further noted that recognition for B.Ed. programme was granted to appellant institution vide its order dated 18.2.2011 and the above order also makes a mention in para 2 and 6 thereof that appellant institution has not submitted the change of land use certificate initially. The CLU dated 20.6.2005 which was subsequently alleged to be bogus and was also accepted by the appellant to be bogus was submitted by appellant institution alongwith application dated 12.11.2008 by the appellant seeking recognition. Had this CLU dated 2.6.2005 been accepted by the NRC, recognition would not have been refused on this ground by an order of NRC dated 25.7.2009. Appeal Committee further noted that after the case was remanded vide NCTE order dated 8.10.2009, inspection of the institution was conducted on


9.2.2010 and copies of documents enclosed with the inspection report include the CLU dated 15.5.2009 which is found to be valid document relied on for the purpose of grant of recognition.

AND WHEREAS there is no doubt that there was a misconduct on part of the appellant institution, but it is still felt that the disputed document was not made use of for grant of recognition and appellant has apologised for the lapse on its part. The institution was recognised for conducting B.Ed. programme in February, 2011 and the penalty to withdraw recognition by issue of impugned refusal order 13.4.2017 is not proportionate to the admitted misconduct moreso when the alleged document was not made use of for granting recognition.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee, therefore, decided to reverse the impugned withdrawal order dated 13.4.2017.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the Memoranda of Appeal, affidavit, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the hearing, Appeal Committee concluded to reverse the impugned refusal order dated 13.4.2017.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby reverse the case of S.G.R. Mahavidyalaya, Yaduvansh Nagar, Talgram, Talgram Road, Talgram – 209731, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Smt. Kasturi Dwivedi Adarsh Shiksha Mahavidyalaya, Jalaun, U.P. dated 22.05.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201615415/Bachelor of Elementary Education [B.El.Ed.]/UP/2017-18/2 dated 28/03/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.El.Ed. course on the grounds that "The applicant institution has not submitted the reply of the SCN within the stipulated time. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 2003. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Dr. S.B. Dwivedi, Principal, Smt. Kasturi Dwivedi Adarsh Shiksha Mahavidyalaya, Jalaun, U.P. presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that Show Cause Notice was not received by post. Of late we came to know that NRC is now corresponding online and by that time it was already late to have submitted reply to SCN facts are now explained in the appeal."

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that impugned refusal order dated 28.03.2017 is some what contradictory so far it says that reply to SCN dated 28.03.2017 was considered and then it says that applicant institution has not submitted the reply of the SCN within the stipulated time.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee further noted that SCN dated 30.01.2017 was on three grounds namely:

- i) Copy of recognition order of B.Ed. course not submitted.
- ii) Copy of affiliation letter for B.A., B.Sc., B.Com not submitted.
- iii) Name of the course not mentioned on building plan.

AND WHEREAS Appellant submitted copies of all three documents at the time of appeal hearing on 25.08.2017. Appeal Committee is of the view that approval of building plan is a one time event unless there is some additional construction added to it. Wherever an existing institution seeks recognition for an additional course, it is more logical if the institution is asked to establish adequacy of built up area and earmarking of built up area for the proposed course rather than asking it to get the name of programme on the already approved building plan.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee decided to remand back the case to NRC for revisiting the matter after the appellant institute submits to it copies of required documents. Appellant is required to submit to NRC copies of recognition order for B.Ed, affiliation letter for B.A. B.Sc., B.Com and approval building plan within 15 days of the issue of appeal orders.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the Memoranda of Appeal, affidavit, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the hearing, Appeal Committee concluded to remand back the matter to NRC for revisiting the case. Appellant institution is required to submit to NRC within 15 days of the issue of Appeal order copies of i) Recognition order for B.Ed., ii) affiliation letter for B.A., B.Sc, B.Com and iii) Copy of approved building plan.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Smt. Kasturi Dwivedi Adarsh Shiksha Mahavidyalaya, Paharpura, Jalaun Road, Jalaun – 285123, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Bhagwant Singh Mahavidyalaya, Thakurdwara, Uttar Pradesh dated 30.05.2017 is against the Minutes recorded against serial no. 162 of 267th Meeting of NRC held from 5th to 7th April, 2017 deciding to refuse recognition for conducting B.El.Ed. course on the grounds that "The applicant institution has not submitted the reply of the SCN issued by the NRC on 02.03.2017 within the stipulated time. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Balram Singh, President, Bhagwant Singh Mahavidyalaya, Thakurdwara, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "The above statement of NRC is not correct as the reply to the Show Cause Notice was submitted to NRC vide our letter dated 10th March 2017 copy attached through Courier. For the perusal of Appellate Authority, the parawise reply to the points of Show Cause Notice are narrated below ours institution is a recognised institution running B.Ed. since 2004. The copy of recognition order No. 5104 dated 05th August 2004 issued by NRC, Jaipur is attached. The copy of permanent affiliation issued by the MJP Rohilkahnd University is attached. The certified copy of registered land documents was submitted to NRC, however, the same is also attached with the appeal for perusal of Appellate Authority. The building plan duly mentioning the proposed course was submitted, however, the same is submitted before the Appellate Authority.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that appellant institution submitted online application dated 31.05.2016 seeking recognition for one unit of B.El.Ed. programme. Appeal Committee noted that a Show Cause Notice (SCN) dated 02.03.2017 was issued to appellant on following grounds :

- i) Copies of recognition order for B.Ed. and affiliation order for B.Sc. course not submitted.
- ii) Certified copy of land documents were not submitted.


- iii) Latest Non Encumbrance Certificate for Khasra No. 297, 299 & 300 not submitted.
- iv) Name of proposed course is not mentioned in the Building Plan.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that to SCN was required to be submitted within 21 days. The decision to refuse recognition was taken by NRC in its meeting held from 5th to 7th April, 2017 on the ground that reply to SCN was not received. Committee noted further that appellant during the course of appeal presentation submitted the reply to SCN was sent to NRC vide its letter dated 11.03.2016 (By Courier). The track report and courier receipt were also found submitted by the appellant. However, the above reply and enclosed documents are not found available on the regulatory file.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted from the aforesaid reply that appellant had enclosed copies of required documents which more or less meet the requirement except that instead original certified copy of land document, zerox of certified copy of land document was enclosed. Appeal Committee decided to remand back the case to NRC for considering the reply dated 11.3.2017 a copy of which appellant should submit within 15 days of the issue of Appeal Orders.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the Memoranda of Appeal, affidavit, documents on records and oral arguments advanced during the hearing, Appeal Committee concluded to remand back the case to NRC for consideration of the reply dated 11.3.2017 a copy of which should be sent by the appellant to NRC within 15 days of the issue of appeal orders.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Bhagwant Singh Mahavidyalaya, 2167.95, Thakurdwara Seohara Road, Thakurdwara, – 244601, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Kishan Lal, President, Bhagwan Jambheshwar Mahavidyalaya, Dhorimana, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "required documents are now submitted with the Memoranda of Appeal".

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that appellant institution was issued a Show Cause Notice (SCN) dated 02.03.2017 for non submission of

- i) Bye laws of society
- ii) Affiliation order for B.A.
- iii) Certified copy of land documents
- iv) Non Encumbrance Certificate
- v) Approved building plan with details of infrastructure.


Written representation in reply to SCN dated 02.03.2017 was required to be submitted within 21 days from the date of receipt of SCN dated 02.03.2017. Appeal Committee noted that NRC in its 267th Meeting held on 05.04.2017 decided to refuse recognition on ground of non receipt of reply to SCN.

AND WHEREAS appellant during the course of appeal presentation submitted that copies of required documents were submitted with the Appeal Memoranda as sufficient time was not given to appellant institution to submit a reply to SCN. Original of land documents were also presented before Appeal Committee for perusal. Appeal Committee however, noted that certified copy of land documents were not submitted alongwith Appeal Memoranda.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee having noted that appellant institution is already conducting degree level course in the institution, decided to remand back the case to NRC for further processing of the case. The appellant institution is required to submit a complete and comprehensive reply of Show cause notice enclosing therewith copy of all required documents including original certified copy of the land documents.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the Memoranda of Appeal, affidavit, documents on records and oral arguments advanced during the hearing, Appeal Committee concluded to remand back the case to NRC for further processing of the case. The appellant institution is required to submit a complete and comprehensive reply of Show cause notice enclosing therewith copy of all required documents including original certified copy of the land documents.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Bhagwan Jambheshwar Mahavidyalaya, Dhorimana – 344704, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Indian Institute of Education, Naul, Shyampur, West Bengal dated 25.05.2017 is against the Order No. ER/7-208.8.12/ERCAPP3235/(D.El.Ed.)/2016/44868 dated 22/03/2016 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.El.Ed. course on the grounds that "(i) The land documents (Registered land deed) is in the name of S.K. Golam Ehiya i.e. in the name of individual which is not acceptable as per NCTE Regulation 2014. In view the above, the committee decided as under: The committee is of the opinion that application bearing code No. ERCAPP3237 of the institution regarding recognition for B.Ed. is refused under section 14(3)(b) of NCTE Act, 1993."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Rafik Ali Khan, Representative and Sh. S.K. Golam Ehiya, Secretary, Indian Institute of Education, Naul, Shyampur, West Bengal presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "The applicant Trust, submitted its online application for grant of recognition for the academic session 2016-17 on 30/05/2015 for D.El.Ed. programme (ERCAPP3235) with an annual intake for 50 (one basic unit) and for B.Ed. programme (ERCAPP3237) with annual intake of 100 (two basic units) as a composite institute in the name of "Indian Institute of Education" under "Ankur Educational and Welfare Trust". Relevant documents and an application fee of Rs. 3,00,000/- (Rs. 1, 50,000/- each programme) by local courier. The application trust obtained NOC from West Bengal Board of Primary Education and the University of Calcutta in the name of the Institution" besides, all other relevant documents including building plan in favour of the institution/trust. The applicant trust, in its reply dated 11/02/2016 against show cause notice vide proceedings of 202nd Meeting held on 18th-23rd January 2016 by ERC, NCTE, Bhubaneswar, submitted in its written submission alongwith relevant documents with a prayer of consideration for both the applications, which was unfortunately not considered by ERC, NCTE. The applicant trust, at the time of submitting online application was in possession of 3723.08 sq. mts. (92.734 decimal) of Land and 3553.75 sq. mts. of Built-up area in the name of the institute "Indian Institute of Education" which satisfied the norms for composite institution as per NCTE Regulation, 2014. The applicant Trust, before its online application, having all significant documents (Land Position Certificate, Land Mutation Certificate, Non-Encumbrance

Certificate, etc. issued by concerned BL & LRO, Govt. of West Bengal) in the name of the "Indian Institute of Education" to establish its land position/ownership in favour of the institution. Hence such a point can't be ground of rejection. The applicant Trust found an order passed by Hon'ble Appeal Committee vide F.No. 89-168/2016 Appeal/7th Meeting-2016, dated 04/07/2016 filed by one Dr. Grahams Homes, Kalimpong, Darjeeling, West Bengal, wherein the case was remanded back to ERC, NCTE with undermentioned observation/facts/ground: "...Committee further noted the submission made by the appellant stating that land was allotted to the founder member of the society during early years of last century. The appellant institution has furnished copy of land title certificate issued by paying fee to District Sub-Registrar, Darjeeling, Certificates issued by Dist. Land & Land Reforms officer and Non-Encumbrance Certificate issued by Block Land and Land Reforms Officer, Kalimpong also support the fact that land is recorded in the name of Kalimpong also support the fact that land is recorded in the name of Dr. Graham's Homes Board of Management. Appeal Committee is of the opinion that registered land documents does not necessarily mean copy of sale deed of land documents registered in the office of Registrar/Sub-Registrar. Legal ownership and possession of land can also be through land allotment or some other certificates issued by competent authority....". ERC, NCTE without consideration of the facts and documents including affidavit/undertaking rejected both the applications of D.El.Ed. (ERCAPP3235) Programme vide order No. ER/7-208.8.12/ERCAPP3235/(D.El.Ed.)/2016/44868, dated 22/03/2016 and B.Ed. (ERCAPP3237) Programme vide order No. ER/7-208.8.11/ERCAPP3237/(B.Ed.)/2016/44862, dated 22/03/2016 applied for the academic session 2016-17 with liberty to file an appeal to the Applicant Institution as per NCTE Act, 1993. ERC, NCTE, after passing of 9 month 10 days (approx.) from the receipt of the hard copies of the online application (12/06/2015) to issuance of rejection order/(s) (22/03/2016) ultimately refused both the applications for D.El.Ed. (ERCAPP3235) Programme and B.Ed. (ERCAPP3237) Programme. The applicant trust submitted the facts that NCTE issued public notice dated 9th March 2016 inviting online application for the academic session 2017-18, however it was also noted on the NCTE Public Notice that "In case of Tamil Nadu and West Bengal the decision about restriction on the TE courses shall be taken on receipt of the input of the respective State Govt." it is to be observed that the Government of West Bengal did not provide any recommendation to NCTE regarding ban for the academic session 2017-18. Hence, the applicant Trust/Institute has lost the opportunity to file a fresh application for the academic session 2017-18. The applicant Trust also submitted the facts that NCTE issued public notice deciding not to invite/accept applications for the academic session 2018-19 for grant of teacher training institutions/programmes, published in the NCTE website <http://ncte-india.org>. Thus, the Applicant Trust/Institute has lost all the opportunity to file a fresh application for the academic session 2018-19. The applicant trust affirms that "Indian Institute of Education"

has diligently portrayed its true position of the land and building on the aforementioned address. Hence the applicant trust submitted its prayer for condoning the delay and allows/reconsiders the Appeal Application. The applicant trust found proceedings from internet (NCTE website), where the Hon'ble Appeal Committee considered many cases and reverted back the matter to the ERC, NCTE for reconsideration, analogous to the Applicant Trust/Institution. The Applicant Trust/Institute had no other alternative but to file an Appeal under Section 18 of the NCTE Act 1993, with clean hand before the Hon'ble Appeal Committee to save the future of the institute. The applicant trust/institute thus seeks for reconsideration of the case with the provision for remanding back to the ERC, NCTE for further processing of the applications."

AND WHEREAS Appellant requested for condoning the delay in preferring appeal as secretary of the institution was seriously ill during the period. Appeal Committee decided to condone the delay and take up the appeal on its merits.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that rejection order is only on the ground that 'Land documents are in the name of SK Golam Ehiya i.e. in the name of individual which is not acceptable.' Appeal Committee noted that the name of Sh. Golam Ehiya is mentioned as Secretary of the Indian Institute of Education in all the sale deed documents including the Memo of consideration. To support the possession and ownership of land by the 'Indian Institute of Education', the applicant had furnished following documents:


- i) Non Encumbrance Certificate dated 13.11.2013 issued by Block Land and Land Reforms Officer, Howrah.
- ii) Change of Land Use Certificate dated 29.10.2013 issued by office of Sub Divisional Land and Land Reforms Officer, Uluberia, Howrah.
- iii) Land Possession Certificate dated 28.05.2015 issued by Block Land and Land Reforms Officer, Shymapur-II, Howrah.
- iv) Building Plan in the name of India Institute of Education approved on 22.05.2015 by Nirman Sahayak, Nakole Gram Panchayat.

Building Completion Certificate dated 19.01.2016 issued by Asstt. Enginner, Howrah Zila Parishad.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee after going through the details of case does not have any iota of doubt about the ownership of land which rests with the 'Indian Institute of Education'. Appeal Committee, therefore, decided to set aside the impugned refusal order dated 22.3.2016 and remand back the case to ERC, Bhubaneshwar for further processing of the case.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to ERC for further processing of the case.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Indian Institute of Education, Naul, Shyampur – 711312, West Bengal to the ERC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Sorabh College of Physical Teacher Training, Kheda, Hindauncity, Rajasthan. dated 31.05.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP.201616453/B.P.Ed./RJ/2017-2018/2 dated 11.02.2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.P.Ed. course on the grounds that "The institution has not submitted any proof / evidence to prove that it is a composite institution as per clause 2(b) of NCTE Regulations, 2014. A major portion of the land in the possession of the applicant institution was not in the name of the society / institution at the time of the submission of the application for the proposed course. ? Non-Encumbrance Certificate is not related to the concerned land. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition / permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Surendra Sharma and Sh. Vishnu Sharma, Representatives, Sorabh College of Physical Teacher Training, Kheda, Hindauncity, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 25/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that Appellant had applied for grant of recognition of B.P.Ed. course vide its application dated 29.06.2016 while making necessary arrangements with regard to physical infrastructure and facilities. In the reply of Show Cause Notice, appellant had submitted relevant documents which would clearly show that the observations made by NRC in its 262nd Meeting had been removed by appellant. So far as observation with regard to proof / evidence of "composite institution" under clause 2(b) of NCTE Regulations, 2014 is concerned, it is stated that appellant is already running M.Ed., B.Ed. and STC courses and thus it is running multiple Teacher Training courses and it satisfies the eligibility of being a composite institution. Appellant had submitted Non-Encumbrance Certificate pertaining to land of institution which is/was issued by the competent authority. Thus, a wholly non-existent ground has been taken

by NRC while rejecting the application. A wholly invalid and unwarranted ground of refusal with regard to land in possession of institution being in name of society / institution has been taken. It is stated that the aforesaid ground was never mentioned in the show cause notice and nor was any opportunity of hearing given to appellant previously. Thus, the decision taken by NRC in its 263rd Meeting with regard to aforesaid ground clearly violates principles of natural justice as no opportunity of hearing was given to appellant on this very aspect. Therefore, same is liable to be quashed and set aside. Because appellant had submitted a representation dated 04.05.2017 to NRC for considering case objectively but same has not been considered by NRC. A copy of representation dated 04.05.2017 is enclosed. Appellant prays indulgence of appellate body to produce relevant documents and pronouncements during the course of arguments. Because various other institutions were exactly placed like appellant had been granted recognition. Because other appropriate ground and submissions would be made by appellant after seeking prior permission from the learned appellate authority."

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that appellant institution in its online application dated 29.06.2016 applied for seeking recognition for conducting B.P.Ed. programme. As per details filed in the application form, the appellant institution was proposed to be located at Survey No. 951, 953/2 village Kheda, District Karavli, Rajasthan. The land area was mentioned as 32500 Sq. Meters.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that NRC in its 262nd Meeting (Part 9) dated 24.01.2017 decided to issue a Show Cause Notice (SCN) to appellant institution for non submission of following documents and a few deficiencies such as :

Non submission of :

- i) Renewed society Registration Certificate.
- ii) Evidence to prove that it is a composite Inst.
- iii) Certified copy of Land documents
- iv) Name of courses being run on khasra no. 951 and 953/2
- v) Non Encumbrance Certificate
- vi) Approved building plan with all infrastructural details.

Further in the minutes of NRC Meeting it was pointed out that land at Khasra no. 951 measured 4700 Sq. Meters and at Khasra No. 953/2, 2700 Sq. Meters total land was not adequate for proposed course and also did not tally with the land area declared in the affidavit and application form.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee further noted that appellant institution had submitted a reply dated 20.02.2017 on the points of deficiencies mentioned in the 262nd Meeting of NRC. Appellant enclosed copies of certified land documents with this reply as follows:

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee further noted that appellant institution also submitted copy of a building plan approved by Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat at Kheda, Jamalpur, Hindon City, Rajasthan. This building plan mentions only two khasra number i.e. 951 and 953/2, Karavli Road, Kheda. Online application also has only these Khasra numbers on record. Appeal Committee is of the view that land located at other khasra number which were not mentioned in the application and also the land purchased by the appellant society after submission of the online application have no relevance. Clause 8(4) of the NCTE Regulations says that 'No institution shall be granted recognition unless the institutions or society sponsoring the institution is in possession of required land on the date of application.' Obviously the ownership of land is required to be checked with

reference to the identification of land given in the application form. Para 6.2 of Norms and standards (Appendix 7) for B.P.Ed. Degree programme require thus an institution must have 5-8 acres of land and Physical education' course are not to be run with other teacher education courses.

AND WHEREAS considering that appellant institution did not have adequate land on Khasra no. 951 and 953/2, as on the date of application, Appeal Committee decided to confirm the impugned refusal order dated 11.02.2017 issued by NRC Jaipur.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the Memoranda of Appeal affidavit, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the hearing, Appeal Committee concluded to confirm the impugned order dated 11.02.2017.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.




AND WHEREAS Sh. A. Kumar Chaudhary, Director, Bhavnath Chaudhary College of Education, Maganpur, Durgapur (Diwanganj) P.O. – Koora, Pindrajora, Chas, Jharkhand presented the case of the appellant institution on 26/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "they had applied to Director Primary Education Department of Human Resource Development of Jharkhand Government to issue no objection certificate for opening D.El.Ed. course vide their letter dated 18.05.2016. It was mentioned that the last date of online application to NCTE is 31.05.2016. Though they had applied for NOC to the Jharkhand Government well in advance but the NOC was issued by them vide letter 09.08.2016. So, this is not fault from their side. The delay in issuance of NOC is not attributable to them which was beyond their control. It has come to their knowledge that institutions having submitted

their NOC even after they have got the opportunity for Visiting Team. Therefore, it is their submission that they should also get a chance on the same ground. As per NCTE Regulations 2014, it has been mentioned that those organizations who conduct B.Ed course can conduct D.El.Ed course which is the mandatory requirement. Their Institution has the required infrastructure to conduct the two composite courses."

AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that according to the provisions of Clause 5(3) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 a No Objection Certificate (NOC) issued by the concerned affiliating body shall be submitted along with the copy of the on-line application. Since, the appellant institution obtained the NOC only on 9.8.2016 i.e. after the last date of 15.7.2016 for submission of hard copies of the on-line application, the Committee concluded that the ERC was justified in refusing recognition and therefore, the appeal deserved to be rejected and the order of the ERC confirmed.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, the documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the ERC was justified in refusing recognition and therefore, the appeal deserved to be rejected and the order of the ERC is confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.



AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC with a direction to re-issue their show cause notice dt. 21.1.2017 which appears to have been sent by e-mail to the appellant by registered/speed post, to enable him to send a reply in respect of all the points mentioned therein, and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Shri Krishan Co-Education College, Harsoli, Mundawar Road, Kotkasim – 301403, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.



In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "the Appellant had already applied for two Units vide Letter Dated 23 02 2017 and thereafter vide Letter Dated 15 03 2017. The Appellant had also applied to the Member Secretary, Delhi Vide Letter Dated 03 04 2017. Ignoring the same the NCTE vide order dated 24 04 2017 has given recognition to one unit only which was not actually prayed for. Since academic session 2017-18 has ended, therefore, recognition for two units for academic session 2018-19 should be awarded. It should be noted that all facilities of infrastructural and instructional facilities, Library, accommodation, financial, resources, laboratory, etc. for two units i.e for 100 students is already made out. The V.T. has already recommended for 100 seats."


AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that the appellant, in the affidavit enclosed to their on-line application dated 10.01.2011 for grant of recognition for D.El.Ed. course, has requested an intake of 50 seats. The Visiting Team that inspected the appellant institution on 18.02.2017, while observing that some of the facilities are not available but the management is ready to fulfil after getting permission letter from the NCTE, suggested that NCTE should consider the proposal positively. The Visiting Team did not make any recommendation about the intake. Thereafter, the WRC issued the Letter of Intent on 27.02.2017 for an annual intake of 50 students (one basic unit). On receipt of a reply dt. 02.03.2017 to the Letter of Intent from

the appellant, the WRC, in their 272nd meeting held on April 6-8, 2017, noting that the institution has submitted a list of one HOD and seven faculty members, decided to grant recognition for one unit of D.El.Ed. In these circumstances, the Committee concluded that the WRC was justified in granting recognition for one unit of D.El.Ed. with an intake of 50 students and therefore, the appeal deserved to be rejected and the order of the WRC confirmed.

AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that the appellant, with their reply to the Letter of Intent enclosed minutes of the Section Committee for the teaching staff, in which the Principal of Institute of Advanced Study in Education, Bhopal was a representative of the SCERT. The Committee also noted that the same representative has signed the statement of staff profile. There is no formal approval of the concerned affiliating body to the faculty recommended by the Selection Committee. In these circumstances, the Committee concluded that the WRC should immediately obtain from the appellant, the approval of the selected faculty from the concerned affiliating body, which is a requirement as per the provisions of Clause 7(13) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the WRC was justified in granting recognition for one unit of D.El.Ed. with an intake of 50 students and therefore, the appeal deserved to be rejected and the order of the WRC confirmed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby confirms the Order appealed against.

WHEREAS the appeal of Amman T.T. College, Dholakhera, Udaipurwati, Rajasthan dated 01.06.2017 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP-12836/265th Meeting/2017/170312 dated 04/04/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on the grounds that "the institution was given show cause notice dated 15/09/2016. Reply of the institution dated 25/10/2016 was considered in the meeting and following deficiencies are found:- As per CLU total converted land is only 2500 sq. mts. which is not sufficient for the existing B.Ed. (2 units) and proposed B.A. B.Ed. / B.Sc. B.Ed. course. Total land area and name of proposed course is not mentioned in the building plan. Khasra No. in NEC is not matching with Khasra No. in application as well as land documents."


AND WHEREAS Sh. Vidhya Dhar Singh, President, Amman T.T. College, Dholakhera, Udaipurwati, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 26/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation and in a letter dt. 25.08.2017, it was submitted that there are two conversion orders- order no 25/2007 khasara no. 986/604 Rakba for 2500 sq. Mtr. and order no 25/2007 khasara no. 986/604 Rakba 2500 sq. Mtr. Total converted Land Area is 5000 sq. Mtr. Copy submitted. In the new building plan, course name has been added and total Land area is shown. In the application form the khasara no. is 986/604 and now in NEC also the khasara no. is 986/604. The appellant submitted copies of the conversion order, blue print of the building plan and NEC.

AND WHEREAS the Committee, noting the conversion orders, blue print of building plan and the NEC submitted by the appellant, concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the NRC with a direction to take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward the documents submitted in the appeal to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of orders on the appeal.

AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that while the on-line application is dated 30.05.2015, the appellant submitted on 15.03.2016 the No Objection Certificate (NOC) issued by Pandit Deendayal Upadhaya Shekawati University, Sikar on 14.03.2016. According to the provisions of clause 5(3) of the NCTE Regulations, 2014, a No-Objection Certificate (NOC) issued by the concerned affiliating body shall be submitted along with the print out of the on-line application. The Council, for the academic year 2016-17, extended the last date of submission of hard copies of the applications, along with the NOC upto 15.07.2015. NRC, while taking further action as suggested in para 3 above, should take into account the fact that the appellant did not submit the NOC in time as per the NCTE Regulations.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC with a direction to take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward the documents submitted in the appeal to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of orders on the appeal. While taking further action suggested in para 3 above, the NRC should take into account the observations contained in para 4 above.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Amman T.T. College, Dholakhara, S.H.-37, Udaipurwati – 333307, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of J.B. Shah Girls (P.G.) College, Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan dated 01.07.2017 is against the Order No. NCTE/NRC/NRCAPP201615406/B.A. B.Ed./ B.Sc. B.Ed.-4 year integrated/RJ/2017-2018/2 dated 18.04.2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on the grounds that "the institution has not submitted the certified registered land documents issued by the Registering Authority or civil authority concerned. The institution has not submitted the approved building plan signed by the Competent Govt. Authority indicating the name of the course, name of the institution, Khasra No./Plot No., total land area, total built-up area and the measurements of the Multi-purpose hall as well as the other infrastructural facilities such as class rooms etc. The institution has not submitted the Non-Encumbrance Certificate issued by the Competent Authority indicating that the land is free from all encumbrances. Hence, the Committee decided that the application is rejected and recognition/permission is refused u/s 14/15 (3)(b) of the NCTE Act, 1993. FDRs, if any, be returned to the institution."


AND WHEREAS Sh. Mukesh Krishnia, Lecturer and Sh. Anil Mishra, Staff, J.B. Shah Girls (P.G.) College, Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan presented the case of the appellant institution on 26/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "this college is running U.G. & P.G. courses since 1982. This institution has applied for grant of recognition for B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course online on 30.05.2016 and the hard copy of application was submitted to NRC, NCTE on 10.06.2016. The NRC, NCTE has issued a show cause notice indicating certain deficiencies on 03.03.2017. This institution has submitted a reply of SCN along with all required documents to NRC, NCTE on 17.03.2017. The NRC, NCTE has rejected the application of this institution without considering the documents submitted by this institution. 36700 sqm. of Land of khasra No. 4381/1543 and 4382/1544 situated in village Jhunjhunu is in the name of "Shri Madan Lal Shah Education Society, Jhunjhunu." For proof of ownership of land in the name of Society, following documents are annexed:- (i) Copy of lease of land for 99 years issued by Distt. Collector, Jhunjhunu (Raj.) and duly registered in the office of Sub-Registrar, Jhunjhunu (Raj.). (ii) Copy of allotment letter and letter for

extension of period of Lease deed issued by Distt. Collector, Jhunjhunu (Raj.). (iii) Copy of Zamabandi (Khatauni) issued by Revenue Deptt., Govt. of Rajasthan. (iv) Copy of approved building map from Nagar Parishad, Jhunjhunu (Raj.) and (v) copy of Non-Encumbrance Certificate issued by Tehsildar, Jhunjhunu. Thus NRC, NCTE has rejected the application of this institute for grant of recognition of B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course on arbitrary, and unjustified basis. Therefore, it is prayed that the rejection order issued by NRC, NCTE be set aside and directions be issued to NRC, NCTE for further process of application of this institute for grant of recognition of B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course. In the course of personal presentation, the appellant submitted a copy of the land documents certified by the Dy. Registrar, Jhunjhunu and a NEC dt. 2.5.2017 issued by the Tahsildar, Jhunjhunu.

AND WHEREAS the Committee, noting that the appellant has submitted the relevant documents mentioned in the order dt. 18.4.2017, concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the NRC with a direction to consider the documents to be submitted to them by the appellant and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward all the documents submitted in the appeal to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of the orders on the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC with a direction to consider the documents to be submitted to them by the appellant and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward all the documents submitted in the appeal to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of the orders on the appeal.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of J.B. Shah Girls (P.G.) College, Jhunjhunu – 333001, Rajasthan to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

WHEREAS the appeal of Tirhut College of Physical Education, Jhaphan, Bochahan, Bihar dated 02.06.2017 is against the Order No. ERC/233.7.1/APP2362/D.P.Ed./2017/52283 dated 13/04/2017 of the Eastern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.P.Ed. course on the grounds that "(a) Show Cause Notice was issued on 01.03.2016 on the following grounds: (i) As per VT Report, built-up area is only 2150 sq. mts. which is less than requirement for B.P.Ed. + D.P.Ed. as per NCTE Regulations. (b) In reply to SCN, the institution submitted its reply vide letter dated 02.12.2016 received in ERC, NCTE on 09/12/2016. The ERC considered the reply of the institution and observed that the institution is still deficient on the following grounds:- (i) As per VT Report, the total built-up area was only 2150 sq. mts. (ii) Now, the institution submitted photocopy of building plan of existing hostel building (Block-C) mentioning total built-up area 1368.26 sq. mts. out of which Ground floor having 684.13 sq. mts. built-up area which was constructed after the inspection and the same is not accepted by the Committee. (iii) As per NCTE Regulation 2014, there is no provision for re-inspection of the institution. In view the above, the Committee decided as under: The Committee is of the opinion that application bearing code No. ERCAPP2362 of the institution regarding permission of D.P.Ed. Programme is refused under section 15(3)(b) of NCTE Act 1993."

AND WHEREAS Sh. Manish Kumar, Jt. Secretary, Tirhut College of Physical Education, Jhaphan, Bochahan, Bihar presented the case of the appellant institution on 26/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation and in a letter dt. 24.08.2017, it was submitted that "The applicant institution is running B.P.Ed. course with the permission of ERC. As required under NCTE Regulations, 2014, with a view to make the institution composite, they applied for D.P.Ed. course. The building of the institute comprising of Block A, B and C sanctioned by the competent authority provides

for the total built up area of 4867.28 Sq. Mts. The competent authority, sanctioned the building plan in the year 2013 i.e. much prior to submission of application to ERC. The Competent Authority, which is Sub Divisional Officer issued the Building Completion Certificate dated 11.02.2014 in respect of total built up area of the building i.e. 52391 Sq. Ft. which is equivalent to 4867.28 Sq. Mts. Thus, the applicant has the built-up area of 4867.28 Sq. Mts. from 11.02.2014 itself. A copy of the sanctioned building plan and building completion certificate are attached. It is evident from the sanctioned building plan and building completion certificate, that the applicant has more than sufficient built up area much prior to even submission of application seeking recognition for D.P.Ed. course. Thus, the ERC was neither justified in issuing show cause notice nor justified in refusing recognition on the grounds mentioned in para 4 b of the refusal order dated 13.04.2017. Further, it is submitted that the applicant institution has all the necessary infrastructure for the sports i.e. 400 mts. standard track, football, hockey, volleyball, Kabaddi, Kho Kho, Basketball, badminton, table tennis, ground and equipment etc. Thus, the applicant institution has all the physical and academic infrastructure for running DP Ed. course. Thus, the Applicant is entitled for recognition for running D.P.Ed. course and the order dated 13.04.2017 of ERC deserves to be set aside."

AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that the Visiting Team, who were also supplied with a copy of the building completion certificate dt. 11.02.2014, to which a reference has been made in the appeal, in their report, recorded that after physical measurement, the total built up area was 2150 sq. mts. (Block 'A'-1150 sq. mts + Block 'B'-1000 sq. mts). The VT also suggested that the building plan and building completion certificate are required to be analysed by the ERC for taking necessary decision.


AND WHEREAS the Committee also noted that the appellant, in response to the decision taken by the ERC in the 206th meeting held on 26-27 February, 2016 to issue a show cause on the ground that the built up area of 2150 sq. mts reported by the VT is inadequate for B.P.Ed. and D.P.Ed. course as per NCTE Regulations, sent a letter dt. 29.02.2016 to the ERC. In this letter, the appellant submitted that the College decided to allocate ground floor with a built up area of 684.13 sq. mts of the proposed hostel of two floors, as no admitted students turned up for accommodation in the hostel. The appellant also submitted in this letter that building construction on full covered area of

1050 Sq. mts is in progress and it is expected to be completed with proper furnishing before 15th May, 2016. The appellant, in the appeal, is claiming that they have a total built-up area of 4867.28 sq. mts from 11.02.2014 itself i.e. the date of issue of building completion certificate.

AND WHEREAS the Committee, noted that there are apparent contradictions between the submissions made in the appellant letter dt. 29.02.2016 and the appeal dt. 02.06.2017 and the VT reported availability of only 2150 Sq. mts on physical measurement. In these circumstances, the Committee concluded that to get a clear and authentic picture about the availability of built up area for the existing B.P.Ed. and the proposed D.P.Ed. courses, the matter deserved to be remanded to the ERC with a direction to get the institution re-inspected on payment of the prescribed fee by the appellant, and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to ERC with a direction to get the institution re-inspected on payment of the prescribed fee by the appellant, and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Tirhut College of Physical Education, Jhaphan, Jhaphan Road, Bochahan – 842314, Bihar to the ERC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.



WHEREAS the appeal of Ram Tej Bhagauti Prasad Mahavidyalaya, Village – Dharsawan, Distt. – Bahraich, Uttar Pradesh dated 30.05.2017 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP-15526/266th Meeting (Part-3)/2017/170188 dated 03/04/2017 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.El.Ed. course on the grounds that “The SCN was issued on 23rd November 2016 followed by a letter on 12.12.2016 regarding not matching of land/plot number in Sale Deed with other documents i.e. Khatauni and LUC, submitted by the institution. The institution had not earmarked teacher education programme area on the building plan. The institution has not submitted its response within stipulated period on the above points so far. The reply dated 24.11.2016 submitted by the institution does not respond to the above queries.”

AND WHEREAS Sh. Ram Sunder Pandey, Founder, Ram Tej Bhagauti Prasad Mahavidyalaya, Village – Dharsawan, Distt. – Bahraich, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 26/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that “the SCN was not received by the institution till today. Therefore, no reply SCN has been sent. It is impossible to reply SCN dated 12.12.2016 by the so-called reply letter dated 24.11.2016 mentioned in refusal order. The letter dated 24.11.2016 sent by the institution is related with the registration and bye-laws of the institution, which was sent during checking of file and giving oral direction/order by the section officer at NRC office Jaipur. The grounds mentioned in refusal order regarding not matching of land/plot number are due to chakbandi process in village Dharsawan. Gata No. 114 etc. of sale deed are old numbers before Chakbandi and Gata No. 1859, 1861/1862/2 of Khatauni are new number after Chakabandi process. The certificate of Chakbandi officer regarding this concern and the earmarked building plan is already attached in the file in process at NRC, Jaipur. These documents are also included with the memorandum of appeal.”


AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that the file of the NRC contains the minutes of their 260th meeting held from 21st to 23rd November, 2016, wherein the decision to issue a

show cause notice was taken. A show cause notice was actually issued on 2.12.2016. As mentioned by the appellant they sent a letter dt. 8.11.2017 (the correct date should be 8.11.2016) suo-moto with which papers relating to registration of their society and bye-laws were sent to the NRC and which was received on 24.11.2016. This letter is not a reply to any show cause notice.

AND WHEREAS the Committee also noted that the appellant with their appeal furnished replies and documents vis-à-vis the grounds of refusal. In these circumstances, the Committee concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the NRC with a direction to consider the replies to the grounds of refusal to be submitted to them by the appellant and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward all the documents submitted in the appeal to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of the orders on the appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC with a direction to consider the replies to the grounds of refusal to be submitted to them by the appellant and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward all the documents submitted in the appeal to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of the orders on the appeal.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Ram Tej Bhagauti Prasad Mahavidyalaya, Plot No. 1859, 1861, 186 Kha, Village – Dharsawan, Distt. – Bahraich, Uttar Pradesh – 271835 to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.



This institution has submitted additional reply of SCN to NRC, NCTE on 03.04.2017 along with ownership certificate issued by Nagar Palika, Surajgarh Distt. – Jhunjhunu (Raj.). copy of reply letter is annexed. The NRC, NCTE has rejected the application of this institution without considering the documents submitted by this

institution vide letter dated 11.04.2017. 29294.15 sqm. Land of khasra No. 835, 1383/835 and 836 situated in village Surajgarh is in the name of "Ganpatrai Ram Kishan Barasia Charitable Trust, Mumbai" for proof of ownership of land in the name of trust, following documents are annexed:- Copy of lease deed for 99 years issued by Nagar Palika, Surajgarh and duly registered in the office of sub-registrar, Surajgarh, Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan; Copy of certificate issued by Nagar Palika, Surajgarh, Jhunjhunu (Raj.) regarding ownership of Land in name of trust; Copy of Zamabandi (Khatauni) issued by Tehsildar, Surajgarh, Jhunjhunu (Raj.) regarding ownership of Land in the name of Trust; Copy of Registered Gift Deed in the name of Trust duly registered in the office of Sub-Registrar, Surajgarh, Jhunjhunu (Raj.); Thus NRC, NCTE has rejected the application of this institute for grant of recognition of B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. course on arbitrary and unjustified basis. Therefore, it is prayed that the rejection order issued by NRC, NCTE be set aside and directions be issued to NRC, NCTE for further process of application of this institute for grant of recognition of B.A. B.Ed./B.Sc. B.Ed. course." In the course of personal presentation, the appellant submitted a copy of registered correction deed dt. 25.08.2017 for the land according to which the deed is now in favour of the Trust through their secretary.

AND WHEREAS the Committee, noting that the appellant has met the objection of the NRC regarding the title of the land by executing a registered correction deed dt. 25.8.2017, concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the NRC with a direction to consider the correction deed to be submitted to them by the appellant and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward a copy of the correction deed to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of the orders on the appeal.

WHEREAS the appeal of Ram Naval Singh Smarak Mahavidyalay, Bhikhampur, Mohammadabad Gohana, Mau, Uttar Pradesh dated 25.05.2017 is against the Order No. NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP-13833/260th Meeting/2016/162564 dated 30/11/2016 of the Northern Regional Committee, refusing recognition for conducting D.El.Ed. course on the grounds that "as per VT report the institution has 2395 sq. mts. only. The reply submitted in response to the show cause notice of NRC, NCTE dt. 10.02.2016 is not acceptable."


AND WHEREAS Sh. Ajit Kumar Singh, Chairman, Ram Naval Singh Smarak Mahavidyalay, Bhikhampur, Mohammadabad Gohana, Mau, Uttar Pradesh presented the case of the appellant institution on 26/08/2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation and in a letter dt. 26.08.2017, it was submitted that "as per VT report the institution has 2395 sq. mts. only. NRC failed to observe that the appellant has also submitted the separate building Completion Certificates for the B.A. & B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. course. The expert visit team conducted the visit of the Appellant institution for the D.El.Ed. course only and they have only taken the documents in respect of the D.El.Ed. course because impugned order is bad in law because the LOI could not had been issued if the appellant had not satisfied because the SCERT also conducted its visit and granted the affiliation to the petitioner institution after verifying the infrastructural facility. The appellant, in their letter dt. 26.08.2017 submitted that in response to the show cause notice decided upon by the NRC in their 250th meeting held on 26-27, February, 2016 on the ground of inadequacy of built up area, he sent a reply on 01.03.2016, which was received on 03.03.2016.

AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that the NRC in the first instance in their order dt. 2.5.2016 granted recognition to the appellant institution for conducting D.El.Ed. course with an intake of 100 students. Subsequently, the NRC in their corrigendum dt. 9.6.2016 deleted the names of certain institutions, including that of the appellant

institution, from their recognition order dt. 2.5.2016 as they decided to issue show cause notices to them. NRC issued a show cause notice to the appellant institution on 10.6.2016 on the grounds that the total built-up area in the possession of the institution is only 2395 Sq.mtrs. which is just sufficient to run the existing B.Ed. course of two units. The Committee noted from the file that the appellant sent replies to the show cause notice twice, one dated 1.7.2016, which was received on 6.9.2016 and another of the same date which was received on 5.10.2016. The Committee noted that the file of the NRC does not indicate the consideration of the replies submitted by the appellant and the building completion certificates enclosed by them. In these circumstances, the Committee concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the NRC with a direction to consider the replies of the appellant to the show cause notice dt. 10.6.2016 and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC with a direction to consider the replies of the appellant to the show cause notice dt. 10.6.2016 and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Ram Naval Singh Smarak Mahavidyalay, Bhikhampur, Mohammadabad Gohana, Mau – 276129, Uttar Pradesh to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.

In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "The applicant institute Swami Shivendrapuri Sanskrit Mahavidyalay, Belauna kala, Jaunpur, U.P. has extra land and building for B.El.Ed. course as per norms beside Shastri course infrastructure and Governing trust has passed a resolution for same. In reference with same the Registrar, Sampurnanand Sanskrit University Varanasi has issued a new letter no. G 1169/17 Dt. 19/03/2017 with approval of Vice- Chancellor stating the above mentioned fact that proposed course may be conducted in the extra space available in the college premises for which university has no objection. So kindly taking into notice the newly added fact please reconsider our application and grant us the recognition of proposed B.El.Ed. course."

AND WHEREAS the Committee noted that the Sampurnand Sanskrit University, Varanasi has given a new letter dt. 19.3.2017 conveying their No Objection for conducting the proposed B.El.Ed. course in the land and building available in the complex. Since the objection raised by the NRC in their refusal order has been met, the Committee concluded that the matter deserved to be remanded to the NRC with a direction to consider the letter of the university dated 19.3.2017 and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The appellant is directed to forward a copy of the university's letter dt. 19.3.2017, submitted in appeal to the NRC within 15 days of receipt of the orders on appeal.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the memorandum of appeal, affidavit, documents available on records and considering the oral arguments advanced during the hearing, the Committee concluded that the appeal deserves to be remanded to NRC with a direction to consider the letter of the university dated 19.3.2017 and take further action as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014. ORDER

WHEREAS the appeal of Maa Rewathi College of Education, Mandla, Madhya Pradesh dated 16.2.2017 against the order no. WRC/NCTE/APP3118/254th/D.El.Ed. (MP)/2016/169556 dated 20.6.2016 of the Western Regional Committee granting recognition for one unit of D.El.Ed. programme whereas the application was for seeking two units of D.El.Ed. programme.

AND WHEREAS Sh. Abhishek Chobey, Representative, Maa Rewathi College of Education, Mandla, Madhya Pradesh presented the case of appellant institution on 4.5.2017. In the appeal and during personal presentation it was submitted that "we have sufficient built up area and given 1+15 staff profile for two units of D.El.Ed. course".

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that appeal made by appellant is for grant of recognition for two units of D.El.Ed. programme where as the impugned recognition order is for granting recognition for one unit (50 seats).

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that inspection of the appellant institution was conducted on 19.11.2015 with a proposed intake of one unit of D.El.Ed programme. Appeal Committee noted that the Visiting Team had made certain adverse observation's in the report such as:

- i) The location of the building did not match with the description given in the land document.
- ii) The existing building did not match with the approved building plan which has been submitted to WRC.
- iii) The building shown to Visiting Team by the management has eight classrooms, four labs, one seminar room, common room, one multipurpose hall with tin roof.
- iv) Furniture and equipment did not have identification mark as per stock register.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee further noted that appellant institution was issued a Show Cause Notice (SCN) dated 23.12.2015 but the adverse remarks made by V.T. were not Communicated to the appellant. Appeal Committee further noted that based on an order of Hon'ble High Court dated 23.11.2015, WRC opted to process the applications and issued a Letter of Intent (LOI) dated 26.04.2016 to the appellant institution for D.El.Ed. programme with an annual intake of 50 students. It is doubtful whether the adverse findings of the Inspection Team were ever brought to notice of Hon'ble Court. As location of land and building itself did not match with the submitted documents, there was no sanctity to find out whether the infrastructure is suitable since a part of the structure was having tin roof also.

AND WHEREAS appellant during the course of appeal presentation stated that appellant institution is at present recognised for conducting 2 units of B.Ed., one unit of BA. B.Ed. and one unit of D.El.Ed. programme and built up area of 4034 Sq. Meters. Appeal Committee, before taking a decision on the appeal filed by appellant, decided to get a composite inspection for all the teacher education programmes applied for and being conducted by the appellant institution strictly restricting the inspection to the land and building for which documents were submitted. Report of the composite inspection report has now been made available to the Appeal Committee.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee noted that the submission made by appellant seeking two units of D.El.Ed. programme as against the one unit for which recognition was granted on 20.6.2016, is primality on two grounds i.e. it has sufficient built up area and has given staff profile for two units". Appeal Committee further noted that impugned recognition order dated 20.6.2016 does not specify any deficiency on the above grounds and also does not mention any other reason for recognising only one unit and not two as applied for by the appellant institution.


AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee further noted that the visiting team in its inspection report dated 19-20 August, 2017 intimated that the institution is in possession of land measuring 4000 sq.mtrs. and a built up area of 4034 Sq.mtrs. The specifications of land and built up area are the same as were mentioned in the affidavit submitted by

appellant at the time of applying for the programme. Appeal Committee further noted that appellant institution on getting the LOI dated 26.4.2016 for one unit immediately wrote back to WRC that it had applied for two units and LOI should accordingly be modified for two units. WRC without intimating any reason for not giving two units, issued impugned recognition order granting recognition for conducting one unit of D.El.Ed. programme.

AND WHEREAS Appeal Committee considering that impugned recognition order is devoid of any reason for not granting two units, decided to remand back the case to WRC for issue of a speaking order disposing of the request made by appellant vide its letter dated 26.4.2016 seeking modification in the LOI. The case is accordingly remanded back to WRC for revisiting the case.

AND WHEREAS after perusal of the Memoranda of Appeal, affidavit, documents on record and oral arguments advanced during the hearing, Appeal Committee concluded to remand back the case to WRC for revisiting its decision to grant only one unit of D.El.Ed. programme.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council hereby remands back the case of Maa Rewati College of Education, Jantipur Road, Badi Khairi, Mandla, Madhya Pradesh – 481661 to the NRC, NCTE, for necessary action as indicated above.
